Topic: January 2008 Public Report

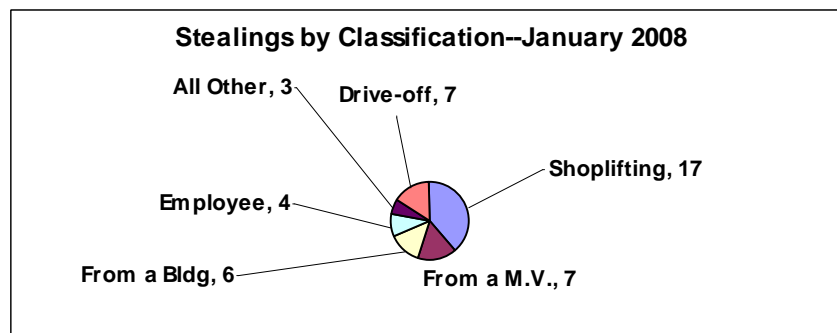
This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of January 2008. In January 2008, there were 63 Part I offenses and 611 Part II offenses for a total of 674. This compares with 67 Part I offenses and 323 Part II offenses for a total of 390 in January 2007. The main difference was in the number of stealing and burglaries in 2007 and traffic stops in 2008.

There was one robbery reported in January. On 01-02-2008, a male entered a business on Big Bend and displayed a weapon and demanded money. The employee gave the male the money and he left the business.

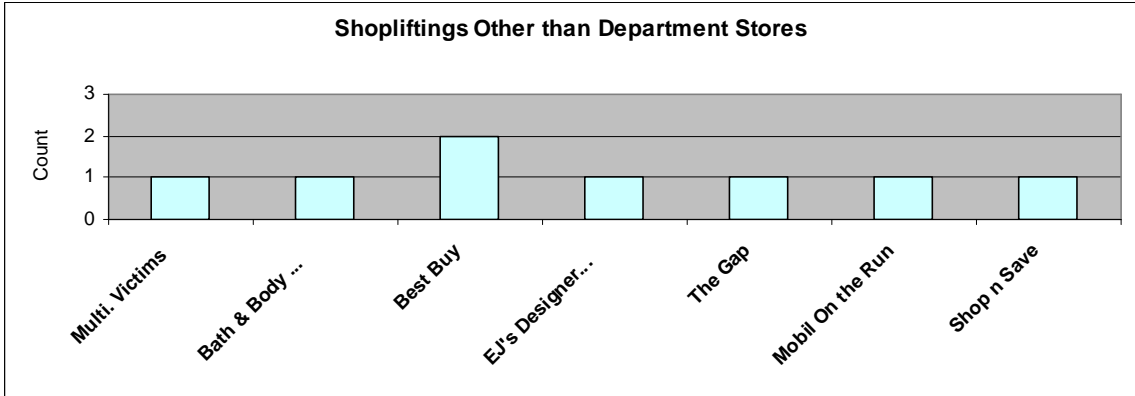
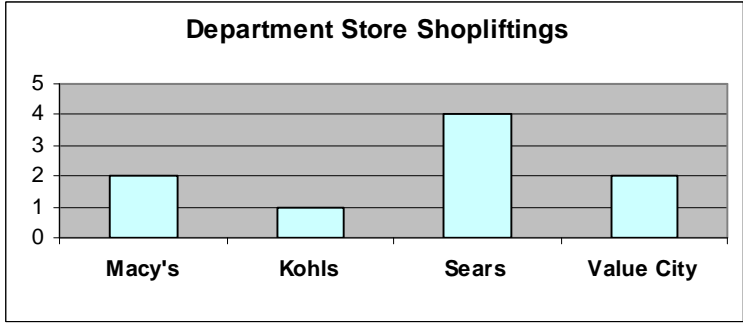
There were eight assaults in January 2008 and five involved domestic violence. In all cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

Stealing offenses numbered 44 in January 2008.

Stealings were of the following classifications in January 2008:

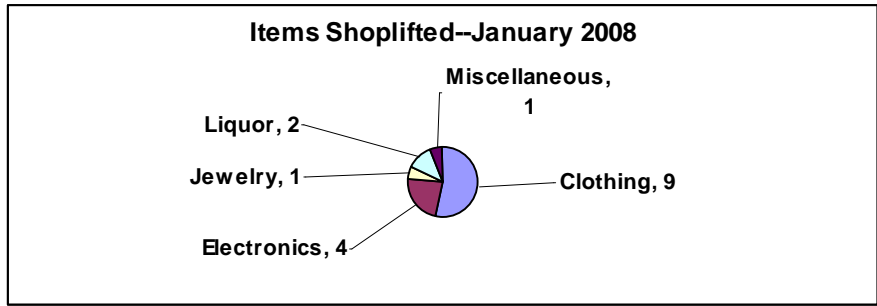


Shopliftings accounted for seventeen of the 43 stealings in January 2008 or 38%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in January 2008:

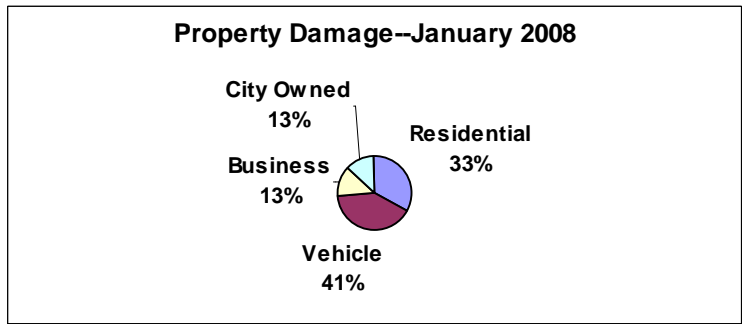


Of the shopliftings, 59% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 80% and juveniles accounted for 20% of the clearances.

There were fifteen property damages in January 2008 and they were of the following classifications:



The two City Owned were damage to stop signs.

There were three stolen vehicles in January 2008. The first was on 01-01-2008 from a residence on Ferndale. The vehicle, a white 2001 Honda Accord, was parked warming up when the suspect took the vehicle. An Officer observed the vehicle driving from the area and stopped the vehicle and arrested the driver. The second stolen vehicle, a maroon 2005 Chevrolet Impala was stolen from CWP on 01-08-2008. The third stolen vehicle, silver 2002 Chevrolet Pickup truck was stolen, on 01-18-2008, from a business along Watson Road and was later recovered in St. Louis County.

Part I offenses numbered 63 in January 2008.

Part II:

In January 2008, there were ten frauds, four bad checks, two forgeries, two identity thefts, one credit card fraud and one counterfeiting. There were three offenses against public peace, including two annoying telephone calls and one disorderly conduct. There was one DWI case and 67 people related incidents including 66 medical emergencies and one missing person. There were 26 animal related calls, one runaway juvenile, one family offense and 57 suspicious activity calls.

Part II offenses totaled 611 in January 2008.

In January 2008 in Ward One, stealings numbered five with four at addresses on Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered eight, three at addresses along Watson Industrial and five in the neighborhoods. There was one stolen vehicle from Ferndale. There were three frauds. There were twelve traffic accidents, thirteen people related calls and nine animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eighteen and occurred on ten different streets and there were 36 miscellaneous police service calls.

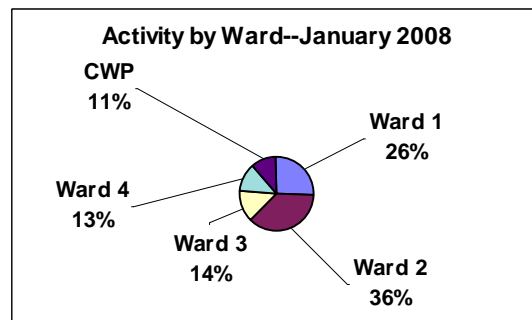
In Ward Two in January 2008, there was one robbery of a business on Big Bend. Stealings numbered 20 with eighteen at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and two in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered four, three at addresses along Watson Road, Reco and Big Bend and one in the neighborhoods. There was one stolen vehicle from Watson Road. There were four frauds and two offenses against public peace. There was one DWI case, fourteen traffic accidents, 20 people related calls and nine animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered fifteen and occurred on ten different streets and there were 61 calls for miscellaneous police services.

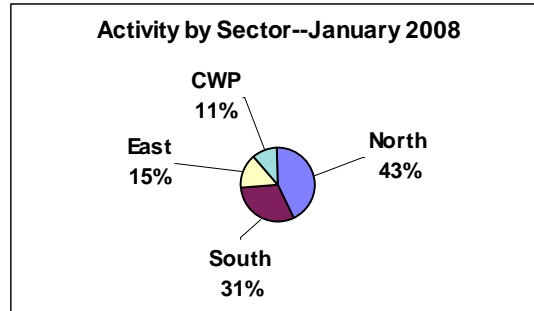
In January 2008 in Ward Three, stealings numbered five with four at addresses on Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered one, in the neighborhoods. There was one fraud, one juvenile offense and one family offense. There was one traffic accident, fifteen people related calls and three animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered seven and occurred on six different streets and there were 27 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in January 2008, there were no stealings and property damages numbered one. There was one fraud and one offense against public peace. There were two traffic accidents, ten people related calls and five animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered twelve and occurred on eleven different streets and there were seventeen calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered fourteen with nine shopliftings, one from vehicles, two from buildings, one employee theft and one all other thefts. There were no property damages and there was one stolen vehicle. There was one fraud and four traffic accidents and nine people related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered five and there were seventeen police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

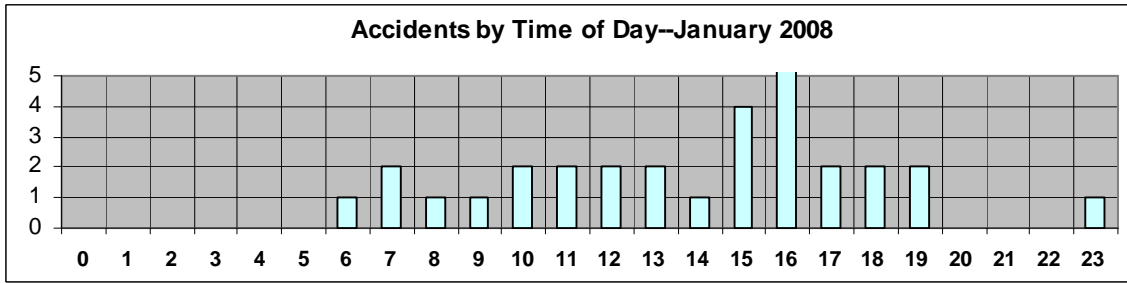

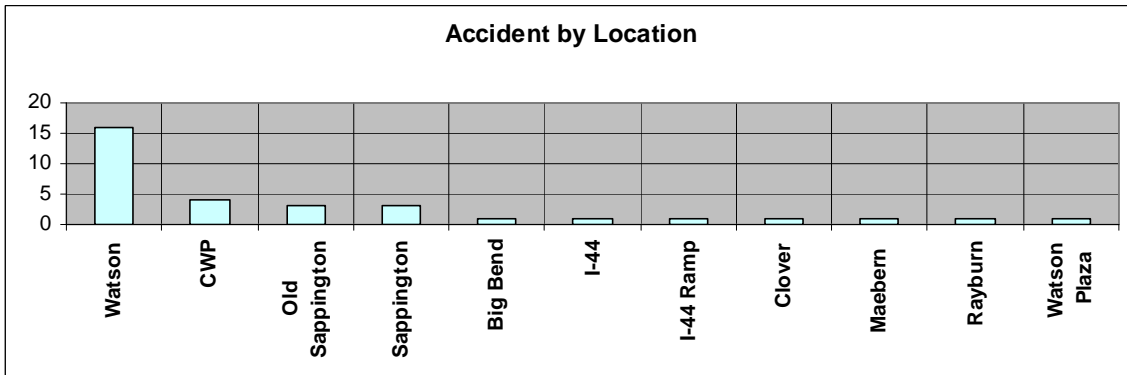
Accidents occurred on the following days of the week:



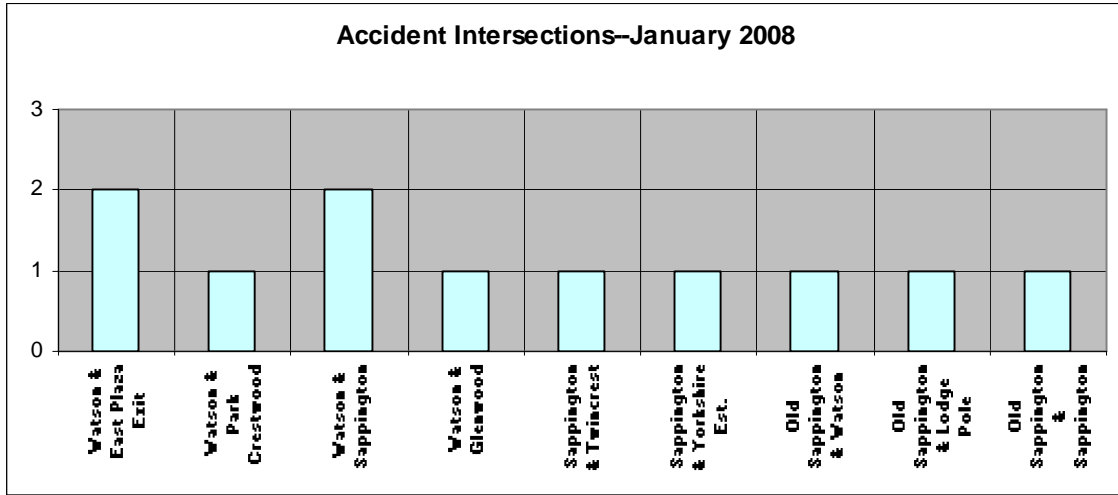
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



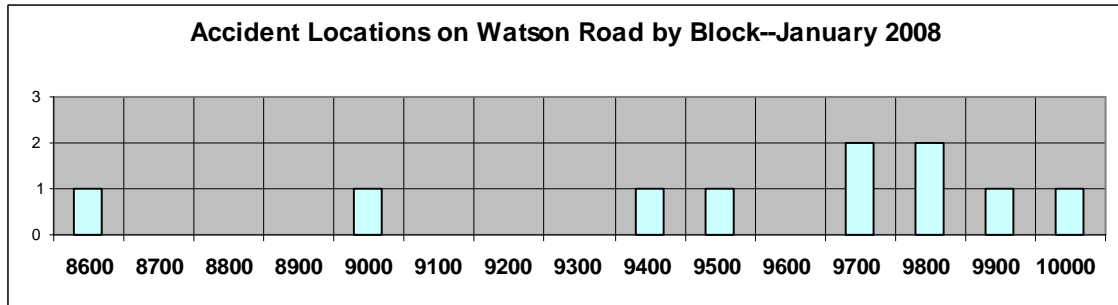

Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



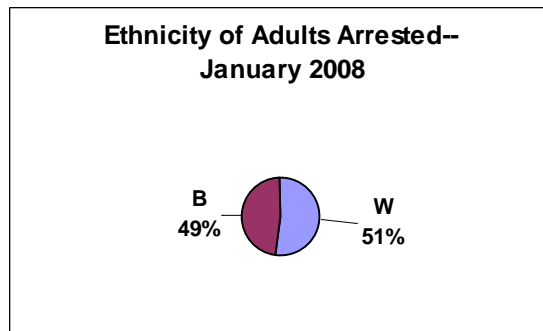

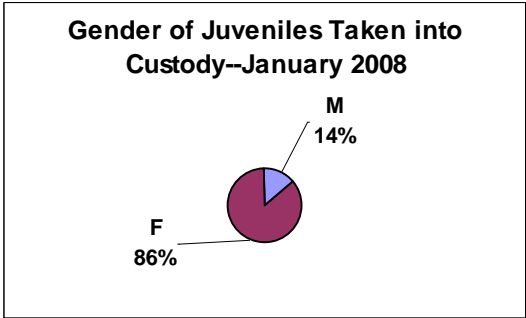
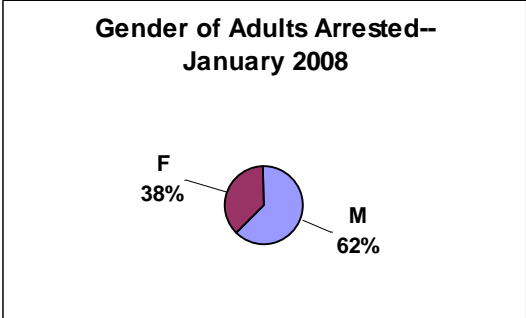
Seventy-six adults and seven juveniles were taken into custody in January 2008. Five persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:

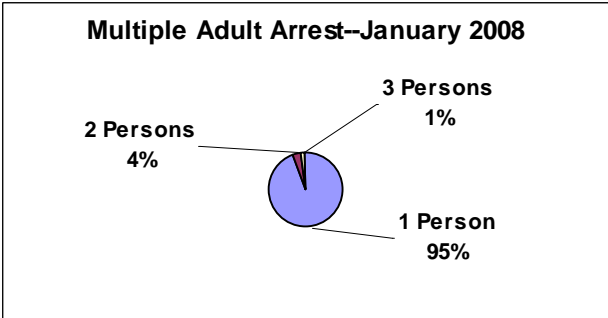


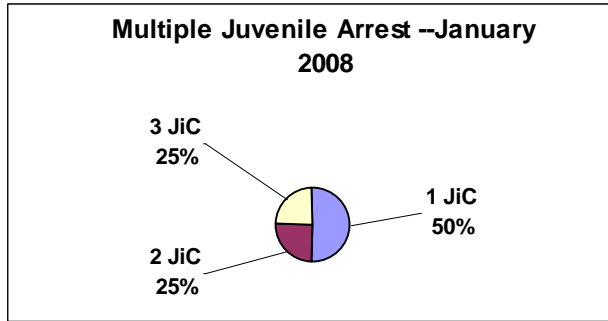


The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



Multiple Arrests:

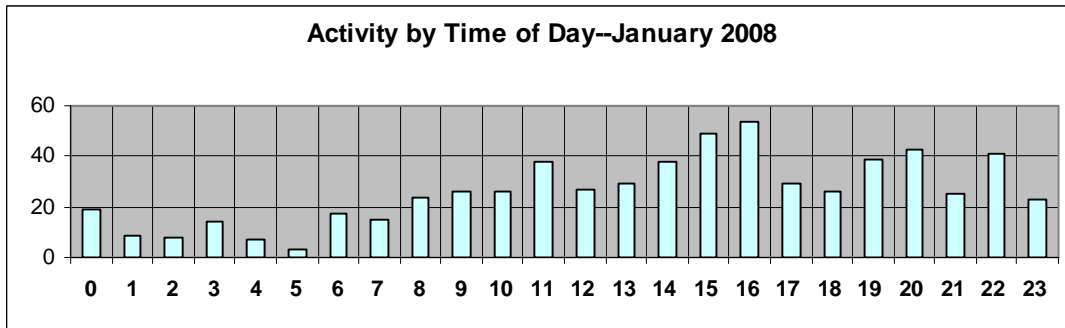
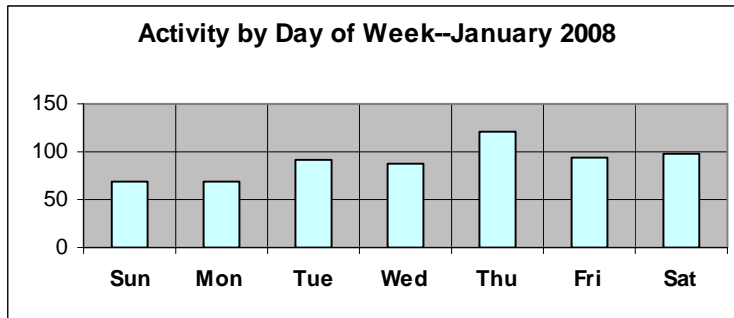




Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

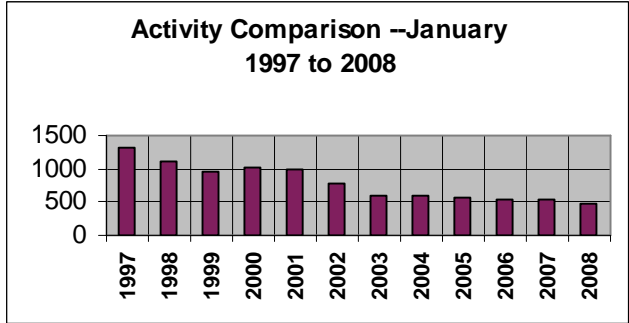
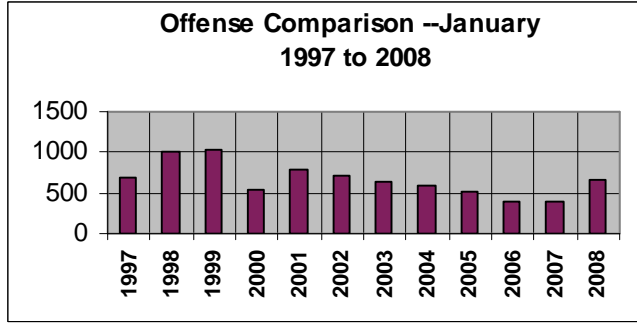

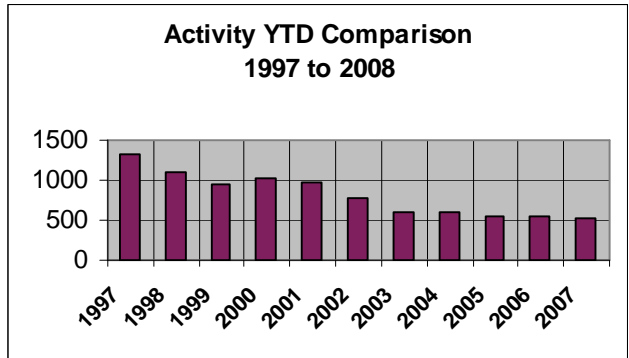
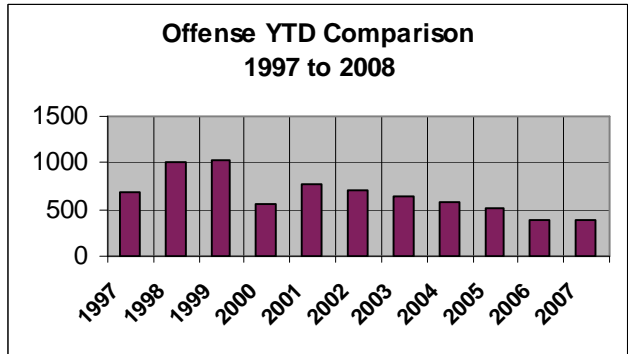


Offense and Activity Comparison:

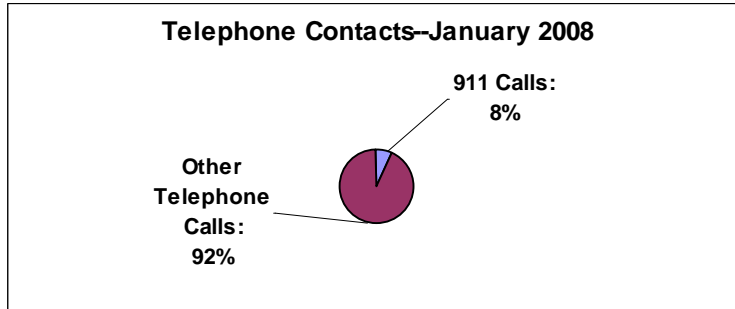


Years to Date:



Communications:

Communications handled over 4851 telephone contacts and 406 9-1-1 calls in January 2008. This is a daily average of 156 telephone contacts and thirteen 9-1-1 calls.

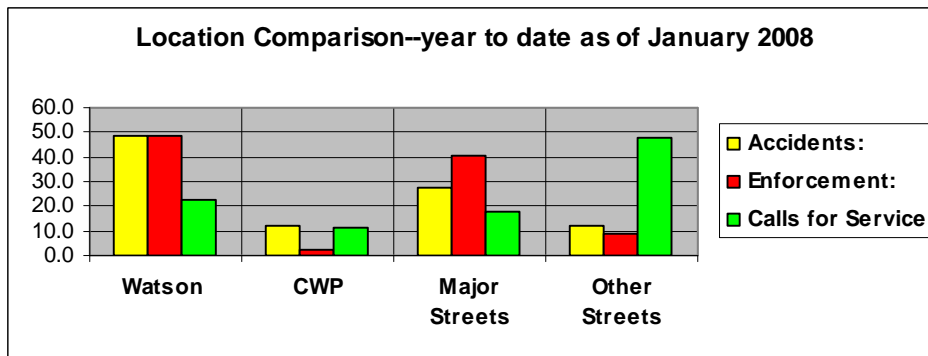


Location Comparison:
