Topic: January 2006 Public Report

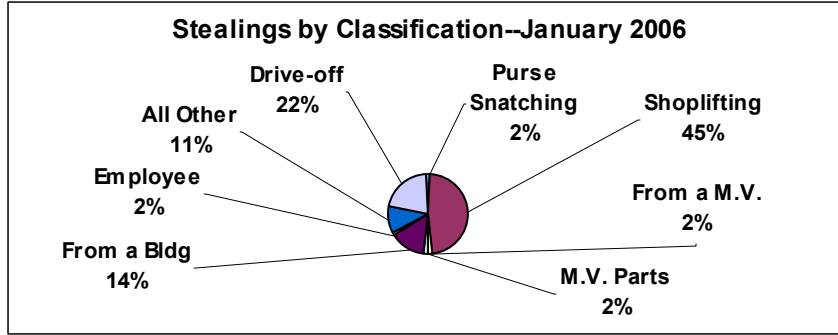
This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of January 2006. In January 2006, there were 78 Part I offenses and 312 Part II offenses for a total of 390. This compares with 47 Part I offenses and 476 Part II offenses for total of 523 in January 2005. The main difference was in the number of traffic stops, stealings, DWI cases, traffic accidents and suspicious activities.

There were no sexual assaults or burglaries in January. There was one robbery that involved a cell phone taken from a juvenile male and the threats that he received from the person, who had grabbed the phone. The person, who had grabbed the phone, was later located, identified and taken into custody. The phone was not recovered.

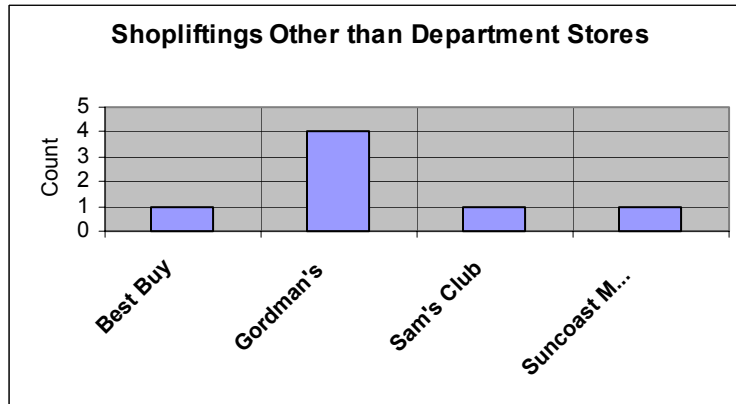
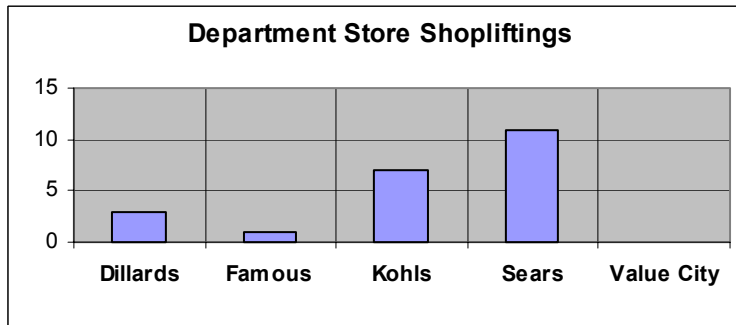
There were three assaults in January 2006 and two involved domestic violence. In two cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

Stealing offenses numbered 63 in January 2006. Twenty-nine were shopliftings and the remainder involved a woman having her purse snatched by a male, who ran from the scene. A purse and a car stereo faceplate were stolen from vehicles. Purses and wallets were stolen from buildings along with petty cash from an office, money taken from a cash register and someone not paying their bar bill. One employee was stealing from his employer. Mailboxes were stolen from residences, a brick saw, nails and a microwave were stolen from a construction site and a park bench was stolen from near the Aquatics Center in Whitecliff Park. There were fourteen drive-offs without paying for gasoline.

Stealings were of the following classifications in January 2006:

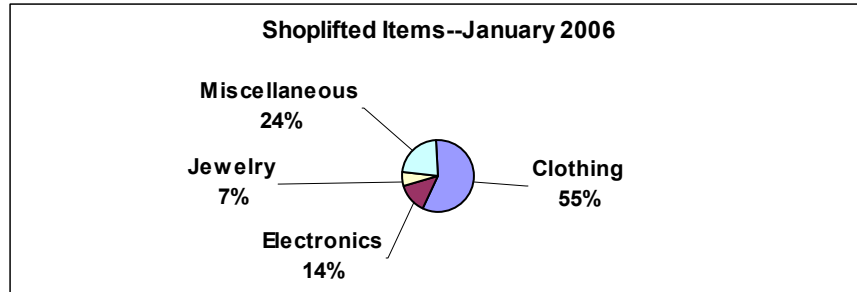


Shopliftings accounted for 29 of the 63 stealings in January 2006 or 45%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in January 2006:

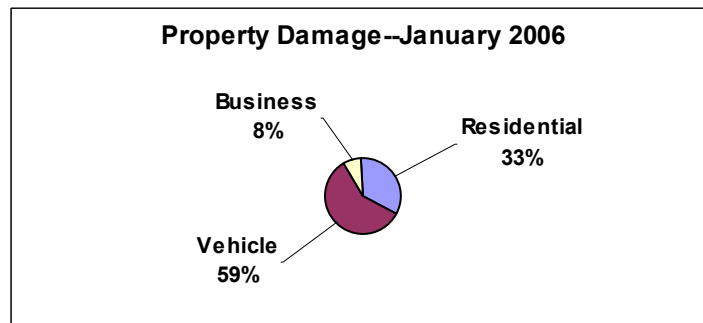


Of the shopliftings, 79% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 53% and juveniles accounted for 43% and adults and juveniles together accounted for another 4% of the clearances.

There were twelve property damages in January 2006 and they were of the following classifications:



The property damages included fourteen mailboxes that were reported damaged on 01-13-06, eggs thrown on a vehicle, paint scratched on a vehicle, a beer bottle broken against a motorcycle, damage to a lamppost in the front yard of a residence and damage to the front of a store in CWP.

There were no receiving stolen properties and two stolen vehicles in January 2006. The first was a black 1998 Chevrolet Beretta that was stolen from CWP and later recovered in St. Louis City. The second was a white 1992 Oldsmobile Ciera that was stolen from CWP and the owner recovered in St. Louis City.

Part I offenses numbered 78 in January 2006.

Part II:

In January 2006, there were four frauds, one credit card fraud, one forgery, one identity theft and one other type fraud. There was one possession of a drug pipe and two disorderly conducts, a harassing telephone call and a trespassing at the Aquatics Center by skateboarders. There were three DWI cases with only one submitted to a breath test. There were five people related calls, one sudden death, two sick cases, both involving an elderly female with dementia and two missing persons. There were no juvenile, family or weapons offenses reported in January.

Part II offenses totaled 312 in January 2006.

In January 2006 in Ward One, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered nine with seven at addresses on Watson Road and two in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, none at addresses along Watson Road and two in the neighborhoods. There were no stolen vehicles. There were two offenses against public peace and no frauds, drug offenses, juvenile related, family or weapons offenses. There was one DWI case and six traffic accidents, no people related calls and nine animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered fifteen and occurred on nine different streets and there were 39 miscellaneous police service calls.

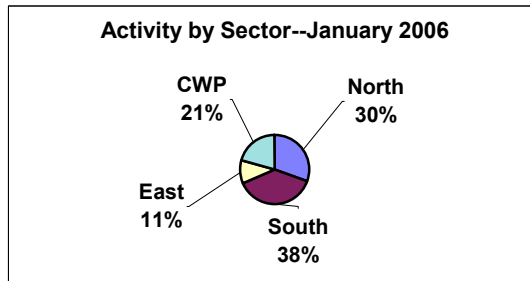
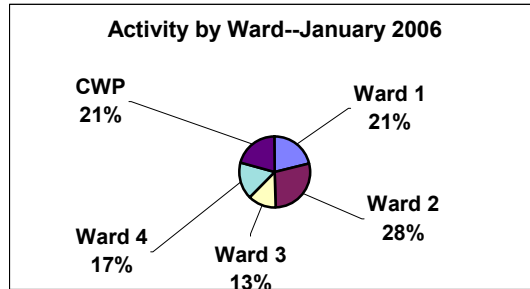
In Ward Two in January 2006, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered twenty-three with twenty-three at addresses on Watson Road and Big Bend and none in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, two at addresses along Watson Road and Big Bend and none in the neighborhoods. There were no stolen vehicles. There were two frauds, one drug offense and no offenses against public peace, juvenile related, family or weapons offenses. There were two DWI cases and seven traffic accidents, two people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eleven and occurred on nine different streets and there were 47 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In January 2006 in Ward Three, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered four with one at addresses on Watson Road and three in the neighborhoods. There were no property damages in January. There were no stolen vehicles. There was one fraud, one offense against public peace and no drug offenses juvenile related, family or weapons offenses. There were no DWI cases and no traffic accidents, one people related calls and no animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered nine and occurred on four different streets and there were seventeen miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in January 2006, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered two and property damages numbered six with multiple victims. There were no stolen vehicles. There were no frauds, drug offenses, offenses against public peace, juvenile related, family or weapons offenses. There were no DWI cases and one traffic accident, people related calls and animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eight and occurred on seven different streets and there were 28 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, there was one robbery and no sexual assaults, or burglaries. Stealings numbered twenty-five with one purse snatching, sixteen shopliftings, six from buildings, none from kiosk, one employee thefts and one all other thefts. Property damages numbered two. There were two stolen vehicles. There was one fraud, one offense against public peace and no drug offenses, juvenile related, family or weapons offenses. There were no DWI cases and one traffic accident, no people related calls and no animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered three and there were ten police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

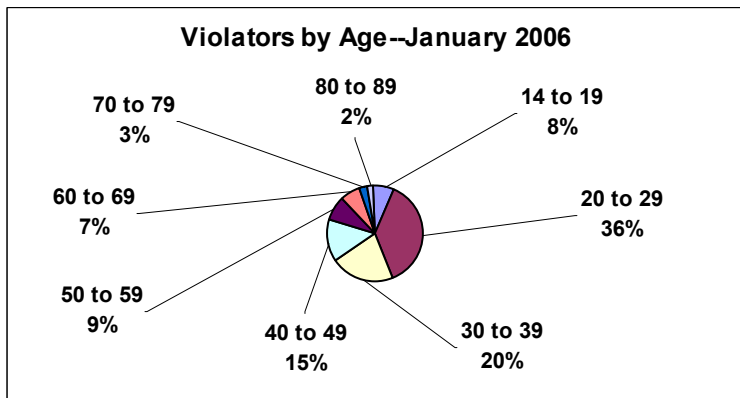

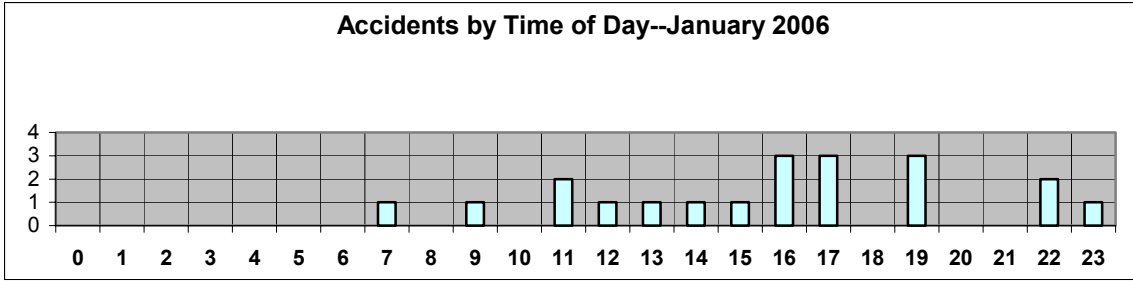

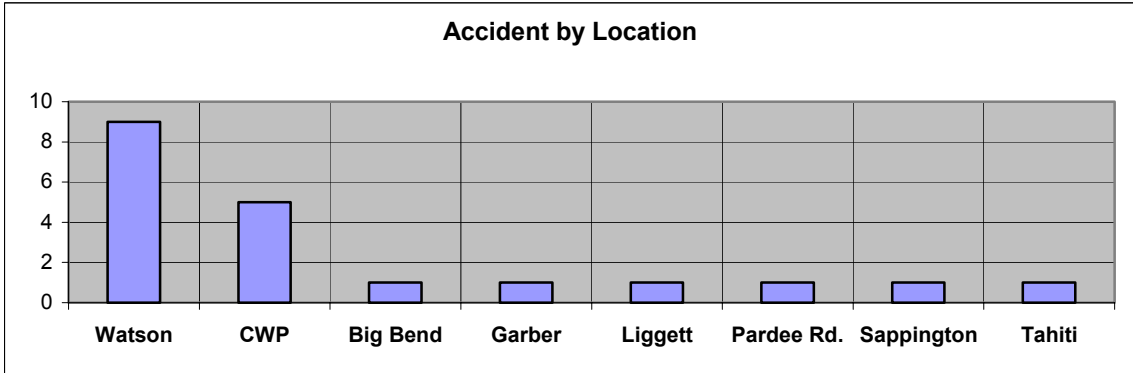
Accidents occurred on the following days of the week:



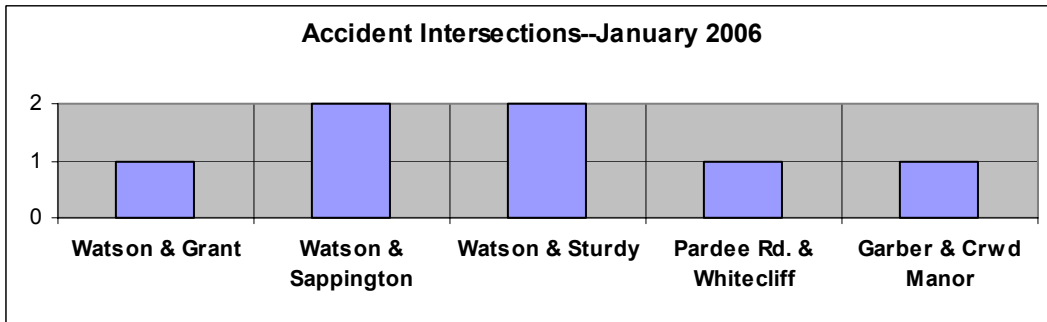
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



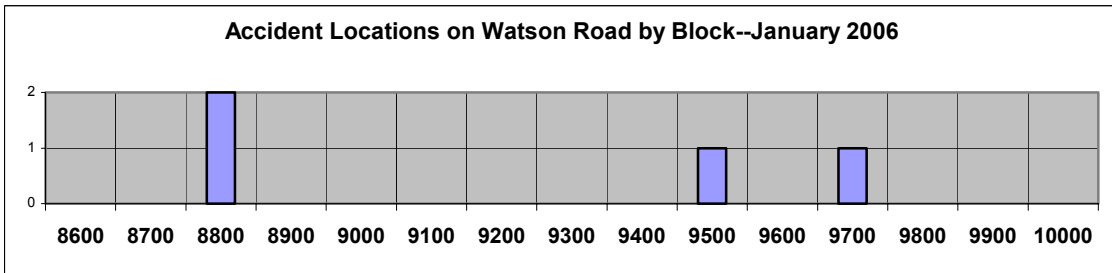
Accidents occurred on the following streets in January 2006:



Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



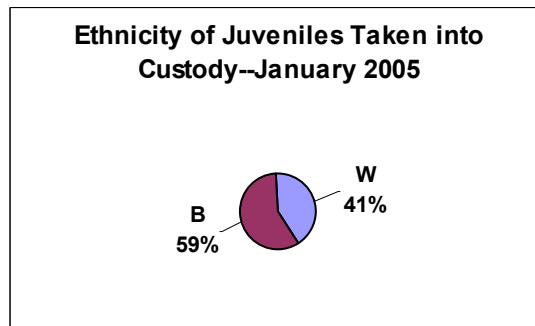
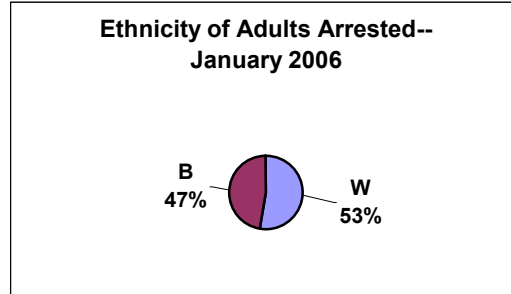
Accidents occurred in the following blocks of Watson Road:



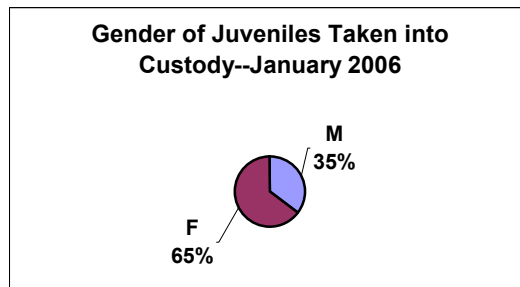
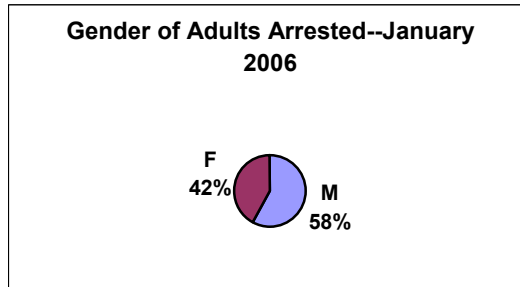
Arrest Information:

Seventy-six adults and seventeen juveniles were taken into custody in January 2006. Ten persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

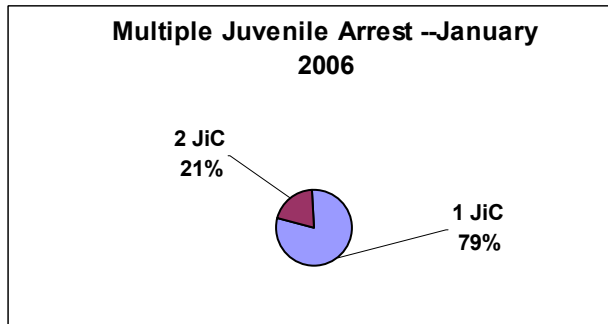
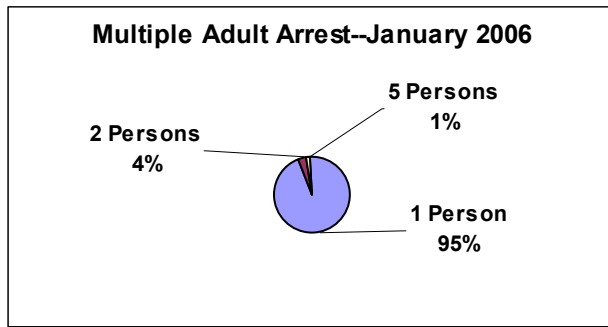
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



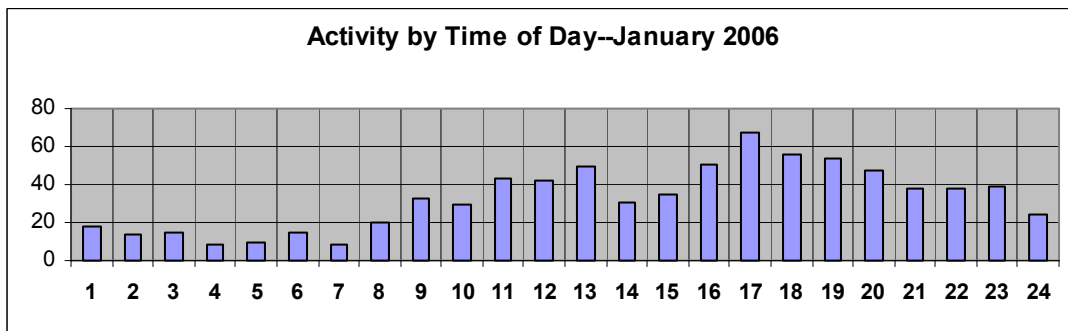
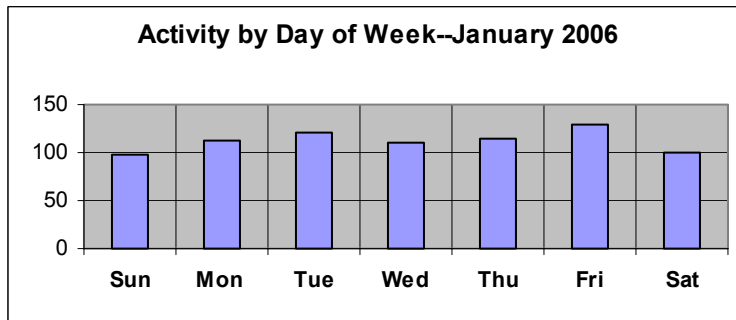
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

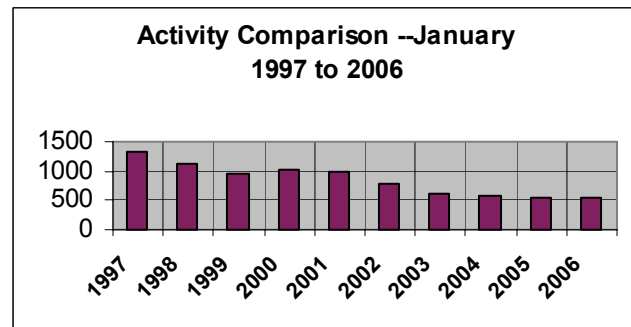
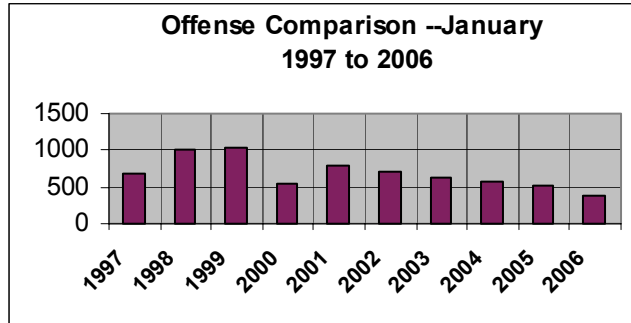

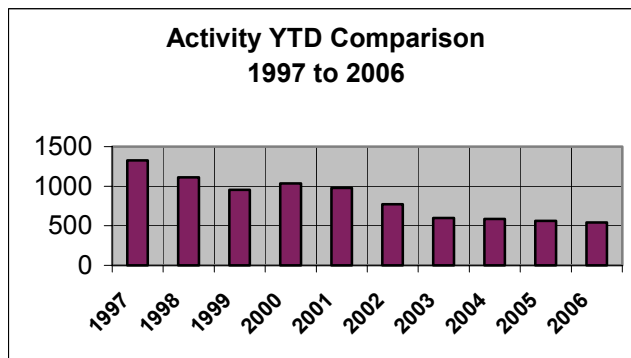
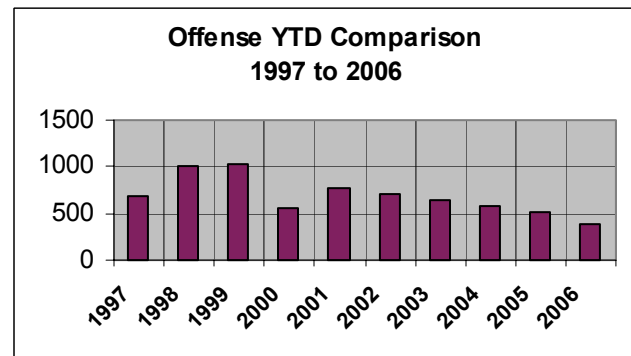


Offense and Activity Comparison:

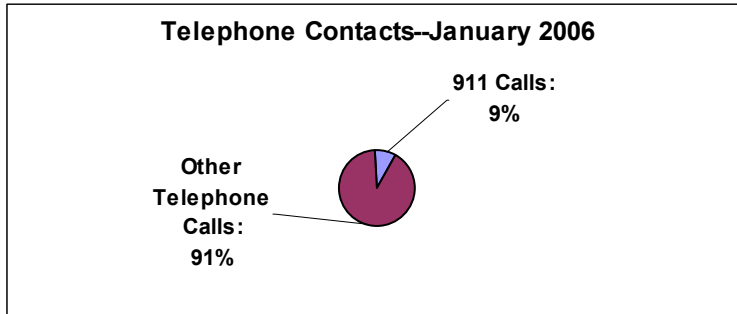


Years to Date:



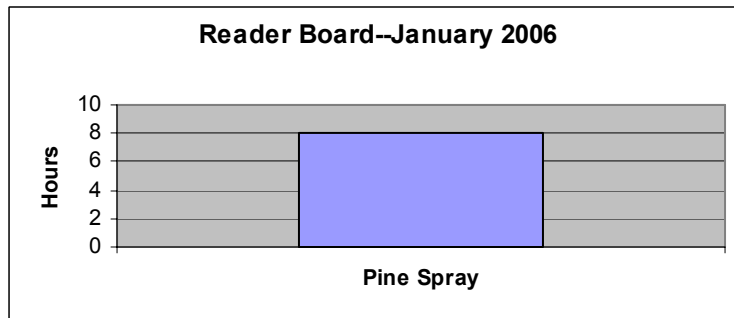
Communications:

The speed measuring reader board was placed at the following locations and for the following amount of time in January 2006:

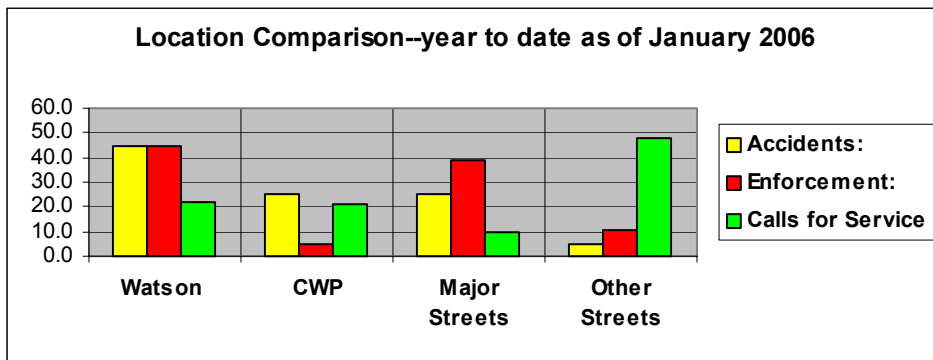


Location Comparison:
