Topic: June 2009 Public Report

This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of June 2009. In June 2009, there were 43 Part I offenses and 340 Part II offenses for a total of 383. This compares with 81 Part I offenses and 442 Part II offenses for a total of 523 in June 2008. The main difference was in the number of stealings, traffic accidents and traffic stops.

There was one sexual assault reported in June. A female victim reported that she had been sexually assaulted by a neighbor. The investigation is continuing into this case.

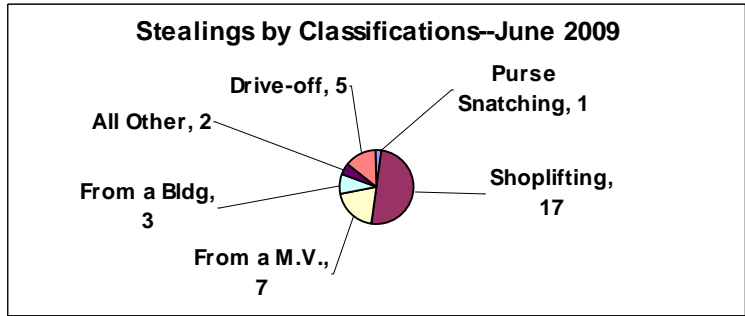
There was one robbery reported. On 06-10-09, an employee of a business on Watson Road answered the delivery buzzer for the business about 7:05AM. The employee opened the door and was grabbed by a male, who struck the employee with some object on the head. The employee was able to break free from the male and was able to lock the door and called for the Police. The male had attempted to take the victim's wallet but was unsuccessful and the employee did not request medical attention.

There was one burglary in June. On 06-04-2009, at a residence on Garber Road, a male and a female, who said that they were with a tree service distracted the victim and his son into the yard while the female entered the unlocked residence and removed cash from a bedroom.

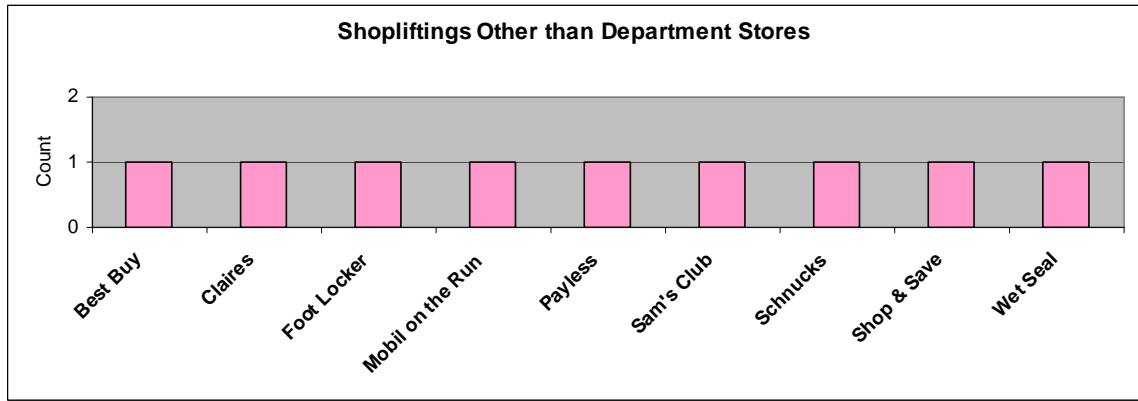
There were two assaults in June 2009 and two involved domestic violence. In both cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

Stealing offenses numbered 35 in June 2009.

Stealings were of the following classifications in June 2009:

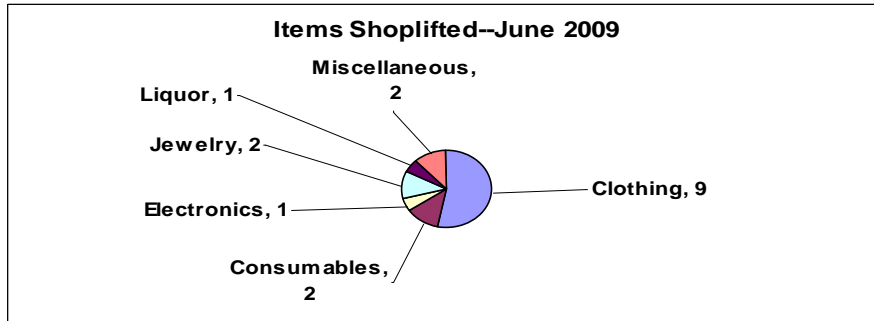


Shopliftings accounted for 17 of the 35 stealings in June 2009 or 49%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in June 2009:

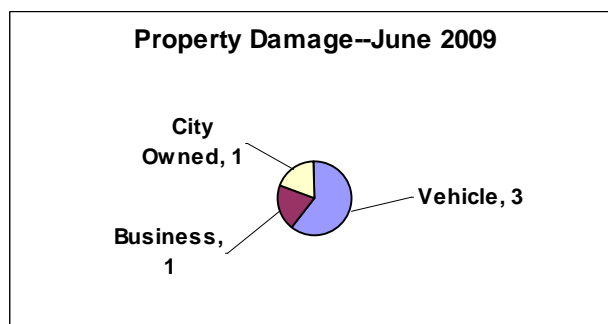


Of the shopliftings, 59% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 80% and juveniles accounted for 20% of the clearances.

There were five property damages in June 2009 and they were of the following classifications:



The City Owned property damage was to the pool furniture and a pool vacuum control at the Aquatics Center.

Part I offenses numbered 43 in June 2009.

**Part II:**

In June 2009, there were three frauds reported, one counterfeiting, one passing a bad check and one all other type fraud. The possession of drug paraphernalia case involved the possession of syringes, metal spoon and tubing used in drug usage. The one offense against public peace was an annoying telephone call. There were fifteen animal related calls and 59 people related calls including 54 medical emergencies, two missing persons, two sudden deaths and one suicide or attempt suicide. There was one juvenile case of the all other type and two family offenses that involved Ex-Parte Order Violations.

Part II offenses totaled 340 in June 2009.

In June 2009 in Ward One, there was one robbery, stealings numbered six with three at addresses on Watson Road, two at addresses on Watson Industrial and one in the neighborhoods. There was one fraud and one juvenile offense. There were three traffic accidents, 19 people related calls and five animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eleven and occurred on eight different streets and there were 76 miscellaneous police service calls.

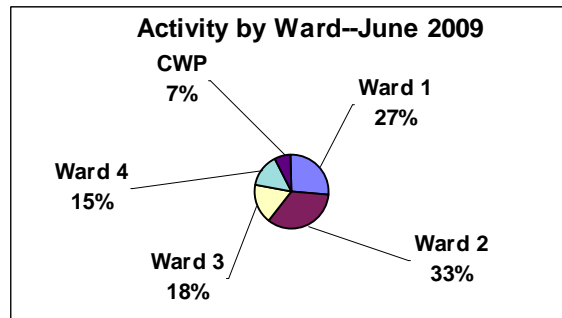
In Ward Two in June 2009, stealings numbered twelve with eleven at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered one, in the neighborhoods. There was one fraud and two family offenses. There were eight traffic accidents, thirteen people related calls and three animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered thirteen and occurred on eight different streets and there were 97 calls for miscellaneous police services.

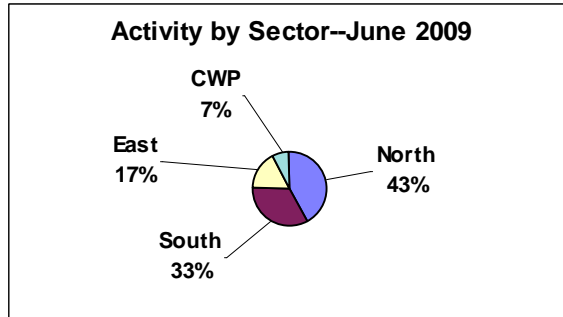
In June 2009 in Ward Three, stealings numbered two with one at addresses on Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods and property damages numbered two with both in the neighborhoods. There was one fraud, one drug offense and one offense against public peace. There were four traffic accidents, eighteen people related calls and four animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eight and occurred on five different streets and there were 40 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in June 2009, there was one burglary reported on Garber Road and stealings numbered one. There was one traffic accidents, seven people related calls and three animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered four and occurred on three different streets and there were 43 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered fourteen with eleven shopliftings and three from vehicles and property damages numbered two. There were three traffic accidents and two people related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered three and there were nine police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

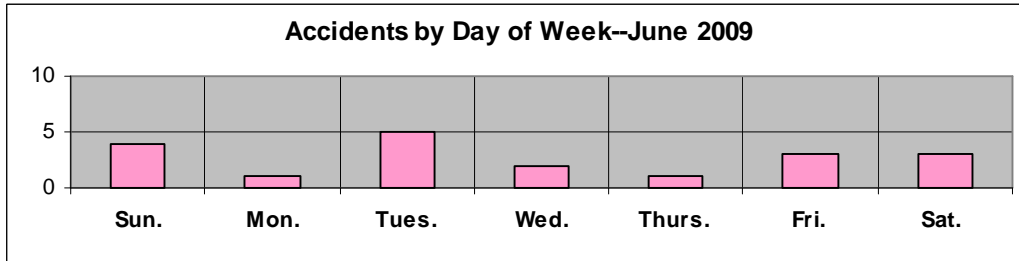
**Traffic Accidents:**

In June 2009, there were 19 traffic accidents reported. These accidents were of the following classifications:

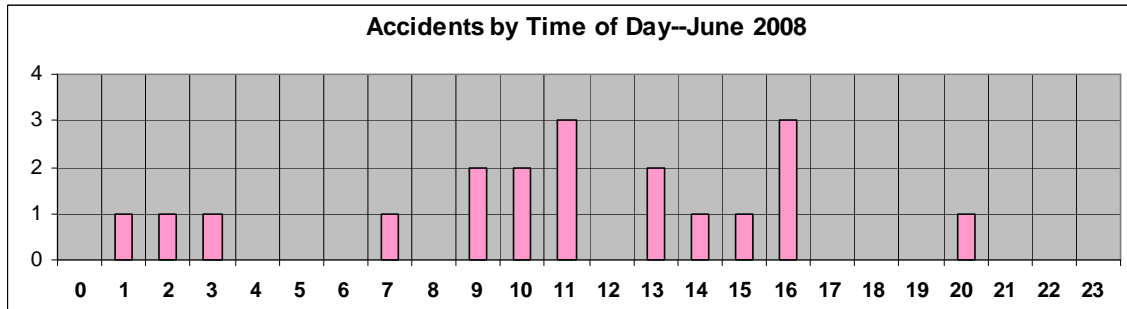

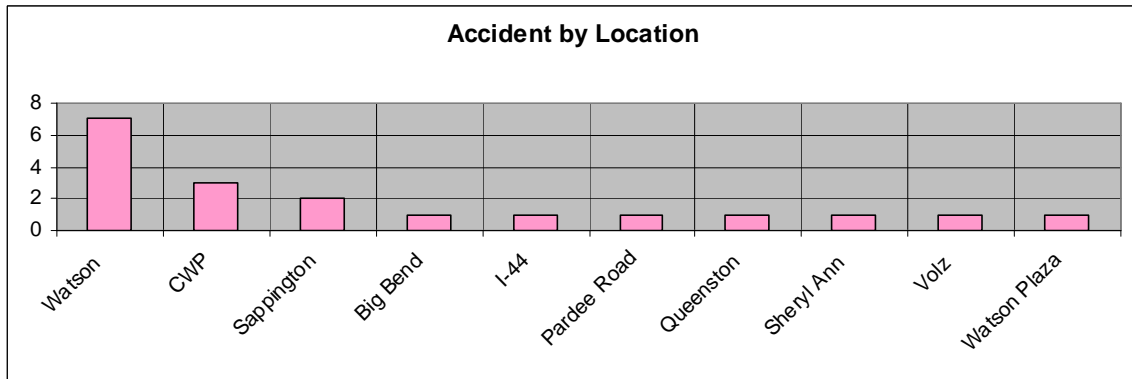

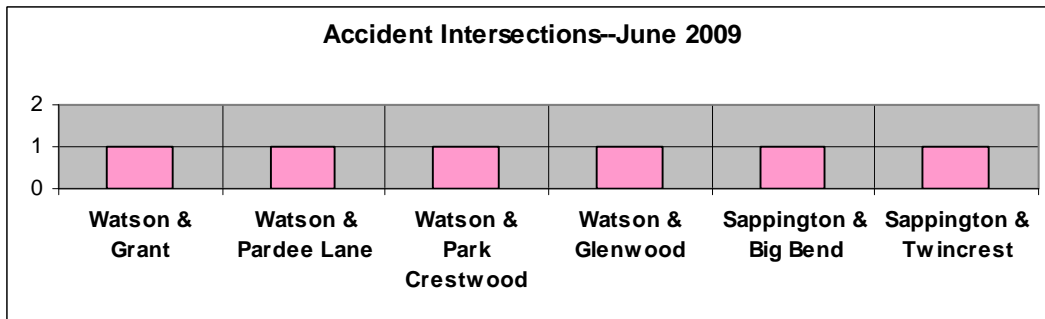
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



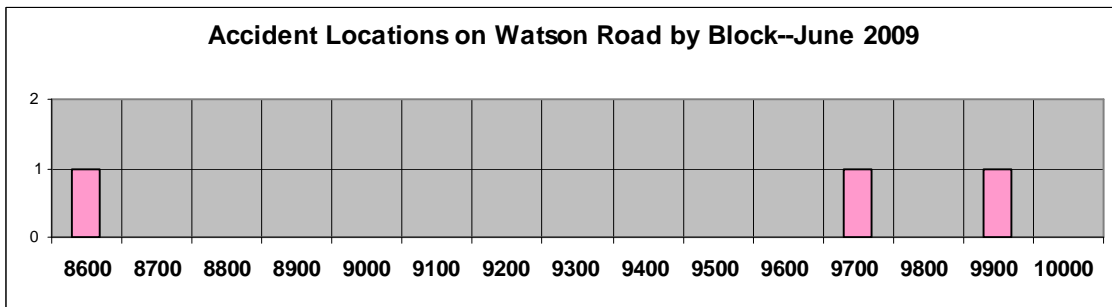
Accidents occurred on the following streets in June 2009:



Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



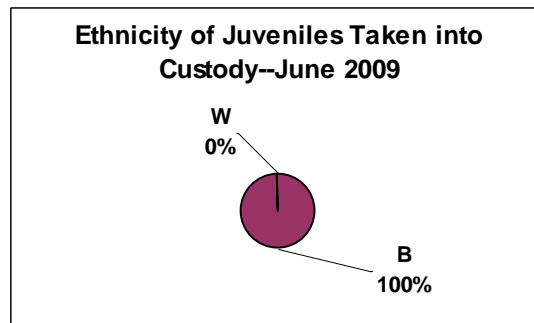
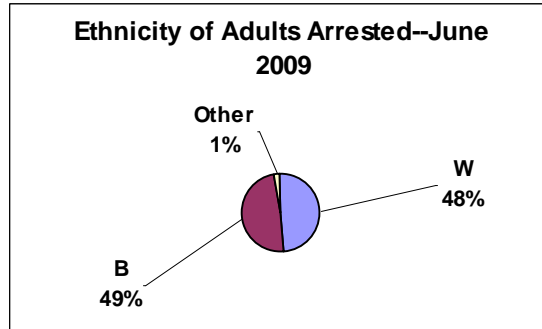
Accidents occurred in the following blocks of Watson Road:



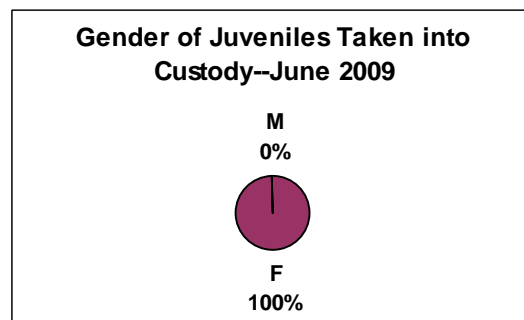
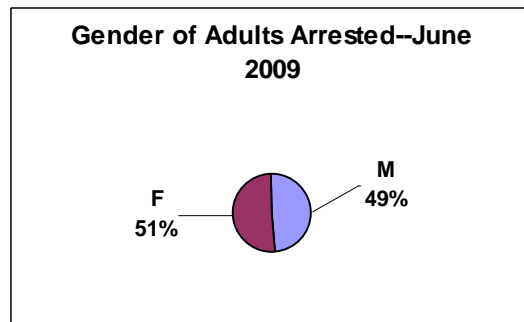
**Arrest Information:**

Thirty-seven adults and five juveniles were taken into custody in June 2009. Five persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

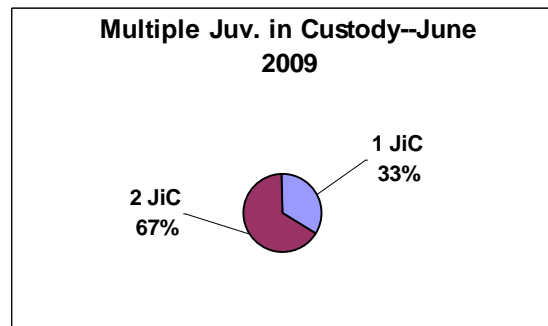
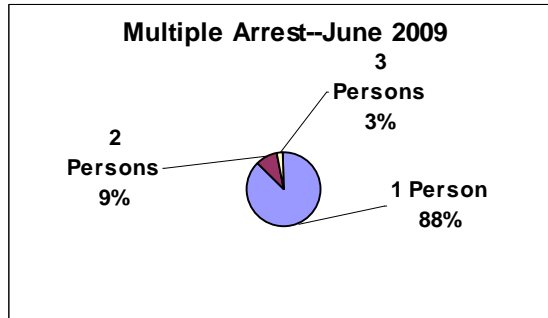
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



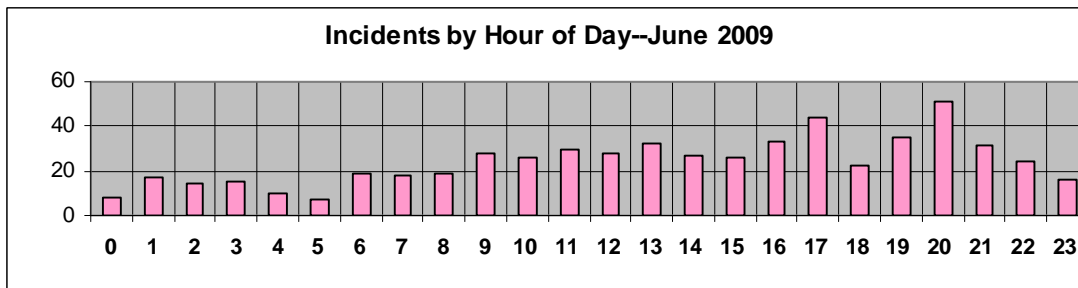
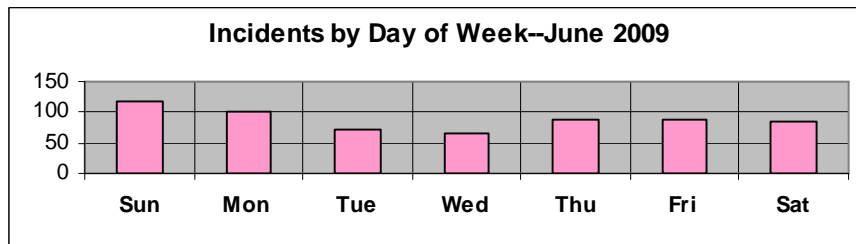
**Multiple Arrests:**



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

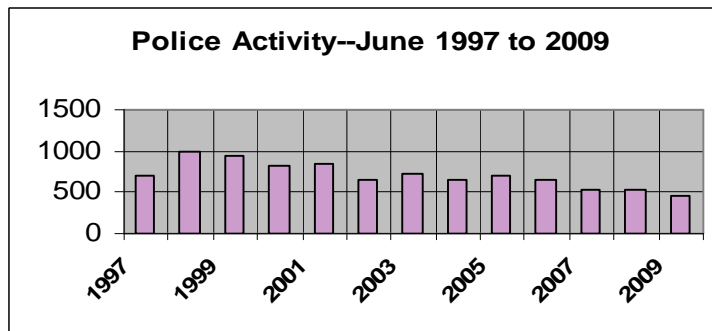
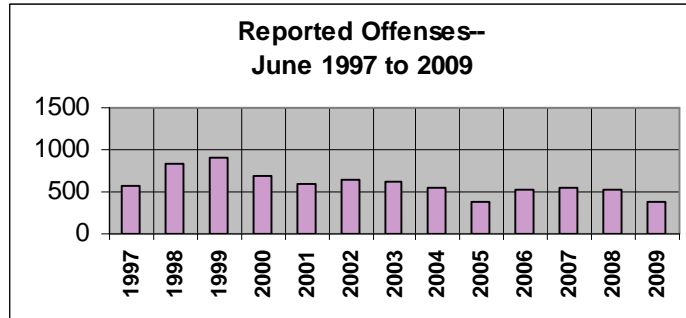

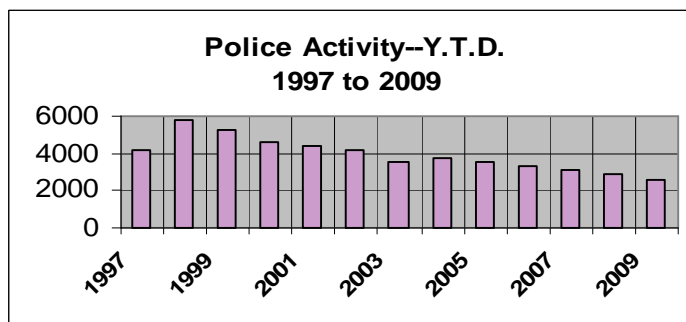
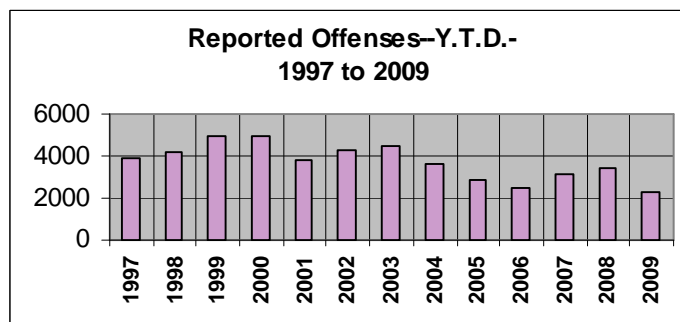


**Offense and Activity Comparison:**

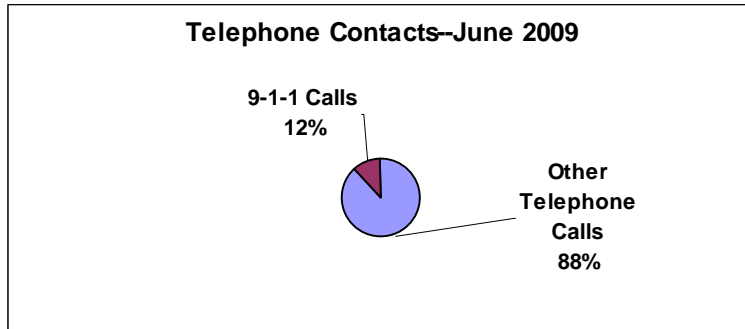


Years to Date:

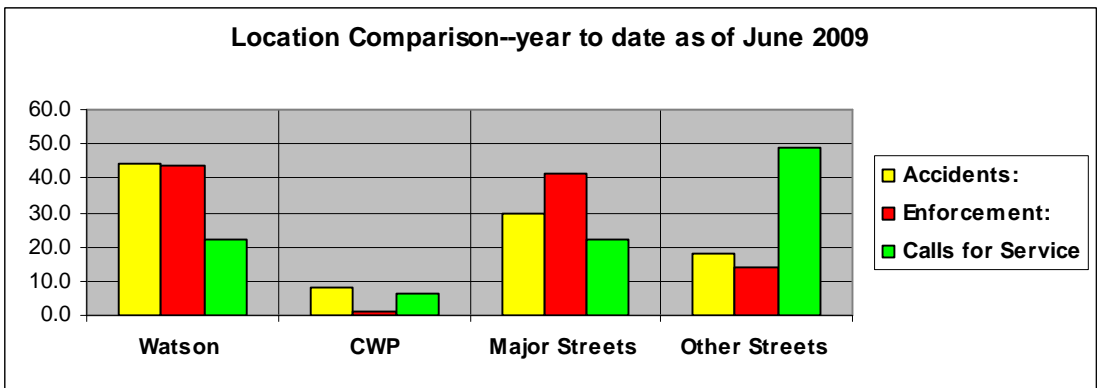


**Location Comparison:**
