Topic: March 2007 Public Report

This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of March 2007. In March 2007, there were 63 Part I offenses and 519 Part II offenses for a total of 582. This compares with 90 Part I offenses and 279 Part II offenses for a total of 369 in March 2006. The main difference was in the number of traffic stops, stealings, property damages and auto thefts.

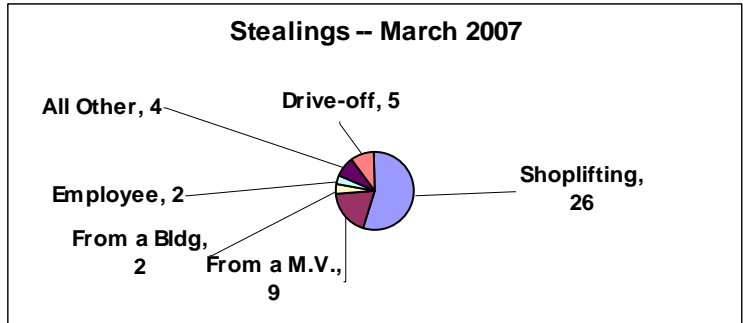
There were no homicides or sexual assaults in March but there was one robbery. On 03-21-2007, the Southwest Bank was robbed by a lone male. The male drove from the scene. This male was also involved in robberies in the South section of St. Louis County. After a Task Force was formed, the male was identified and taken into custody and warrants were issued.

There were three assaults in March 2007 and two involved domestic violence. In all cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

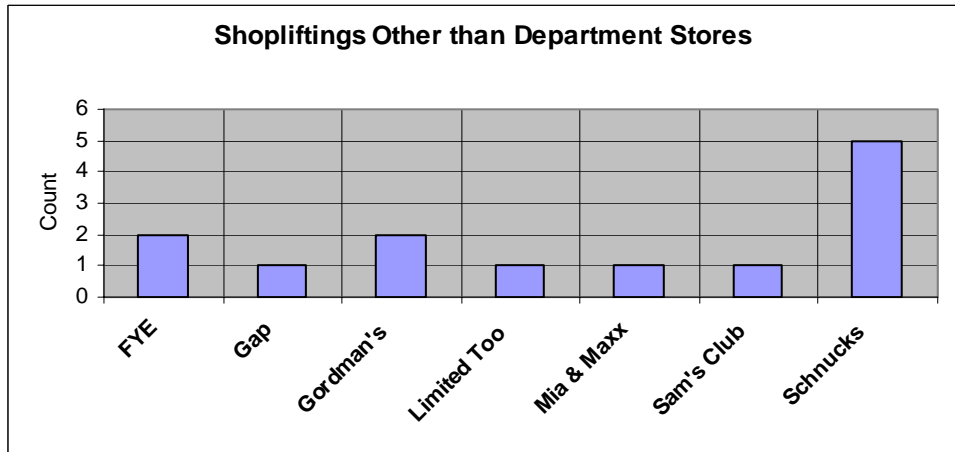
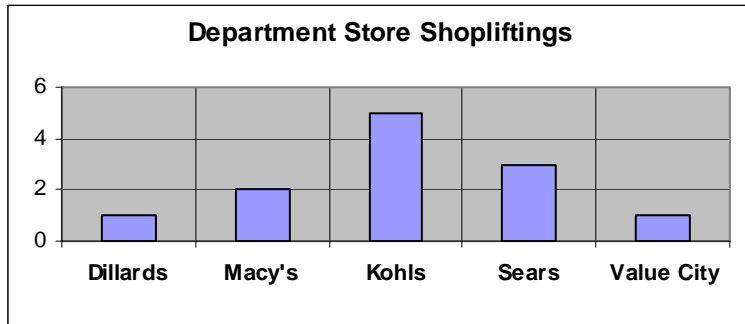
There were two burglaries reported in March. On 03-05-2007, a nail salon on Watson Road was broken into by breaking out a glass window and entering and removing 20 bottles of polish. The second burglary occurred at a storage business on Watson Road. Someone had cut the locks on some lockers at the business.

Stealing offenses numbered 48 in March 2007.

Stealings were of the following classifications in March 2007:

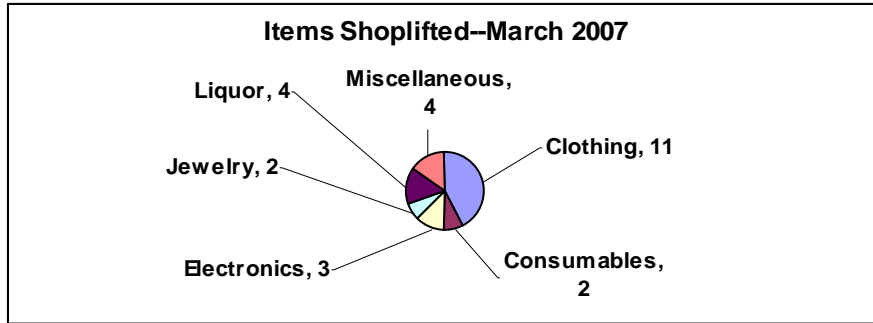


Shopliftings accounted for 26 of the 48 stealings in March 2007 or 55%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in March 2007:

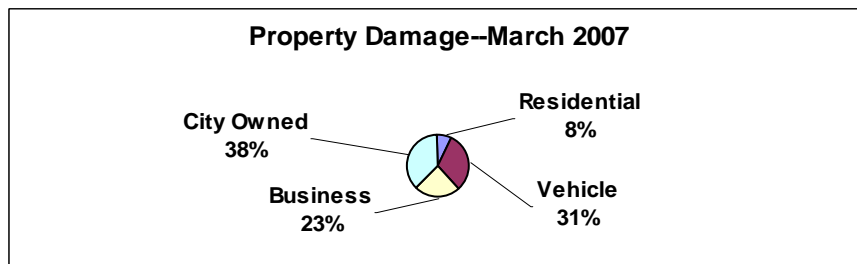


Of the shopliftings, 81% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 67%, adults and juveniles accounted for 14% and juveniles accounted for 19% of the clearances.

There were 13 property damages in March 2007 and they were of the following classifications:



The City Owned involved a damaged street sign and vandalism in two parks. The vehicle property damages included flattened tires and broken mirrors. Business property damages included graffiti on some buildings and the residential property damage was to the interior of a residence by an out of control son.

There were no receiving stolen properties or stolen vehicles in March 2007.

Part I offenses numbered 64 in March 2007.

Part II:

In March 2007, there were eight frauds reported, four bad checks, two credit card frauds, one forgery and one other fraud. There were two drug offenses and three offenses against public peace, two disorderly conducts and one annoying telephone calls. There were six DWI cases, fifteen animal calls and 77 people related calls, including 71 sick cases / accidental injuries, two missing persons, three sudden death and one suicide or attempt. There were three juvenile offenses, all minors in possession of liquor and 64 suspicious activity calls. The four family offenses all involved unattended children in vehicles. There was one unlawful use of a weapon case.

Part II offenses totaled 452 in March 2007.

In March 2007 in Ward One, there were no sexual assaults or burglaries and one robbery at Southwest Bank. Stealings numbered eight with eight at addresses on Watson Road and none in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered six, three at addresses along Watson Road and three in the neighborhoods. There were no stolen vehicles. There were two frauds, one drug offenses, three offenses against public peace, two juvenile related, one family offense and no weapon offenses. There were two DWI cases and six traffic accidents, fourteen people related calls and five animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered fourteen and occurred on five different streets and there were 52 miscellaneous police service calls.

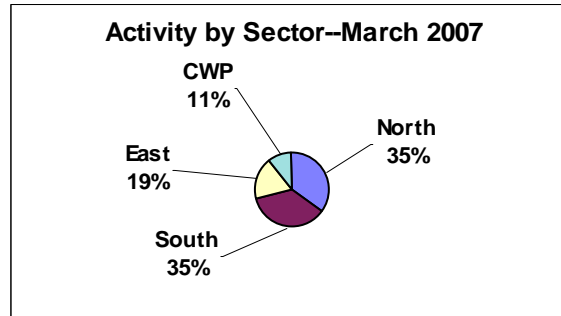
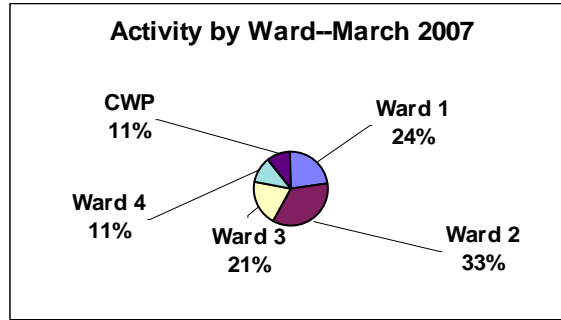
In Ward Two in March 2007, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered fourteen with twelve at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend, one in the neighborhoods and one in an industrial area. Property damages numbered one, one at addresses along Big Bend and none in the neighborhoods. There were no stolen vehicles. There were three frauds, one drug offenses, one family and weapons offenses and no offenses against public peace or juvenile related offenses. There were no DWI cases and twelve traffic accidents, twenty-four people related calls and six animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered twenty-five and occurred on thirteen different streets and there were 95 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In March 2007 in Ward Three, there were no sexual assaults, robberies but there were two burglaries, one at a nail salon and one at a storage facility. Stealings numbered eight with four at addresses on Watson Road and four in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered four, none at addresses along Watson Road, three in the neighborhoods and one in a park. There were no stolen vehicles. There were two frauds, one juvenile and two family offenses and no offenses against public peace or weapon offenses. There were two DWI cases and five traffic accidents, sixteen people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered thirteen and occurred on nine different streets and there were 47 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in March 2007, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered four. Property Damages numbered two and there were no stolen vehicles. There was one fraud and no drug offenses, offenses against public peace, juvenile, family or weapon offenses. There were two DWI cases and two traffic accidents, eighteen people related calls and three animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eight and occurred on seven different streets and there were twenty calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, there were no sexual assaults, robberies, burglaries. Stealings numbered fourteen with eleven shopliftings, two from vehicles, and one all other thefts. There were no property damages or stolen vehicles. There were no frauds, drug offenses, offenses against public peace, juvenile, family or weapons offenses. There were no DWI cases and three traffic accidents, five people related calls and no animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered four and there were twenty-seven police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

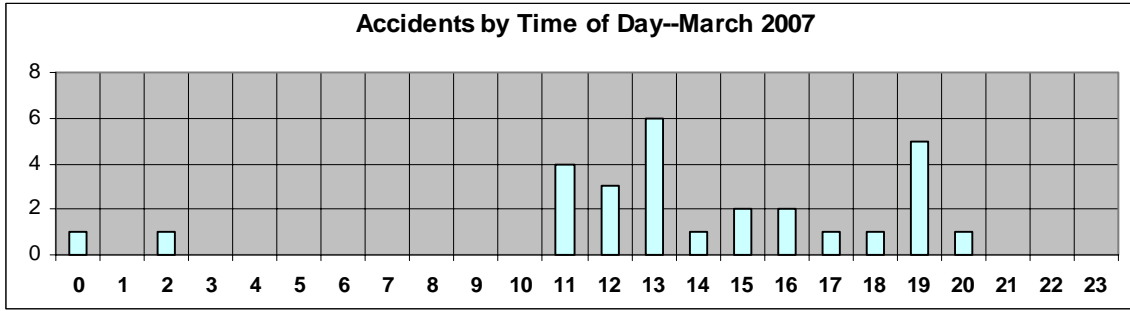

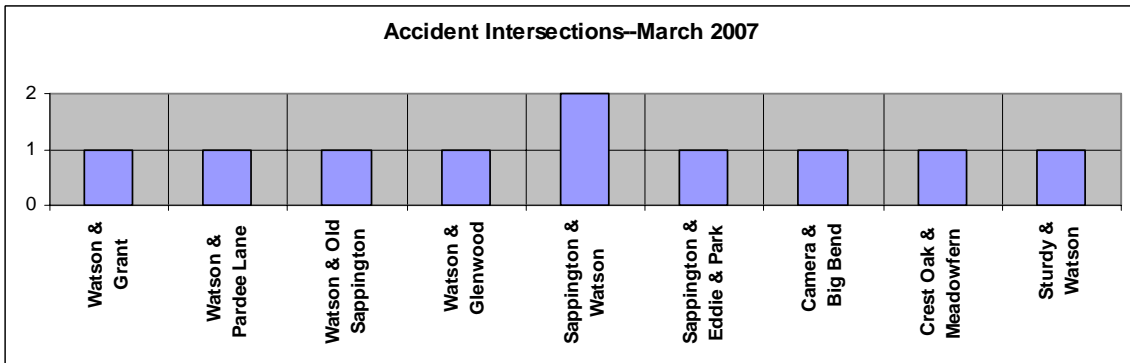
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



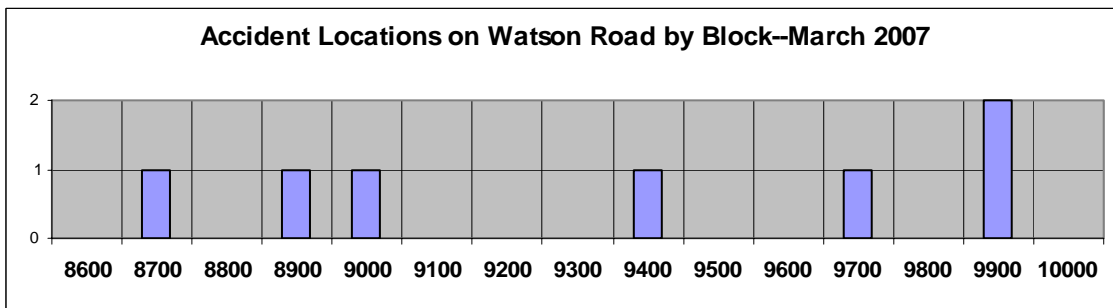
Accidents occurred on the following streets in March 2007:



Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



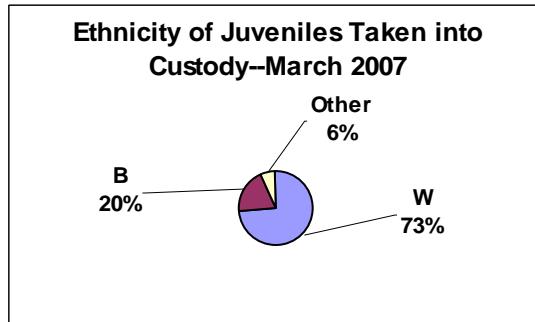
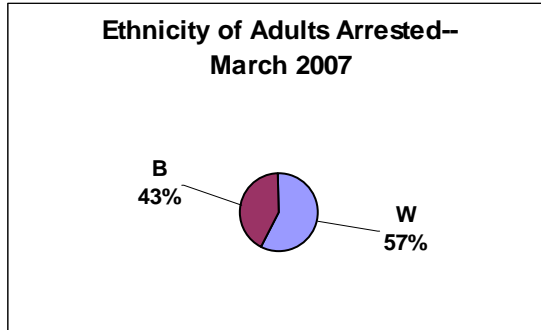
Accidents occurred in the following blocks of Watson Road:



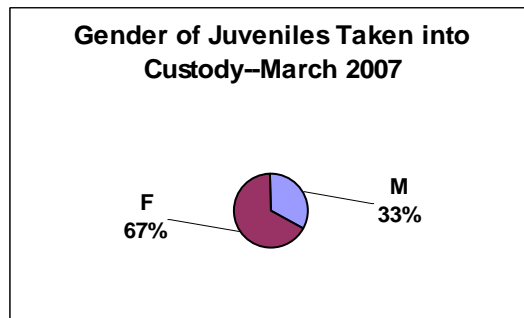
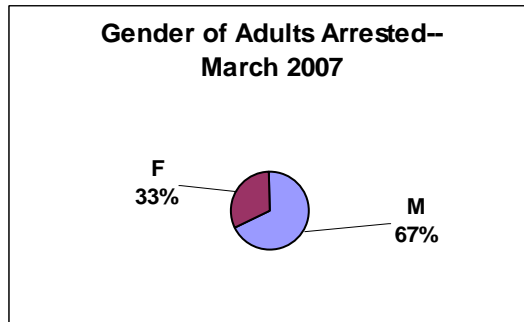
Arrest Information:

Eighty-two adults and eighteen juveniles were taken into custody in March 2007. Eighteen persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

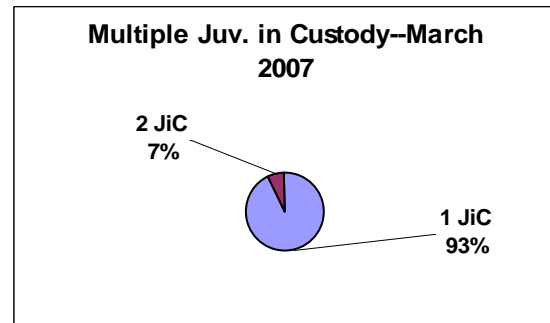
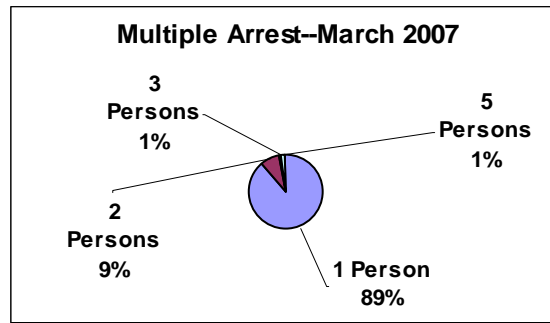
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



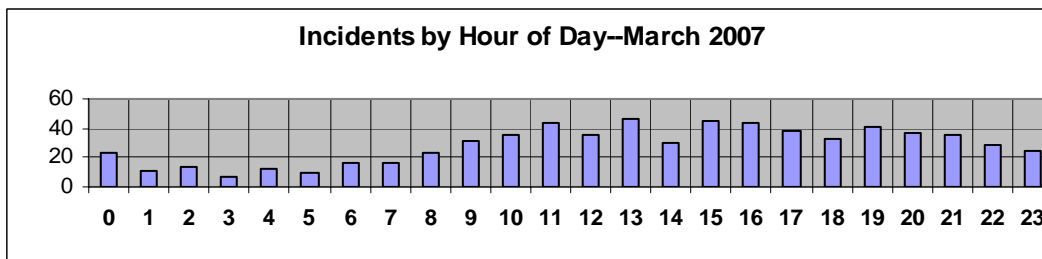
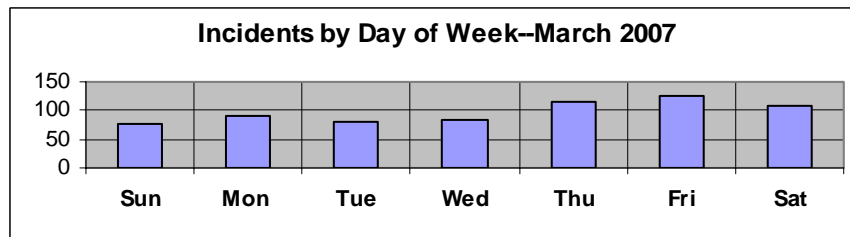
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

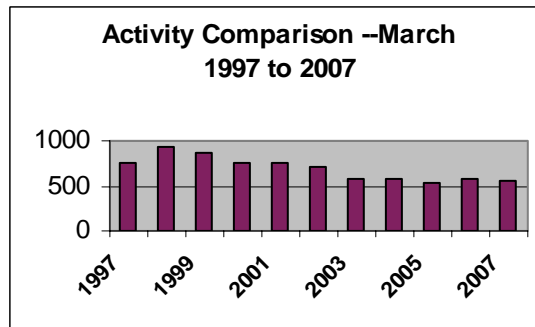
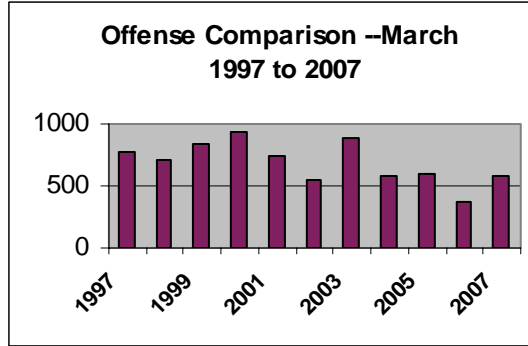

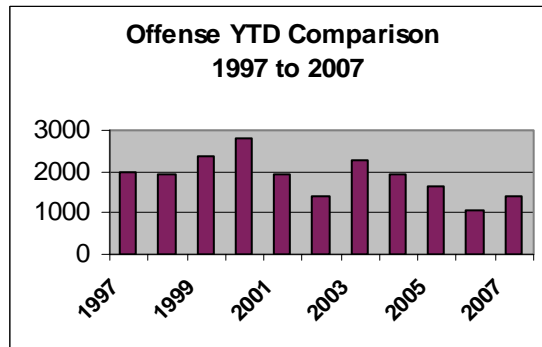


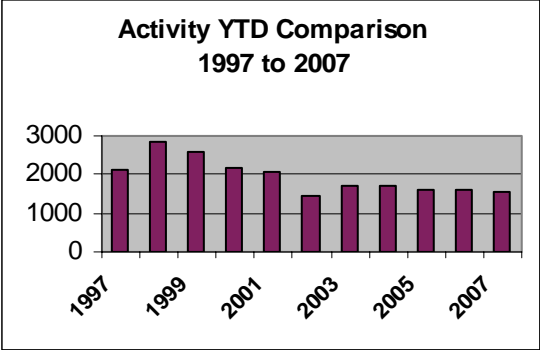
Offense and Activity Comparison:

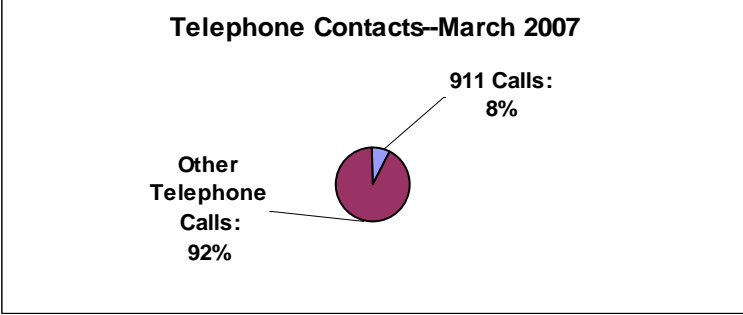

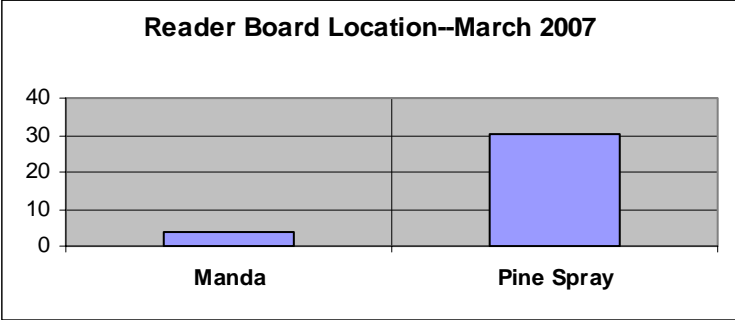
Communications:

The speed measuring reader board was placed at the following locations and for the following amount of time in March 2007:

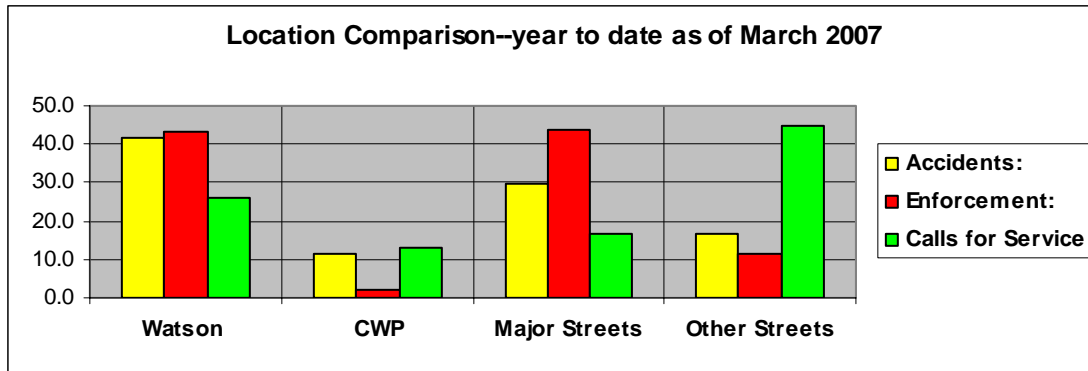


Location Comparison:
