Topic: March 2008 Public Report

This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of March 2008. In March 2008, there were 52 Part I offenses and 494 Part II offenses for a total of 546. This compares with 63 Part I offenses and 519 Part II offenses for a total of 582 in March 2007. The main difference was in the number of stealings, traffic accidents and people related calls.

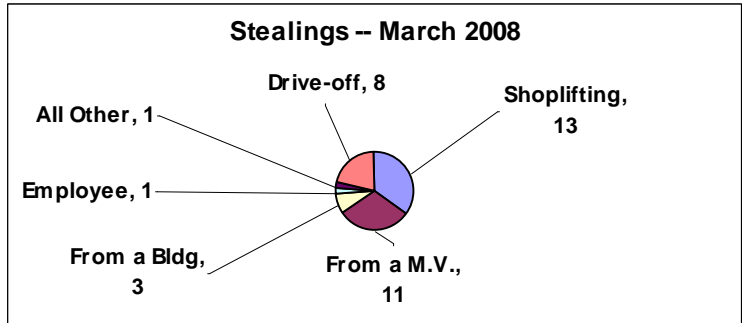
There were four burglaries in March. On 03-18-08, a residence on Fox Park was found to be burglarized by the neighbor's son, who was sleeping in the residence. Arrested, booked and warrants applied for. The second burglary was reported on 03-25-2008 and occurred at a small office building in Watson Industrial. The third burglary was reported on 03-26-2008 to an automotive business on Watson Road. The fourth burglary occurred on 03-26-2008 at a residence on Big Bend.

There were five assaults in March 2008 and one involved domestic violence. In three cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

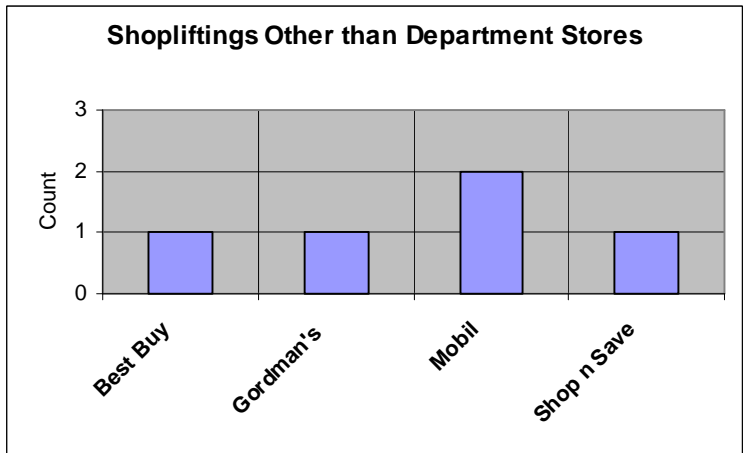
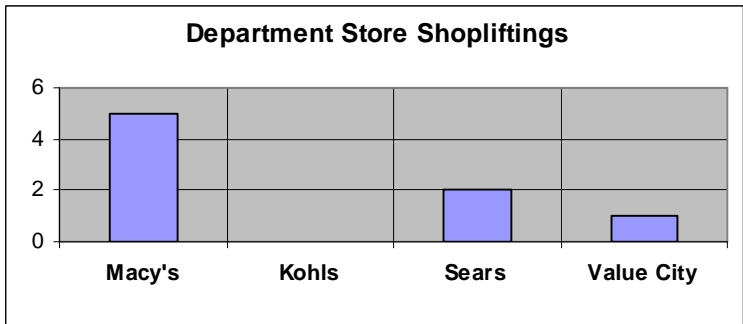
On 03-03-2008 at 1509, a nineteen year old male, from Atlanta, Ga., removed a tip jar from the Starbucks on Watson Road. A customer followed the male onto the parking lot, confronted the male and was struck by the vehicle door and fell to the pavement, striking his head. The customer later died. The Detective Bureau began spending many hours of investigative time and a tip led to the arrest of the male and his female passenger. Warrants were later issued charging the male with the offense. There was less than \$5.00 in the tip jar.

Stealing offenses numbered 37 in March 2008.

Stealings were of the following classifications in March 2008:

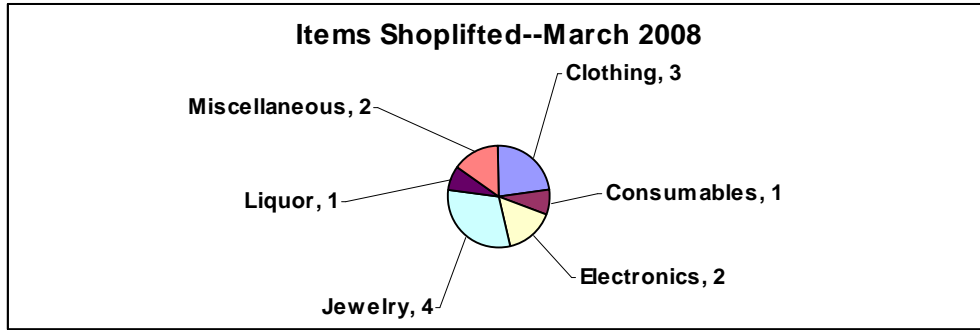


Shopliftings accounted for thirteen of the 37 stealings in March 2008 or 35%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in March 2008:

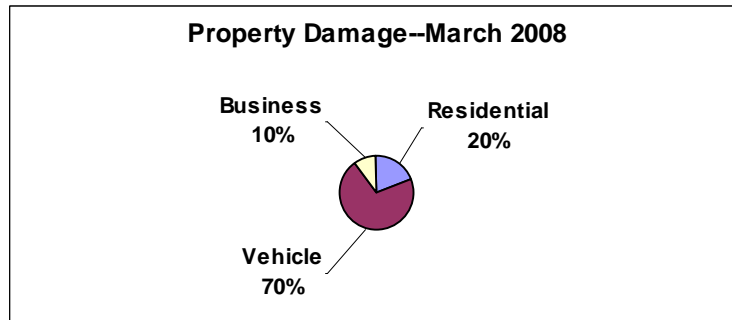


Of the shopliftings, 54% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 29% and juveniles accounted for 71% of the clearances.

There were ten property damages in March 2008 and they were of the following classifications:



There was one stolen vehicle in March 2008. On 03-23-2008 someone stole the victim's white 1997 Jeep Cherokee Sport from the driveway of a residence on Larchwood. The vehicle was later recovered on the street on Del Vista.

Part I offenses numbered 52 in March 2008.

Part II:

In March 2008, there were four frauds reported, two credit card frauds, one forgery and one bad check. There were two drug offenses and both involved small quantities of marijuana. The two offenses against public peace were an annoying telephone calls and a trespassing. There were two DWI cases, nineteen animal related calls and the 57 people related calls included 51 medical emergencies, three missing persons, two sudden deaths and one suicide or attempt suicide. The four juvenile offenses included three runaways and one minor in possession. The two family offenses were a child abuse and an ex-parte order violation. The one weapon violation involved the displaying of a handgun during a dispute in CWP. The suspect and the others involved were gone when the Officers arrived.

Part II offenses totaled 407 in March 2008.

In March 2008 in Ward One, there was one burglary on Watson Industrial and stealings numbered seven with five at addresses on Watson Road and two in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered three, one at addresses along Watson Road, one in an apartment complex and one in the neighborhoods. There were two frauds, three juvenile and one family offense. There was one DWI case and one traffic accident, nine people related calls and five animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered seventeen and occurred on eight different streets and there were 43 miscellaneous police service calls.

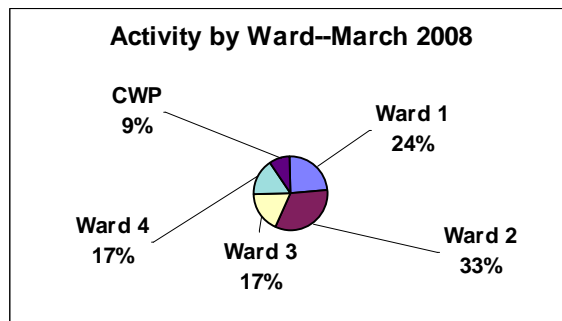
In Ward Two in March 2008, there were two burglaries, one on Big Bend and one on Watson Road. Stealings numbered thirteen with twelve at addresses on Watson Road and Big Bend and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, one at addresses along Watson Road and Big Bend and one in the neighborhoods. There was one drug offense and two offenses against public peace. There was one DWI case and seven traffic accidents, sixteen people related calls and five animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eighteen and occurred on thirteen different streets and there were 63 calls for miscellaneous police services.

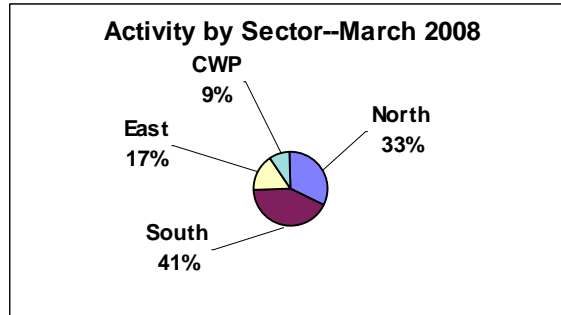
In March 2008 in Ward Three, stealings numbered three with one at addresses on Watson Road and two in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered one in the neighborhoods. There was one fraud, one drug offenses, one juvenile and one family offense. There were six traffic accidents, seventeen people related calls and three animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eight and occurred on five different streets and there were 35 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in March 2008, there was one burglary on Fox Park and stealings numbered seven and property damages numbered three and stolen vehicles numbered one. There were two traffic accidents, twelve people related calls and six animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered sixteen and occurred on thirteen different streets and there were 22 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered seven with seven shopliftings and property damages numbered one. There was one fraud and one weapon offense. There were three traffic accidents and three people related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered seven and there were fourteen police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

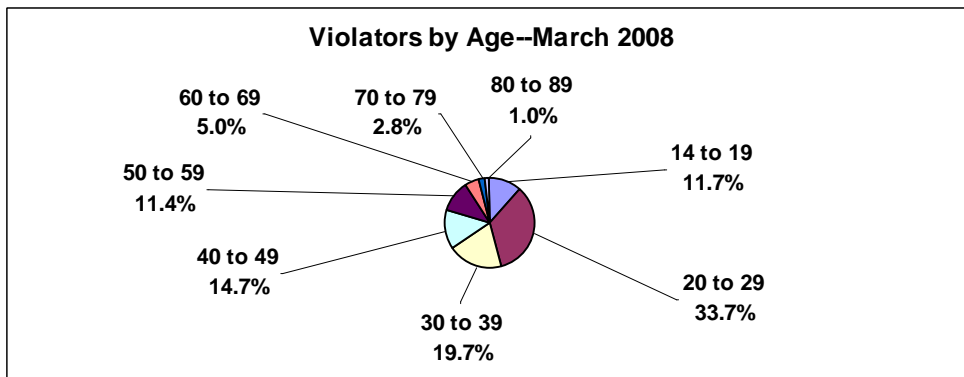

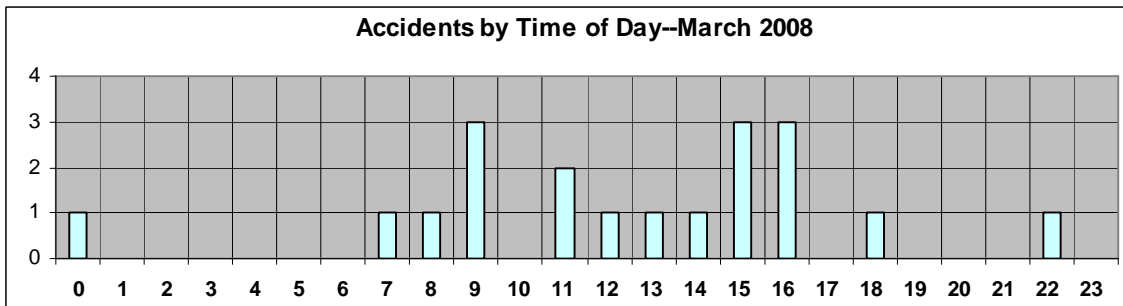

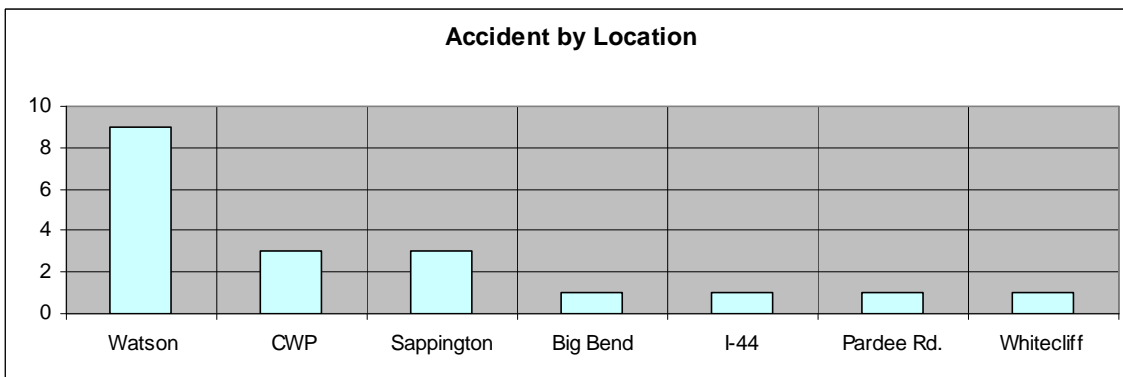
Accidents occurred on the following days of the week:



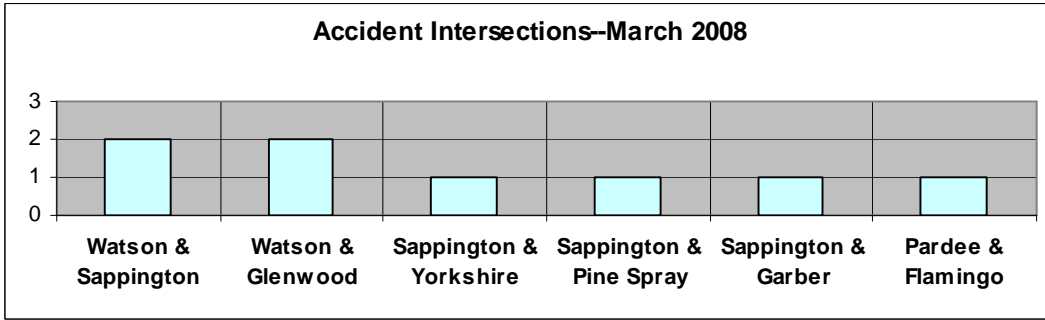
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



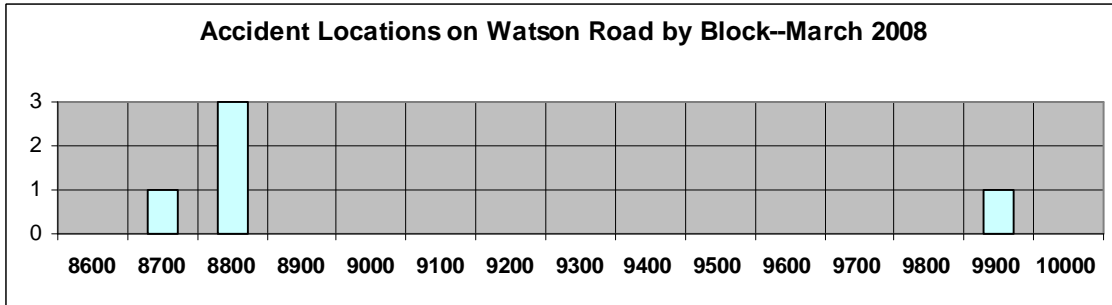
Accidents occurred on the following streets in March 2008:



Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



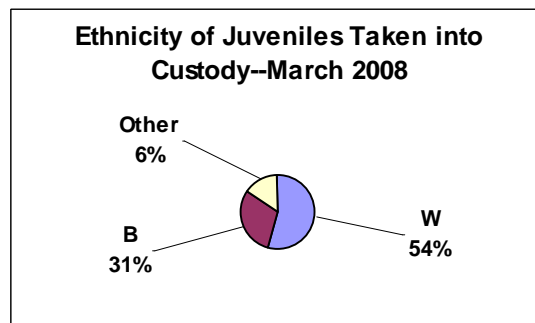
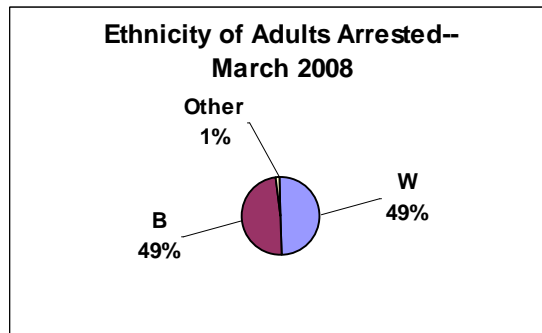
Accidents occurred in the following blocks of Watson Road:



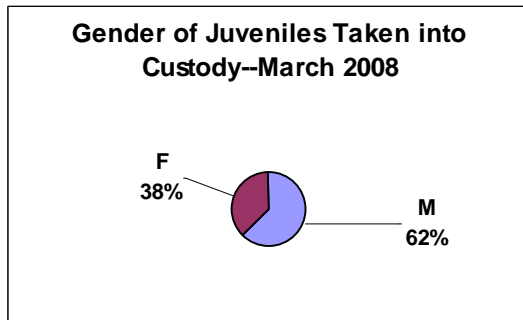
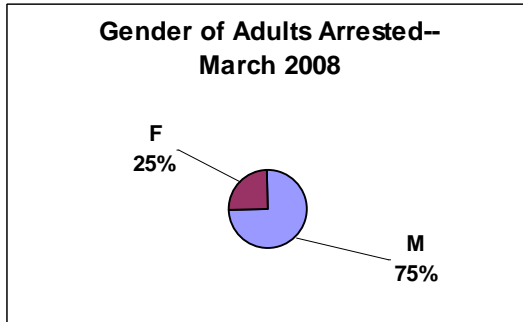
Arrest Information:

Fifty-one adults and thirteen juveniles were taken into custody in March 2008. Four persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

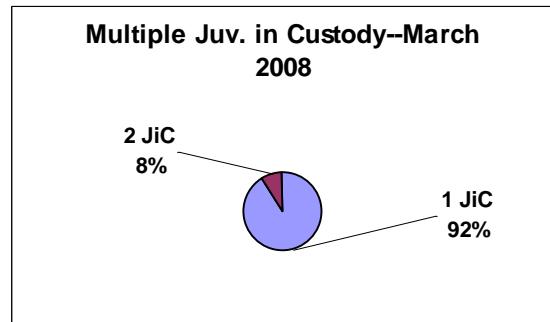
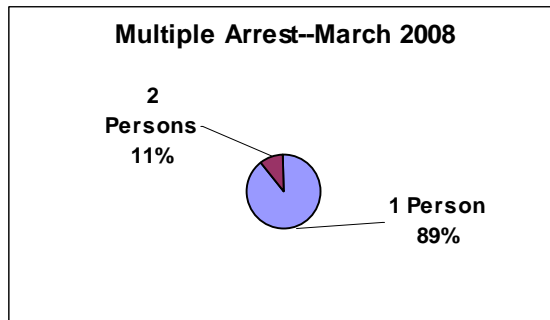
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



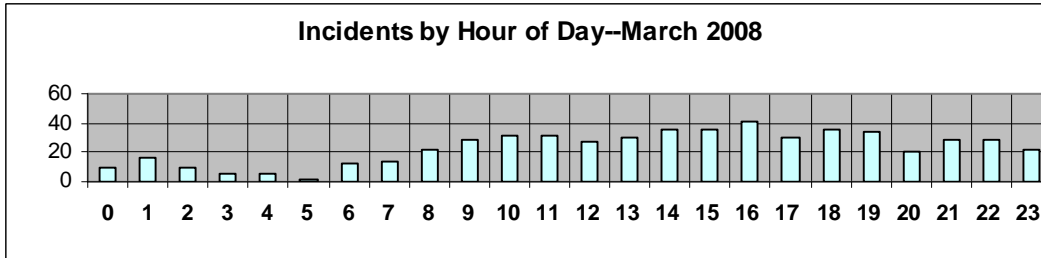
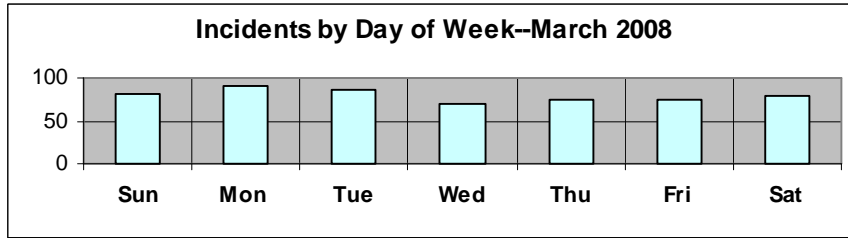
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

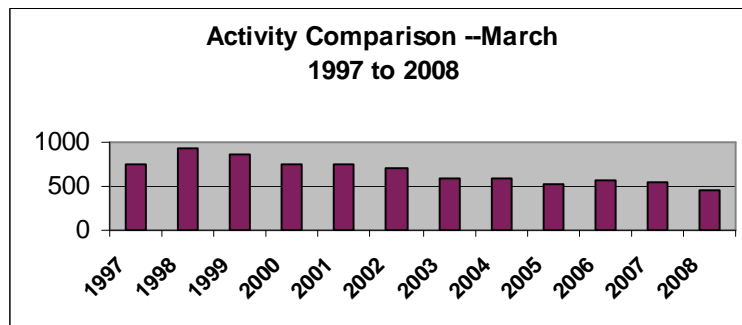
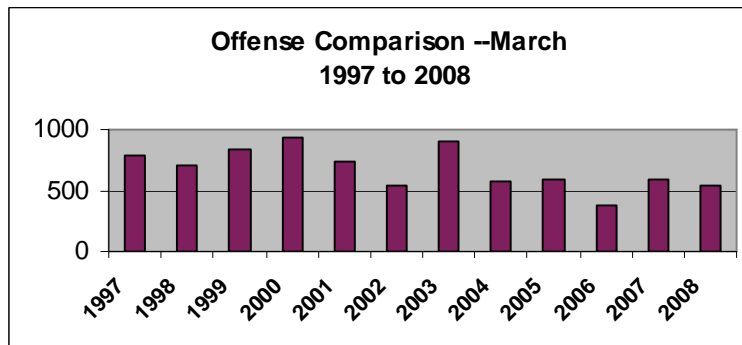

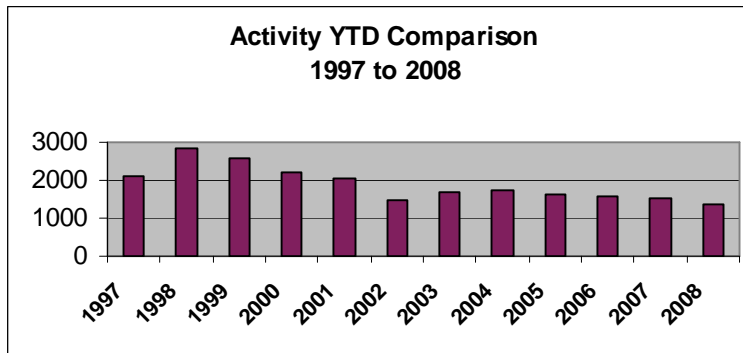
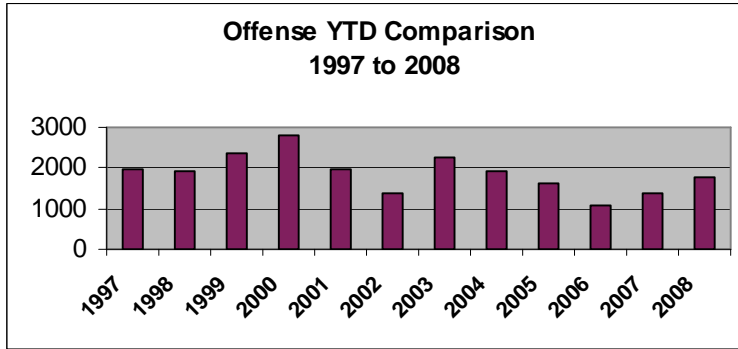


Offense and Activity Comparison:

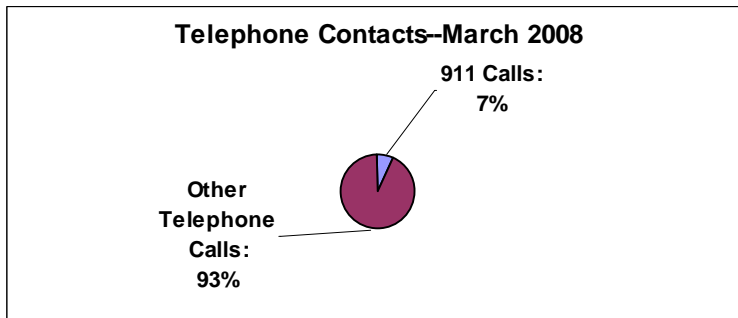


Years to Date:

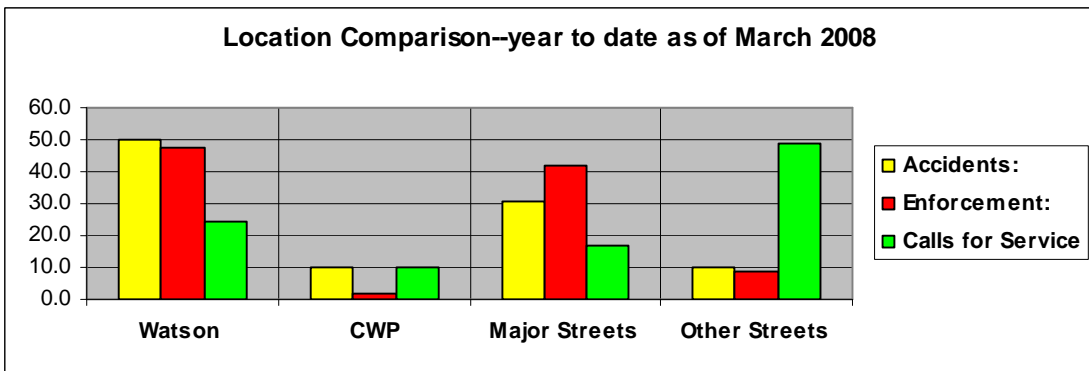


Location Comparison:
