Topic: June 2008 Public Report

This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of June 2008. In June 2008, there were 81 Part I offenses and 442 Part II offenses for a total of 523. This compares with 57 Part I offenses and 500 Part II offenses for a total of 557 in June 2007. The main difference was in the number of stealings and traffic stops.

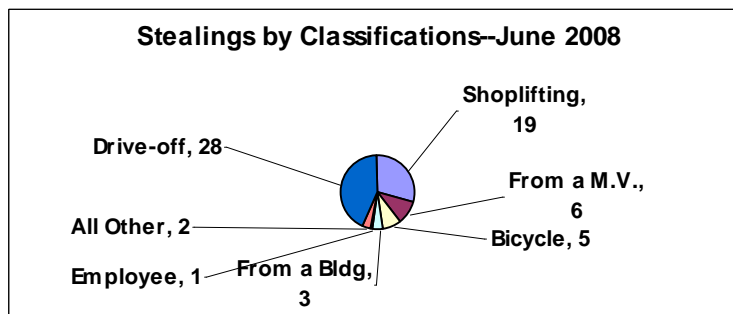
There was one robbery in June. A shoplifter shoved a store employee after the shoplifter had concealed a bottle of liquor and was confronted by the store employee. The employee was not injured and the shoplifter was taken into custody by Store Security.

There were four assaults in June 2008 and four involved domestic violence. In all cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

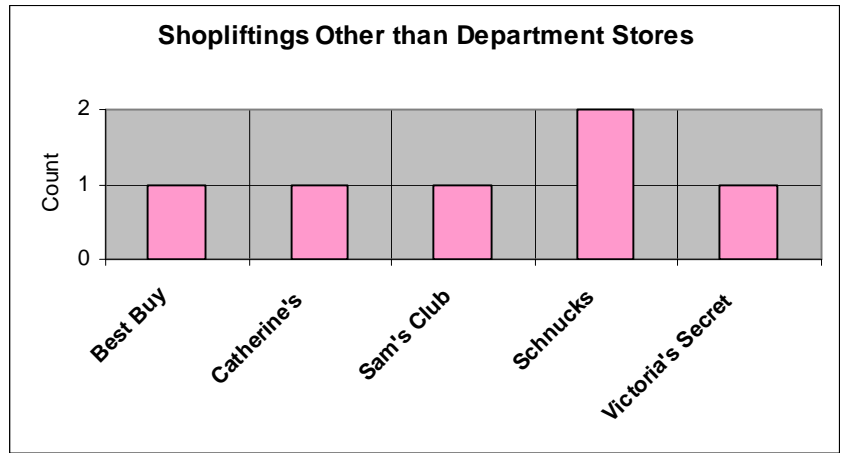
There were two burglaries reported in June. The first was reported on 06-13-08 on Fox Park Dr. During the day, someone broke into the residence and some jewelry was taken. The second burglary occurred on 06-19-2008 on Reco. A business' outbuilding was broken into and construction equipment and tools were stolen.

Stealing offenses numbered 64 in June 2008.

Stealings were of the following classifications in June 2008:

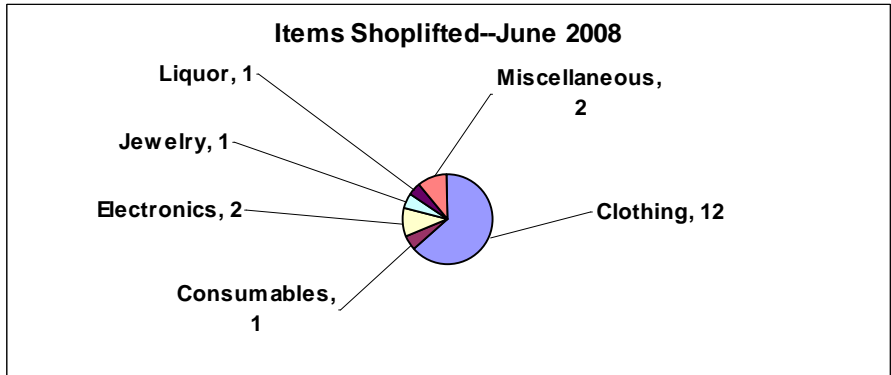


Shopliftings accounted for nineteen of the 64 stealings in June 2008 or 30%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in June 2008:

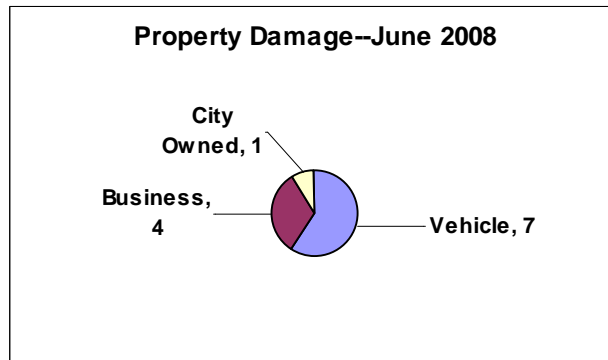


Of the shopliftings, 95% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 61% and juveniles accounted for 39% of the clearances.

There were twelve property damages in June 2008 and they were of the following classifications:



The City Owned property damage was a damaged sign at the tennis courts in Spellman Park.

There were two stolen vehicles in June 2008. The first occurred on 06-02-2008 and was a Kawasaki motorcycle stolen from a residence on Apex. The second was a 2006 Ford F350 pickup that was stolen on 06-23-2008 and was later recovered in St. Louis City.

Part I offenses numbered 81 in June 2008.

Part II:

In June 2008, there were eight frauds reported, four forgeries, two credit card frauds and two other type frauds. There was one drug possession case that involved a small amount of marijuana. The five offenses against public peace included three annoying telephone calls, one disorderly conduct and one trespassing. There was one DWI case and the 58 people related incidents included 55 medical emergencies, two missing persons and one suicide or attempt suicide. The three juvenile offenses included two minor in possession cases and one curfew. The three family offenses involved three ex-parte order violations.

Part II offenses totaled 442 in June 2008.

In June 2008 in Ward One, stealings numbered ten with four at addresses on Watson Road and six in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered three, two at addresses along Watson Industrial and one in the neighborhoods. There were four frauds, one drug offenses and three offenses against public peace. There was one DWI case and ten traffic accidents, sixteen people related calls and four animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered 24 and occurred on seventeen different streets and there were 51 miscellaneous police service calls.

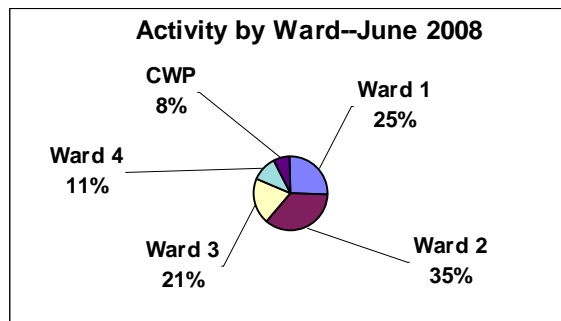
In Ward Two in June 2008, there was one robbery involving a shoplifter and two burglaries, a residential burglary on Fox Park and a business burglary on Reco. Stealings numbered 31 with 27 at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend, three in the neighborhoods and one in an industrial area. Property damages numbered three with three in the neighborhoods. There were two stolen vehicles, a motorcycle and a pickup truck. There were two frauds, one offense against public peace and one juvenile related offense. There were sixteen traffic accidents, fifteen people related calls and three animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered thirteen occurred on seven different streets and there were 62 calls for miscellaneous police services.

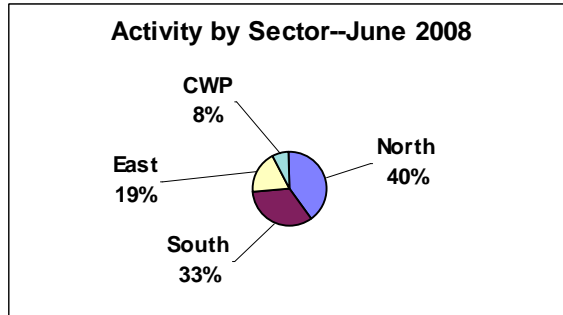
In June 2008 in Ward Three, stealings numbered thirteen with ten at addresses on Watson Road, two in the neighborhoods and one in Whitecliff Park. Property damages numbered five, two at addresses along Watson Road and three in the neighborhoods. There were two frauds, one offense against public peace and three family offenses. There were three traffic accidents, twelve people related calls and one animal related call. Suspicious activity calls numbered ten and occurred on six different streets and there were 46 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in June 2008, there were no stealings or property damages. There were eleven people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered seven and occurred on seven different streets and there were 36 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered ten with ten shopliftings and property damages numbered one. There were three traffic accidents, four people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered four and there were thirteen police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

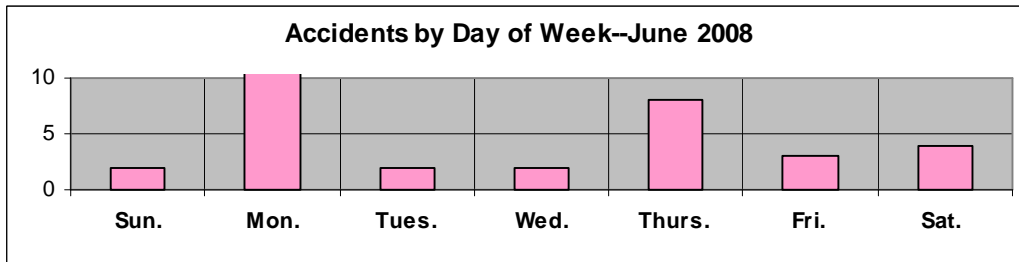

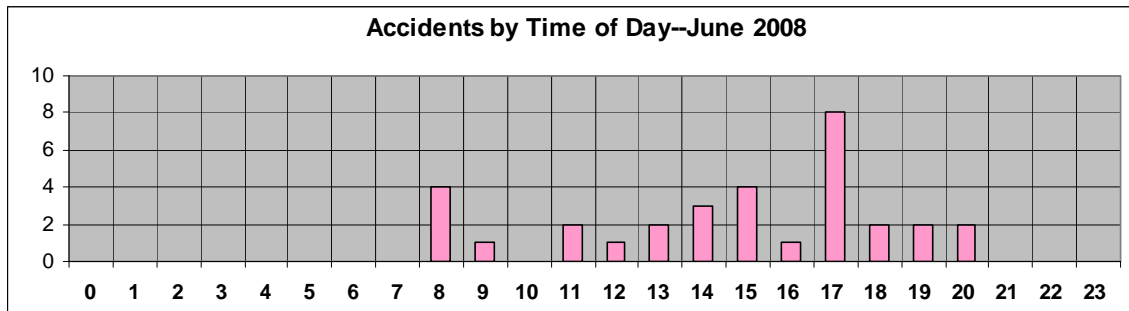

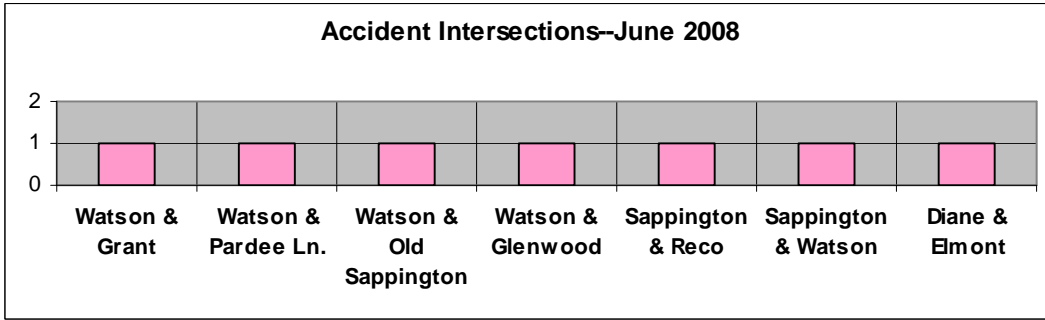
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



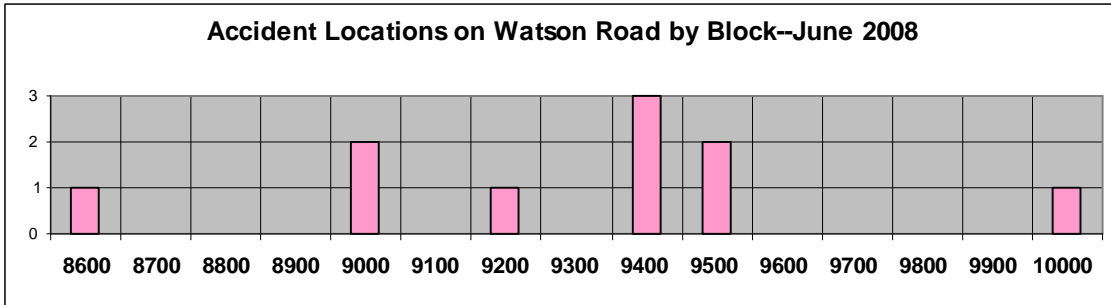
Accidents occurred on the following streets in June 2008:



Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



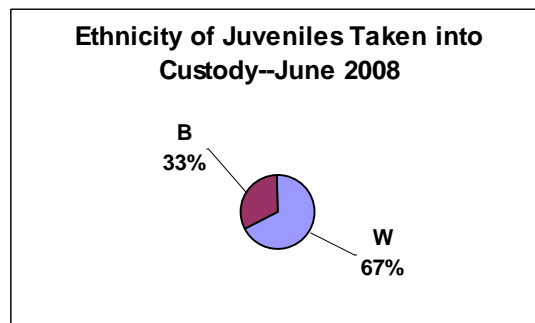
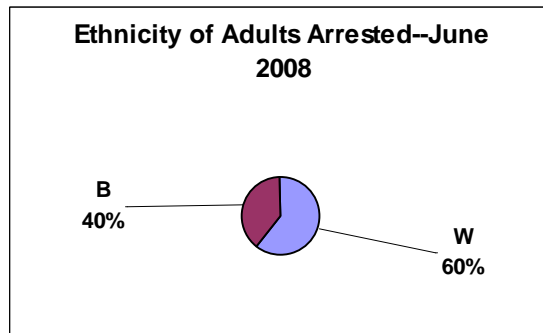
Accidents occurred in the following blocks of Watson Road:



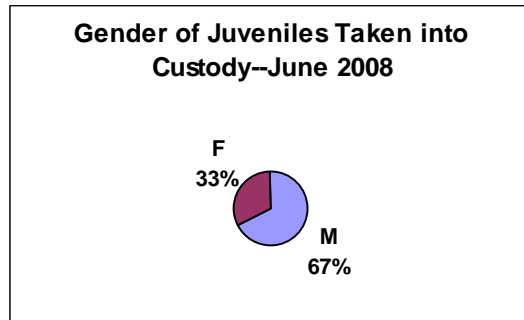
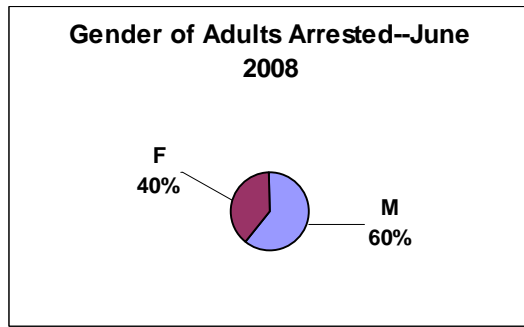
Arrest Information:

Fifty-eight adults and fifteen juveniles were taken into custody in June 2008. Nine persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

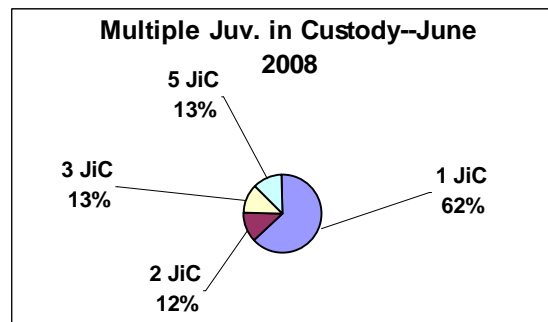
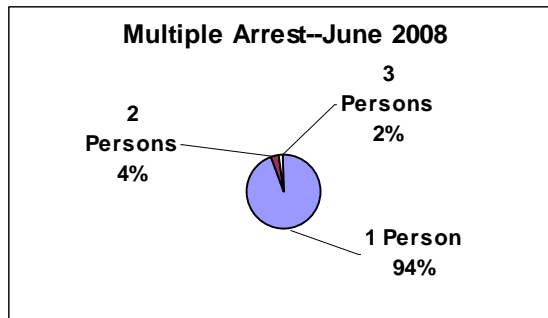
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



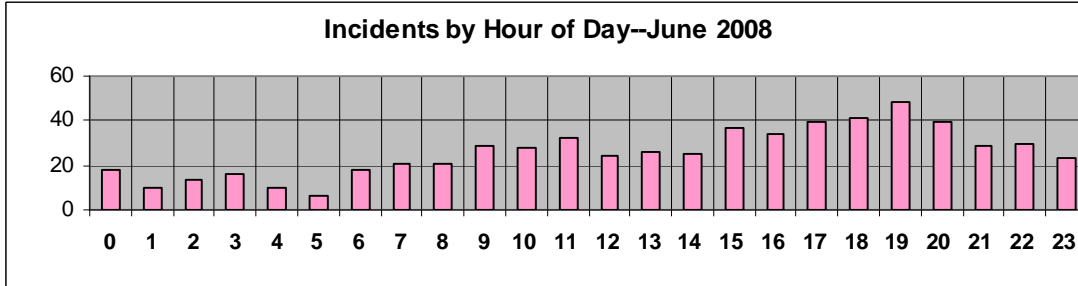
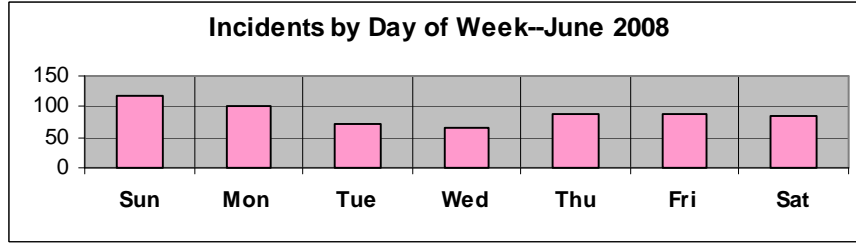
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

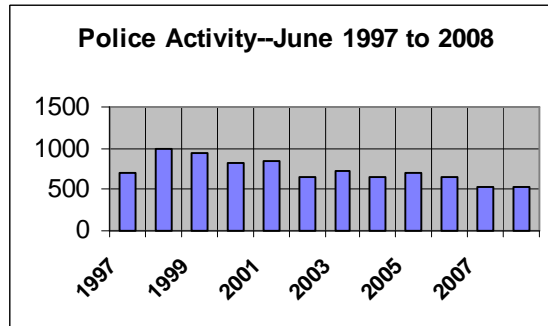
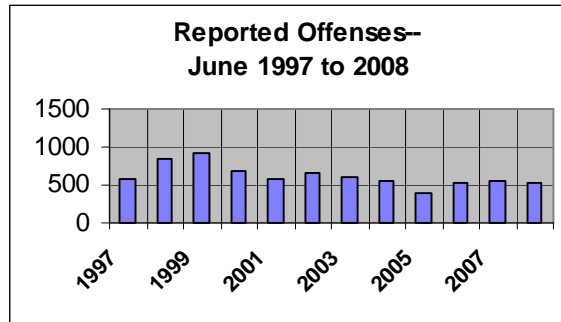

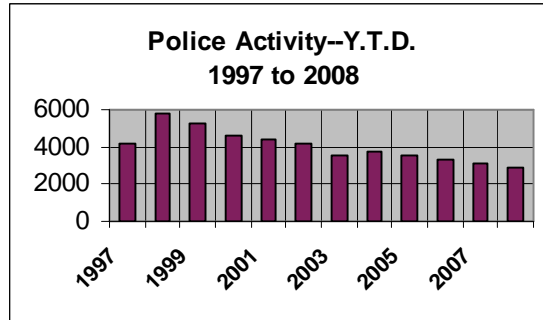
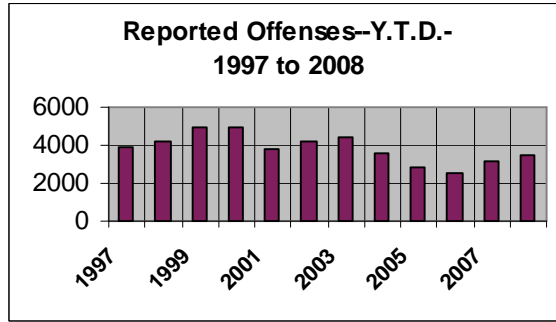


Offense and Activity Comparison:

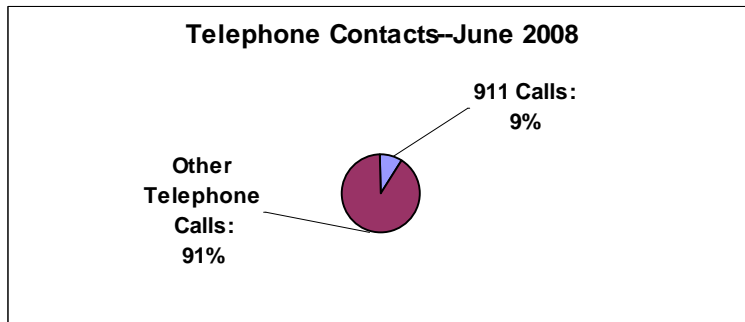


Years to Date:

Communications handled over 4271 telephone contacts and 447 9-1-1 calls in June 2008. This is a daily average of 142 telephone contacts and fifteen 9-1-1 calls.

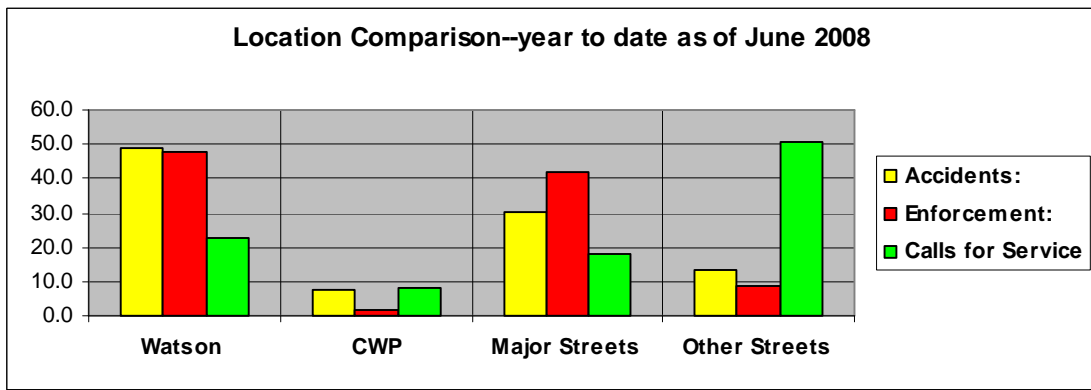


Location Comparison:
