Topic: February 2008 Public Report

This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of February 2008. In February 2008, there were 52 Part I offenses and 516 Part II offenses for a total of 568. This compares with 50 Part I offenses and 361 Part II offenses for a total of 411 in February 2007. The main difference was in the number of traffic stops.

The sexual offense reported in February was the resident of an apartment complex reporting that her neighbor was on the balcony of his apartment without any clothing on. Case was referred to the prosecutor.

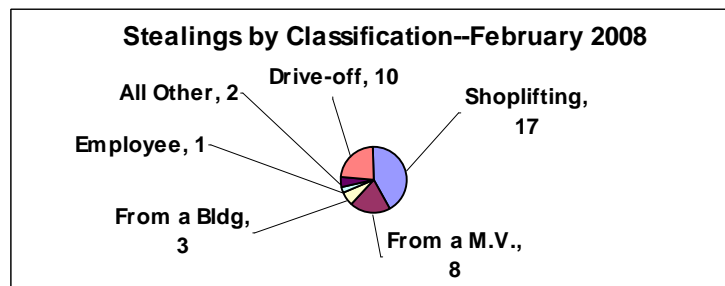
The robbery that was reported in February occurred at the US Bank on Watson. A male entered the bank on 02-29-2008 and presented the teller with a note. The male took the money and left the bank and was last seen on the shopping center parking lot.

There were three assaults in February 2008 and three involved domestic violence. In all cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

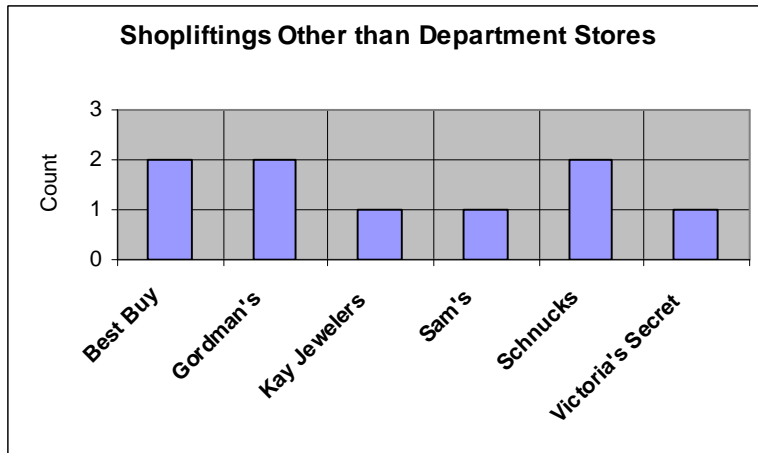
There was one burglary reported in February. The tenant of the medical park reported that someone had broken part of the door frame to the office. The office was insecure when the tenant arrived in the morning but nothing was found to be missing.

Stealing offenses numbered 41 in February 2008.

Stealings were of the following classifications in February 2008:

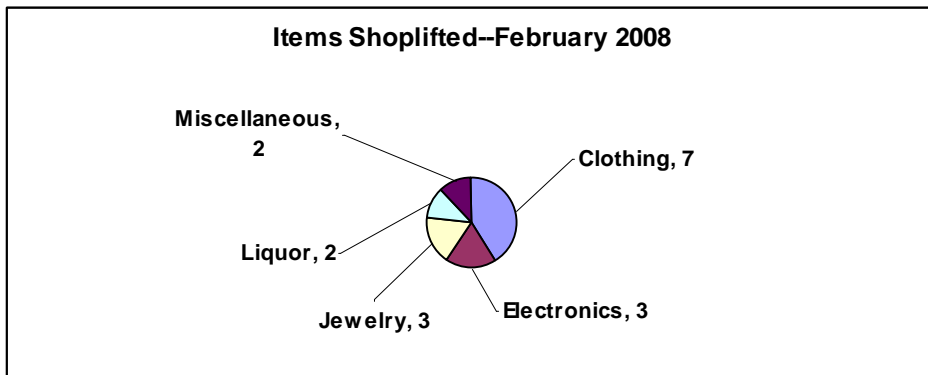


Shopliftings accounted for seventeen of the 41 stealings in February 2008 or 42%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in February 2008:

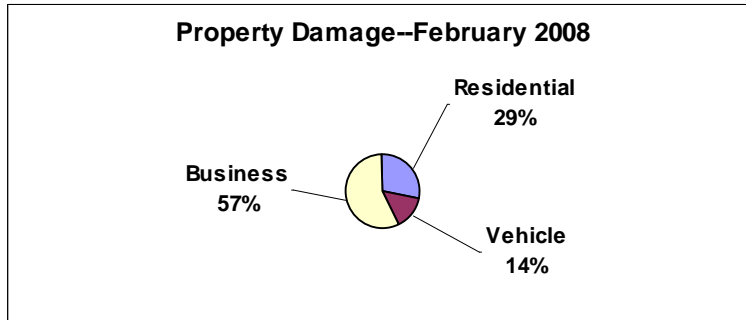


Of the shopliftings, 65% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 64%, adults and juveniles together accounted for 9% and juveniles accounted for 27% of the clearances.

There were seven property damages in February 2008 and they were of the following classifications:



There was one recovered stolen vehicle in February 2008. On 02-12-2008, a stolen grey 2008 Chevrolet Impala was found parked on a parking lot and the vehicle was reported stolen from Texas. The vehicle is owned by a rental car agency and was towed until the owner could take possession of the vehicle.

Part I offenses numbered 58 in February 2008.

Part II:

In February 2008, there were two frauds reported, one forgery and one credit card fraud. There were three drug possession cases and all involved small amounts of marijuana. There was one offense against public peace that involved a harassment incident. There were six DWI cases, 62 people related calls including 60 medical emergencies, one suicide or attempt and one sudden death. There were fourteen animal related calls and four juvenile offenses including two minor in possession, one protective custody and one other juvenile offense. There were 50 calls for suspicious activity and two family offenses, an order of protection violation and an unattended child in a vehicle.

Part II offenses totaled 320 in February 2008.

In February 2008 in Ward One, there was one sexual offense involving an exposing person. Stealings numbered nine with eight at addresses on Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered five, five at addresses along Watson Road and none in the neighborhoods. There was one fraud, two drug offenses and one juvenile related offense. There were two DWI cases, five traffic accidents, eight people related calls and four animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered nineteen and occurred on eleven different streets and there were 40 miscellaneous police service calls.

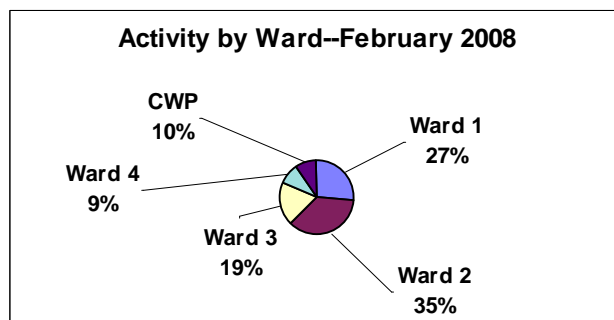
In Ward Two in February 2008, there was one bank robbery at US Bank and one burglary in the medical park. Stealings numbered fifteen with fourteen at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and one in the neighborhoods. There were no property damages reported. There was one stolen vehicle recovered. There was one fraud, one juvenile related and one family offense. There was one DWI case, nine traffic accidents, 25 people related calls and eight animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eighteen and occurred on eleven different streets and there were 48 calls for miscellaneous police services.

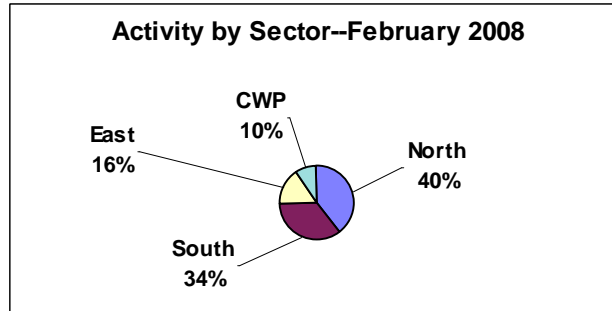
In February 2008 in Ward Three, stealings numbered three with two at addresses on Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. There were no property damages reported or stolen vehicles. There was one drug offense and one family offense. There were three DWI cases, four traffic accidents, seventeen people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered six and occurred on four different streets and there were 39 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in February 2008, stealings numbered one and there were two property damages. There was one offense against public peace and one juvenile related offense. There were two traffic accidents, eleven people related calls and one animal related call. Suspicious activity calls numbered three and occurred on three different streets and there were fifteen calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered thirteen with ten shopliftings and three from vehicles. There was one juvenile related offense and one people related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered four and there were fourteen police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

CAD Activity by Ward and Sector:



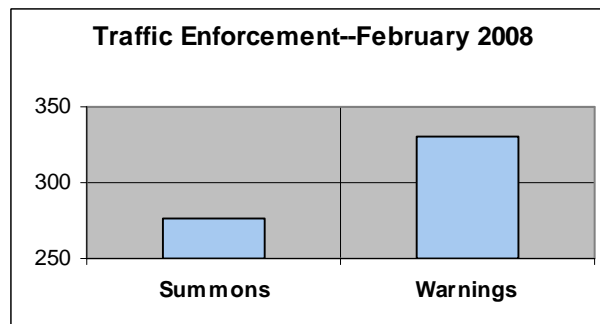


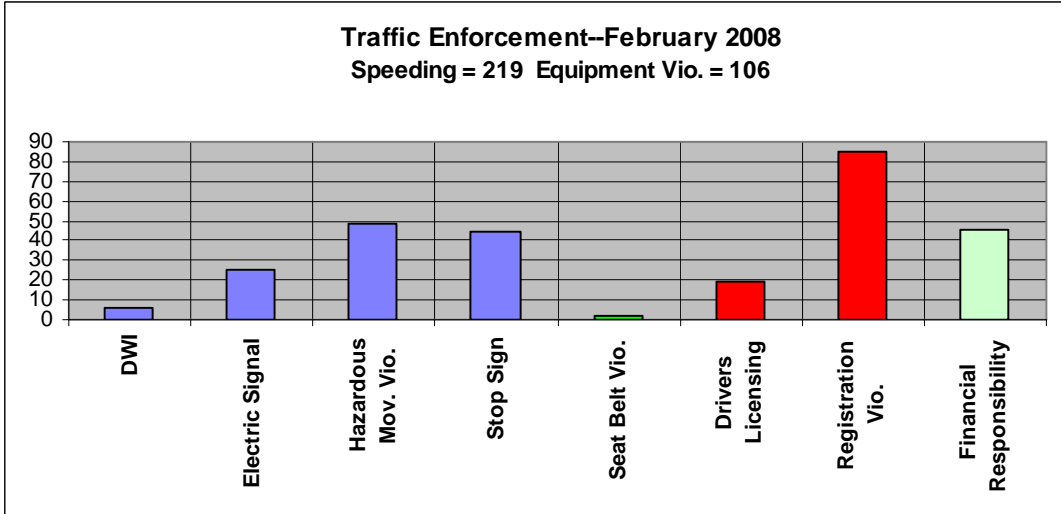

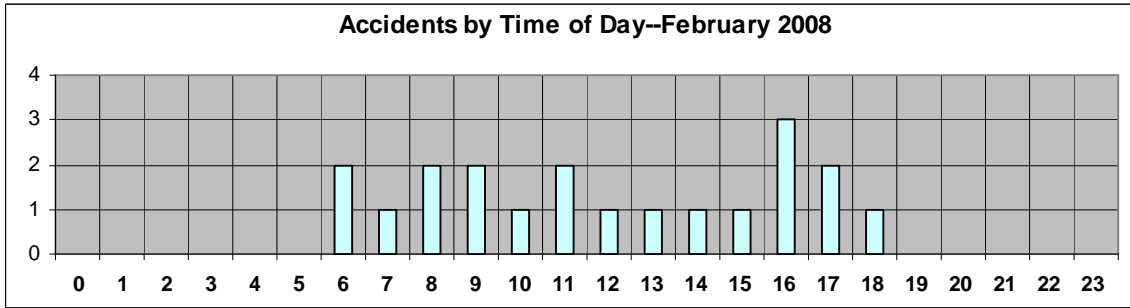

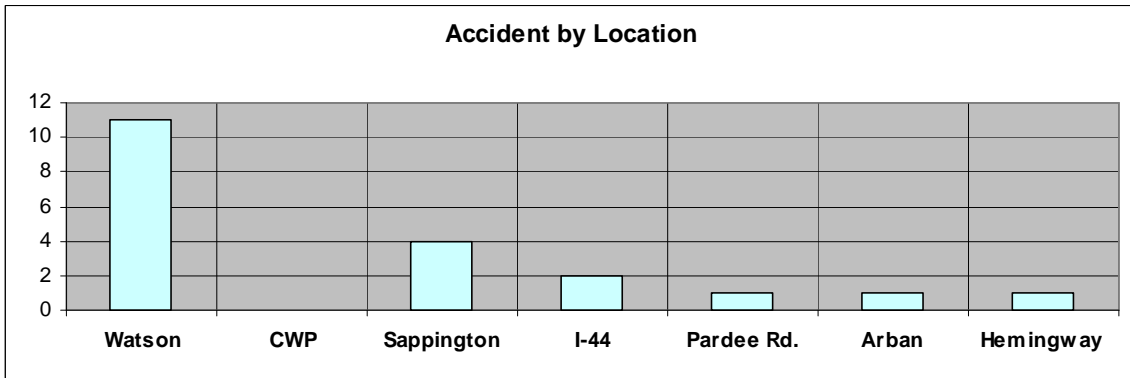

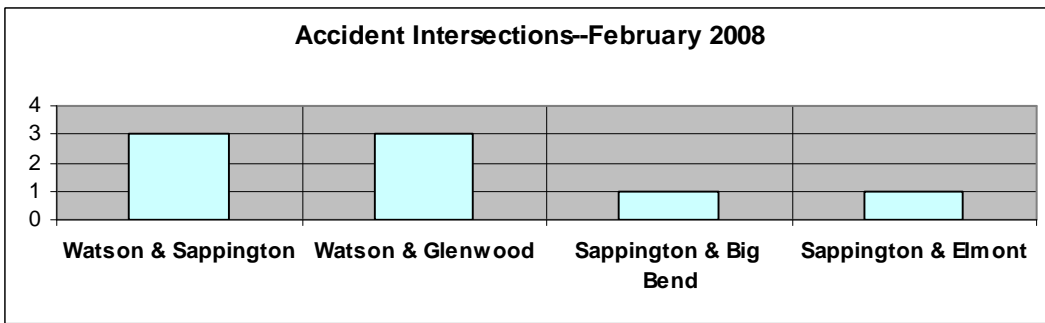
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



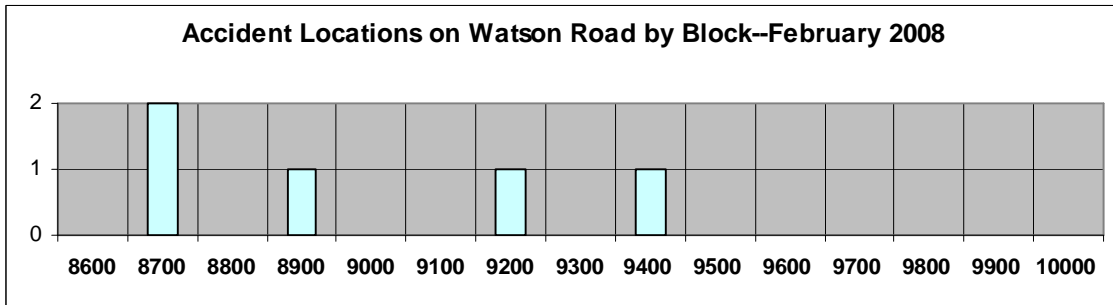

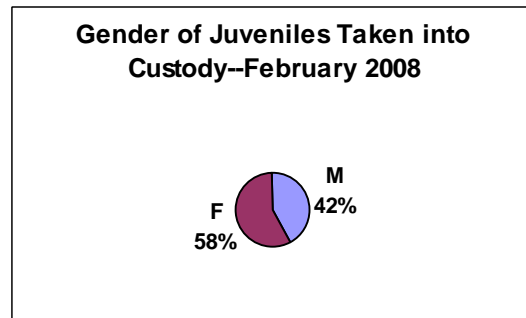
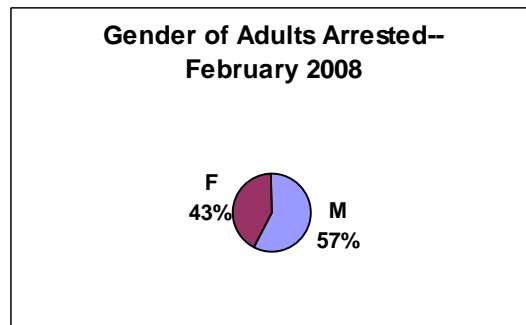
Arrest Information:

Sixty adults and twelve juveniles were taken into custody in February 2008. Five persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

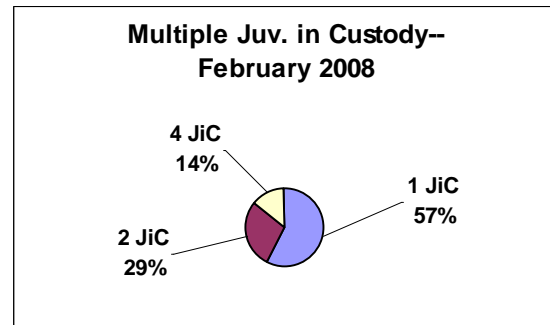
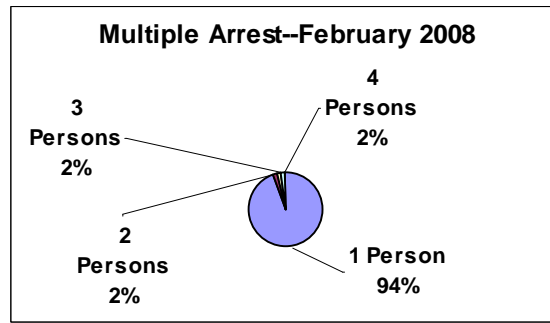
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



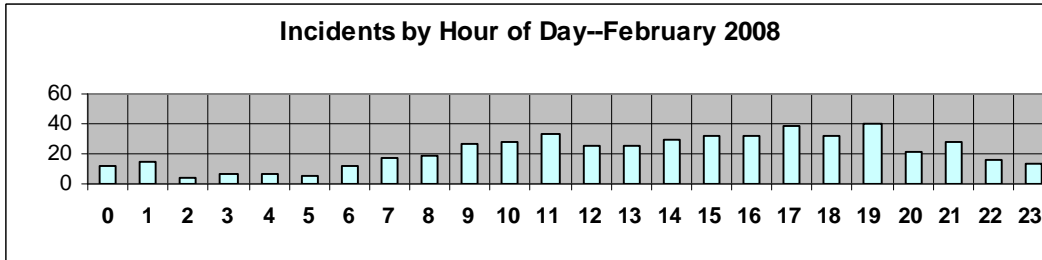
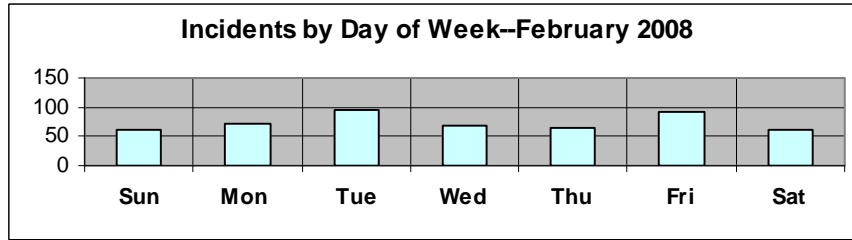
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

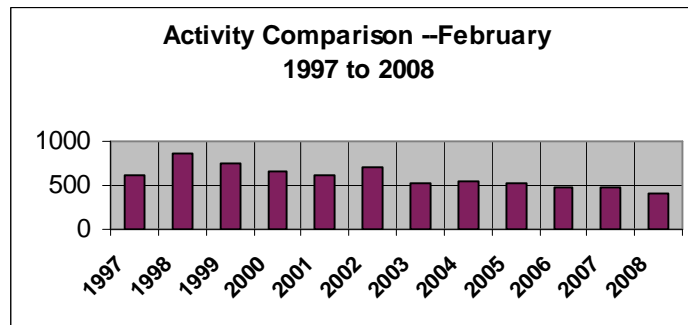
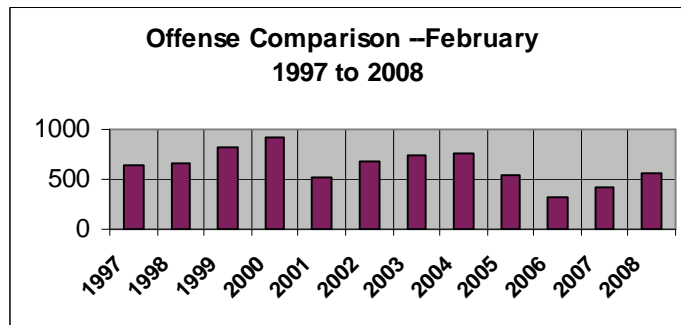

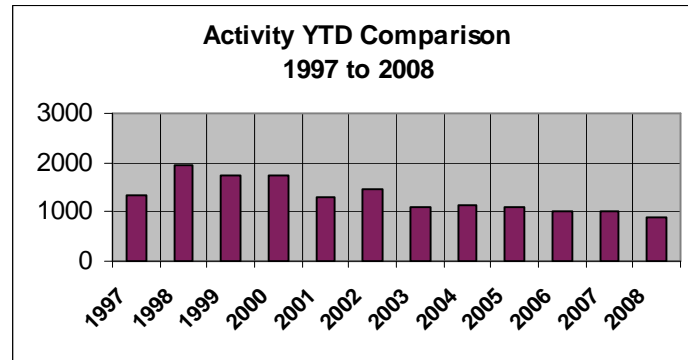
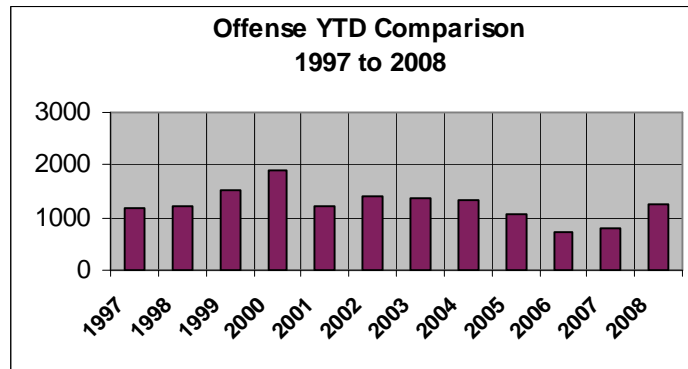


Offense and Activity Comparison:

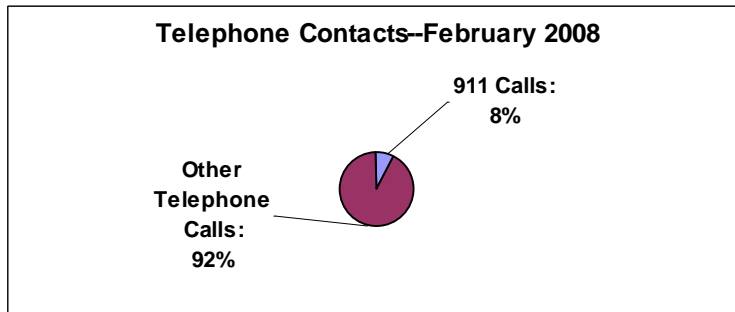


Years to Date:



Communications:

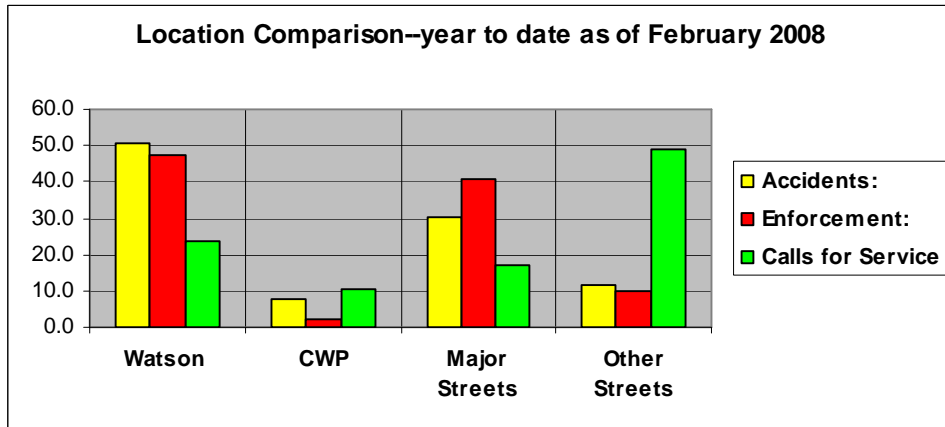


Location Comparison:
