Topic: April 2007 Public Report

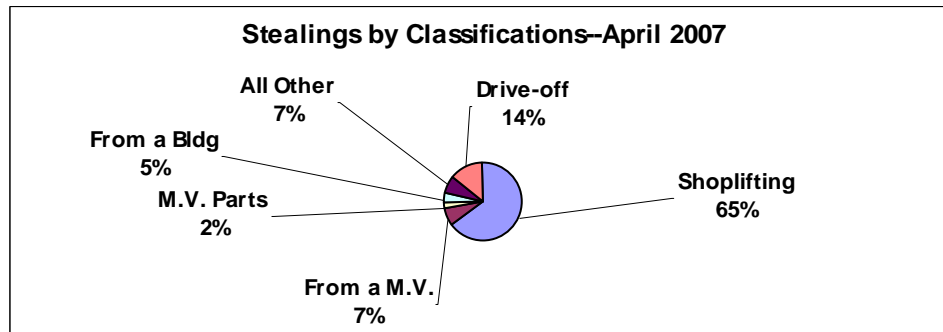
This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of April 2007. In April 2007, there were 57 Part I offenses and 531 Part II offenses for a total of 588. This compares with 71 Part I offenses and 246 Part II offenses for a total of 317 in April 2007. The main difference was in the number of traffic stops and stealing offenses.

There were no sexual assaults or robberies reported in April but there was one burglary. On 04-03-2007, the victim reported someone in her residence on Manda. It was later determined that her boyfriend had invited his cousin over and had not told the victim and she thought the cousin was a burglar.

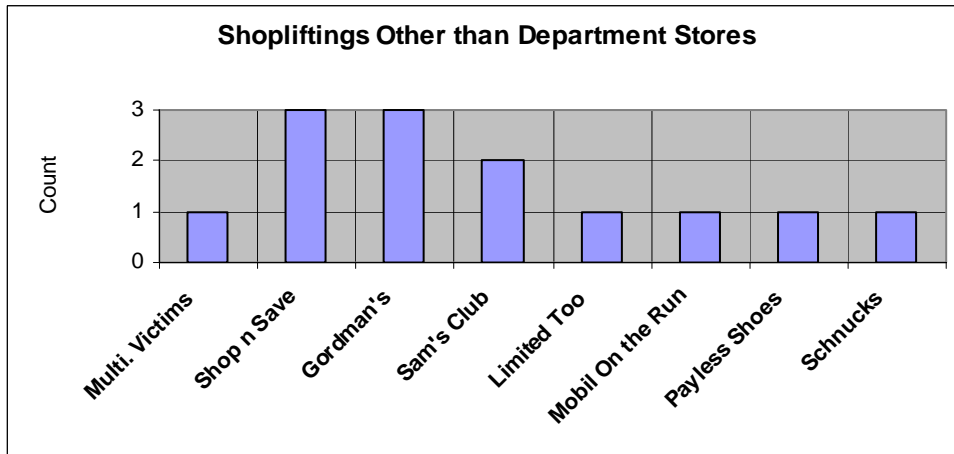
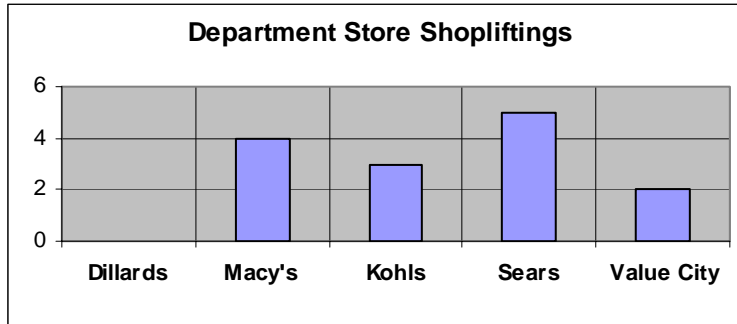
There were five assaults in April 2007 and four involved domestic violence. In all cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

Stealing offenses numbered 42 in April 2007.

Stealings were of the following classifications in April 2007:

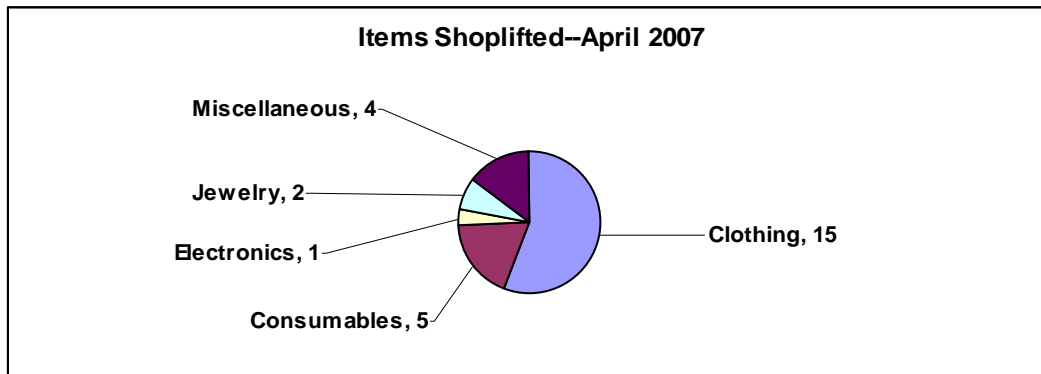


Shopliftings accounted for 27 of the 42 stealings in April 2007 or 65%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in April 2007:

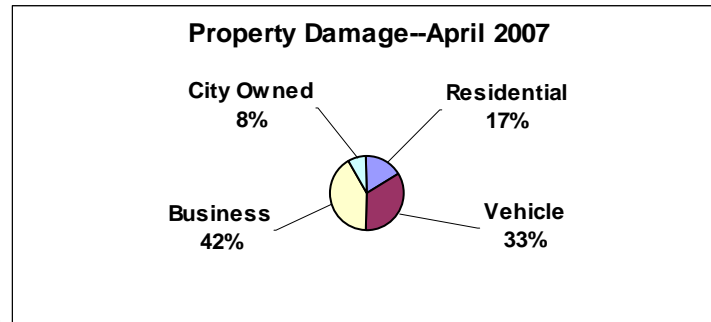


Of the shopliftings, 89% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 75%, juveniles accounted for 21% and adults and juveniles together accounted for 4% of the clearances.

There were twelve property damages in April 2007 and they were of the following classifications:



The City Owned property damages were street signs.

There were no receiving stolen properties but two stolen vehicles in April 2007. The first occurred on 04-24-2007 and involved a black 94 Mitsubishi Eclipse that had been left for service and then disappeared after the business closed. The second stolen vehicle was on 04-25-2007 and involved a copper 1992 Jaguar. The vehicle was later recovered in Washington Park, IL. There was one recovered auto in April. On 04-24-07, a red 1996 Pontiac Grand Am was recovered that had been reported stolen to the Franklin County Sheriff.

Part I offenses numbered 57 in April 2007.

Part II:

In April 2007, there were nine frauds reported, two credit card frauds, two forgeries, one counterfeiting, one identity theft and three other frauds. There were three drug offenses, one possession on marijuana and two drug paraphernalia cases. The two offenses against public peace involved a trespassing and a resisting arrest. There were four DWI cases reported. There were fifteen animal calls and sixty-three people related calls including 58 accidental injuries and sick cases, two suicides or attempts, two sudden deaths and one missing person. There were three juvenile offenses including one runaway, one minor in possession and one protective custody. There were 51 suspicious activity calls

Part II offenses totaled 531 in April 2007.

In April 2007 in Ward One, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered seven with five at addresses on Watson Road, one in an apartment complex and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered one, one at addresses along Watson Road and none in the neighborhoods. There was one stolen vehicle. There were three frauds, one drug offense and no offenses against public peace, juvenile, family or weapons offenses. There was one DWI case and six traffic accidents, thirteen people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eleven and occurred on three different streets and there were 41 miscellaneous police service calls.

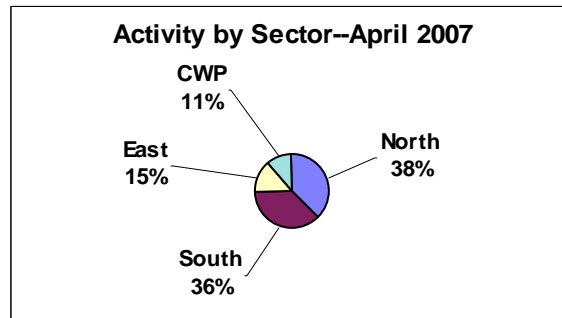
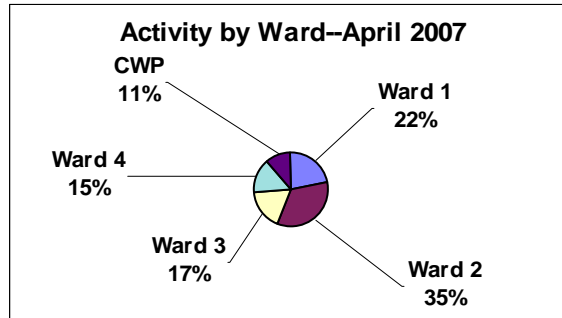
In Ward Two in April 2007, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered seventeen with fourteen at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and three in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered five, four at addresses along Watson Road and Big Bend and one in the neighborhoods. There were no stolen vehicles. There were five frauds, one drug offense and one juvenile offense and no offenses against public peace, family or weapons offenses. There were two DWI cases and five traffic accidents, eleven people related calls and four animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered twenty-one and occurred on ten different streets and there were 76 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In April 2007 in Ward Three, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered four with three at addresses on Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered three, one at addresses along Watson Road and two in the neighborhoods. There was one stolen vehicle. There was one offense against public peace, and one juvenile offense and no frauds, drug offenses, family or weapon offenses. There was one DWI and five traffic accidents, seventeen people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered nine and occurred on seven different streets and there were 37 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in April 2007, there were no sexual assaults, robberies and one burglary on Manda. Stealings numbered one and property damages numbered two and no stolen vehicles. There was one fraud, and one juvenile offense and no drug offenses, offenses against public peace, family or weapon offenses. There were no DWI cases and no traffic accidents, fourteen people related calls and seven animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered seven and occurred on six different streets and there were 25 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered thirteen with twelve shopliftings and one all other thefts. Property damages numbered one and there were no stolen vehicles. There was one offense against public peace, and no frauds, drug offenses, juvenile, family or weapon offenses. There were no DWI and five traffic accidents, eight people related calls and no animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered three and there were nineteen police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

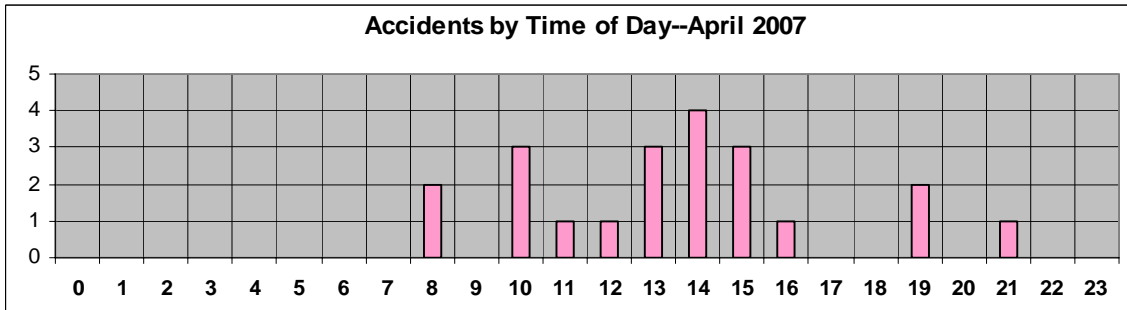

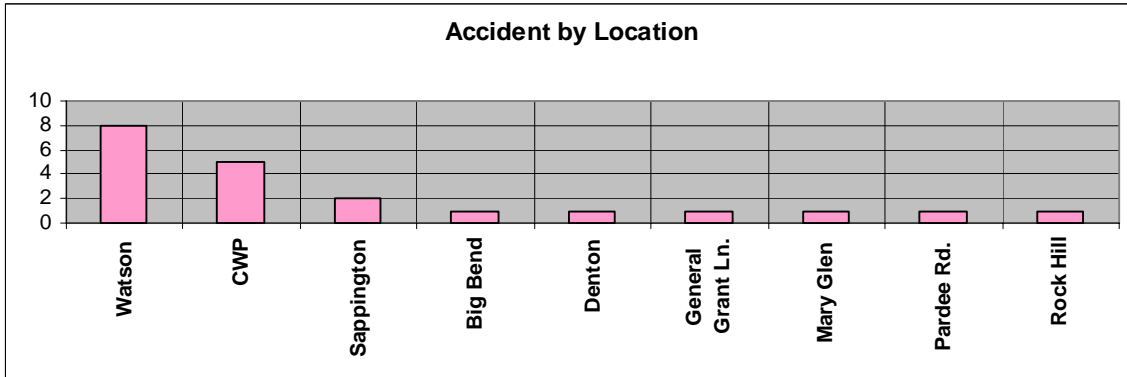
Accidents occurred on the following days of the week:



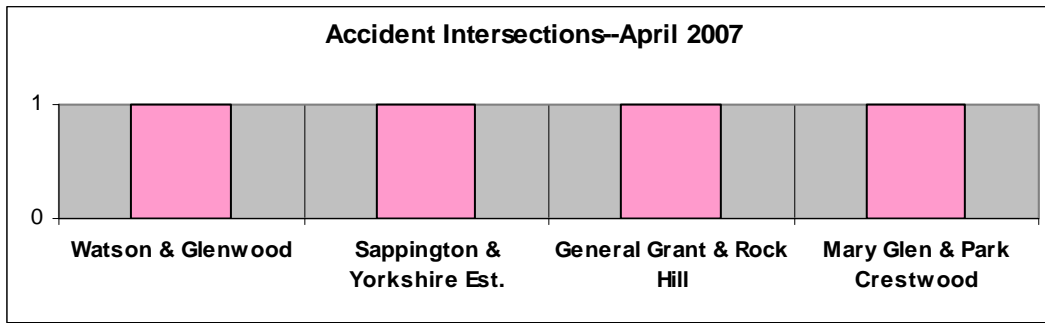
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



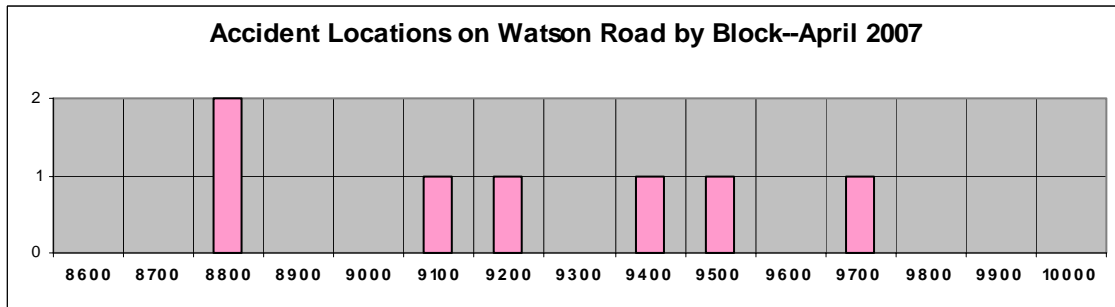
Accidents occurred on the following streets in April 2007:



Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



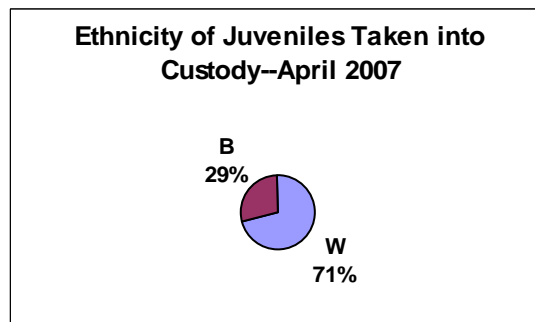
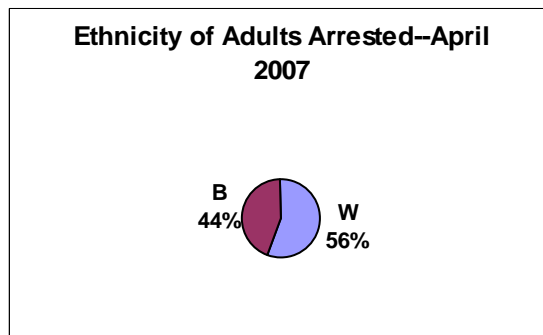
Accidents occurred in the following blocks of Watson Road:



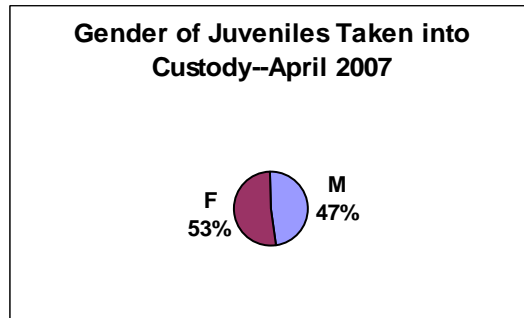
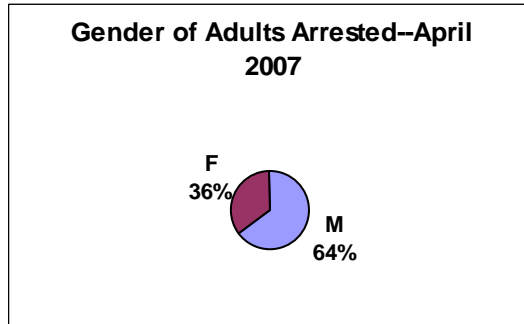
Arrest Information:

Seventy-two adults and seventeen juveniles were taken into custody in April 2007. Eleven persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

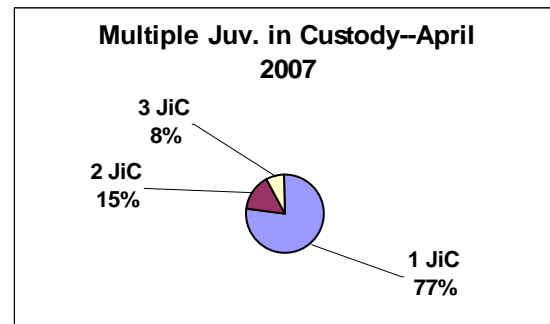
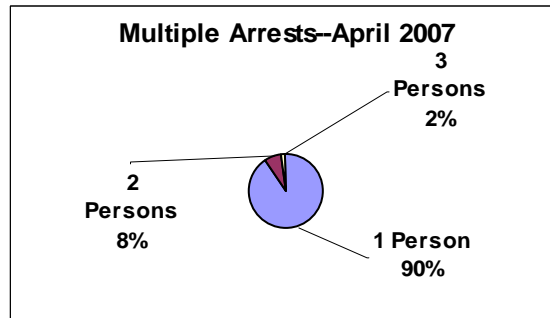
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



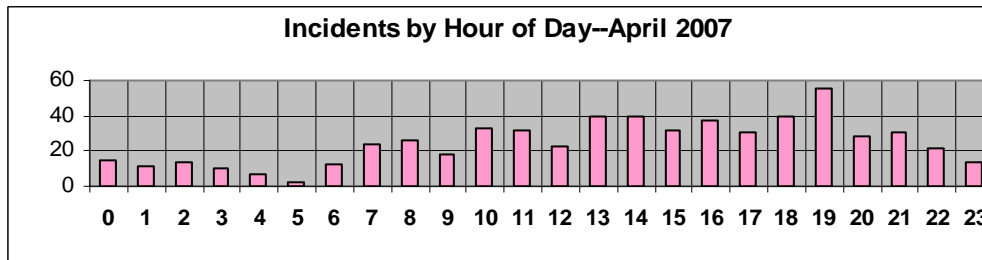
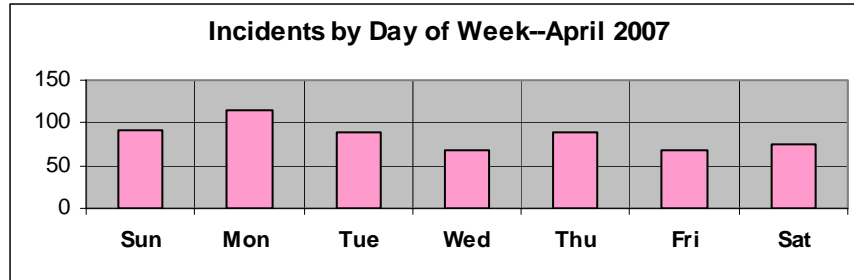
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

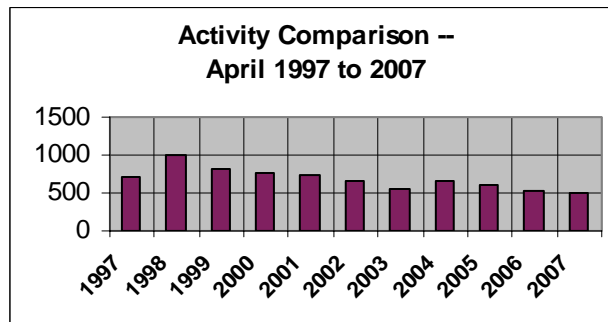
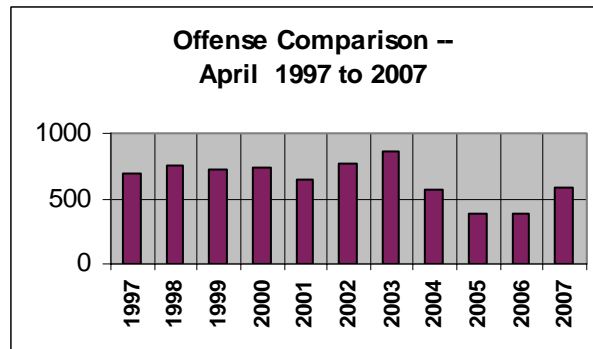

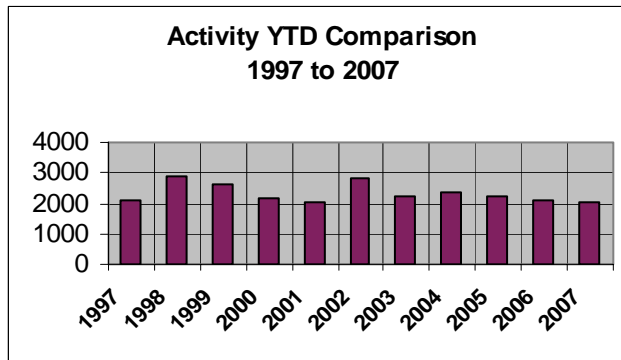
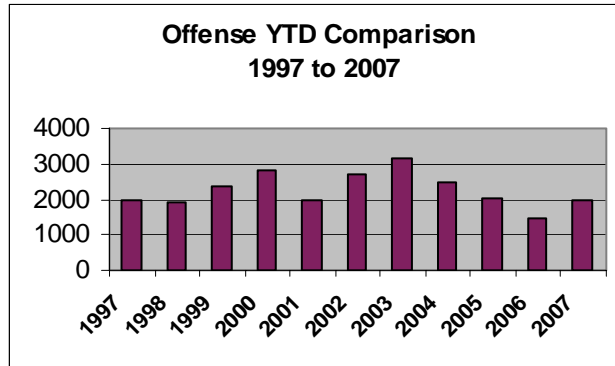


Offense and Activity Comparison:

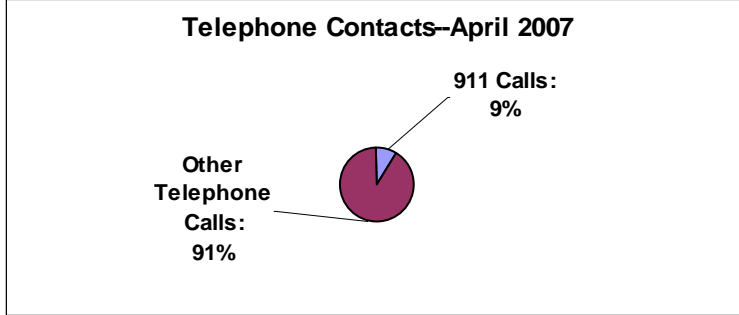


Years to Date:



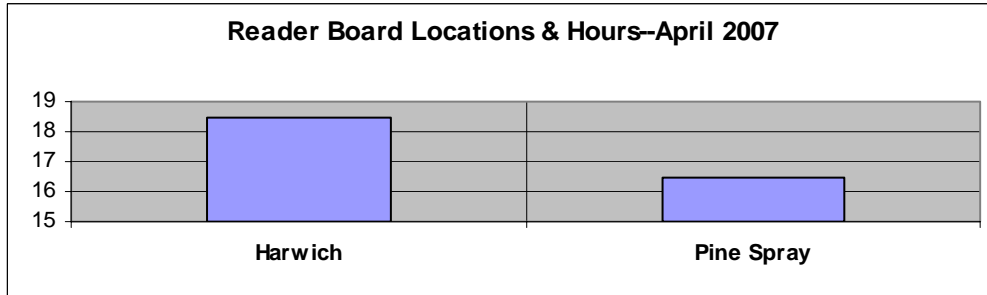
Communications:

The speed measuring reader board was placed at the following locations and for the following amount of time in April 2007:

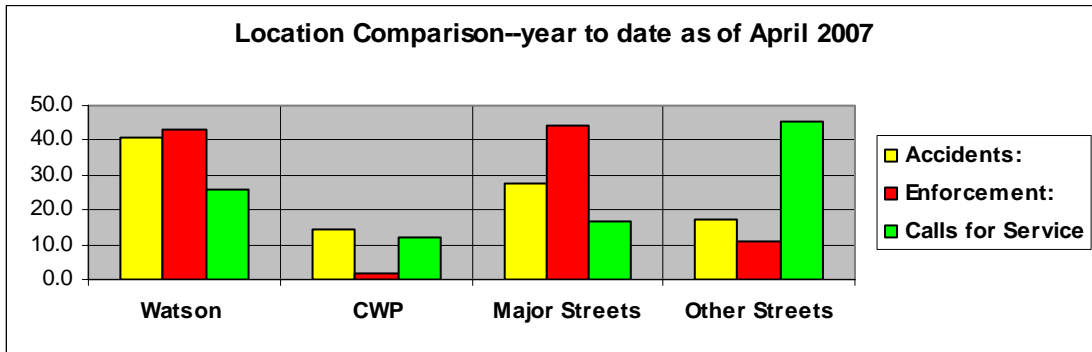


Location Comparison:
