Topic: April 2009 Public Report

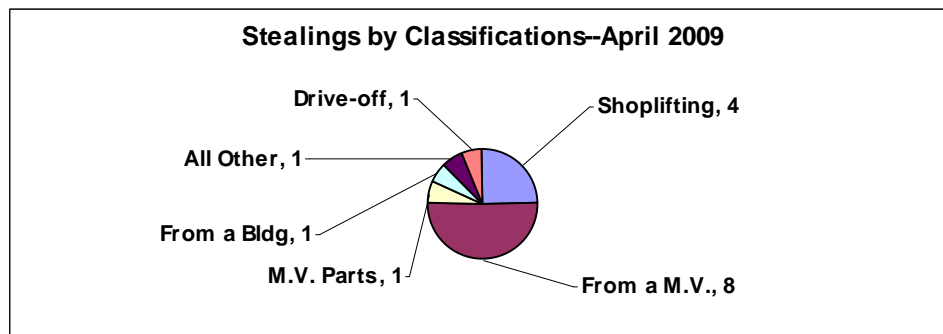
This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of April 2009. In April 2009, there were 20 Part I offenses and 369 Part II offenses for a total of 389. This compares with 61 Part I offenses and 544 Part II offenses for a total of 605 in April 2008. The main difference was in the number of stealings, burglaries and traffic stops.

There was one robbery reported in April at a restaurant on Watson Road. The employees heard the front door open and observed a male with a gun, who demanded the money. The employees ran into the back room and out the back door of the business and to a nearby residence and called the Police. No injuries and nothing was taken.

There was one assault in April 2009 and it involved domestic violence. In this case, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

Stealing offenses numbered 16 in April 2009.

Stealings were of the following classifications in April 2009:



Shopliftings accounted for 4 of the 16 stealings in April 2009 or 25%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in April 2009:

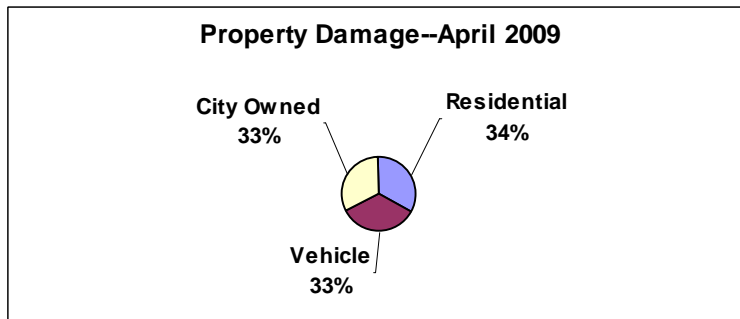


Of the shopliftings, 80% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 75% and adults and juveniles accounted for 25% of the clearances.

There were three property damages in April 2009 and they were of the following classifications:



The City Owned property damage was to cul-de-sac grass median driven over by trash trucks.

Part I offenses numbered 20 in April 2009.

Part II:

In April 2009, there were seven frauds reported, including two passing bad checks, two counterfeitings, two fraudulent use of credit devices and one forgery. The four drug

cases included two possessions of marijuana and two possessions of drug paraphernalia. The one offense against public peace was a resisting arrest and there was one DWI case. There were nine animal related calls and 97 people related calls including 86 medical emergencies, six missing persons and five sudden deaths. The two juvenile offenses were a minor in possession of alcohol and an involved juvenile prank. The two family offenses were an ex-parte order violation and an unattended child in a vehicle.

Part II offenses totaled 308 in April 2009.

In April 2009 in Ward One, there was one robbery of a restaurant on Watson Road. Stealings numbered one with one at addresses on Watson Road and none in the neighborhoods. There was one fraud, two drug offenses and one family offense. There were six traffic accidents, 25 people related calls and four animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered seventeen and occurred on four different streets and there were 39 miscellaneous police service calls.

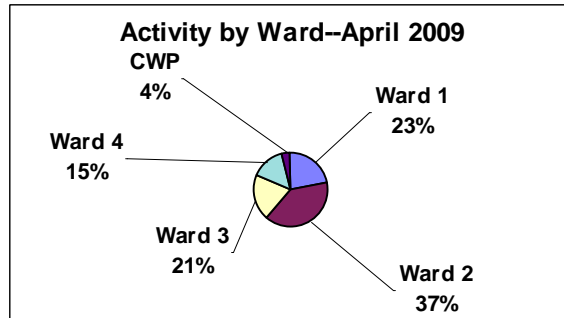
In Ward Two in April 2009, stealings numbered eleven with eleven at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and none in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered one with one in the neighborhoods. There were five frauds, one offense against public peace and one family offense. There was one DWI and nine traffic accidents, 36 people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered five and occurred on three different streets and there were 44 calls for miscellaneous police services.

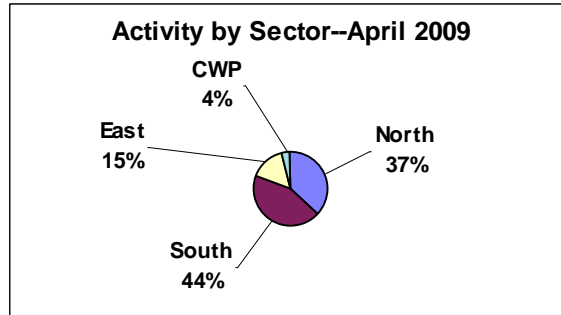
In April 2009 in Ward Three, stealings numbered one with one in Whitecliff Park and property damages numbered one with one in the neighborhoods. There was one fraud, two drug offenses and two juvenile related offenses. There were four traffic accidents, 20 people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered two and occurred on two different streets and there were 31 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in April 2009, stealings numbered one and there was one property damage. There were sixteen people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered five and occurred on five different streets and there were 24 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered two with one shopliftings and one from a vehicles. There was one traffic accident and there were ten police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

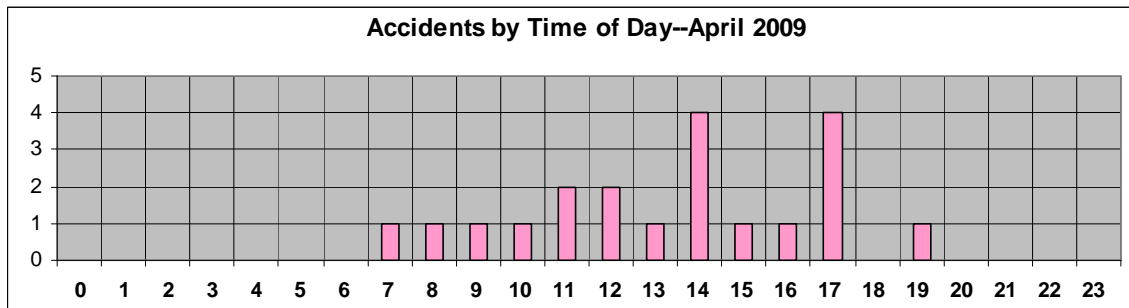

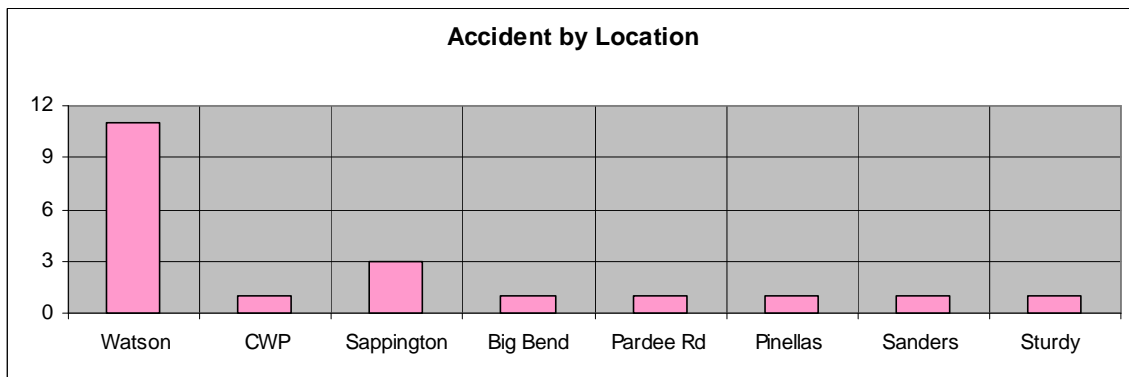

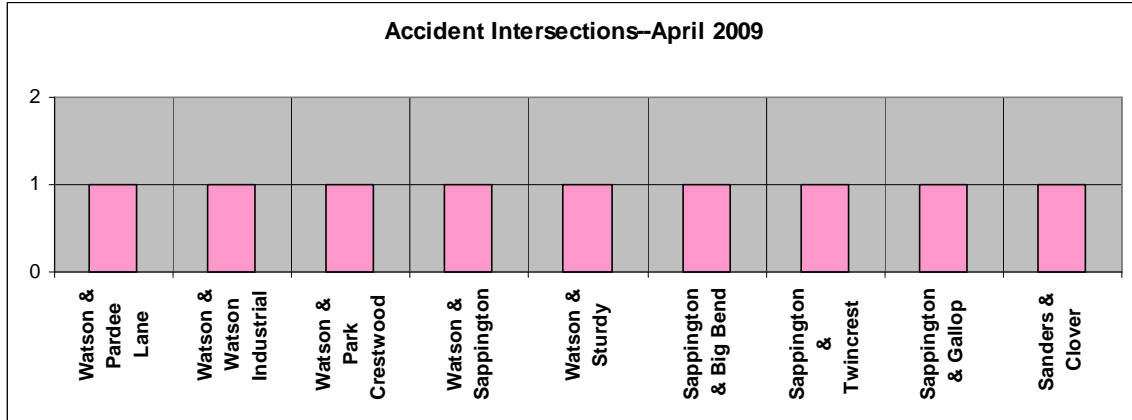
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



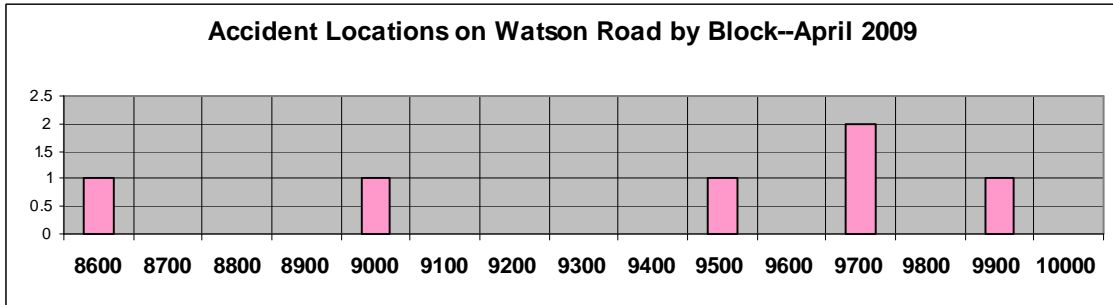

Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



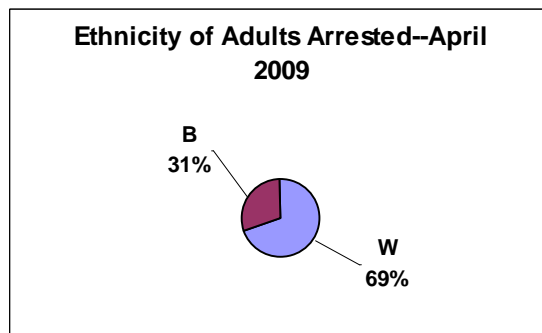

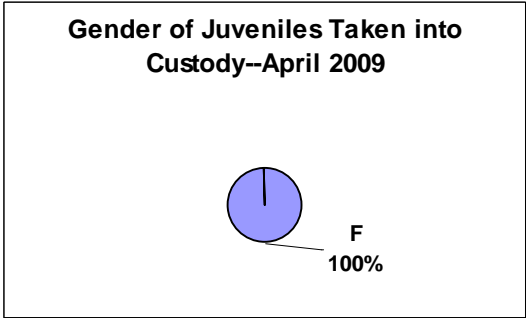
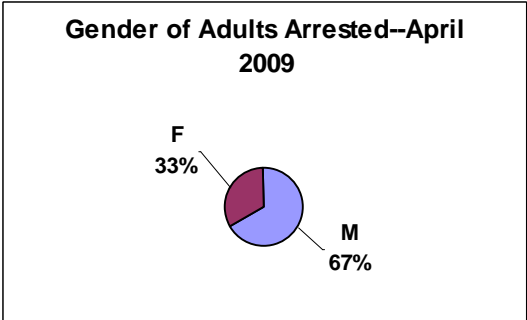
Forty-eight adults and two juveniles were taken into custody in April 2009. Eight persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:

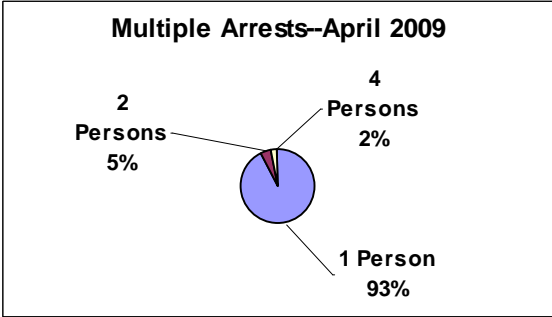


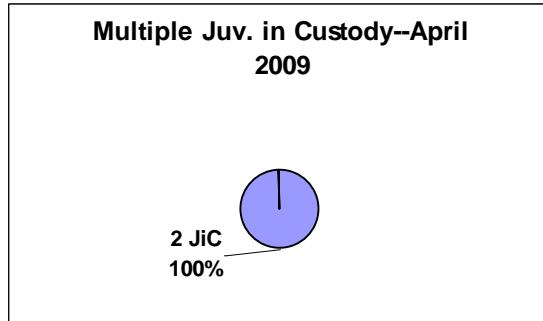


The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



Multiple Arrests:

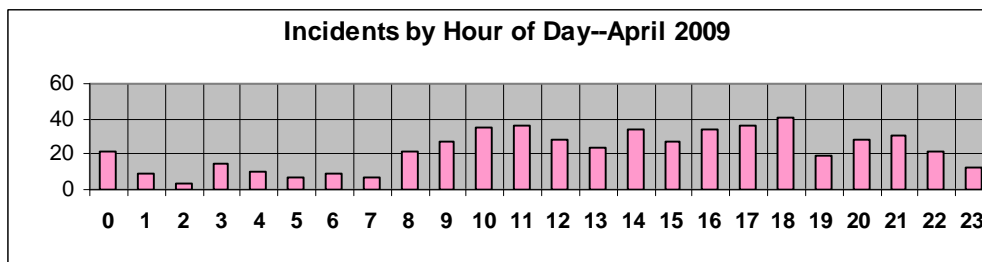
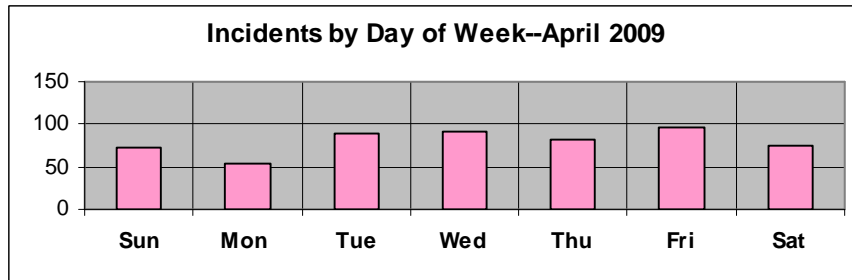




Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

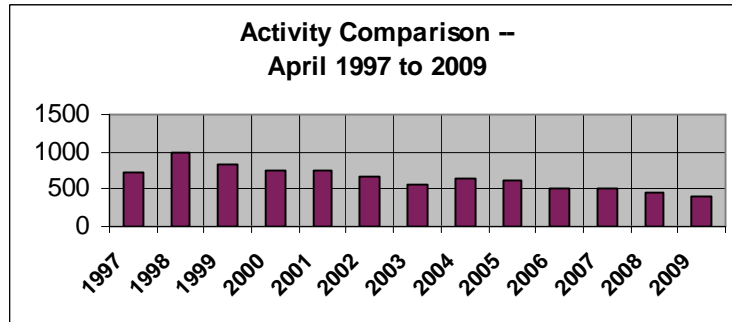
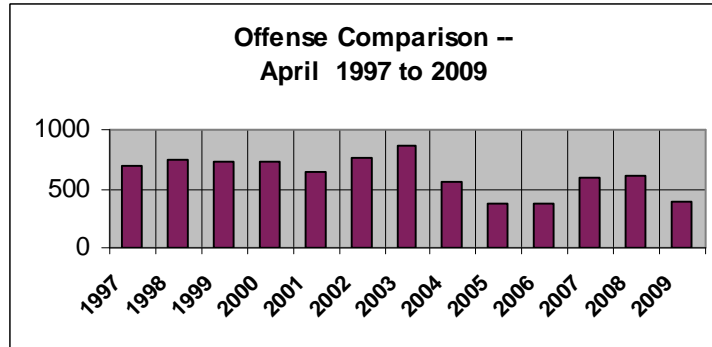

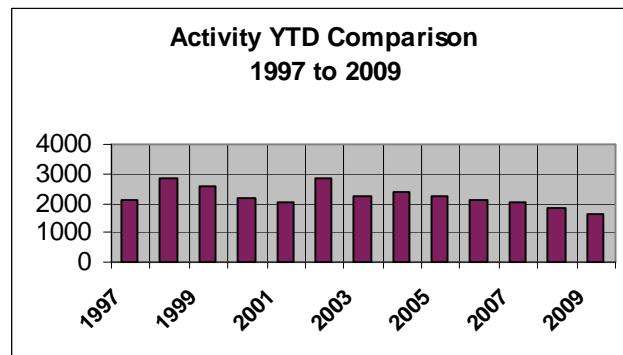
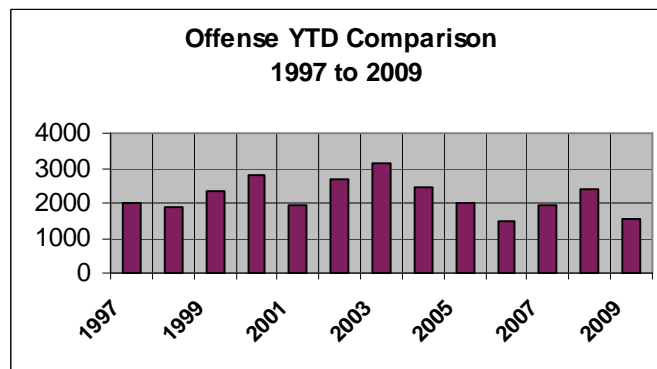


Offense and Activity Comparison:

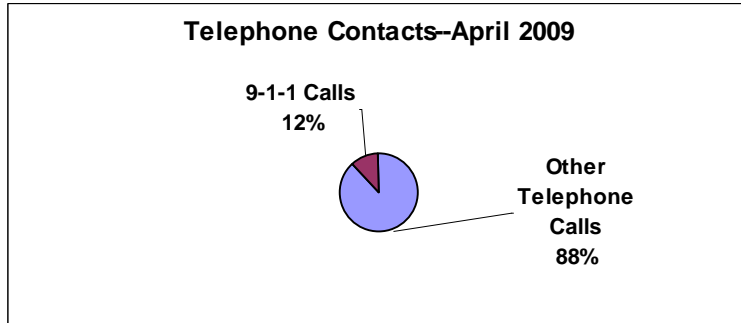


Years to Date:

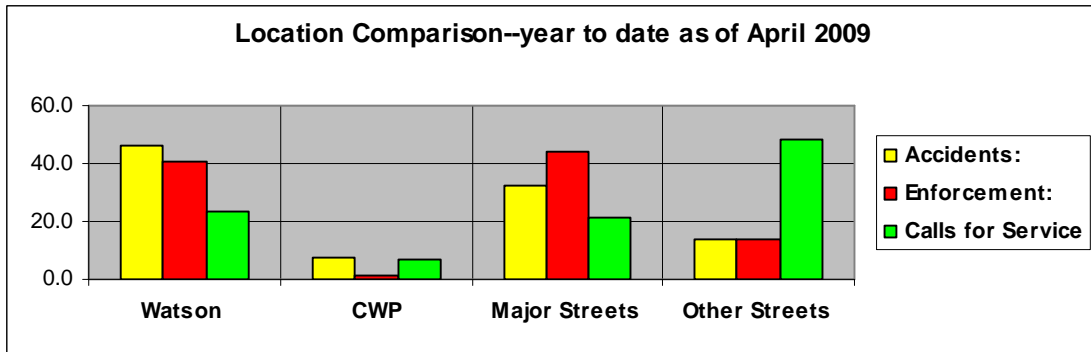


Location Comparison:
