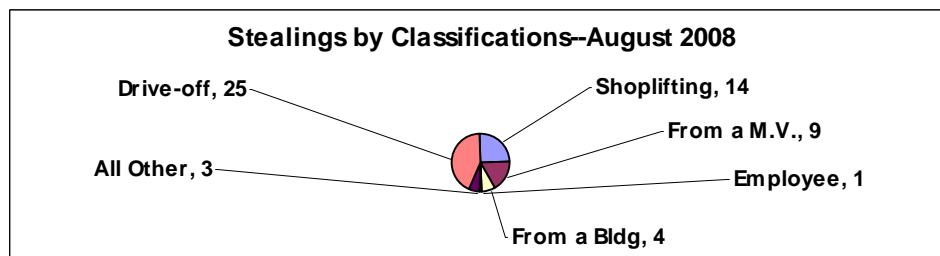
Topic: August 2008 Public Report

This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of August 2008. In August 2008, there were 63 Part I offenses and 405 Part II offenses for a total of 468. This compares with 50 Part I offenses and 612 Part II offenses for a total of 662 in August 2007. The main difference was in the number of stealings, and traffic stops.

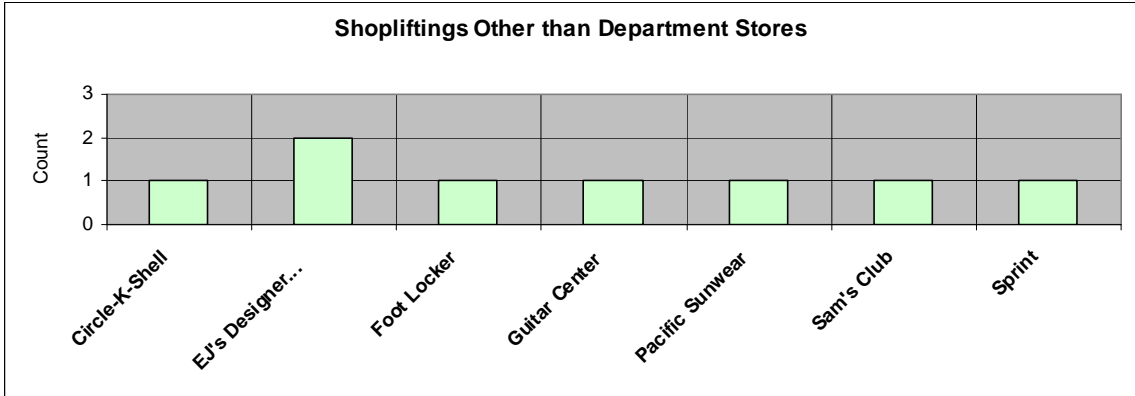
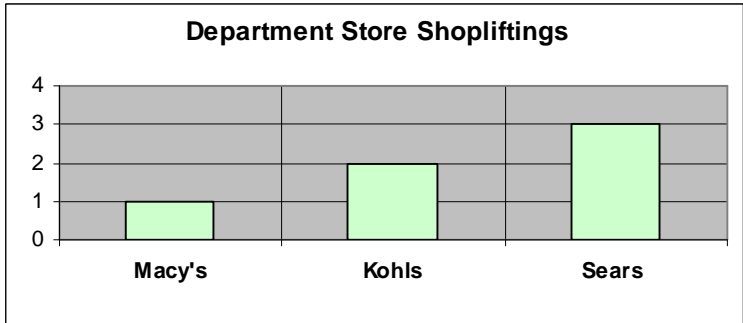
There were two assaults in August 2008 and neither involved domestic violence. In one cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

Stealing offenses numbered 56 in August 2008.

Stealings were of the following classifications in August 2008:



Shopliftings accounted for 14 of the 56 stealings in August 2008 or 25%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in August 2008:

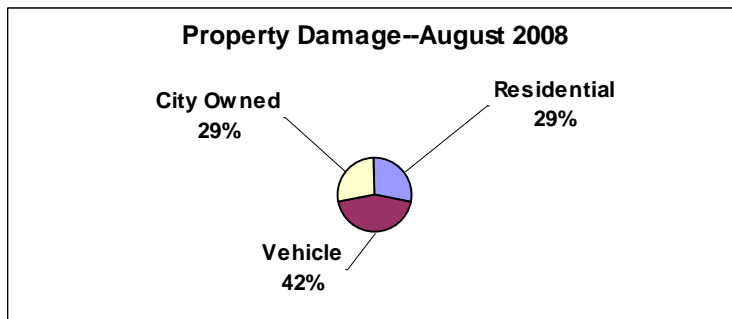


Of the shopliftings, 64% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 56%, adults and juveniles accounted for 11% and juveniles accounted for 33% of the clearances.

There were seven property damages in August 2008 and they were of the following classifications:



The City-Owned property damages were damage to the restroom on Grant's Trail and damage to a park bench in Sanders Park.

Part I offenses numbered 63 in August 2008.

Part II:

In August 2008, there were thirteen frauds, four bad checks, three credit card frauds, two forgeries, one identity theft, one false identification, one failing to return a leased vehicle and one other type fraud. The two drug cases involved the possession of small quantities of marijuana. The one offense against public peace was an annoying telephone call. There were four DWI cases and 76 people related calls including 72 medical emergencies, two missing persons, one sudden death and one suicide or attempt suicide. The three juvenile offenses involved two curfew cases and one other juvenile offense.

Part II offenses totaled 379 in August 2008.

In August 2008 in Ward One, stealings numbered four with one at addresses on Watson Road and three in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, one at addresses along Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. There were three frauds and one offense against public peace. There was one DWI case, five traffic accidents, 16 people related calls and five animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eleven and occurred on ten different streets and there were 48 miscellaneous police service calls.

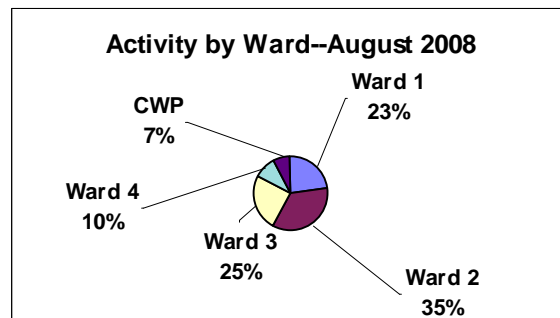
In Ward Two in August 2008, stealings numbered 23 with nineteen at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend, two in Reco Industrial and two in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, one at addresses along Watson Road and Big Bend and one on the Grant's Trail. There were eight frauds, one drug offenses and two juvenile related offenses. There were two DWI cases, twelve traffic accidents, 21 people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eighteen and occurred on nine different streets and there were 60 calls for miscellaneous police services.

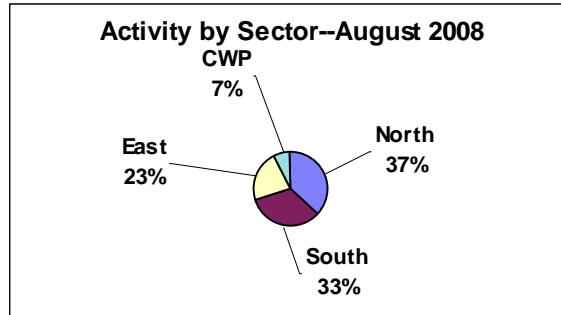
In August 2008 in Ward Three, stealings numbered sixteen with thirteen at addresses on Watson Road and three in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, both in the neighborhoods. There was one juvenile offense. There were seven traffic accidents and seventeen people related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered fourteen and occurred on seven different streets and there were 52 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in August 2008, stealings numbered three. There was one fraud and one drug offenses. There was one DWI case, seventeen people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered seven and occurred on five different streets and there were nineteen calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered ten with seven shopliftings, one from a vehicle and one all other thefts. There was one property damage. There was one fraud. There were two traffic accidents, five people related calls and one animal related call. Suspicious activity calls numbered three and there were thirteen police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

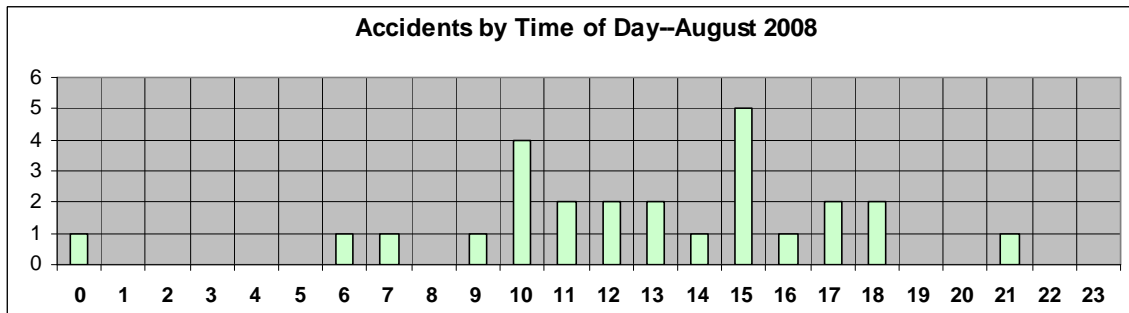

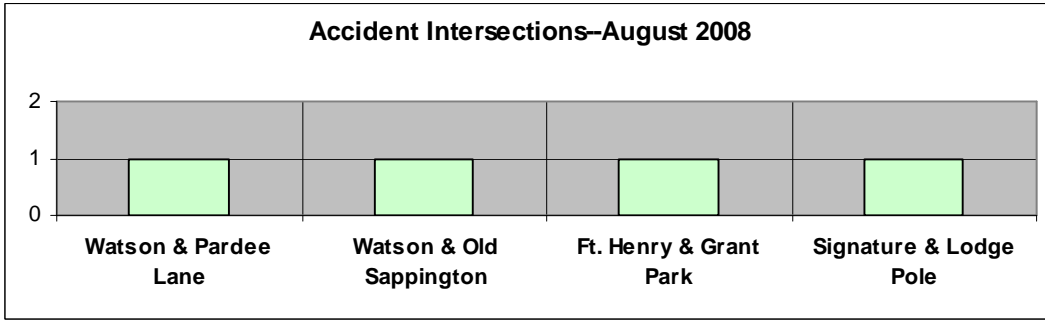
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



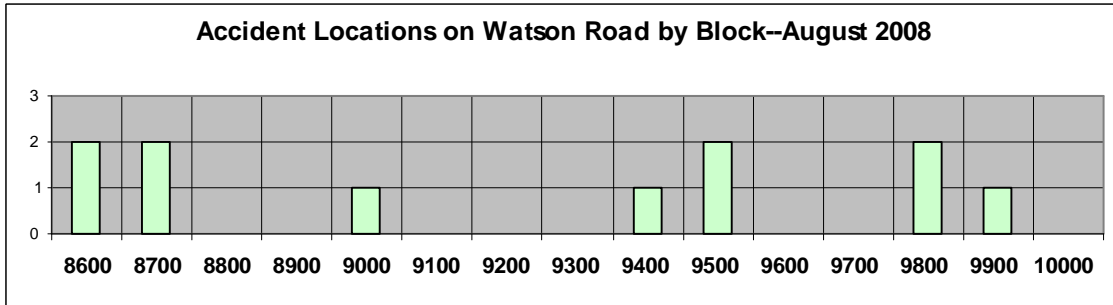

Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



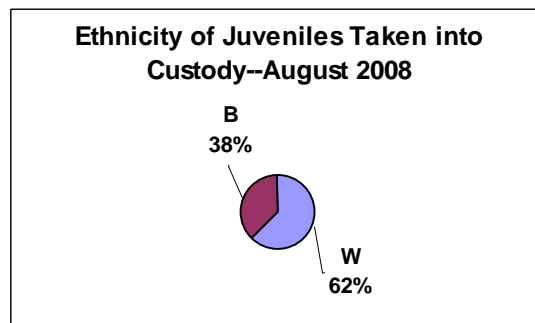
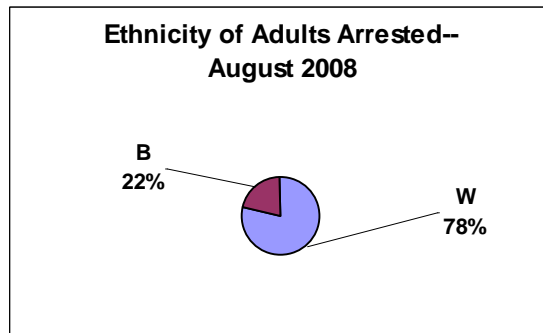
Accidents occurred in the following blocks of Watson Road:



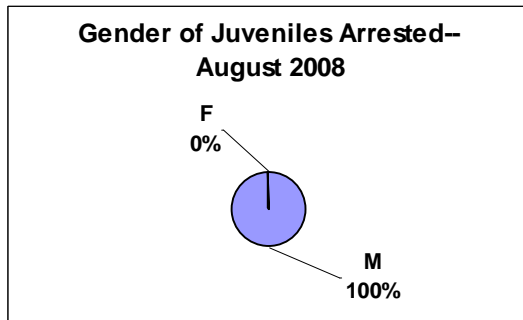
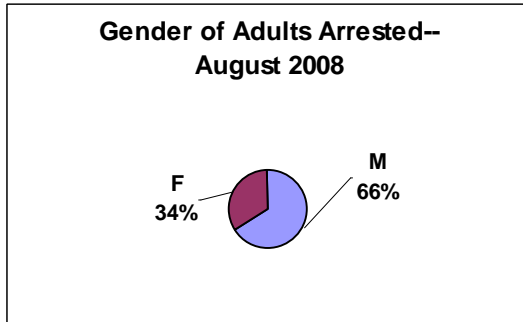
Arrest Information:

Thirty-two adults and thirteen juveniles were taken into custody in August 2008. Five persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

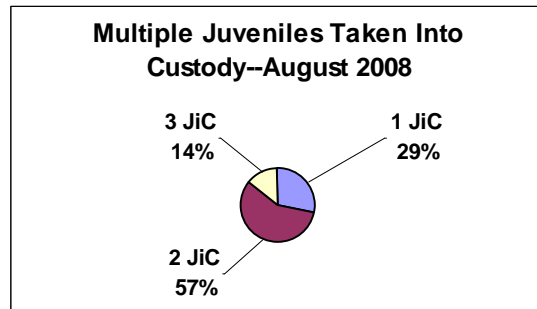
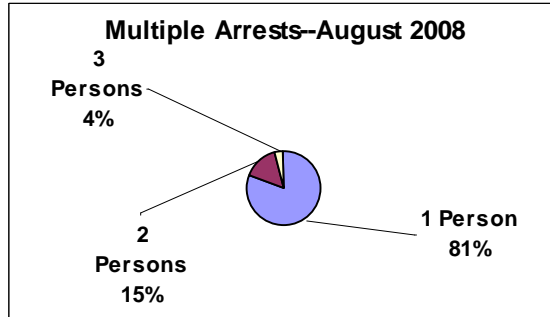
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



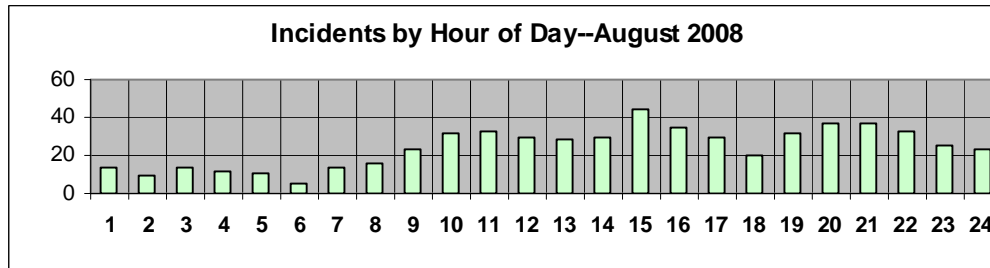
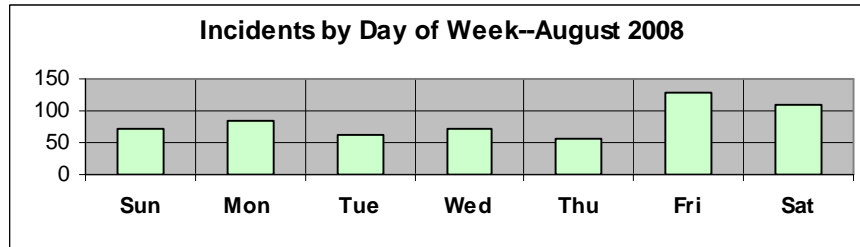
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

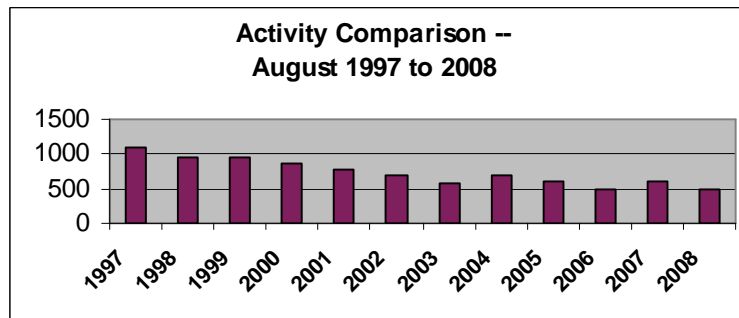
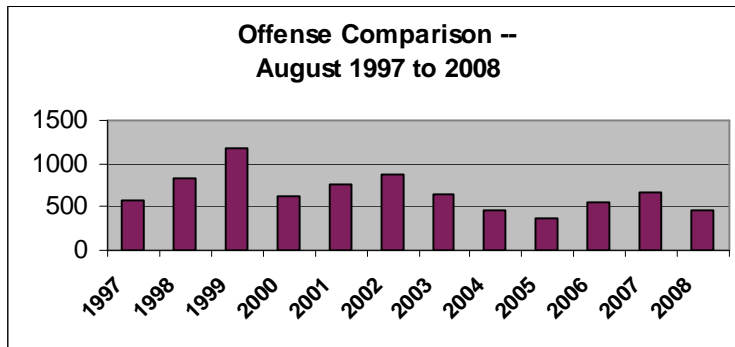

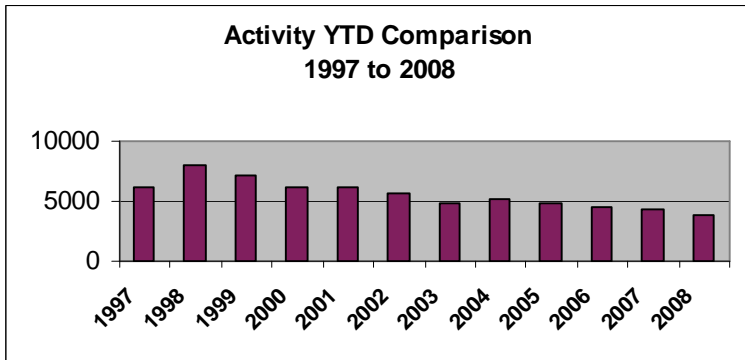
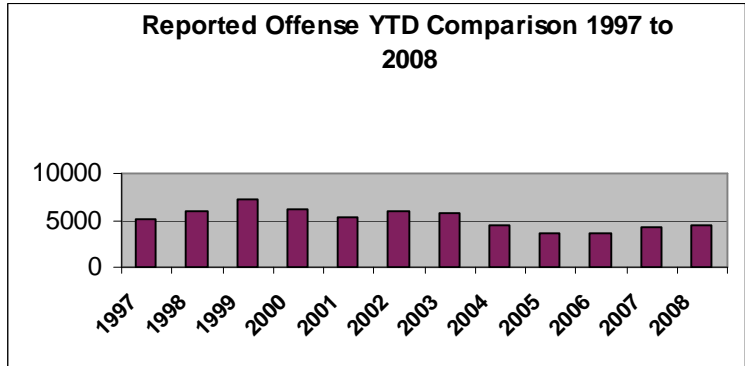


Offense and Activity Comparison:

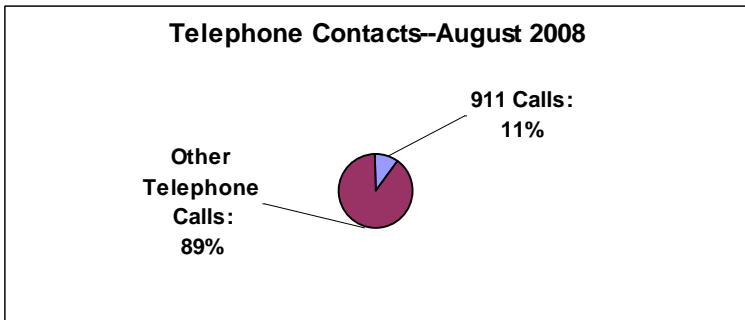


Years to Date:

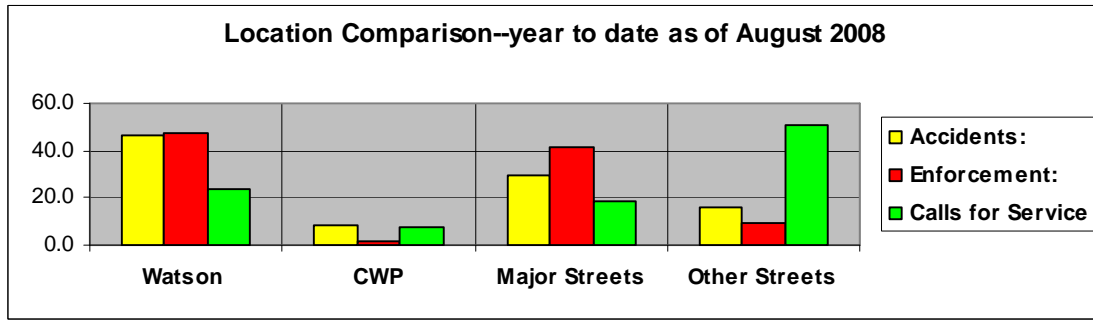


Location Comparison:

This chart is a comparison of the percentage of accidents, enforcement and calls for service by the four major tracking areas in the city year to date for 2008.
