Topic: April 2008 Public Report

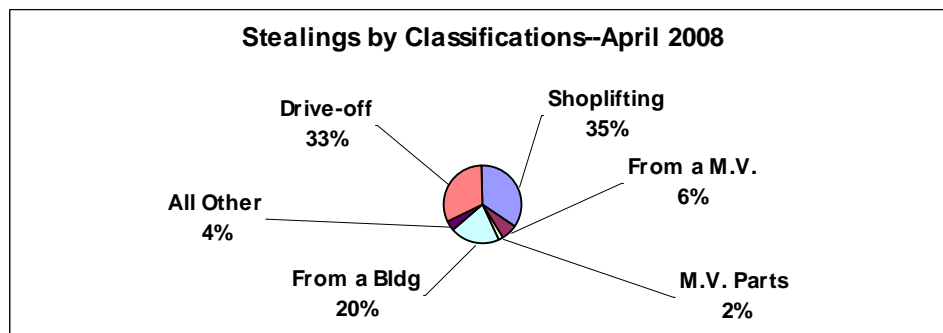
This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of April 2008. In April 2008, there were 61 Part I offenses and 543 Part II offenses for a total of 604. This compares with 57 Part I offenses and 531 Part II offenses for a total of 588 in April 2007. The main difference was in the number of traffic accidents.

There were ten assaults in April 2008 and four involved domestic violence. In six cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

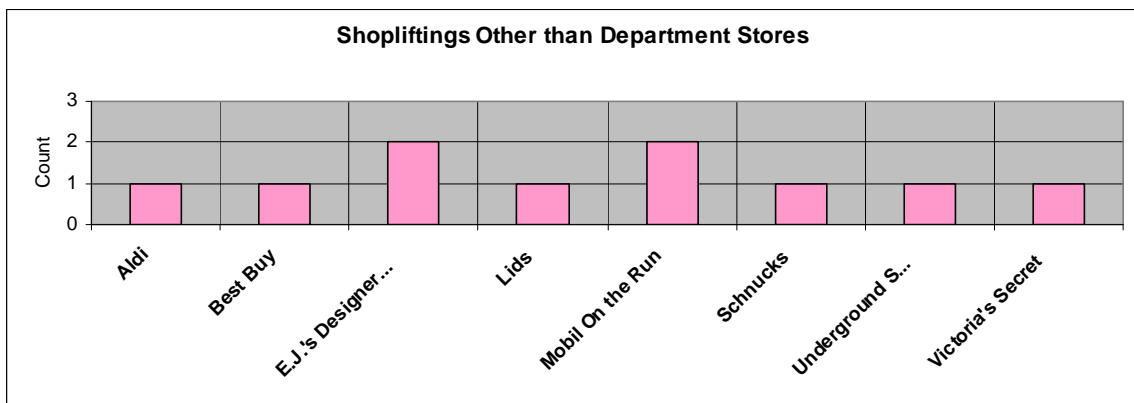
There were four burglaries reported in April. The first was reported on 04-01-2008 in the 8900 blk of Sappington. Someone had broken into a garage and forced the interior door into the residence and was scared off by the pit bulls in the residence. The second burglary was reported on 04-09-2008 in the 9600 blk of Gallop. Someone had broken into a residence by breaking a window but nothing was found to be missing. The third was also reported on 04-09-2008 and was also in the 9600 blk of Gallop. Someone broke out a window and removed a handgun from the residence. The fourth burglary was reported on 04-23-2008 in the Forestview Apartments. Someone entered the apartment through an unlocked window and removed some electronic equipment.

Stealing offenses numbered 49 in April 2008.

Stealings were of the following classifications in April 2008:

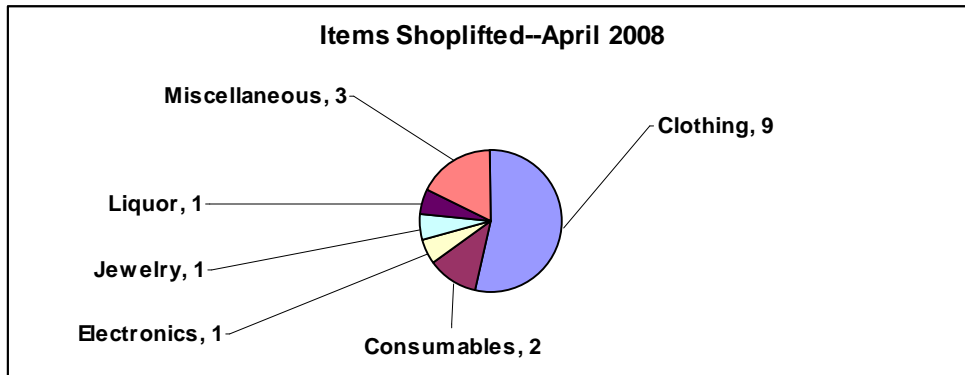


Shopliftings accounted for seventeen of the 49 stealings in April 2008 or 35%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in April 2008:

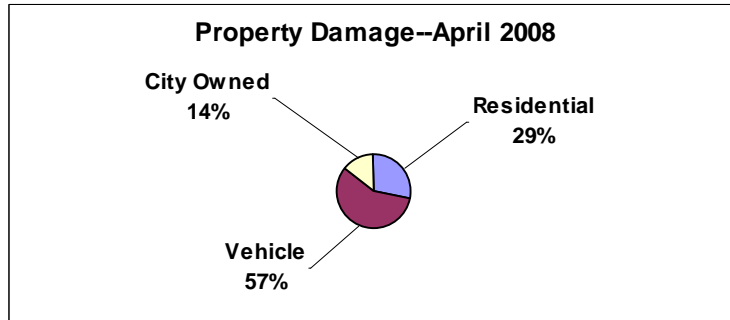


Of the shopliftings, 47% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 75% and juveniles accounted for 25% of the clearances.

There were seven property damages in April 2008 and they were of the following classifications:



The City-Owned damage was graffiti at the restroom on the Grant's Trail.

There was one stolen vehicle reported in April 2008. A rental truck was reported as stolen but it was later learned that the truck had not been stolen but was involved in a computer entry error.

Part I offenses numbered 61 in April 2008.

Part II:

In April 2008, there were six frauds reported, including three bad checks, one credit card fraud and two all other type frauds. The two drug cases both involved possession of small quantities of marijuana. The two offenses against public peace were a disorderly conduct and a trespassing. There were three DWI cases, 33 traffic accidents, sixteen animal calls and 65 people related calls including 59 medical emergencies, three suicides or attempts, two sudden deaths and one missing person. The one weapons offense involved a problem with a concealed carrying of a handgun and a spring loaded knife.

Part II offenses totaled 350 in April 2008.

In April 2008 in Ward One, there were three burglaries. Stealings numbered eight with three at addresses on Watson Road, one in an industrial area and four in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered one with all in the neighborhoods. There were two frauds, one drug offense and one weapons offense. There was one DWI case and six traffic accidents, ten people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered fourteen and occurred on eight different streets and there were 39 miscellaneous police service calls.

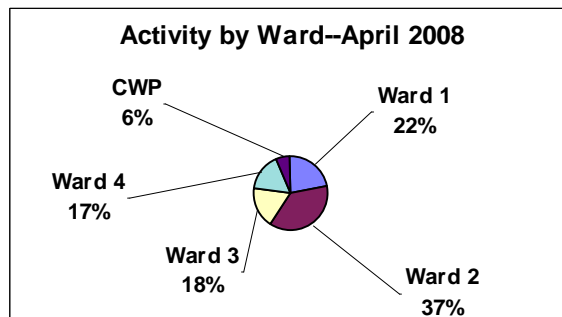
In Ward Two in April 2008, stealings numbered 23 with 22 at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered four, one at addresses along Watson Road and Big Bend and three in the neighborhoods. There were four frauds and one drug offense. There were two DWI cases and seventeen traffic accidents, seventeen people related calls and seven animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered twelve and occurred on eight different streets and there were 62 calls for miscellaneous police services.

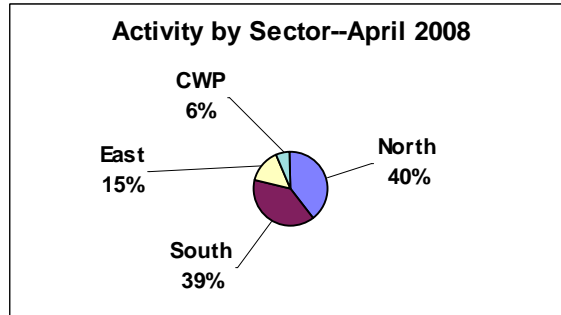
In April 2008 in Ward Three, stealings numbered six with five at addresses on Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. There were no property damages. There were two offenses against public peace and one juvenile related offense. There were five traffic accidents, seventeen people related calls and three animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eleven and occurred on six different streets and there were 34 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in April 2008, there was one burglary. There were no stealings and one property damage. There were four traffic accidents, eighteen people related calls and five animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered thirteen and occurred on eight different streets and there were 26 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered twelve with eight shopliftings, two from buildings and two all other thefts. Property damages numbered one. There was one traffic accident and three people related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered three and there were seven police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

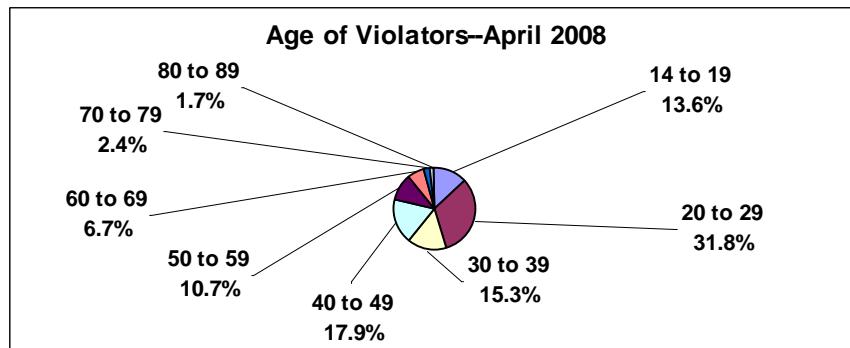

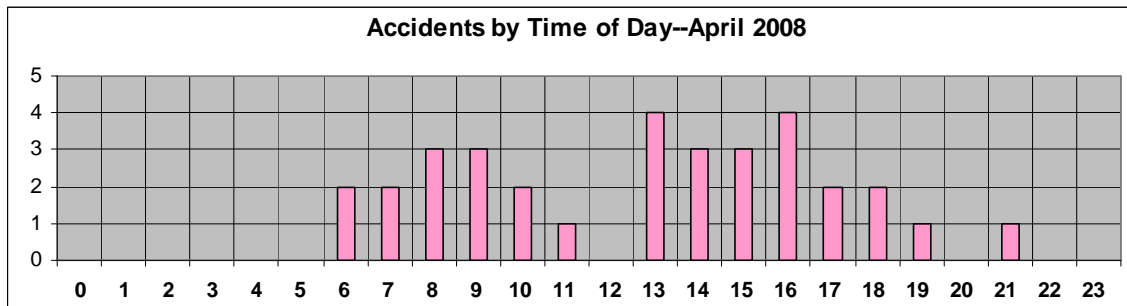

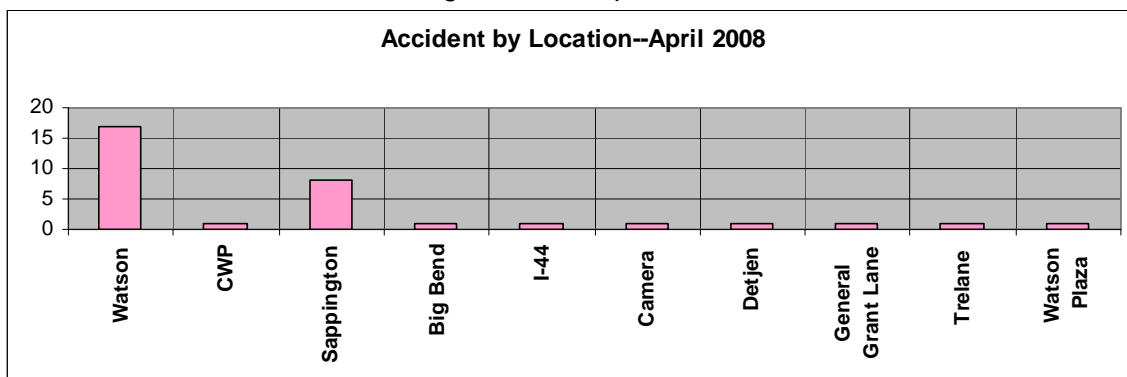

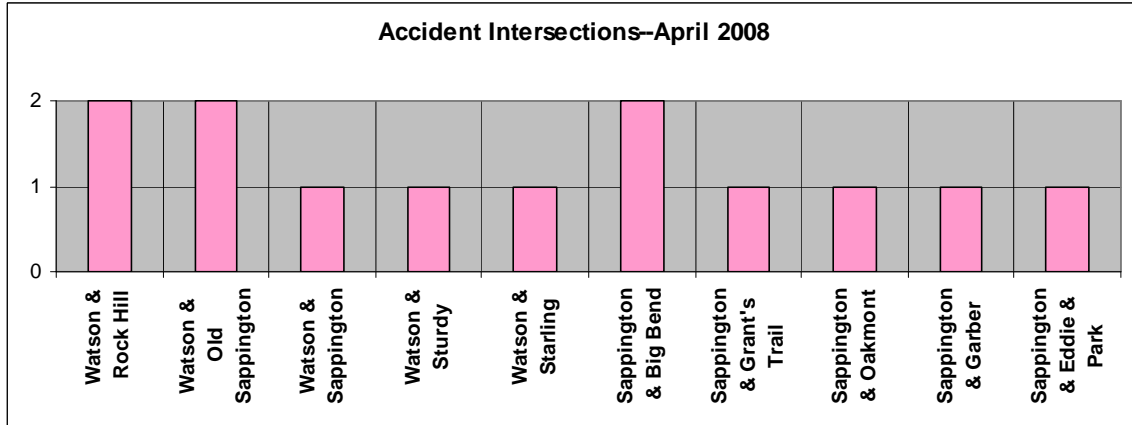
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



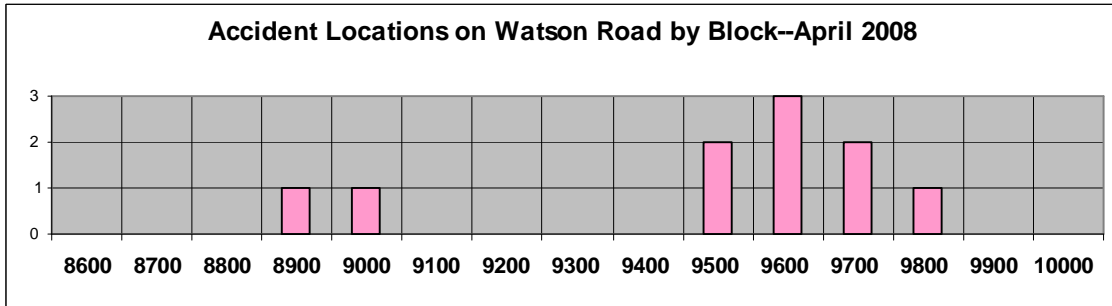

Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



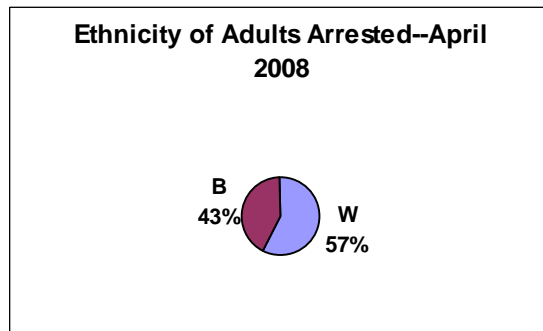

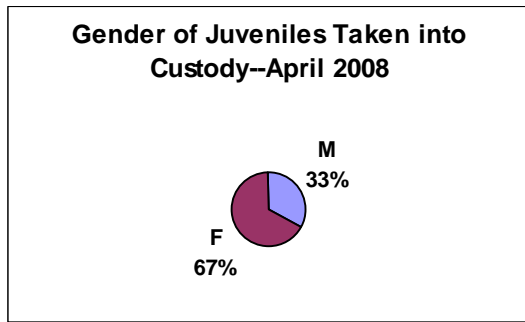
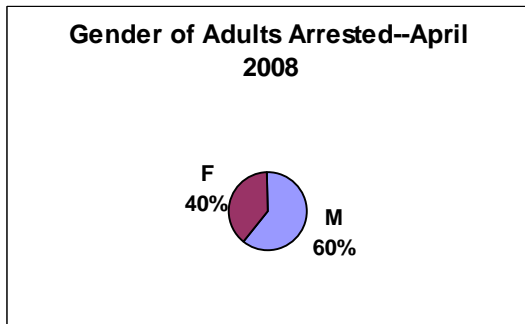
Sixty-five adults and nine juveniles were taken into custody in April 2008. Eleven persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:

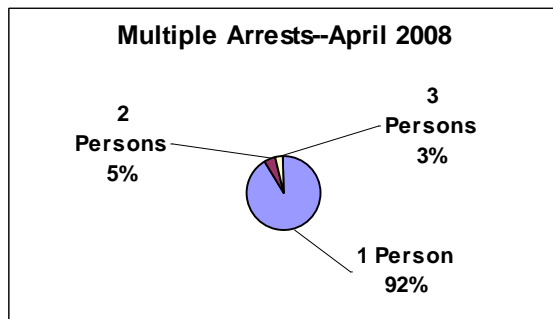


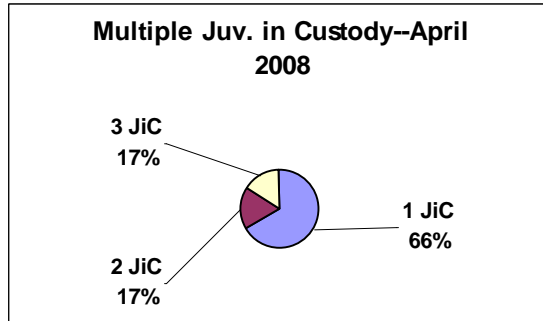


The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



Multiple Arrests:

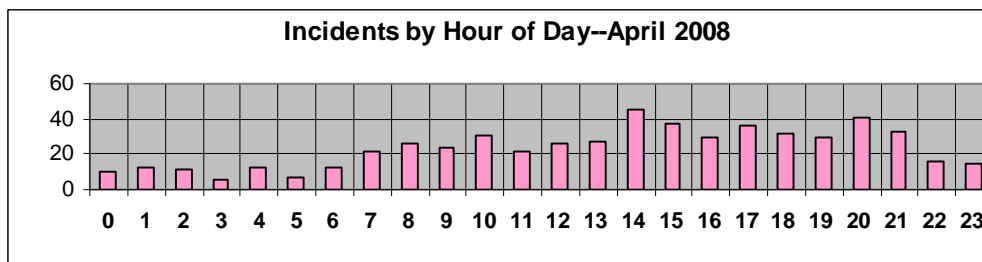
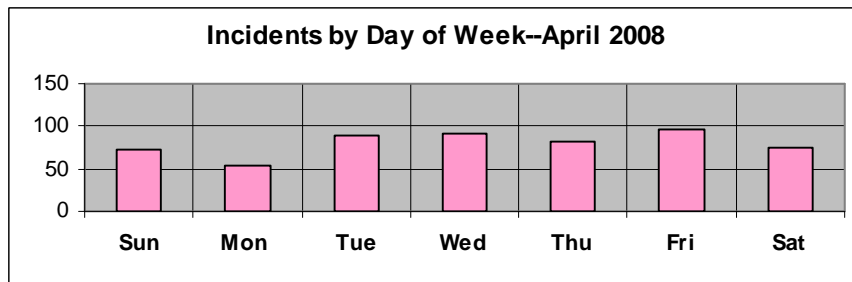




Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

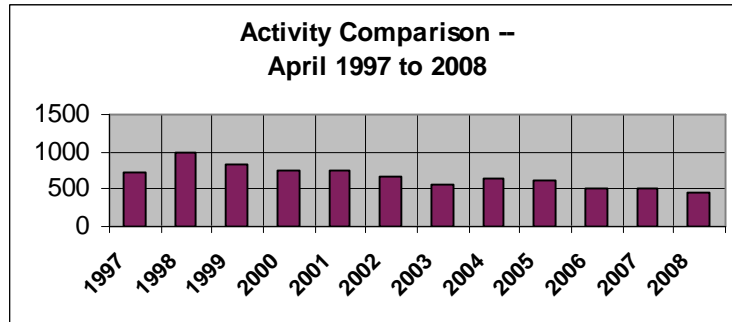
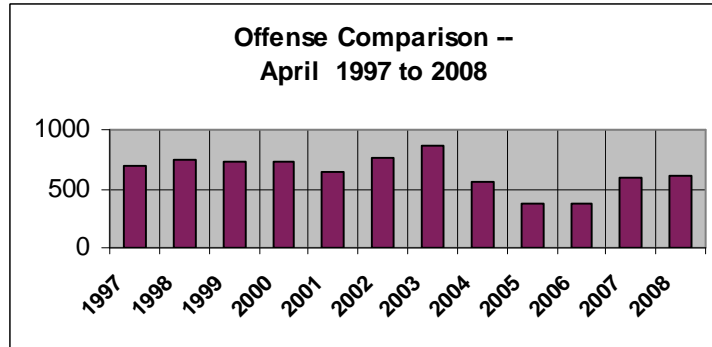

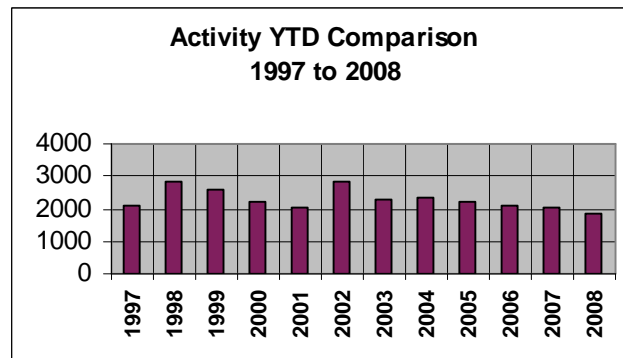
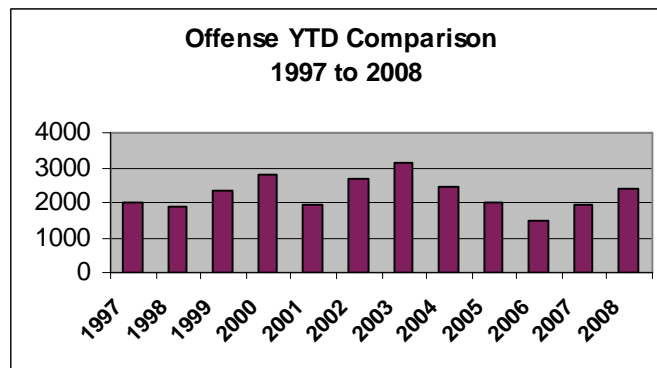


Offense and Activity Comparison:

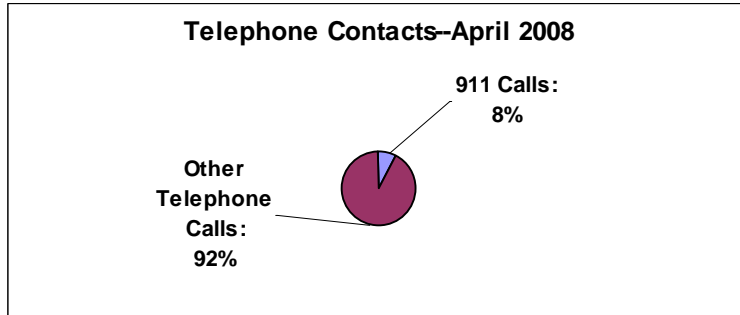


Years to Date:

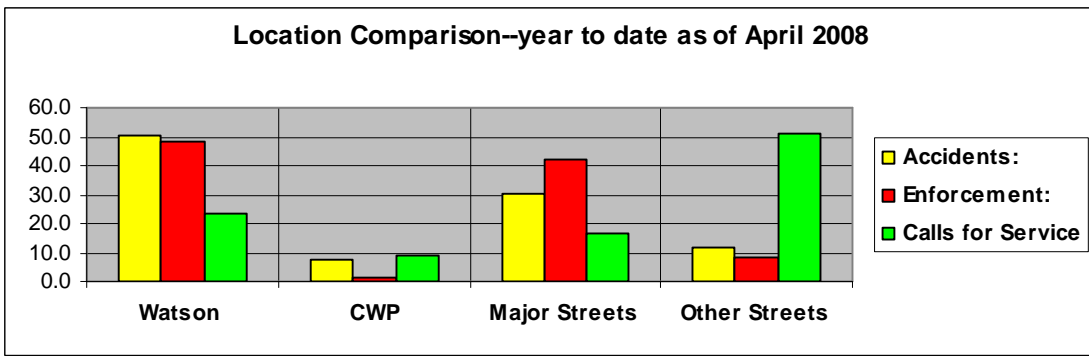


Location Comparison:
