Topic: December 2006 Public Report

This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of December 2006. In December 2006, there were 68 Part I offenses and 436 Part II offenses for a total of 504. This compares with 60 Part I offenses and 254 Part II offenses for a total of 314 in December 2005. The main difference was in the number of traffic stops.

There were no murders in December but there was one sexual offense. This offense involved the alleged inappropriate touching of a child that occurred in 1993 or 1994 by the husband of the victim's babysitter.

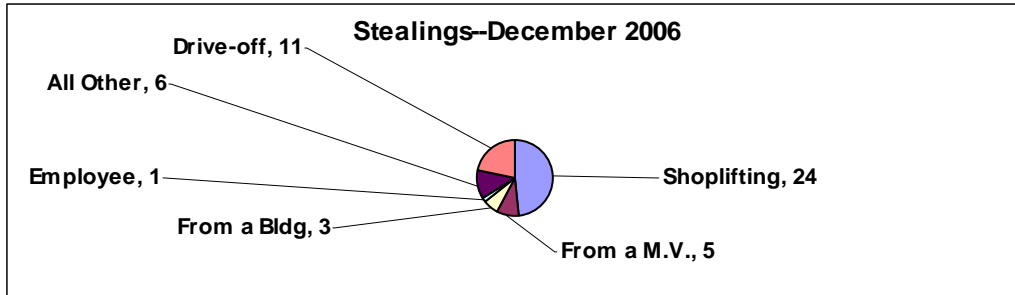
There was one robbery reported in December. On 12-22-06, the victim advised that he had stopped in his vehicle in CWP and reached over to pick something up and then felt someone place something against his back and demanded his wallet. The victim gave the two males his wallet and they ran from the scene.

There were five assaults in December 2006 and one involved domestic violence. In two of the cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults. One of the assaults occurred in a private residence and involved the victim being stabbed by the ex-husband of his girlfriend. Victim was conveyed to the hospital and admitted with multiple stab wounds. The perpetrator was arrested, booked and warrants were issued.

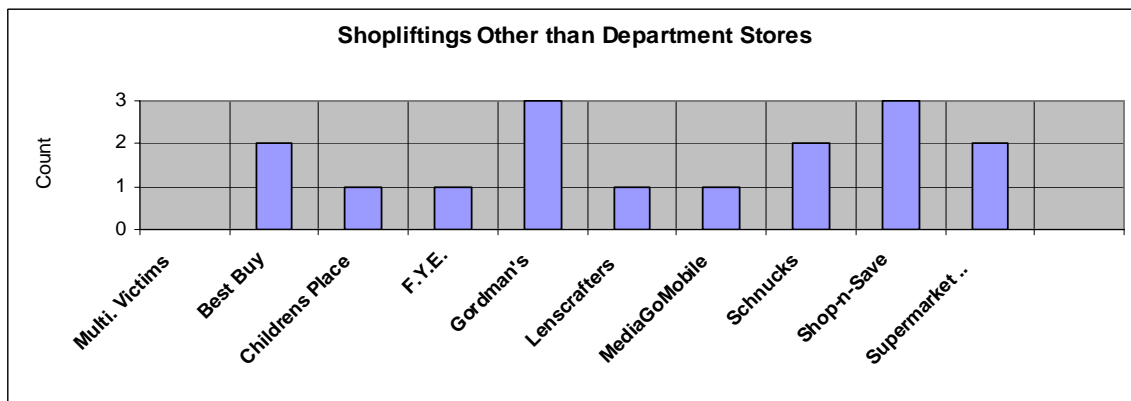
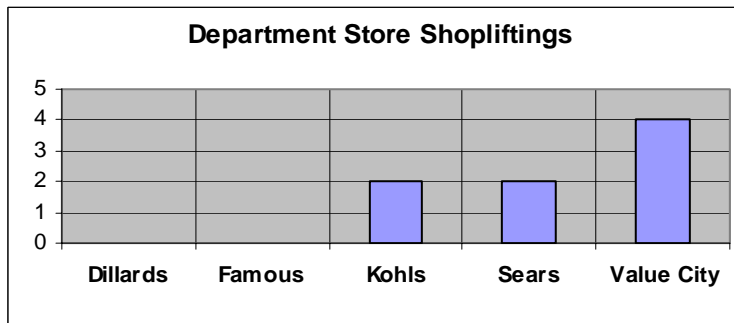
There were two burglaries reported in December. The first was reported on 12-18-2006 at an auto dealership. This offense involved someone breaking into the business over a weekend and removing some shop supplies. On 12-31-2006, in an apartment complex, the victim reported hearing breaking glass and called 911. A witness heard the glass breaking and observed a male running from the area of the apartment. Nothing was taken or disturbed in the apartment.

Stealing offenses numbered 50 in December 2006.

Stealings were of the following classifications in December 2006:

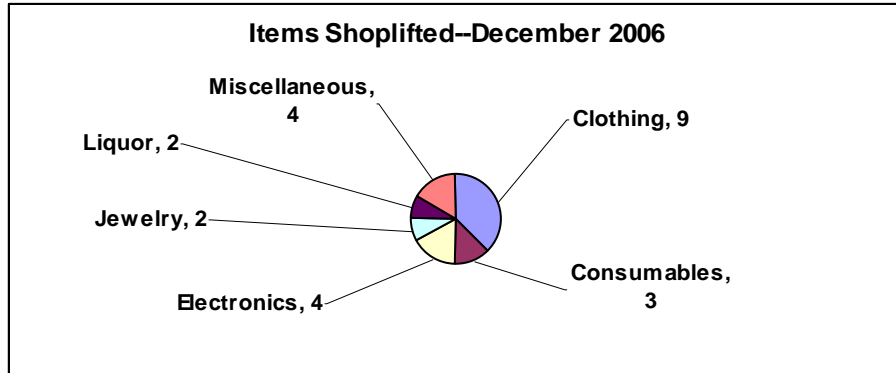


Shopliftings accounted for 24 of the 50 stealings in December 2006 or 48%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in December 2006:

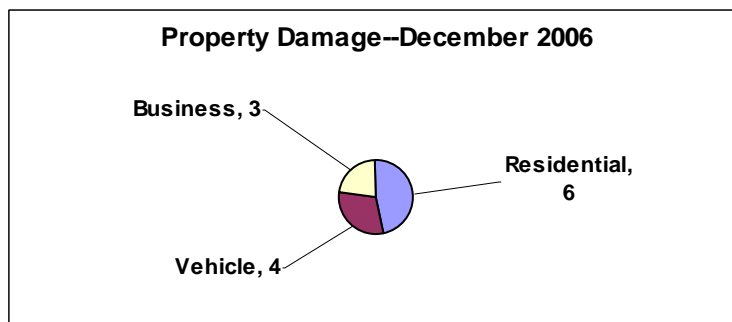


Of the shopliftings, 75% were cleared by arrest. Adults accounted for 61%, adults and juveniles together for 6% and juveniles accounted for 33% of the clearances.

There were thirteen property damages in December 2006 and they were of the following classifications:



There were no receiving stolen properties in December but there was one stolen vehicle in December 2006. On 12-07-06, the victim reported that his red 1993 Plymouth Voyager was stolen from the parking lot of Watson Plaza. The CCTV system for one of the businesses recorded the vehicle being driven away from the parking space. Vehicle was later recovered in St. Louis City.

Part I offenses numbered 68 in December 2006.

Part II:

In December 2006, there were five frauds, two forgeries, two identity thefts and a credit card fraud. There was one drug possession case that involved the possession of a small quantity of marijuana. The three offenses against public peace were one disorderly conduct, one harassment and one annoying telephone calls. There were two DWI cases in December. There were seven animal related incidents and eight people related incident, including three sudden deaths, two sick cases / accidental injuries, one suicide or attempt and one missing person. There were 39 suspicious activities calls,

Part II offenses totaled 436 in December 2006.

In December 2006 in Ward One, there were no sexual assaults or robberies and there was one burglary in an apartment complex. Stealings numbered ten with eight at addresses on Watson Road and two in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered four, two at addresses along Watson Road and two in the neighborhoods. There were no stolen vehicles. There were two frauds, three offenses against public peace and no drug, juvenile, family or weapon offenses. There were two DWI cases and nine traffic accidents, three people related calls and four animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered thirteen and occurred on five different streets and there were 37 miscellaneous police service calls.

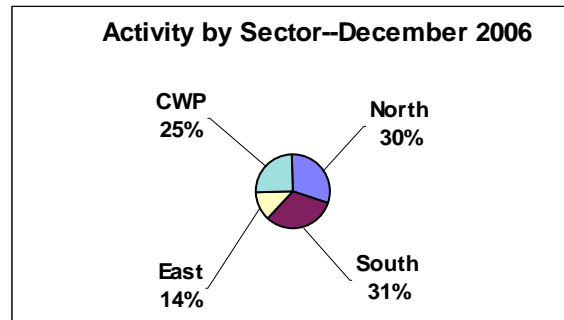
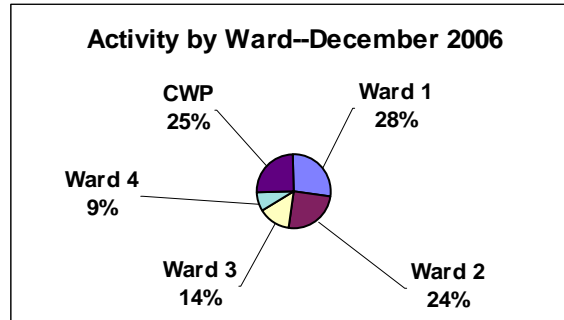
In Ward Two in December 2006, there were no sexual assaults or robberies and one burglary at an auto dealership. Stealings numbered twenty with eighteen at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and two in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered one, one at addresses along Watson Road and Big Bend and none in the neighborhoods. There was one stolen vehicle from the lot of Watson Plaza. There were no frauds, drug offenses, offenses against public peace, juvenile, family or weapon offenses. There were no DWI cases and eleven traffic accidents, three people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered twelve and occurred on nine different streets and there were 55 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In December 2006 in Ward Three, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered six with six at addresses on Watson Road and none in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered seven, one at addresses along Watson Road and six in the neighborhoods. There were no stolen vehicles. There was one drug offense and no frauds, offenses against public peace, juvenile, family or weapon offenses. There were no DWI cases and five traffic accidents, one people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eight and occurred on seven different streets and there were 27 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in December 2006, there was one sexual offense and no robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered fourteen with seven shopliftings, one from motor vehicle, two from building and one employee theft and three all other thefts. Property Damages numbered one. There were no stolen vehicles. There were no frauds, drug offenses, offenses against public peace, juvenile, family or weapon offenses. There were no DWI cases and three traffic accidents, one people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered three and occurred on three different streets and there were 20 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, there were no sexual assaults or burglaries and one robbery of a person. Stealings numbered fourteen with seven shopliftings, one from vehicles, two from buildings, one employee theft and three all other thefts. There were no property damages or stolen vehicles. There were three frauds and no drug offenses, offenses against public peace, juvenile, family or weapon offenses. There were no DWI cases and two traffic accidents, no people or animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered three and there were 17 police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

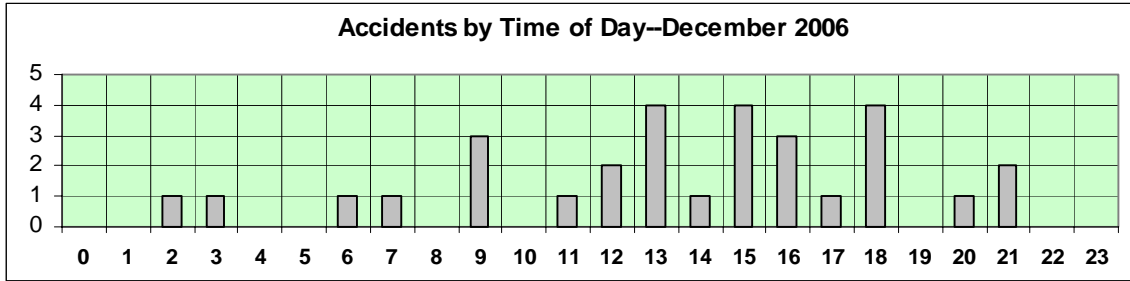

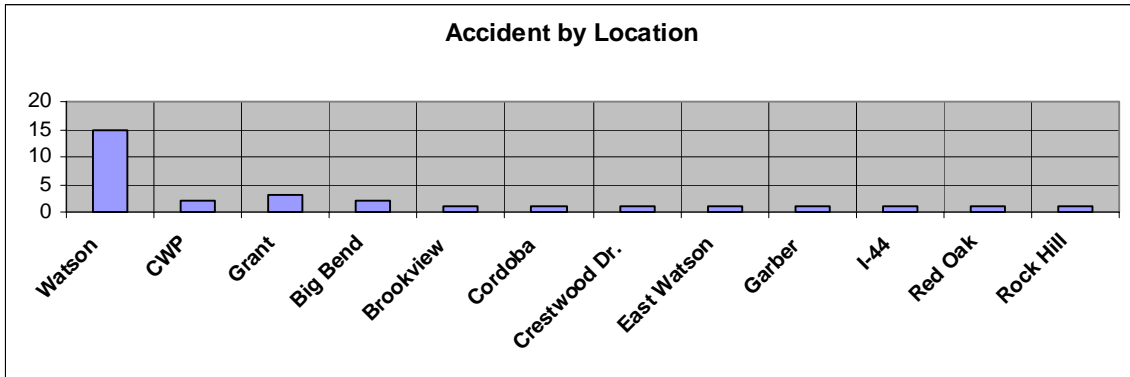
Accidents occurred on the following days of the week:



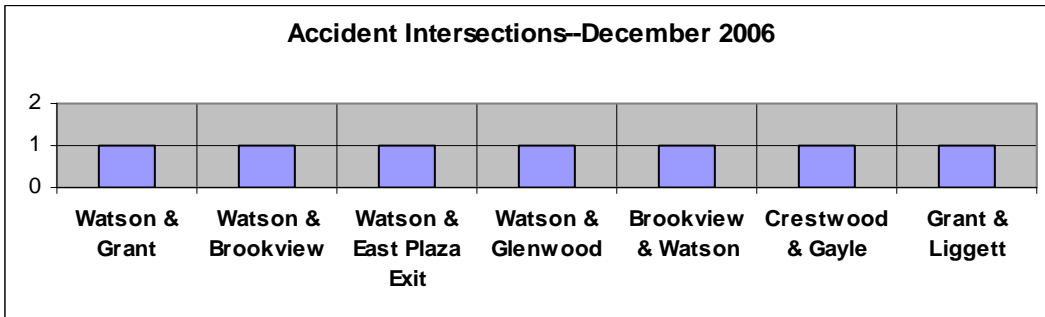
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



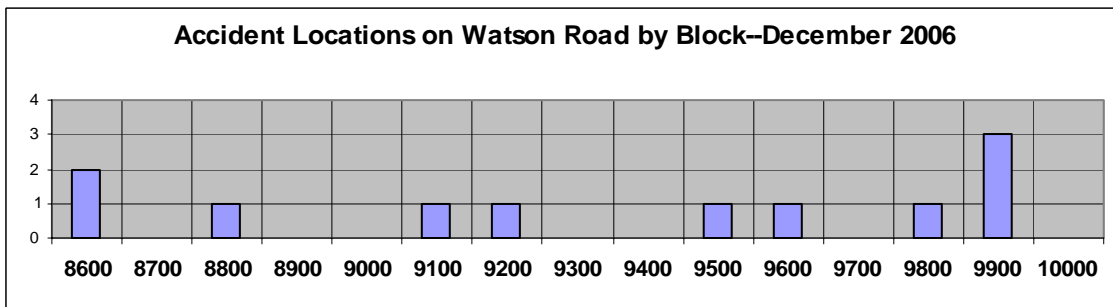
Accidents occurred on the following streets in December 2006:



Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



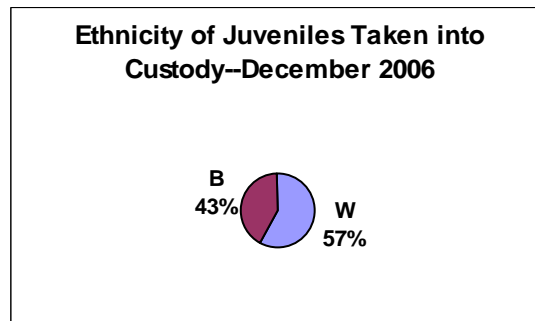
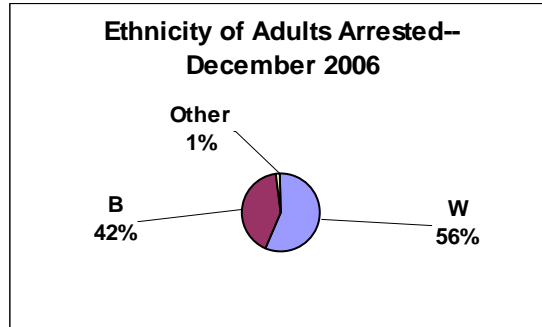
Accidents occurred in the following blocks of Watson Road:



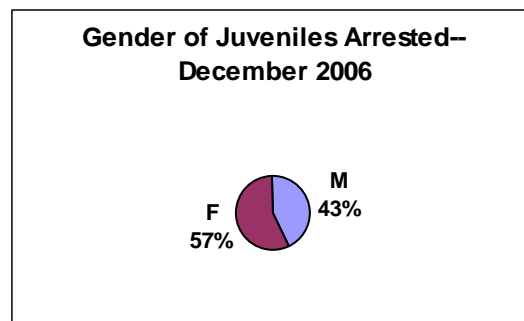
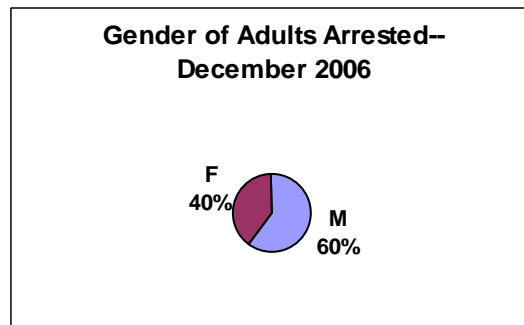
Arrest Information:

Fifty-two adults and seven juveniles were taken into custody in December 2006. Thirteen persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

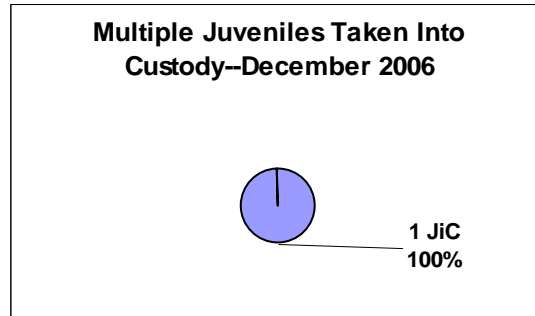
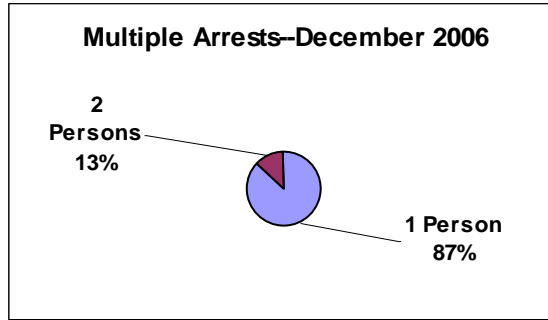
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



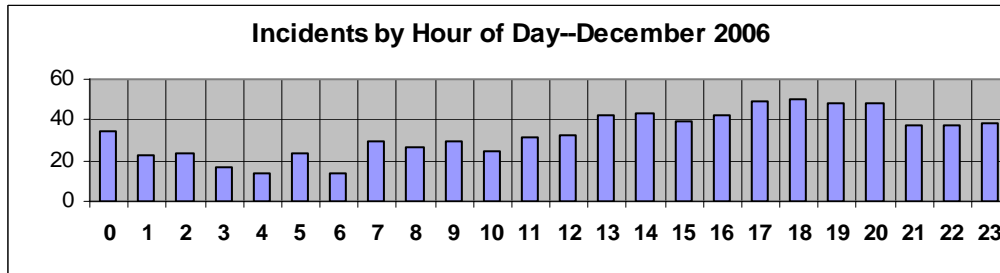
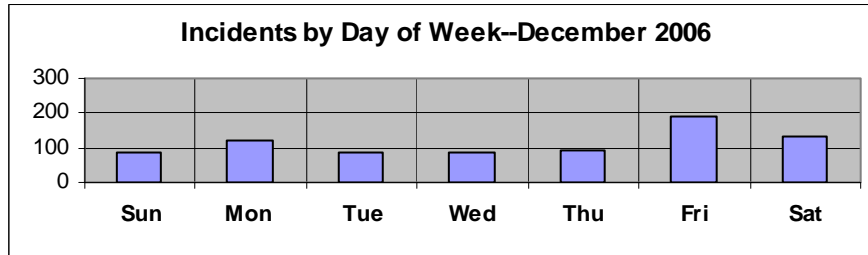
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

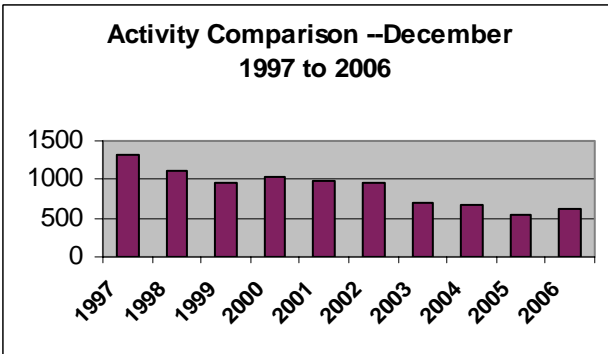
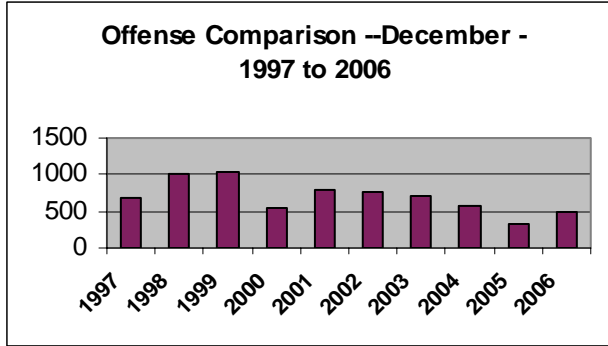

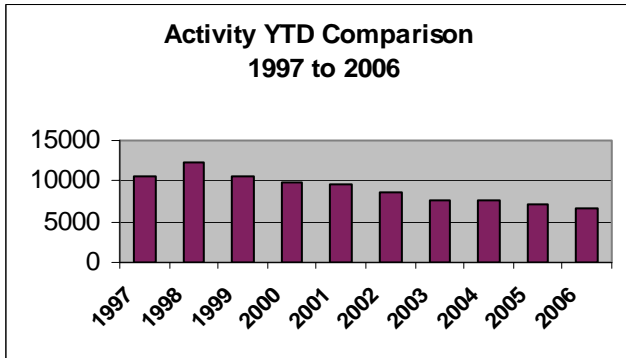


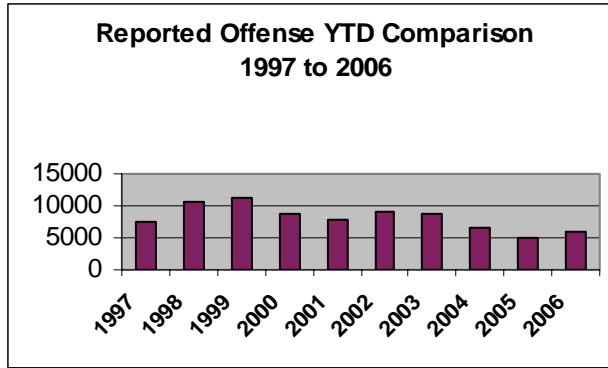
Offense and Activity Comparison:

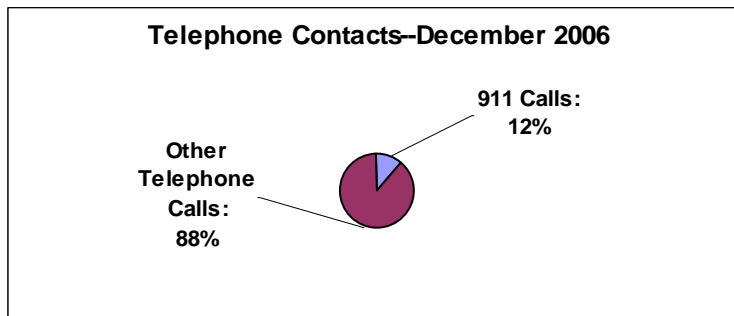

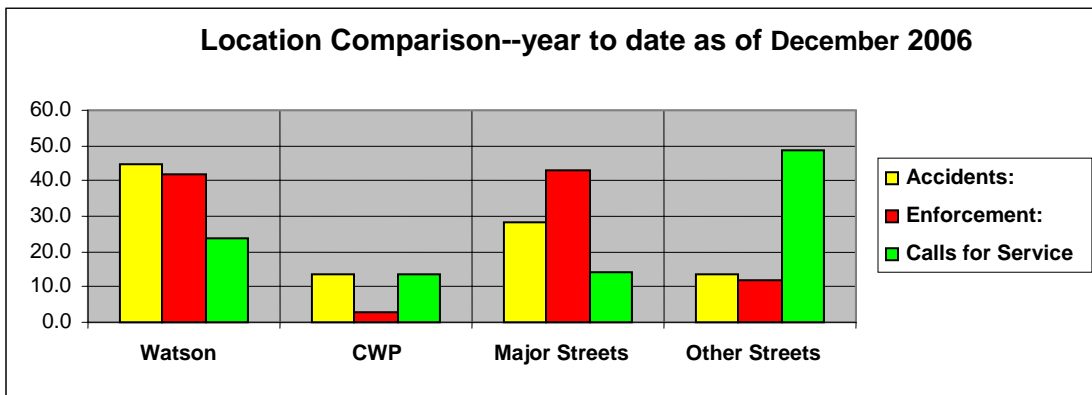
