Topic: July 2007 Public Report

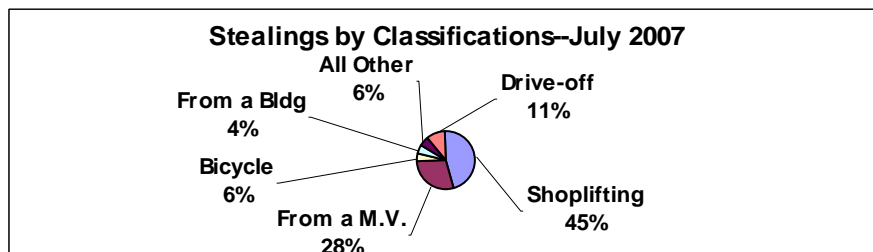
This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of July 2007. In July 2007, there were 83 Part I offenses and 428 Part II offenses for a total of 511. This compares with 85 Part I offenses and 495 Part II offenses for a total of 580 in July 2006. The main difference was in the number of traffic stops.

There was one sexual offense in July. On 07-15-2007, a male reported that he had been sexually assaulted by a male friend. The victim had taken himself to an emergency room and the emergency room called this Department.

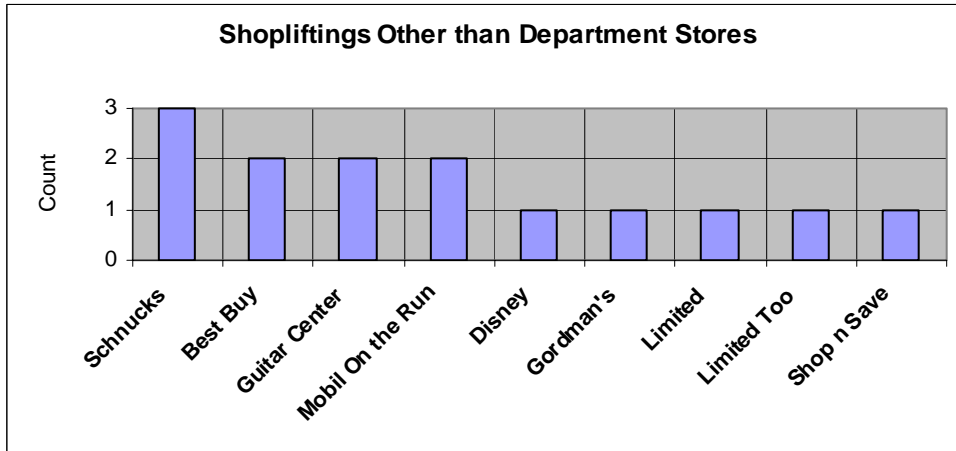
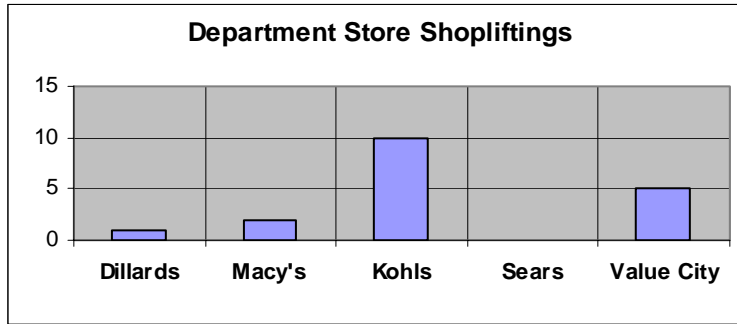
There were three assaults in July 2007 and two involved domestic violence. In all cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

There were two burglaries reported in July. The first, reported on 07-28-2007, was a residential burglary on Pinellas where someone had forced open a window on a residence while the victim was on vacation. A jar of coins was taken. The second, reported on 07-29-2007, was a business burglary where entry was made through the roof but nothing appeared missing from the business. The building alarm sounded and may have scared the perpetrators away.

Stealing offenses numbered 71 in July 2007 and were of the following classifications in July 2007:



Shopliftings accounted for 32 of the 71 stealings in July 2007 or 45%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in July 2007:

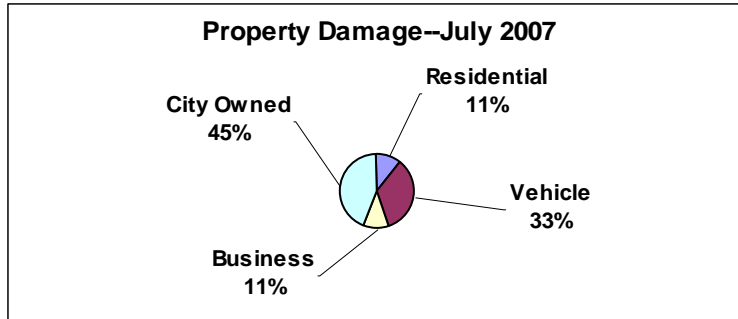


Of the shopliftings, 78% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 76% and juveniles accounted for 24% of the clearances.

There were nine property damages in July 2007 and they were of the following classifications:



The City Owned property damages included construction barrels on a slab replacement street, two different vandalisms to the house in Whitecliff Park and a urinal damaged in Crestwood Park.

There were no receiving stolen properties or stolen vehicles in July 2007.

Part I offenses numbered 83 in July 2007.

Part II:

In July 2007, there were ten frauds reported, six bad checks, two credit card frauds and two all other type frauds. There were two offenses against public peace, one harassment and one annoying telephone call complaint. There were four DWI cases and 63 people related calls, including 61 sick cases and accidental injuries, one suicide or attempt and one sudden death. There were nine animal related calls and five juvenile offenses including two curfew violations, one minor in possession, one juvenile all other offense and one protective custody. There was one family offense involving possible abuse of the elderly.

Part II offenses totaled 399 in July 2007.

In July 2007 in Ward One, there was one sexual offense and one burglary at a business along Watson Road. Stealings numbered fifteen with twelve at addresses on Watson Road and three in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered one with one in the neighborhoods and there were no stolen vehicles. There were four frauds, one juvenile related and one family offense. There were two DWI cases and six traffic accidents, sixteen people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered seventeen and occurred on eight different streets and there were 48 miscellaneous police service calls.

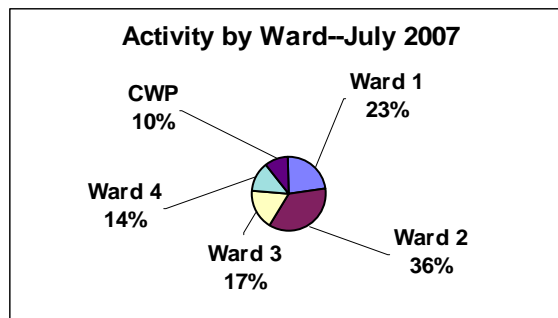
In Ward Two in July 2007, there was one burglary on Pinellas. Stealings numbered thirty-seven with thirty-two at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and five in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered one with one at addresses along Watson Road and Big Bend and none in the neighborhoods. There were no stolen vehicles. There were five frauds, two DWI cases, eight traffic accidents, twenty-two people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered twenty-one and occurred on nine different streets and there were 68 calls for miscellaneous police services.

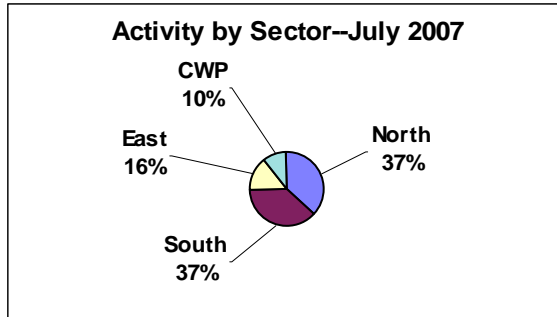
In July 2007 in Ward Three, stealings numbered ten with six at addresses on Watson Road, two in Whitecliff Park and two in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered four, none at addresses along Watson Road, two in Whitecliff Park and two in the neighborhoods. There were no stolen vehicles. There was one fraud, one juvenile related offense, no DWI cases, three traffic accidents, eight people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered fourteen and occurred on seven different streets and there were 36 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in July 2007, stealings numbered two and property damages numbered two and there were no stolen vehicles. There were three juvenile related offenses and no DWI cases and one traffic accidents, fourteen people related calls and three animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered twelve and occurred on eight different streets and there were 32 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered seven with six shopliftings and one from buildings. Property damages numbered one and there were no stolen vehicles. There were two offenses against public peace, no DWI cases and five traffic accidents, three people related calls and no animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered ten and there were 24 police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

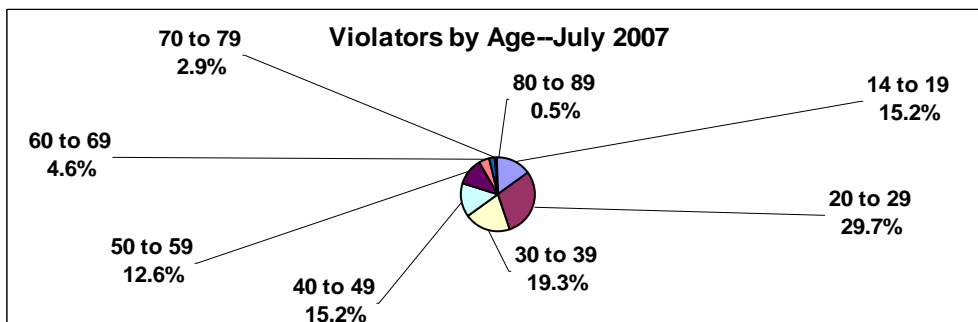

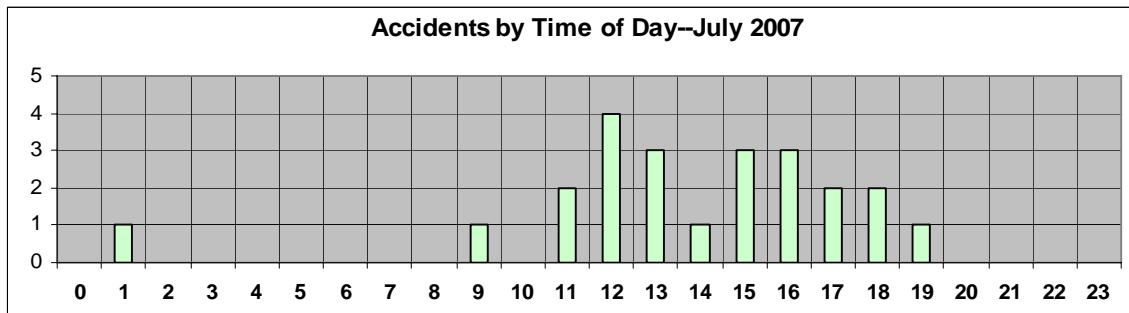

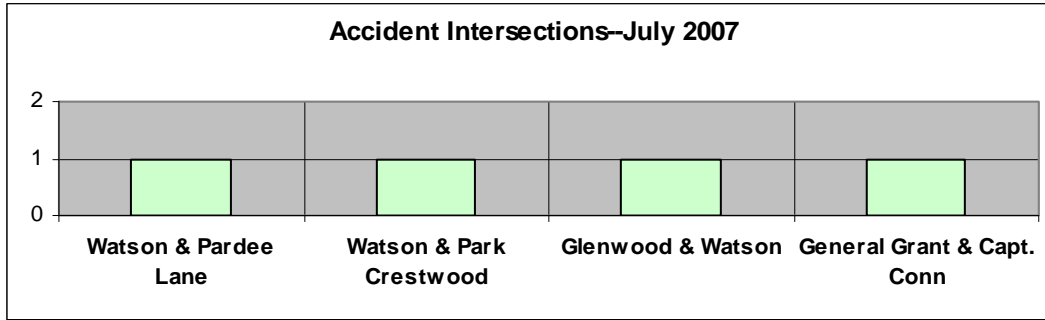
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



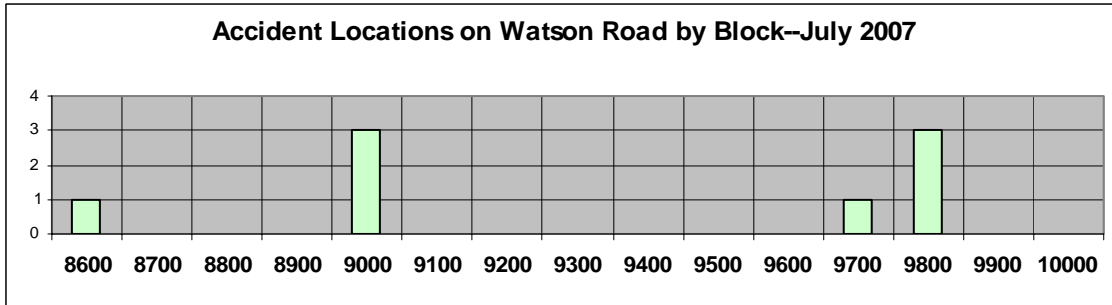
Accidents occurred on the following streets in July 2007:

Accidents occurred in the following blocks of Watson Road:



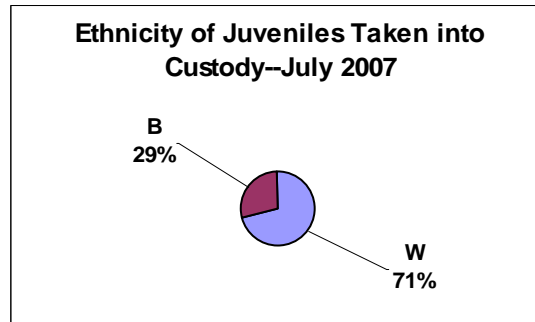
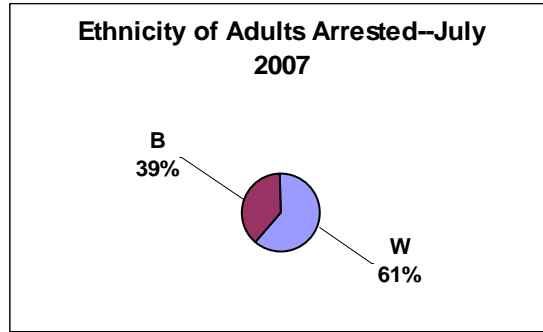

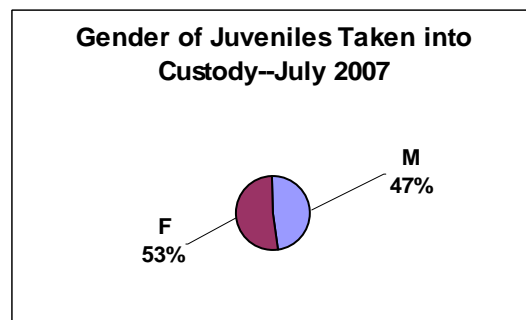
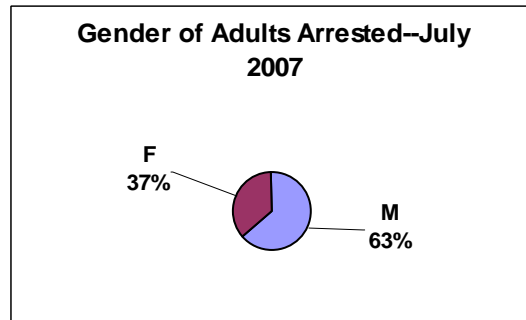
Arrest Information:

Eighty-four adults and seventeen juveniles were taken into custody in July 2007. Fourteen persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

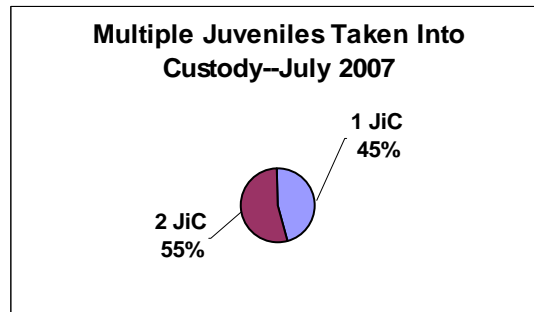
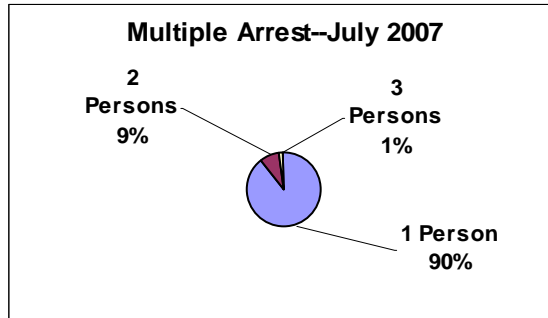
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



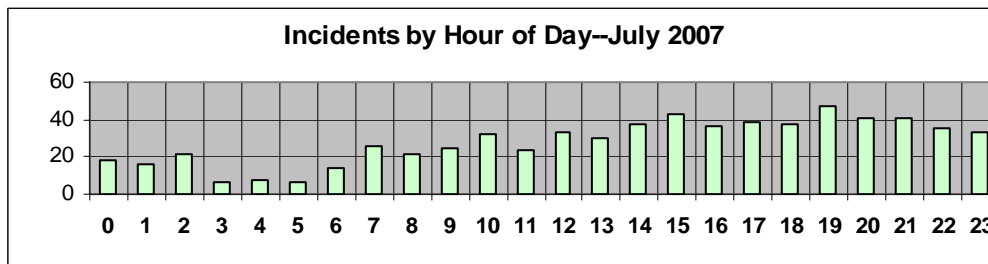
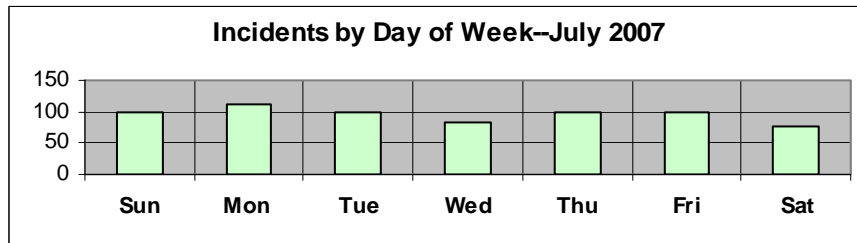
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

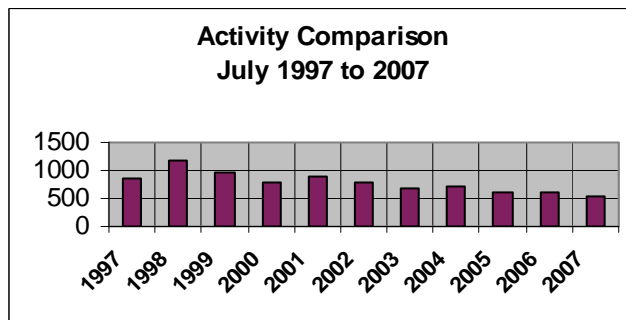
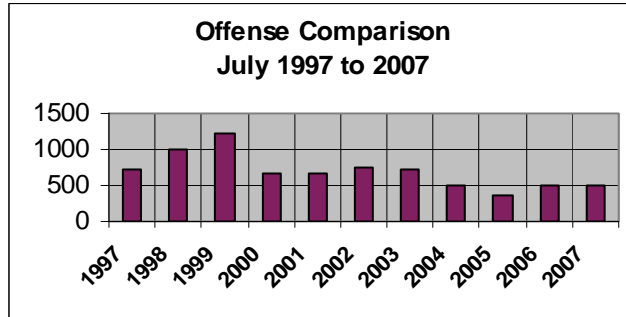

Activity occurred on the following days of the week and hours of the day:

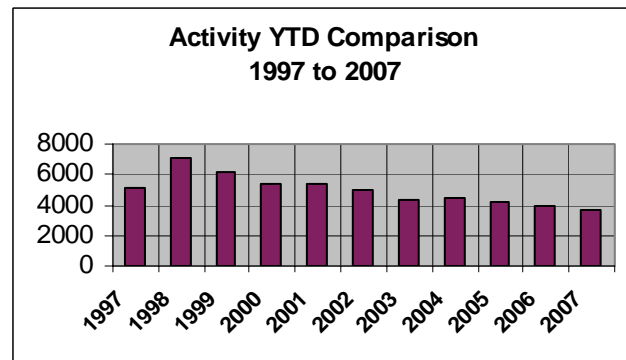
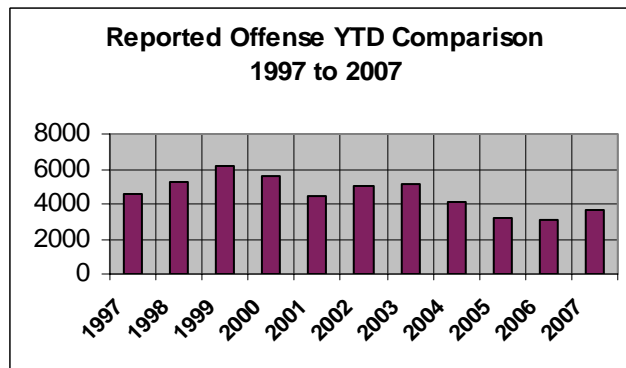


Offense and Activity Comparison:

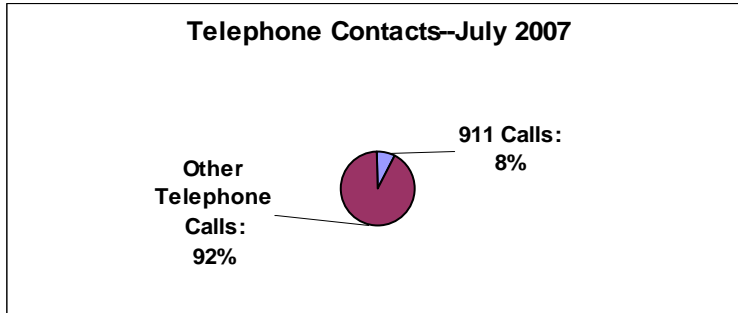


Years to Date:

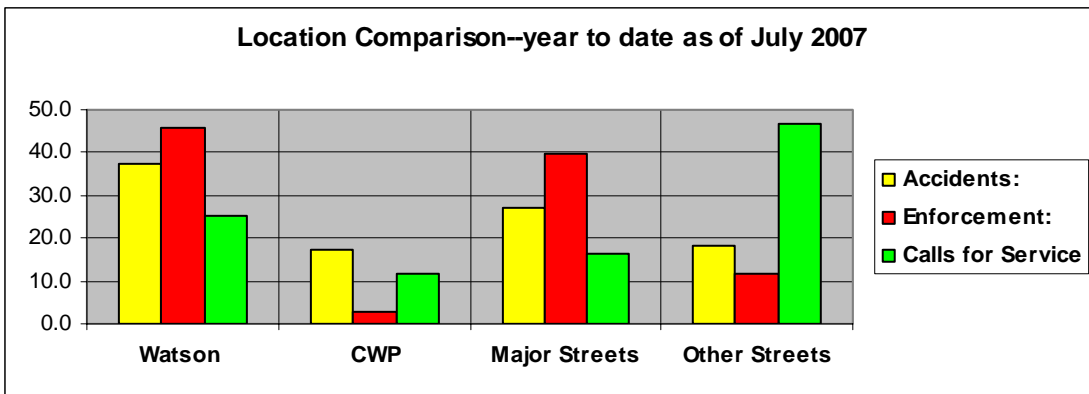
