Topic: January 2007 Public Report

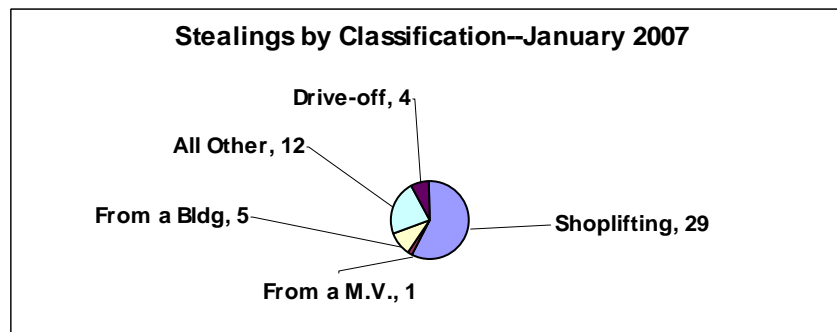
This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of January 2007. In January 2007, there were 67 Part I offenses and 323 Part II offenses for a total of 390. This compares with 78 Part I offenses and 312 Part II offenses for a total of 390 in January 2006. The main difference was in the number of stealings.

There were three assaults in January 2007 and two involved domestic violence. In two cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

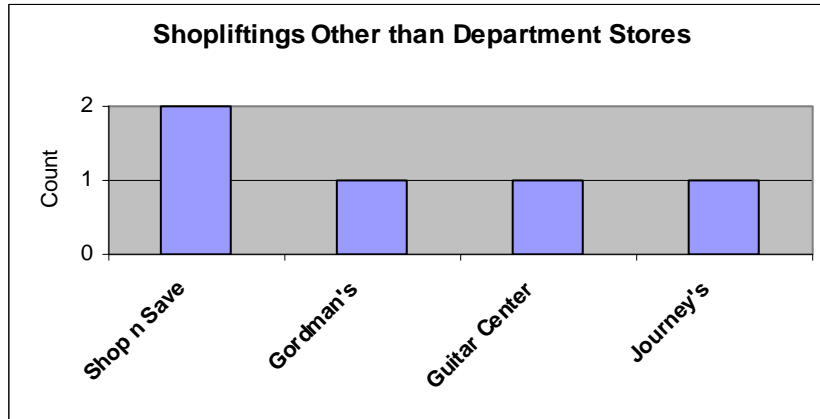
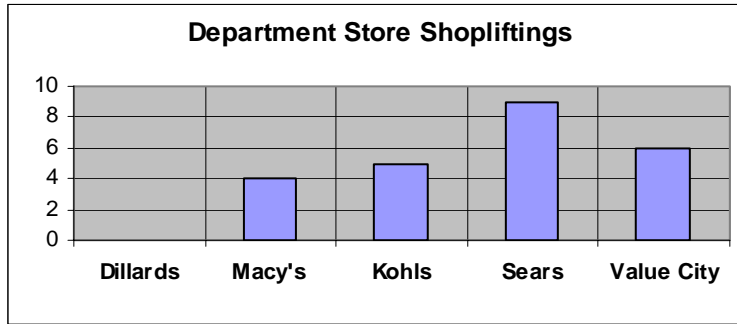
There were three burglaries reported in January. The first was a burglary to a residence on Gillespie. Between 8:00am and 8:00pm, someone entered the residence and removed televisions, a stereo and a game station. The second burglary was to a restaurant along Watson Road. After closing, someone broke into the restaurant and removed cash from the safe. The third burglary was to a business in CWP. Overnight, someone entered the business and removed the petty cash from the business.

Stealing offenses numbered 51 in January 2007.

Stealings were of the following classifications in January 2007:

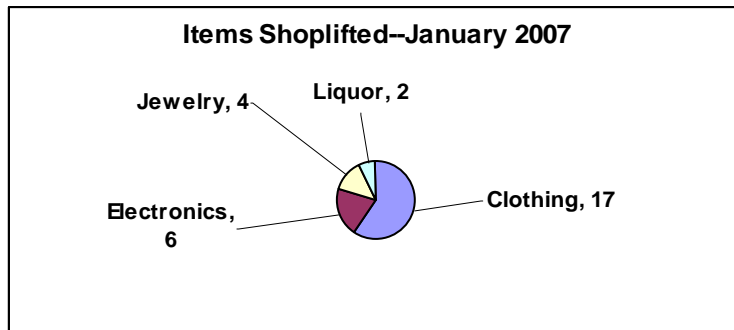


Shopliftings accounted for 29 of the 51 stealings in January 2007 or 57%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in January 2007:

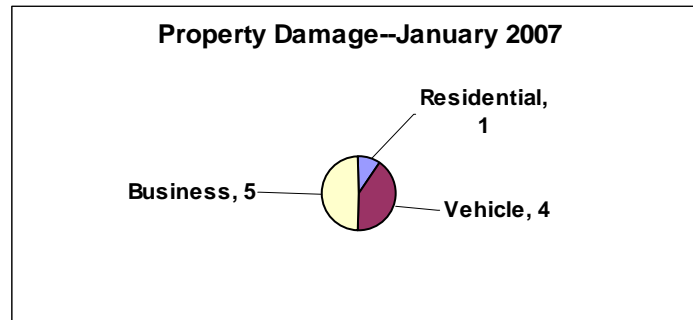


Of the shopliftings, 93% were cleared by arrest, adults accounted for 59%, and juveniles accounted for 41% of the clearances.

The items shoplifted were found to be:



There were 10 property damages in January 2007 and they were of the following classifications:



The residential property damages were to mailboxes and most of the business property damages were graffiti or broken windows.

There was one receiving stolen property that involved musical equipment that had been stolen in a theft in St. Louis City. There were three stolen vehicles in January 2007. The first was a white 1993 Ford pickup truck that was stolen from a business on Grant Road and was later recovered in St. Louis City. The second stolen vehicle was a red 2004 Dodge Pickup with a camper shell that was stolen from CWP and later recovered in St. Louis City. The third was a black 2000 Jeep Cherokee that was stolen from a restaurant along Watson Road and this vehicle was also recovered in St. Louis City.

Part I offenses numbered 67 in January 2007.

**Part II:**

In January 2007, there were four identity thefts, one passing bad checks, one credit card fraud and three other type frauds. The one drug case involved possession of small quantity of marijuana. The two offenses against public peace were annoying telephone calls and a trespassing. There were six DWI cases, four animal cases and five people related cases, including three sudden deaths, one suicide or attempt and a missing person. The three juvenile offenses involved two runaways and a curfew violation. Family offenses involved one criminal non-support and one ex-parte order violation.

Part II offenses totaled 245 in January 2007.

In January 2007 in Ward One, there were no sexual assaults or robberies and one burglary was reported at a restaurant on Watson Road. Stealings numbered four with two at addresses on Watson Road, one on Watson Industrial, one in an apartment complex and none in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered four, four at addresses along Watson Industrial and none in the neighborhoods. There were no stolen vehicles. There were three frauds, one juvenile offense and one family offense and no drug offenses, offenses against public peace or weapon offenses. There were three DWI cases and ten traffic accidents, two people related calls and no animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered fourteen and occurred on ten different streets and there were 35 miscellaneous police service calls.

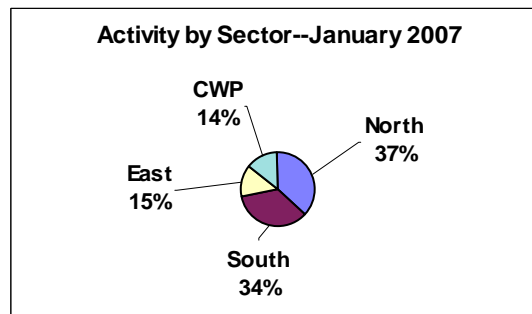
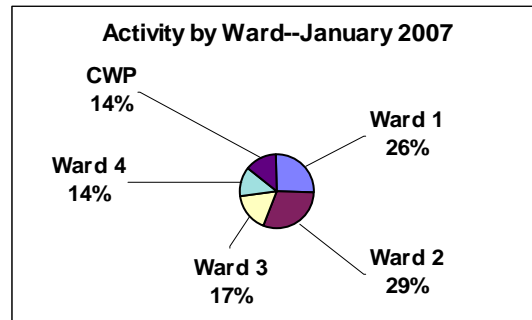
In Ward Two in January 2007, there were no sexual assaults or robberies and one burglary reported at a residence on Gillespie. Stealings numbered fourteen with fourteen at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and none in the neighborhoods. There were no property damages but there was one stolen vehicle from a restaurant along Watson Road. There were three frauds, one drug offense, one offenses against public peace and no juvenile, family or weapon offenses. There were no DWI cases and thirteen and traffic accidents, no people related calls and no animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eleven and occurred on nine different streets and there were 40 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In January 2007 in Ward Three, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered eleven with nine at addresses on Watson Road and two in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered one, none at addresses along Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. There was one stolen vehicle from a business on Grant Road. There was one fraud and one family offense and no drug, offenses against public peace, juvenile, family or weapons offenses. There were three DWI and two traffic accidents, one people related calls and no animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered five and occurred on five different streets and there were 22 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in January 2007, there were no sexual assaults, robberies, burglaries, There was one stealings, one property damage and no stolen vehicles. There was one juvenile offense and no frauds, drug, offenses against public peace, juvenile or weapons offenses. There were no DWI and no traffic accidents, two people related calls and four animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered seven and occurred on seven different streets and there were 26 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, there were no sexual assaults or robberies and one burglary occurred at one of the stores. Stealings numbered 21 with 15 shopliftings, one from buildings and five all other thefts. Property damages numbered four and there was one stolen vehicle. There were two frauds, one offense against public peace, and one juvenile offense and no drug, family or weapons offenses. There were no DWI cases and one traffic accident, no people related calls and no animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered ten and there were 17 police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

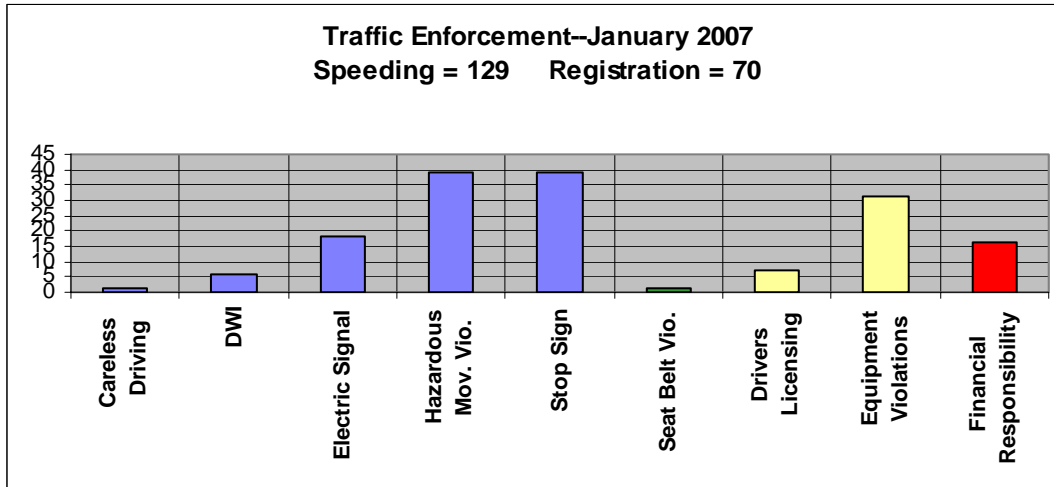

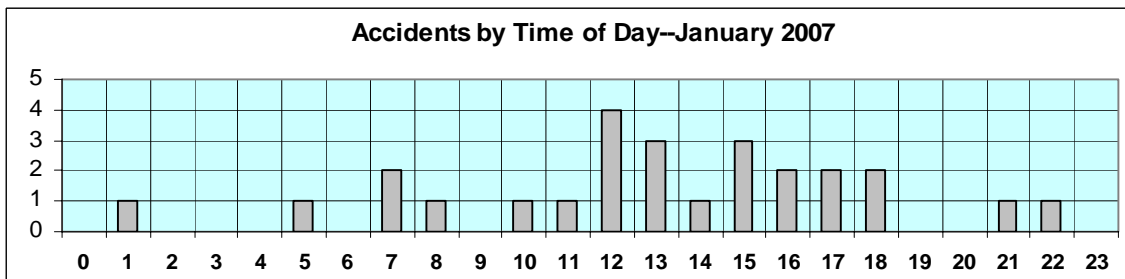

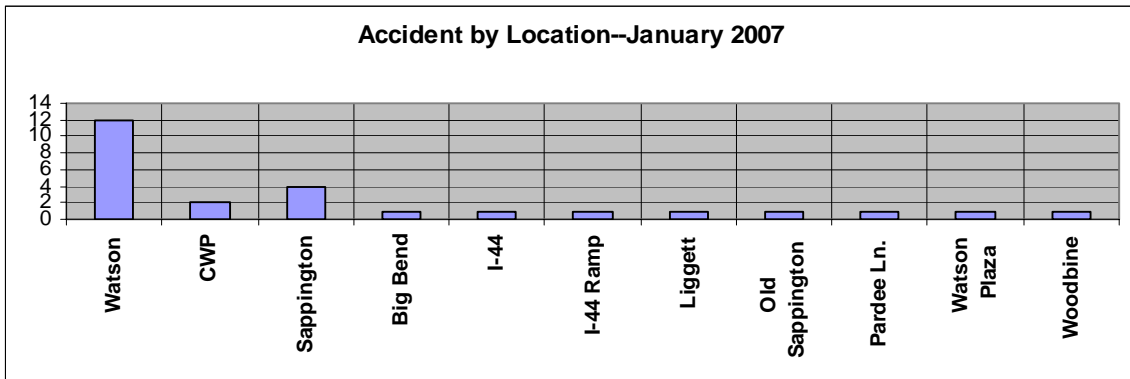
Accidents occurred on the following days of the week:



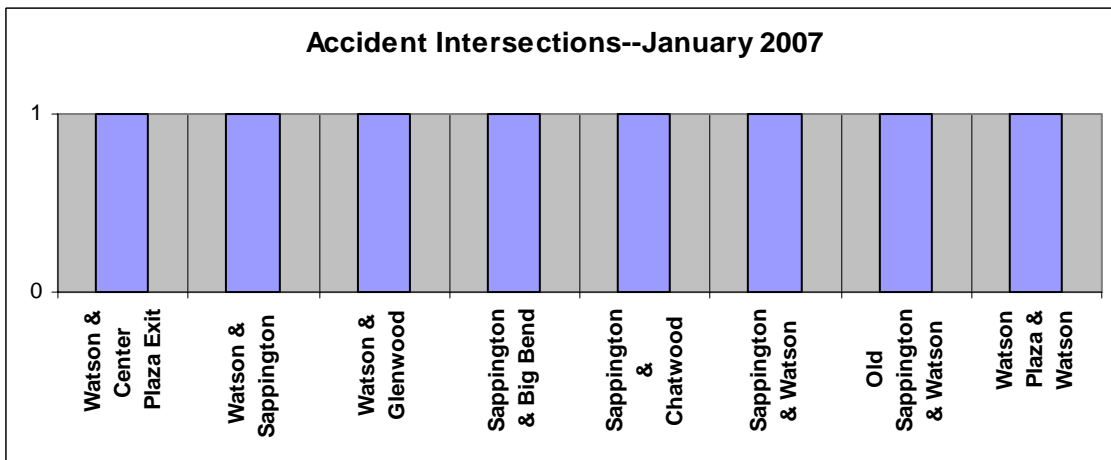
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



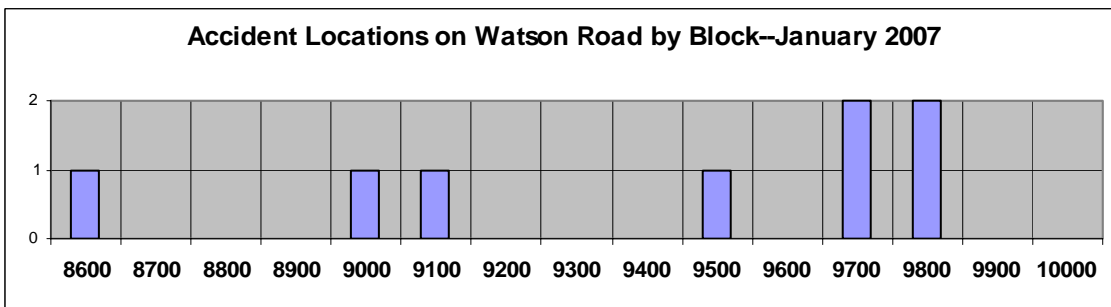
Accidents occurred on the following streets in January 2007:



Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



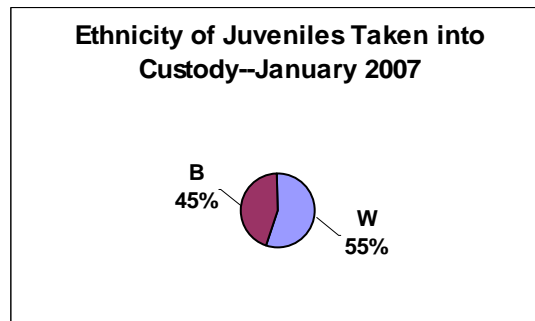
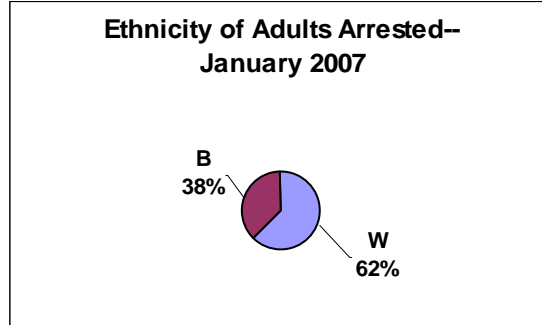
Accidents occurred in the following blocks of Watson Road:



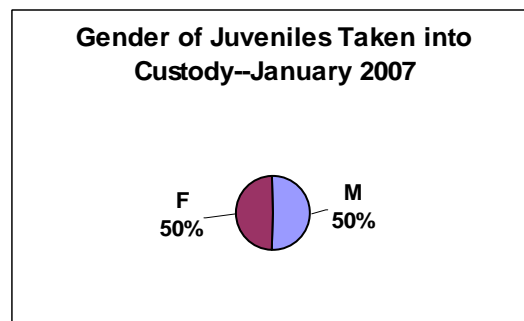
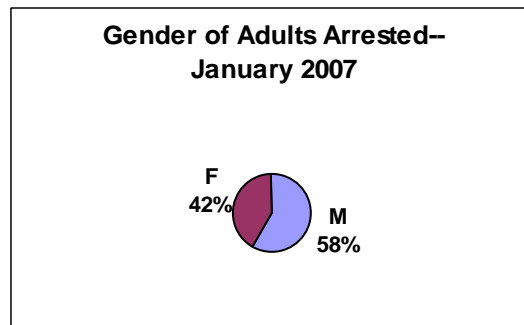
**Arrest Information:**

Seventy-four adults and twenty-two juveniles were taken into custody in January 2007. Fifteen persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

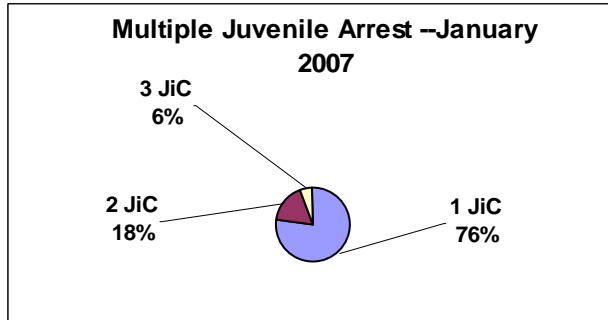
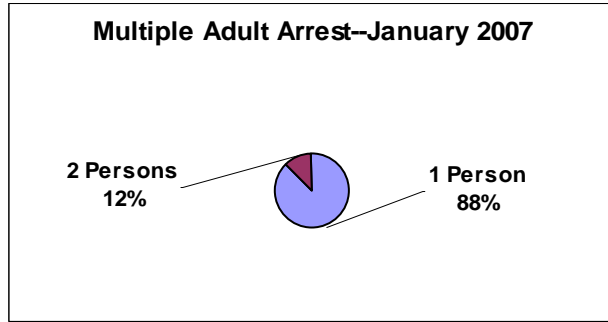
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



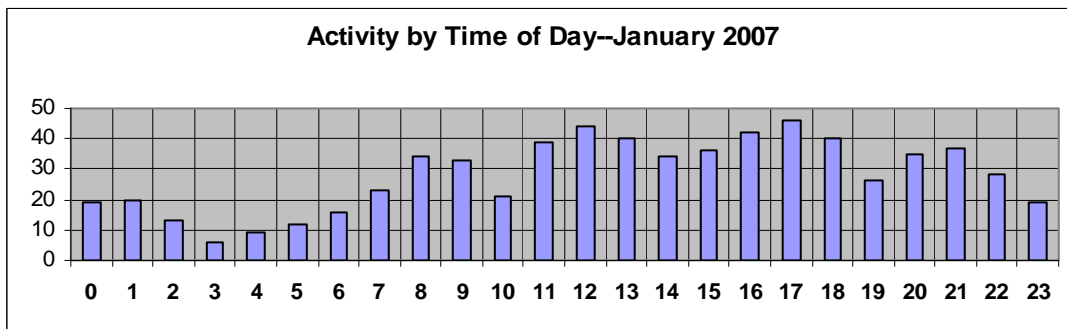
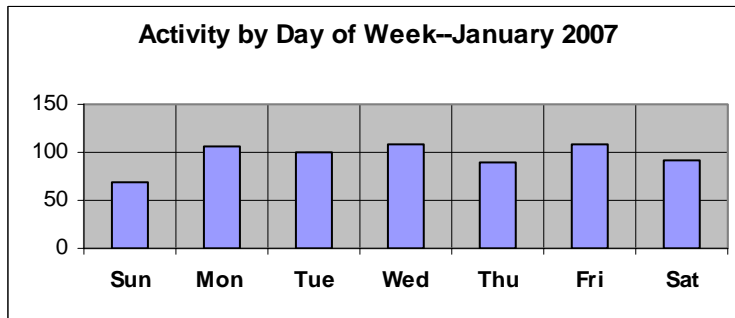
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

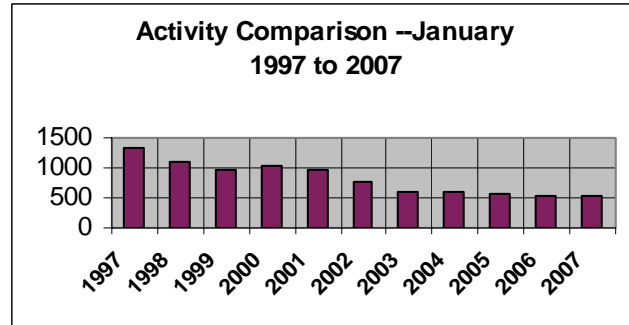
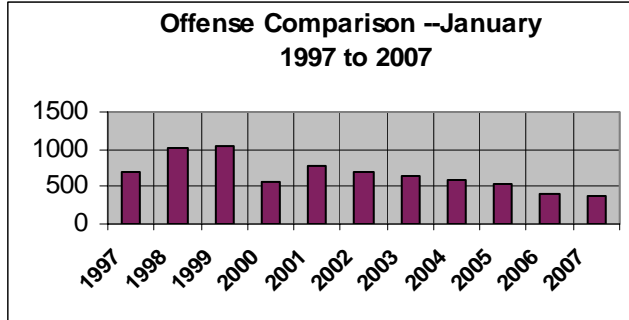

Activity occurred on the following days of the week and hours of the day:

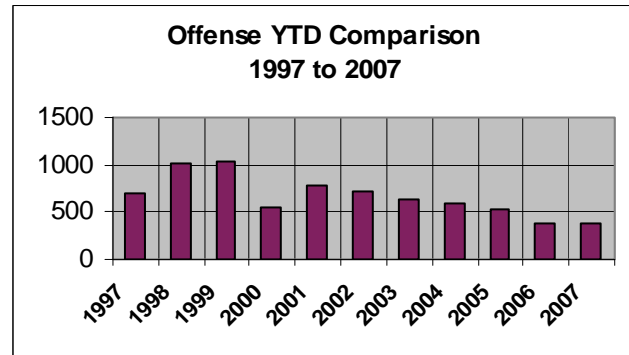


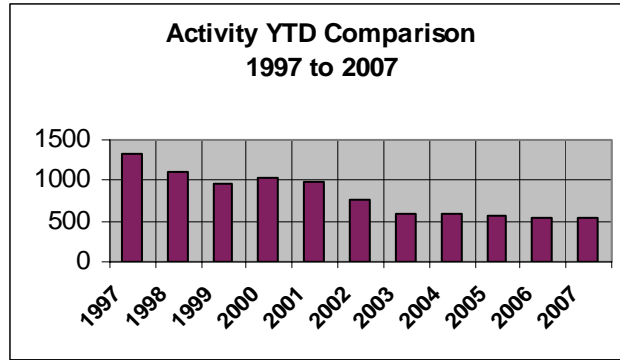
**Offense and Activity Comparison:**

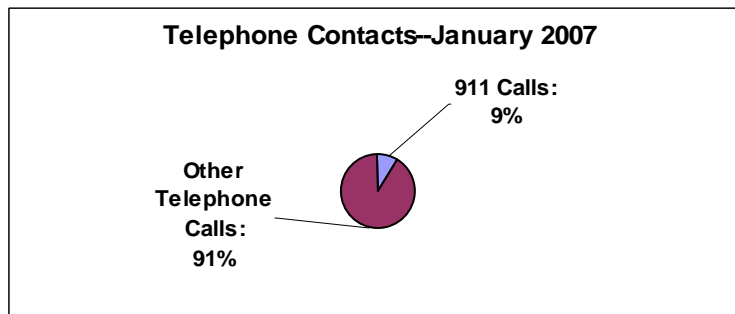
Years to Date:

**Reader Board:**

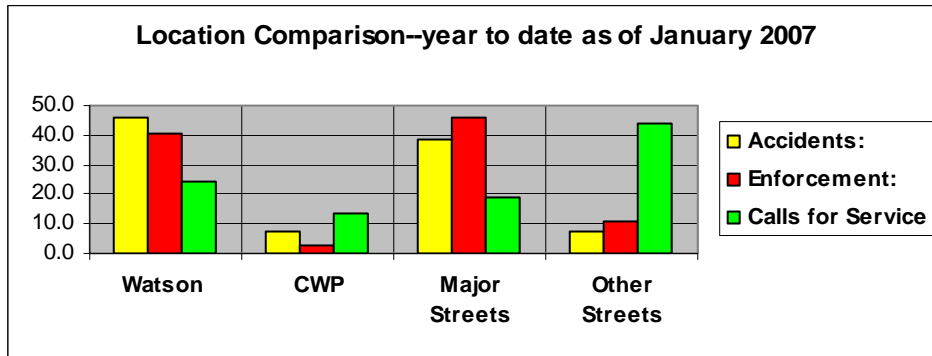
The speed measuring reader board was not placed in January 2007.
