Topic: December 2009 Public Report

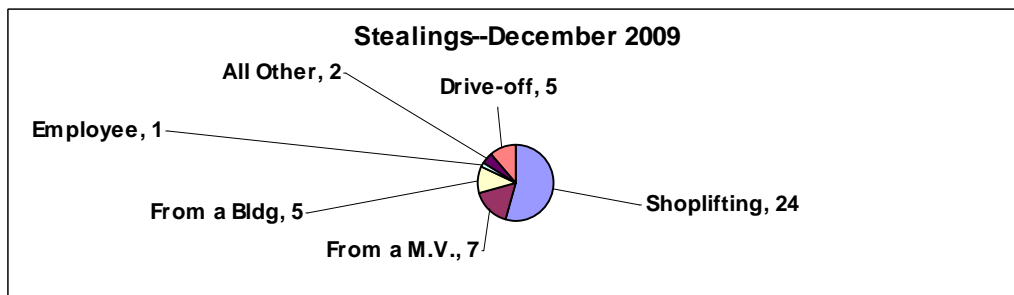
This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of December 2009. In December 2009, there were 52 Part I offenses and 356 Part II offenses for a total of 408. This compares with 38 Part I offenses and 384 Part II offenses for a total of 422 in December 2008. The main difference was in the number of shopliftings and stealings.

There was one assault in December 2009 and it did not involve domestic violence. In this case, the parties knew each other prior to the assault.

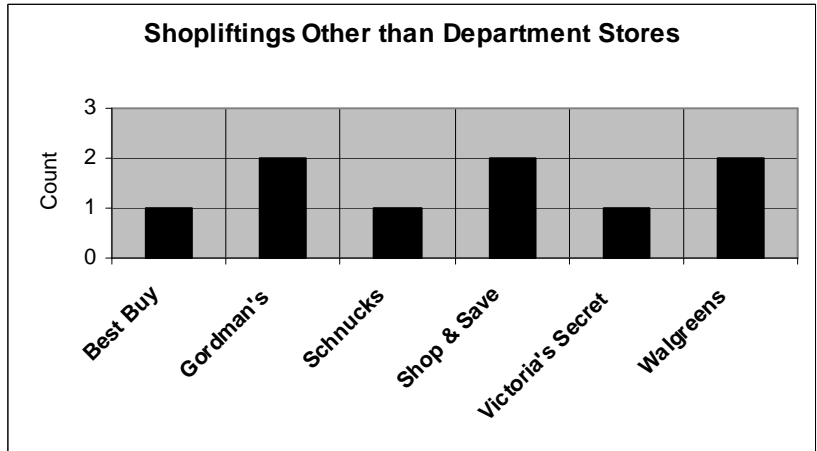
There were two burglaries reported in December. The residential burglary occurred on 12-13-2009 on Greencrest Lane. The victim observed the back door of the residence close while she was outside the residence. She found a female in the residence and the Police were called. Suspect was arrested, booked and warrants were issued. The business burglary occurred on 12-19-2009 in CWP. The backdoor of the restaurant was forced open and petty cash taken.

Stealing offenses numbered 44 in December 2009.

Stealings were of the following classifications in December 2009:



Shopliftings accounted for 24 of the 44 stealings in December 2009 or 55%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in December 2009:

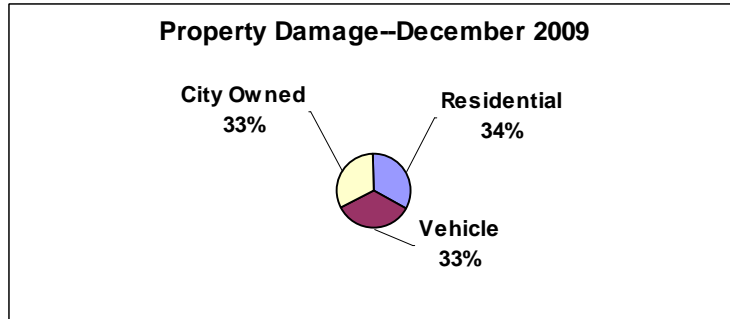


Of the shopliftings, 92% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 59% and juveniles accounted for 41% of the clearances.

There were six property damages in December 2009 and they were of the following classifications:



The two City Owned property damages were graffiti painted on a street and graffiti painted on the restroom building.

Part I offenses numbered 52 in December 2009.

Part II:

In December 2009, there were seven frauds, four credit card frauds, two other type frauds and one passing of a bad check. There were four offenses against public peace, two harassments, one peace disturbance and one annoying telephone calls. There were four DWI cases, 27 motor vehicle accidents and eleven animal calls. The people related call numbered 79 with 78 being medical emergencies and one missing person. The family offense was an Ex-Parte Order violation and the weapon offense was a person discharging a BB gun while the tree trimmers were in the backyard.

Part II offenses totaled 342 in December 2009.

In December 2009 in Ward One, stealings numbered six with four at addresses on Watson Road and two in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered one at an address in the neighborhoods. There was one fraud, one offense against public peace, and one family offense. There were two DWI, ten traffic accidents, 22 people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered nine and occurred on five different streets and there were 49 miscellaneous police service calls.

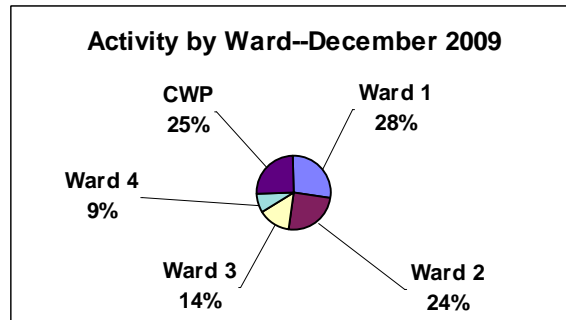
In Ward Two in December 2009, stealings numbered 21 with eighteen at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and three in the neighborhoods. There were no property damages in Ward Two in December. There was one fraud and one offense against public peace. There was one DWI, ten traffic accidents, 25 people related calls and three animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eighteen and occurred on eight different streets and there were 74 calls for miscellaneous police services.

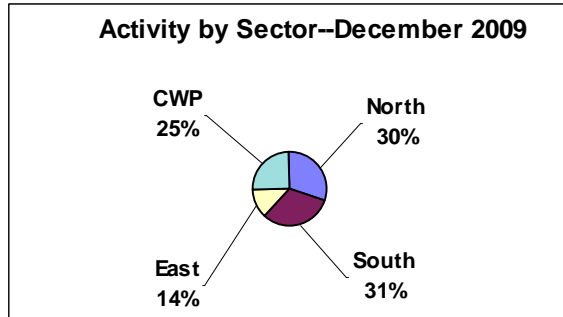
In December 2009 in Ward Three, stealings numbered three with two at addresses on Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two with both at addresses in the neighborhoods. There were three frauds and one offense against public peace and one weapon offense. There was one DWI, two traffic accidents, eighteen people related calls and six animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered two and occurred on two different streets and there were 26 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in December 2009, there was one residential burglary on Greencrest. There were no stealings in Ward Four in December and Property Damages numbered three. There was one fraud, four traffic accidents, thirteen people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered five and occurred on five different streets and there were fourteen calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered fourteen with thirteen shopliftings and one from buildings and there were no property damages. There was one fraud, one traffic accident and one people related call. Suspicious activity calls numbered two and there were nine police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

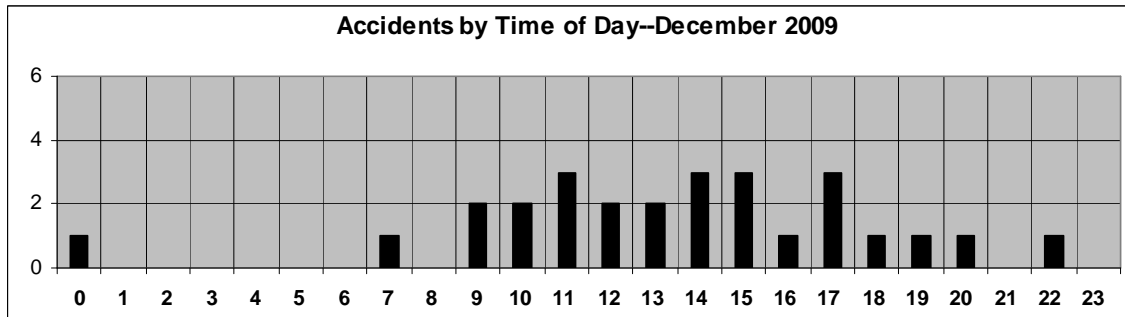

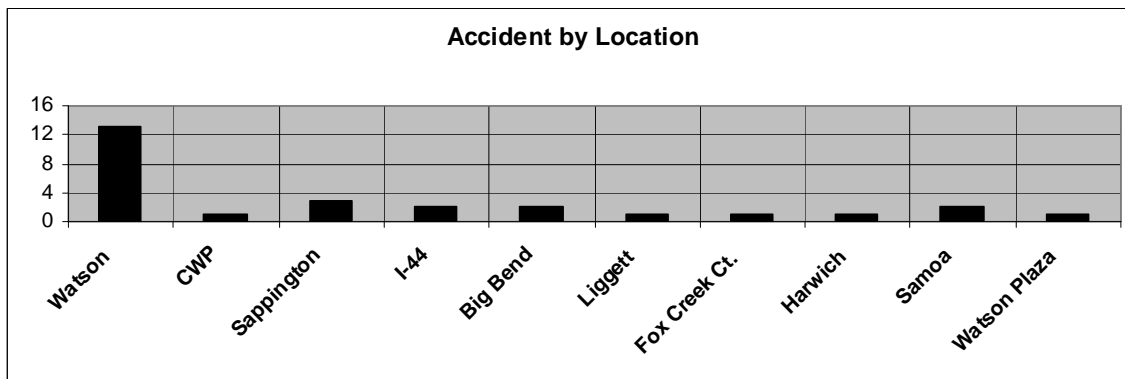

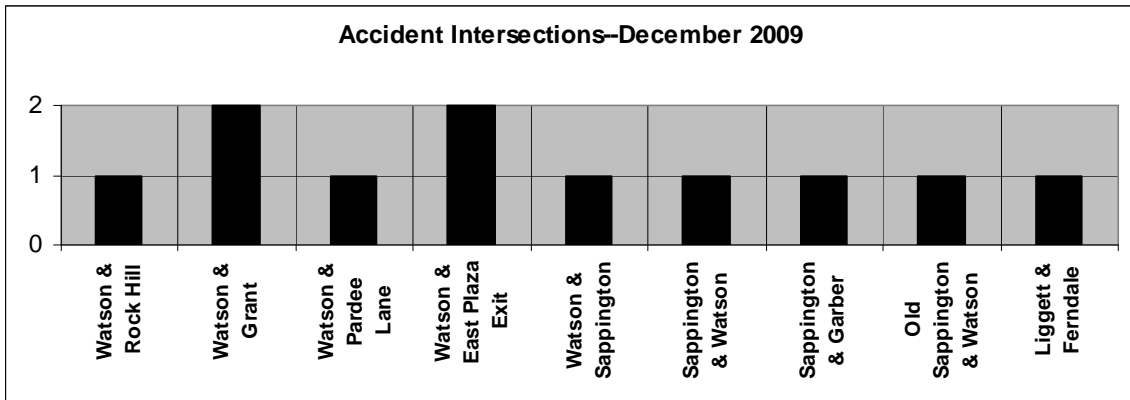
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



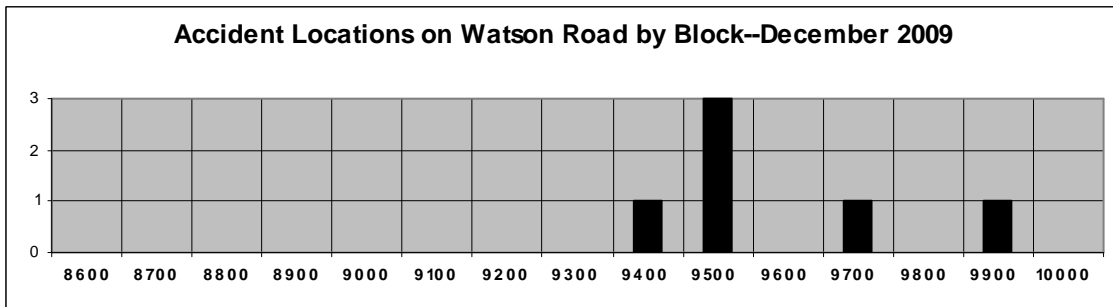

Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



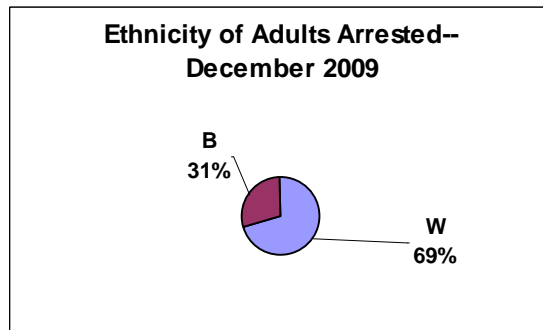

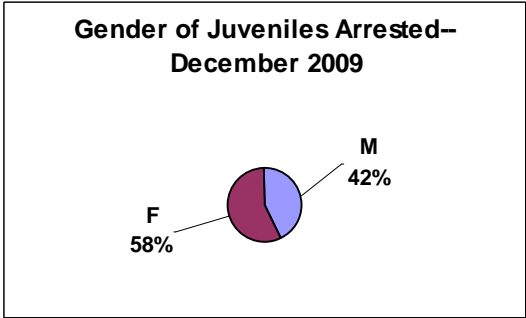
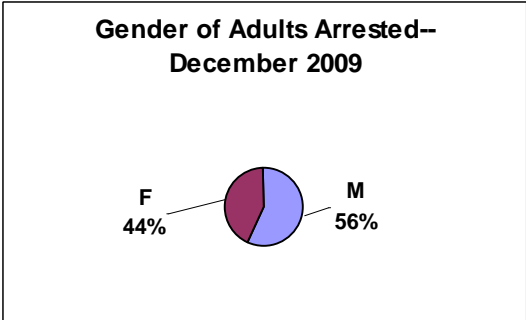
Sixty-two adults and nineteen juveniles were taken into custody in December 2009. Ten persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:

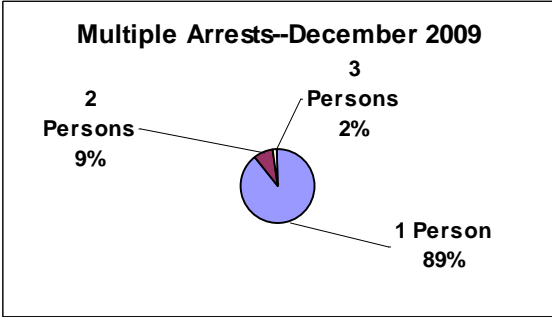


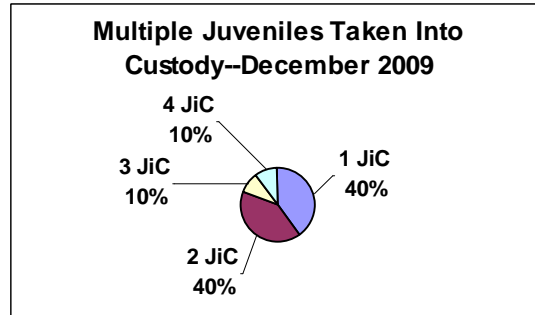


The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



Multiple Arrests:

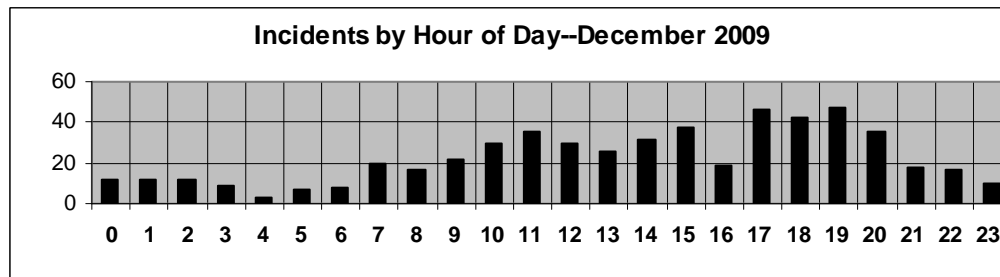
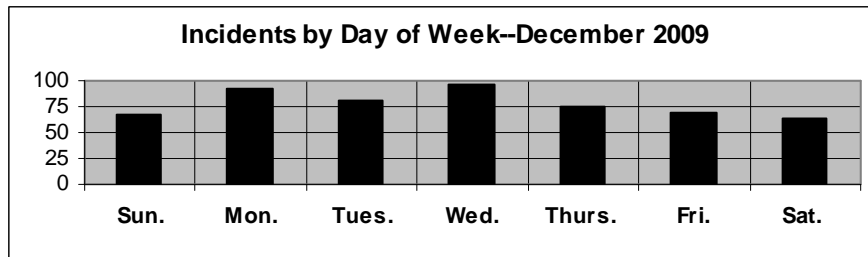




Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

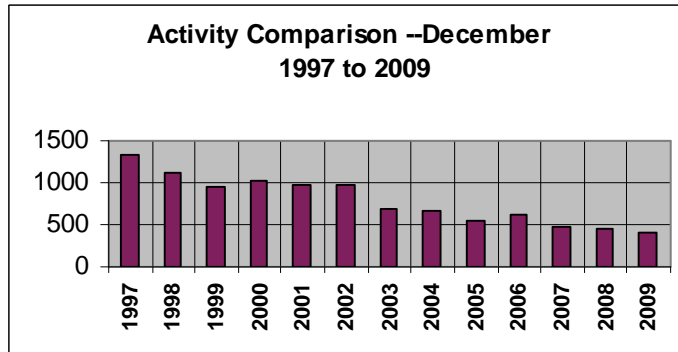
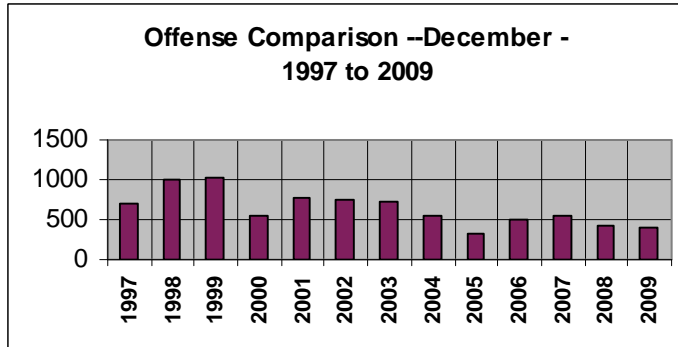

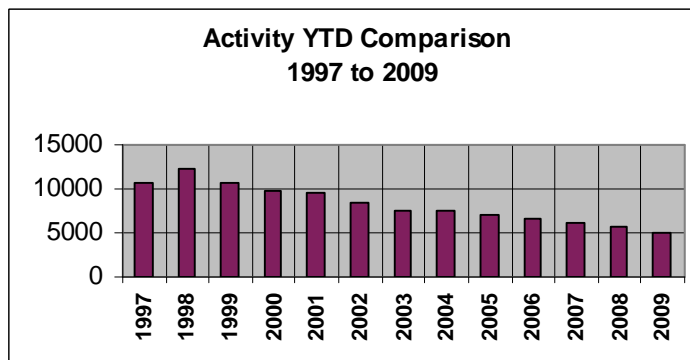
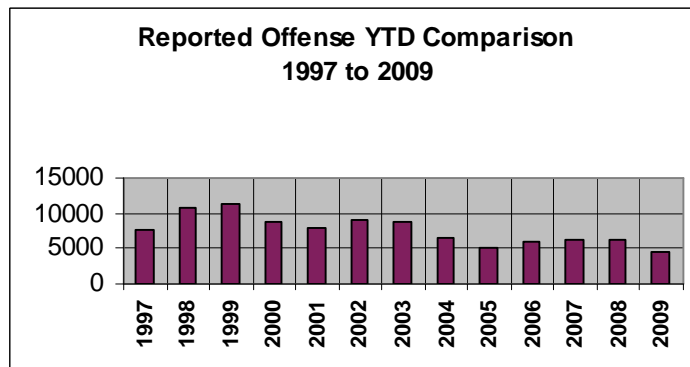


Offense and Activity Comparison:

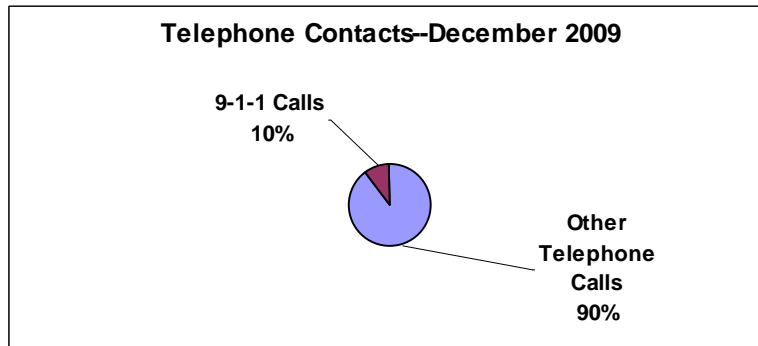


Years to Date:



Communications:

Communications handled over 4005 telephone contacts and 451 9-1-1 calls in December 2009. This is a daily average of 129 telephone contacts and fifteen 9-1-1 calls.

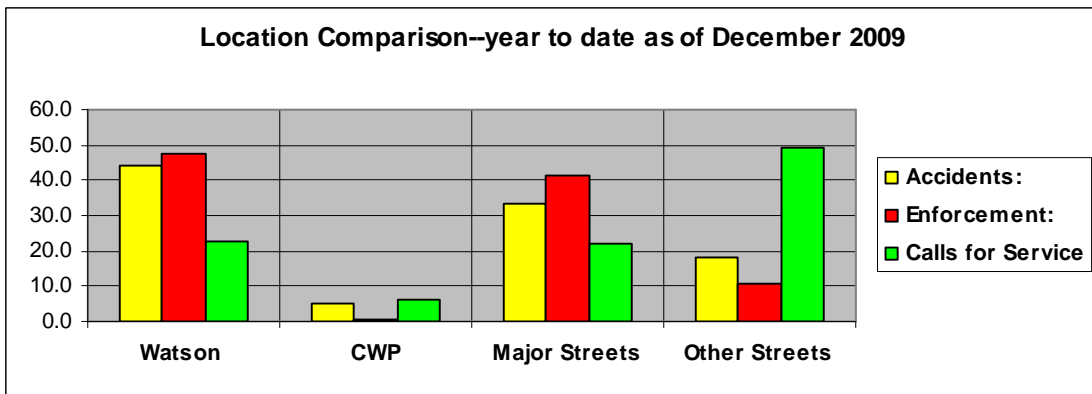


Location Comparison:
