Topic: February 2007 Public Report

This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of February 2007. In February 2007, there were 50 Part I offenses and 361 Part II offenses for a total of 411. This compares with 51 Part I offenses and 272 Part II offenses for a total of 323 in February 2006. The main difference was in the number of people related and animal related calls due to a change in reporting procedures.

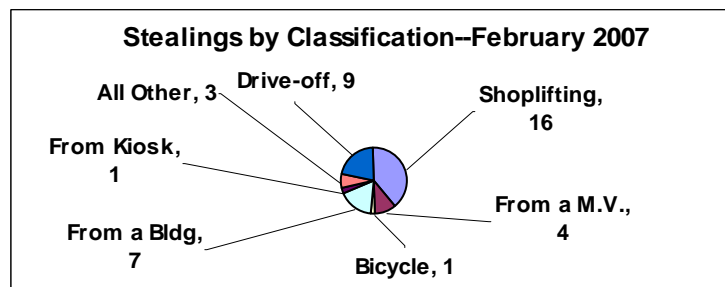
There was one sexual offense in February. On 02-24-2007 a couple, who were mildly retarded were found having sexual relations in a family restroom in CWP. Both were taken into custody and posted bond.

There were six assaults in February 2007 and four involved domestic violence. In four cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

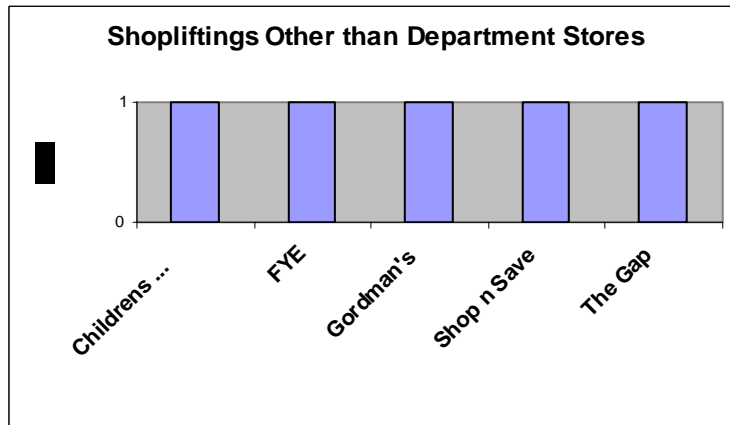
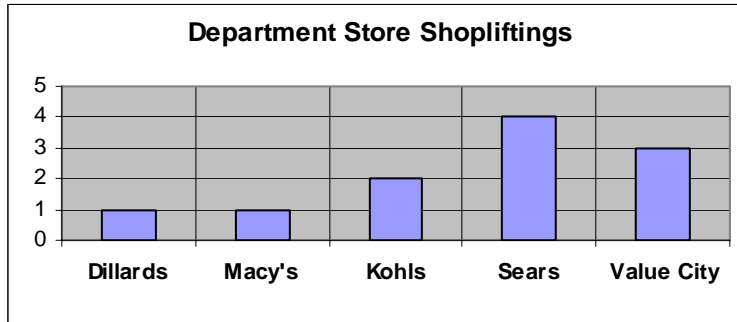
There was one forced entry burglary in February. On 02-19-07, a residence on Villa Crest was burglarized and an electronic game and jewelry were taken from the residence.

Stealing offenses numbered 41 in February 2007.

Stealings were of the following classifications in February 2007:

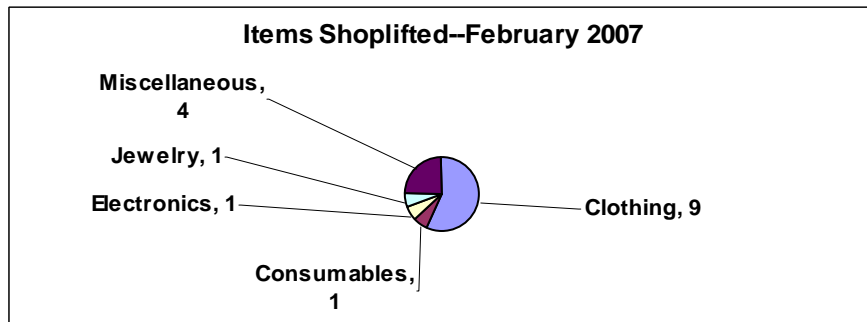


Shopliftings accounted for sixteen of the 41 stealings in February 2007 or 40%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in February 2007:

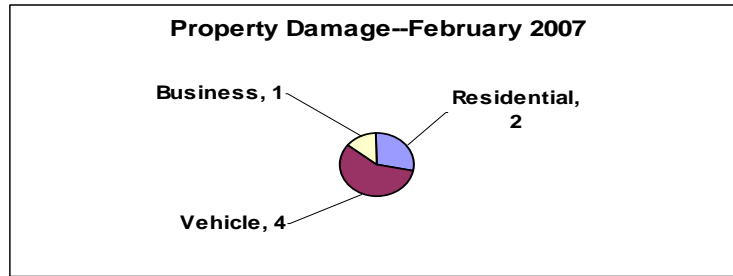


Of the shopliftings, 81% were cleared by arrest, adults accounted for 46%, and juveniles accounted for 54% of the clearances.

There were seven property damages in February 2007 and they were of the following classifications:



There were no receiving stolen properties or stolen vehicles in February 2007.

Part I offenses numbered 50 in February 2007.

**Part II:**

In February 2007, there were five frauds, two credit card frauds, one forgery, one bad check and one identity theft. The two drug offenses were possession of marijuana and possession of drug paraphernalia. The offenses against public peace were three trespassings and one harassment. There was one DWI case and 35 people related events including 31 sick cases, two sudden deaths, one missing person and one suicide or attempt. There were nine animal calls and four juvenile offenses including two minor in possession of alcohol, one runaway and one protective custody. The two family offenses were an unfounded child abduction and a violation of an ex-parte order.

Part II offenses totaled 361 in February 2007.

In February 2007 in Ward One, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered two with one at addresses on Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered three, none at addresses along Watson Road and three in the neighborhoods. There were no stolen vehicles. There was one fraud, one offense against public peace, one juvenile related and no drug, family or weapons offenses. There were no DWI cases and nine traffic accidents, eight people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eighteen and occurred on eleven different streets and there were 52 miscellaneous police service calls.

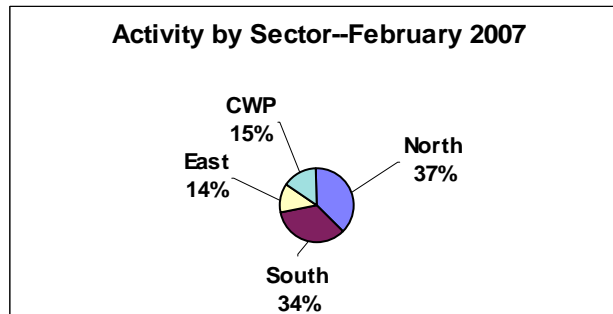
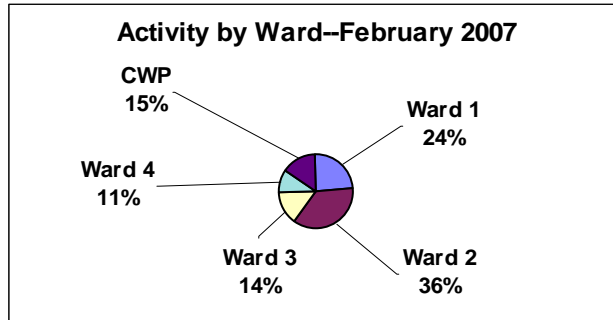
In Ward Two in February 2007, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries, Stealings numbered thirteen with twelve at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered three, one at addresses along Watson Road and Big Bend and two in the neighborhoods. There were no stolen vehicles. There were four frauds, drug offenses, two offenses against public peace, three juvenile related, one family offense and no drug or weapons offenses. There was one DWI case and six traffic accidents, ten people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered seventeen and occurred on ten different streets and there were 82 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In February 2007 in Ward Three, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered eight with seven at addresses on Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. There were no property damages and no stolen vehicles. There were no frauds, drug offenses, offenses against public peace, juvenile, family or weapons offenses. There were no DWI cases and three traffic accidents, seven people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered ten and occurred on six different streets and there were 34 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in February 2007, there were no sexual assaults, robberies and one burglary reported on Villa Crest. Stealings numbered one. Property damages numbered one and there were no stolen vehicles. There was one drug offense, and no frauds, offenses against public peace, juvenile, family or weapons offenses. There were no DWI cases and one traffic accident, six people related calls and four animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered four and occurred on four different streets and there were 20 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, there was one sexual offense, involving a couple having relations in the family restroom and no robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered seventeen with nine shopliftings, one bicycle, four from buildings, one kiosk, and two all other thefts. There were no property damages or stolen vehicles. There was one drug offense, one offenses against public peace, one family offense and no frauds, juvenile, family or weapons offenses. There were no DWI cases and four traffic accidents, four people related calls and no animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eight and there were 30 police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

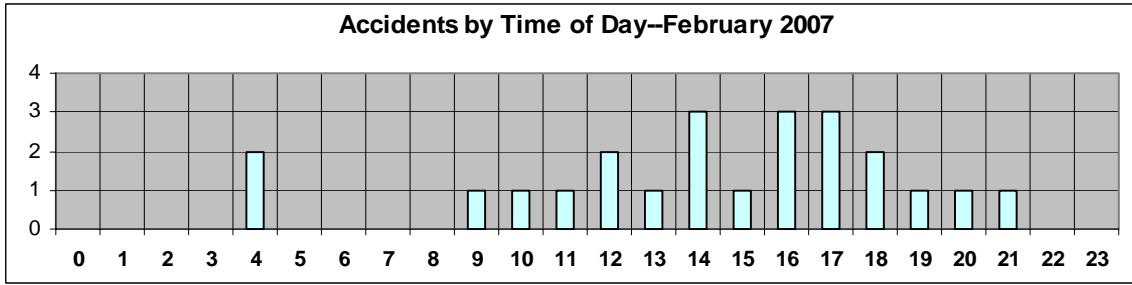

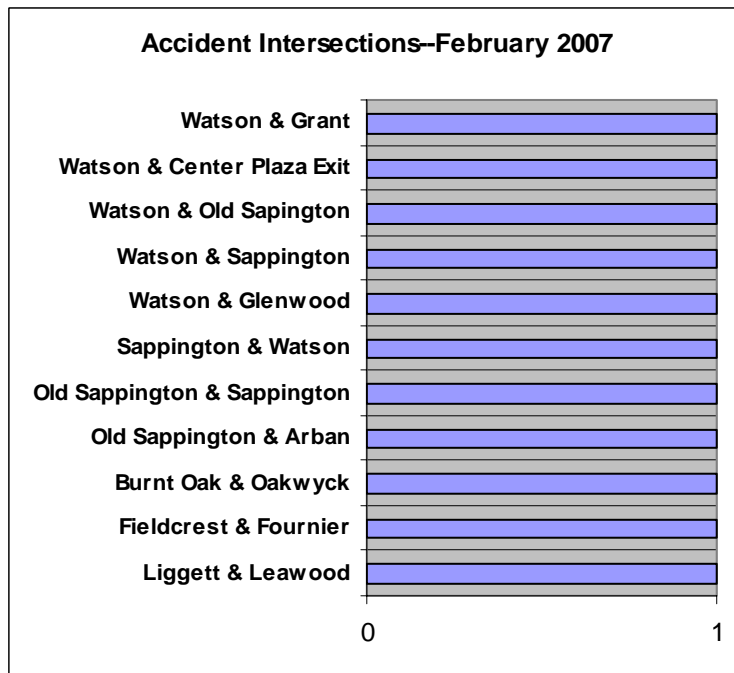
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



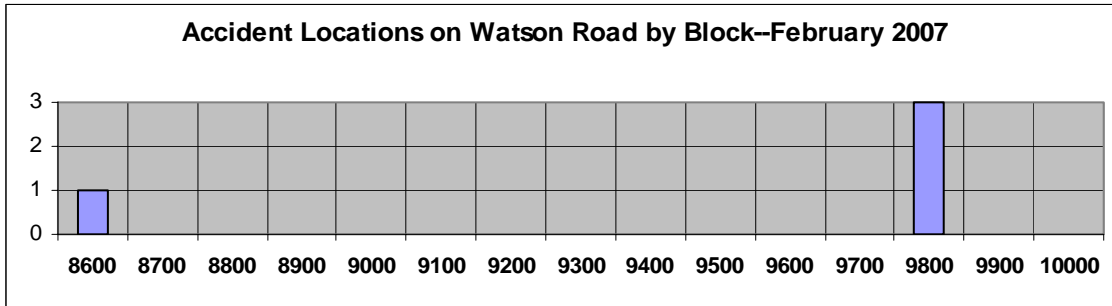

Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



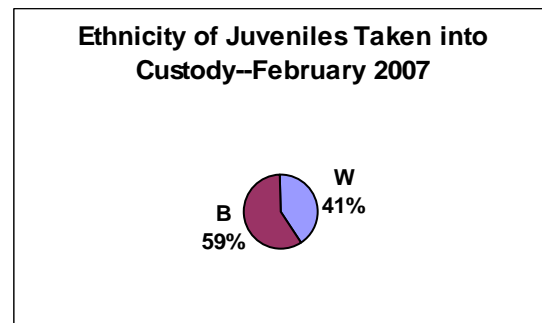
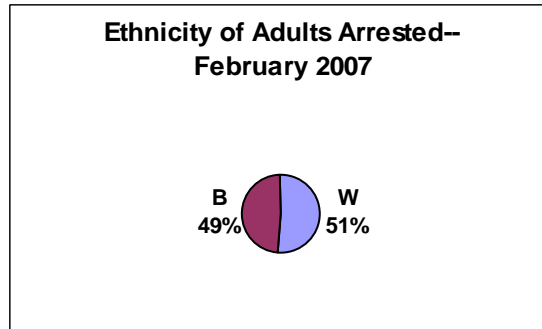

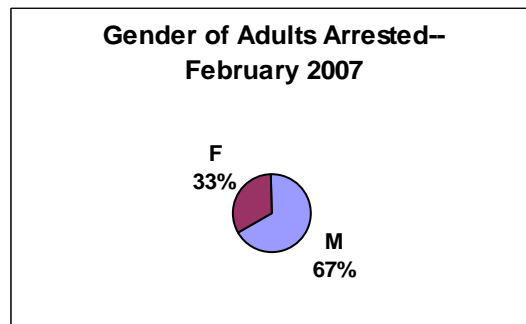
**Arrest Information:**

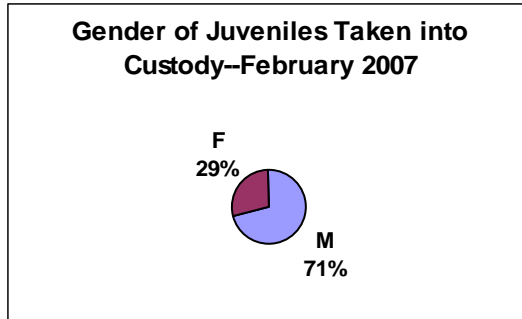
Fifty-seven adults and seventeen juveniles were taken into custody in February 2007. Six persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:

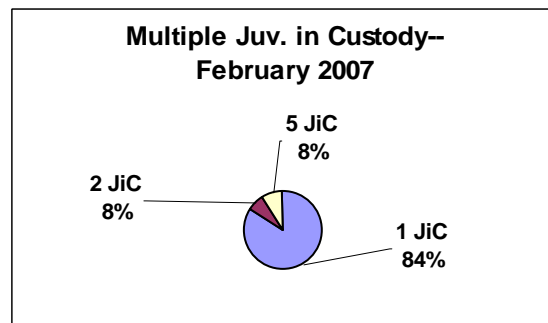
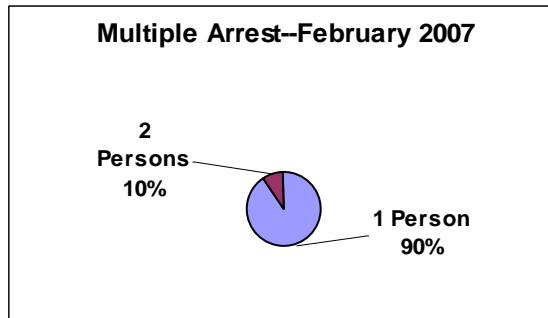


The gender of the persons taken into custody was:





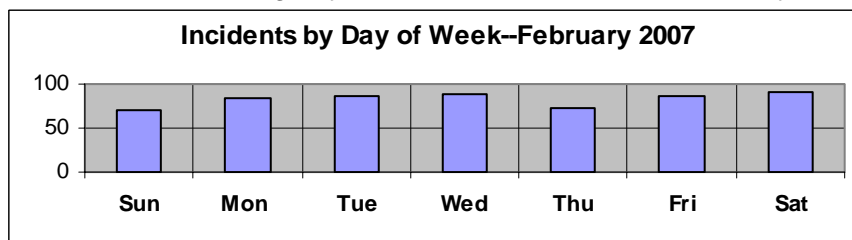
Multiple Arrests:

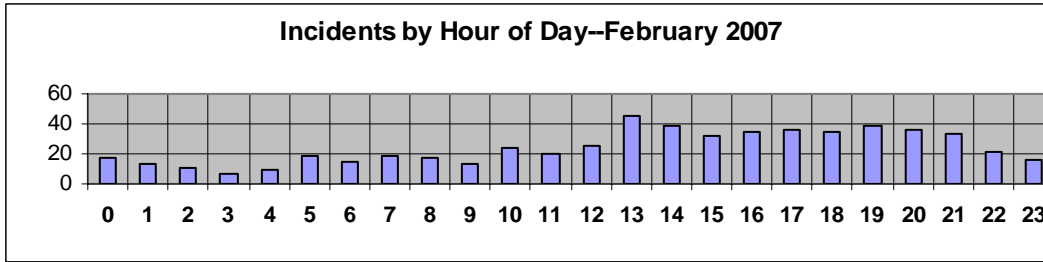


Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

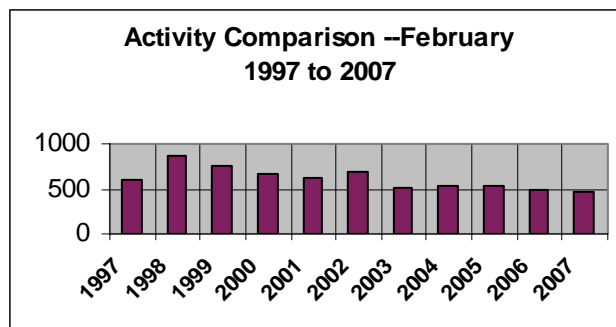
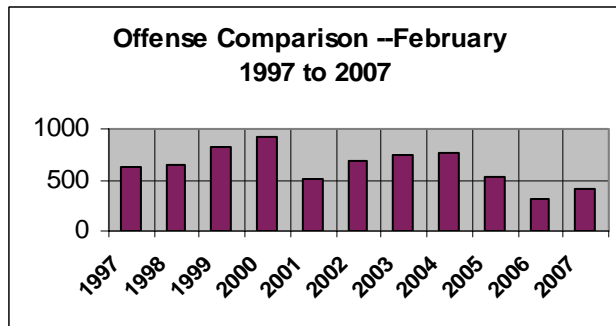
Activity occurred on the following days of the week and hours of the day:



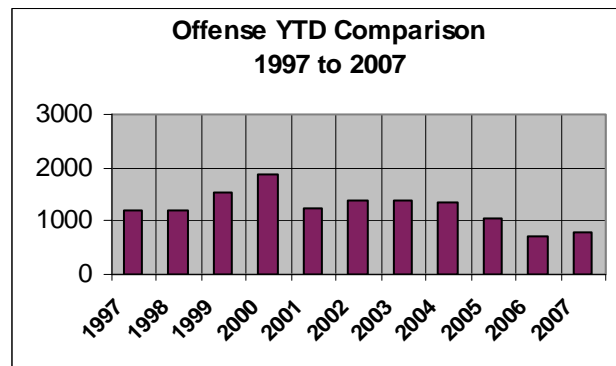


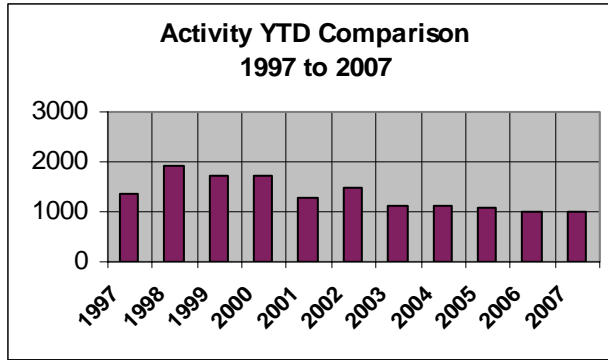
**Offense and Activity Comparison:**

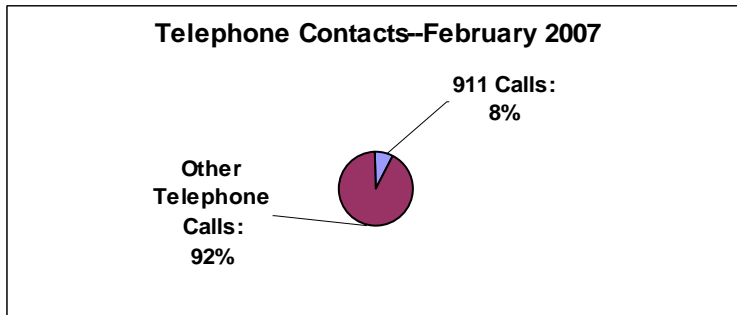

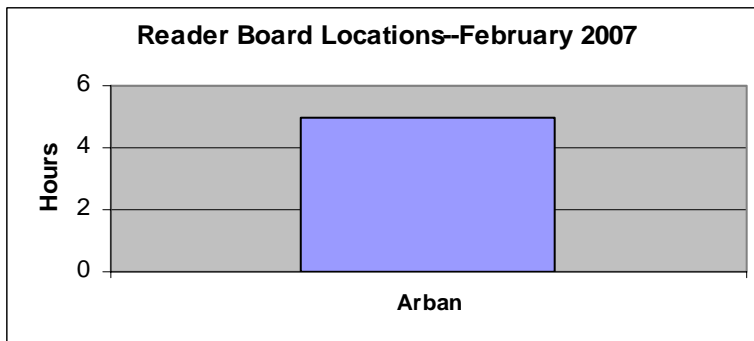
**Communications:**

The speed measuring reader board was placed at the following locations and for the following amount of time in February 2007:

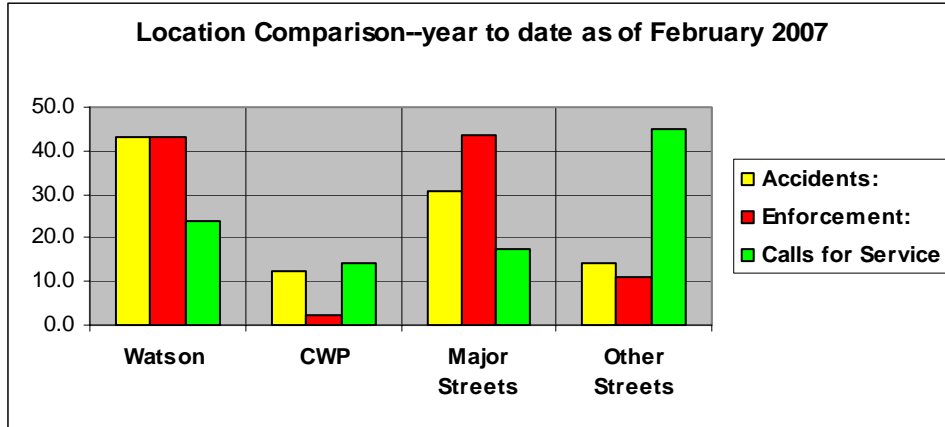


**Location Comparison:**
