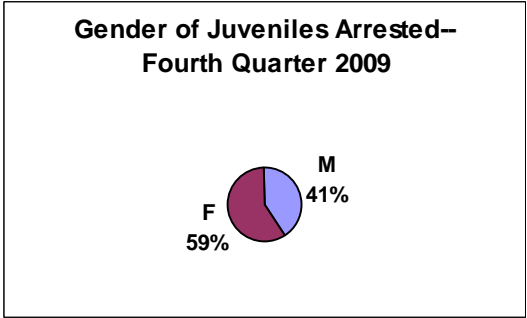
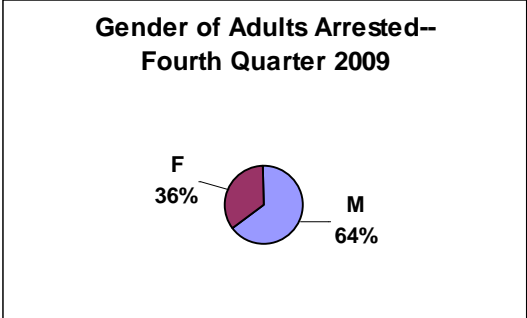
One hundred thirty adults and twenty-two juveniles were taken into custody in the Fourth Quarter. Sixteen persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrest.

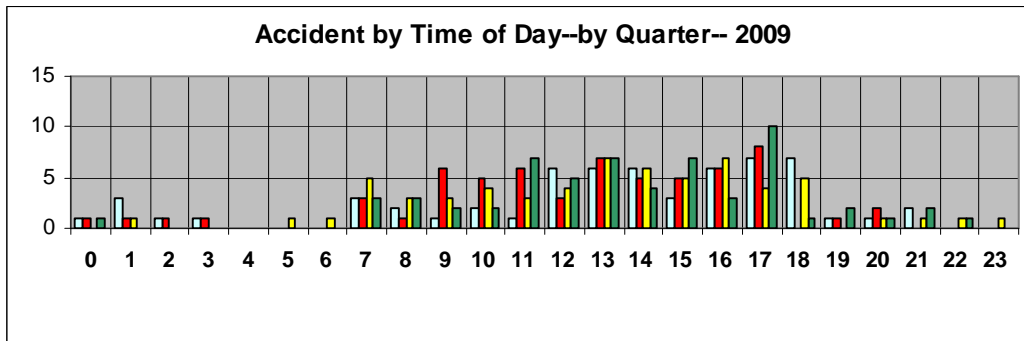

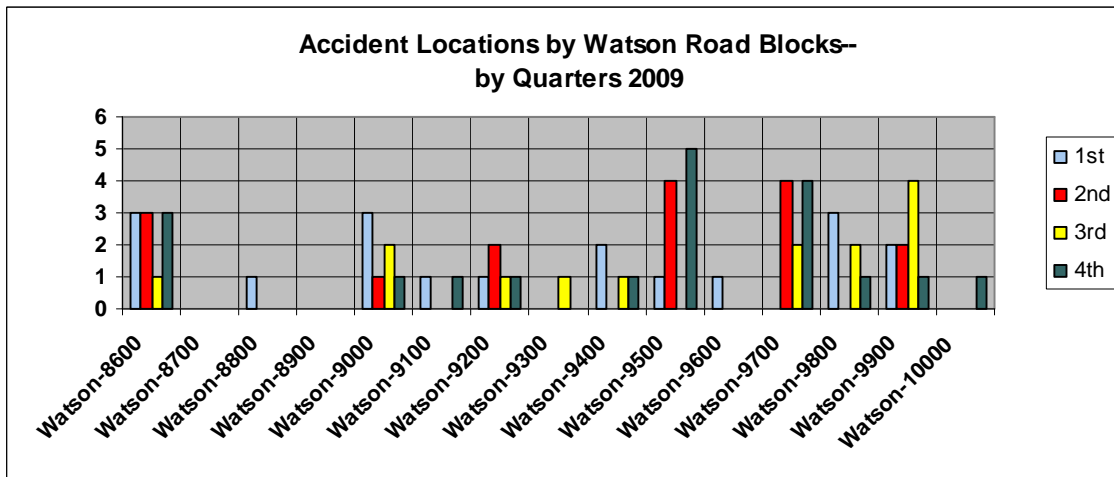

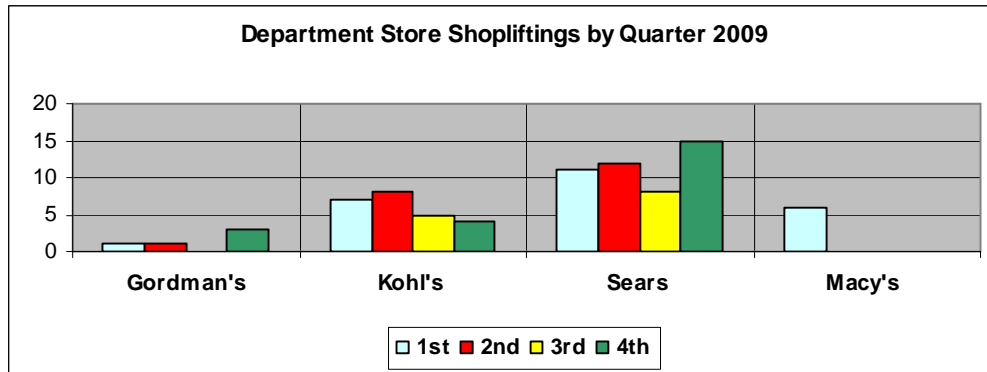
**Stealings:**
