Topic: March 2009 Public Report

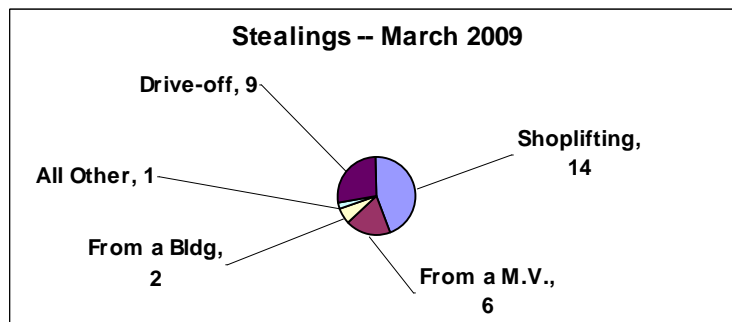
This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of March 2009. In March 2009, there were 43 Part I offenses and 366 Part II offenses for a total of 409. This compares with 52 Part I offenses and 494 Part II offenses for a total of 546 in March 2008. The main difference was in the number of burglaries, stealings, property damages, suspicious activities and traffic stops.

There were four assaults in March 2009 and two involved domestic violence. In three cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

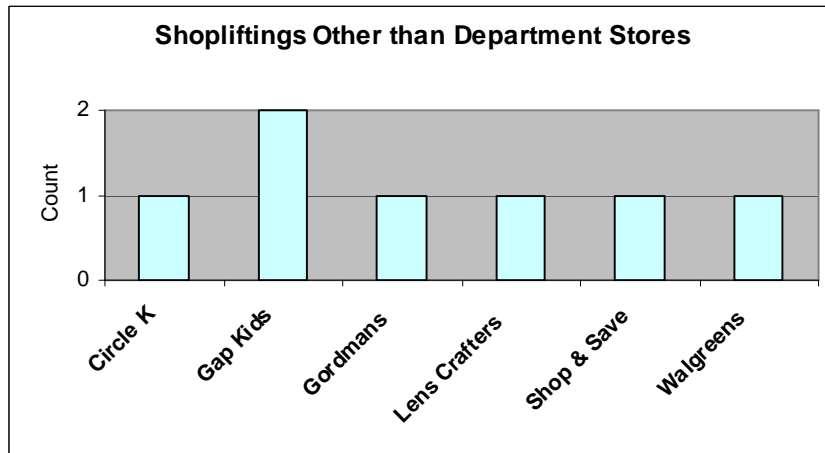
There were two burglaries reported in March. The first was a residential burglary reported on 03-25-2009 on Pinellas. The glass in a door was shattered to gain entry but nothing was taken. The suspect was identified, arrested and warrants were issued. The second burglary was to an apartment on Park Crestwood. The victim reported that someone entered the apartment and had taken some photo albums and a tax return. There was no forced entry to the apartment.

Stealing offenses numbered 32 in March 2009.

Stealings were of the following classifications in March 2009:



Shopliftings accounted for fourteen of the 32 stealings in March 2009 or 44%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in March 2009:

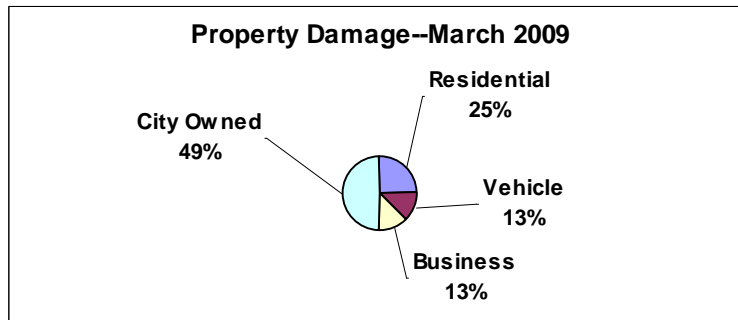


Of the shopliftings, 64% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 89% and juveniles accounted for 11% of the clearances.

There were eight property damages in March 2009 and they were of the following classifications:



The City Owned property damages included three signs and some fence railings.

There were one stolen vehicles in March 2009. On 03-16-2009, a white 2007 Pontiac Grand Prix was stolen from a driveway on Banbury Circle.

Part I offenses numbered 43 in March 2009.

Part II:

In March 2009, there were four frauds reported, three passing bad checks and one other type fraud. There were four drug offenses, three possessions of marijuana and one possession of paraphernalia. The three offenses against public peace were one annoying telephone calls, one harassment and one resisting arrest. There were three DWI cases and 22 traffic accidents. There were sixteen animal related calls and 66 people related calls involving 63 medical emergencies, two missing persons and one sudden death. The two juvenile offenses involved one minor in possession and one curfew violation.

Part II offenses totaled 366 in March 2009.

In March 2009 in Ward One, there was one burglary reported in an apartment complex and stealings numbered one with one at addresses on Watson Road and none in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, one in the neighborhoods and one in an apartment complex. There was one stolen vehicle on Banbury Circle. There was one fraud, one drug offenses, one offense against public peace and one juvenile related offense. There were two DWI cases and five traffic accidents, sixteen people related calls and seven animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eleven and occurred on eight different streets and there were 39 miscellaneous police service calls.

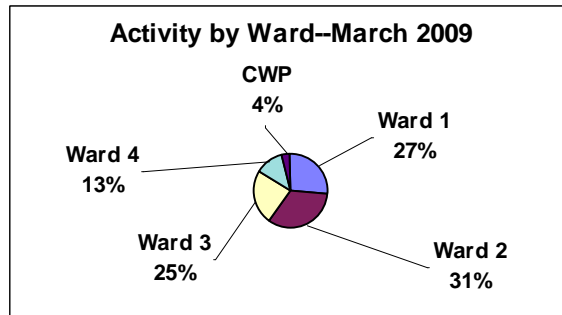
In Ward Two in March 2009, there was one burglary reported on Pinellas. Stealings numbered eighteen with seventeen at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, two at addresses along Watson Road. There were three frauds, two drug offenses and two offenses against public peace. There were three traffic accidents, 20 people related calls and three animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered seven and occurred on seven different streets and there were 37 calls for miscellaneous police services.

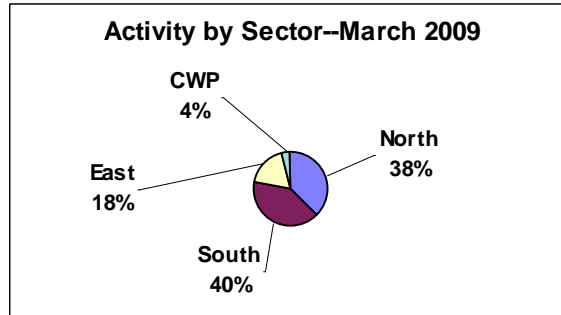
In March 2009 in Ward Three, stealings numbered five with three at addresses on Watson Road and two in the neighborhoods and property damages numbered four, four in Whitecliff Park. There was one drug offense, one DWI cases and six traffic accidents, sixteen people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered nine and occurred on six different streets and there were 28 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in March 2009, stealings numbered two. There was one juvenile related offense, four traffic accidents, fourteen people related calls and four animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered four and occurred on four different streets and there were 21 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered six with five shopliftings and one theft from vehicle. There were two traffic accidents and seven police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

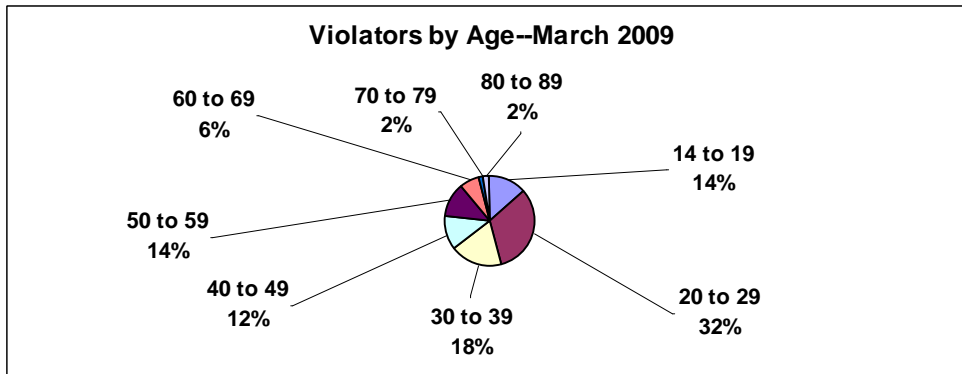

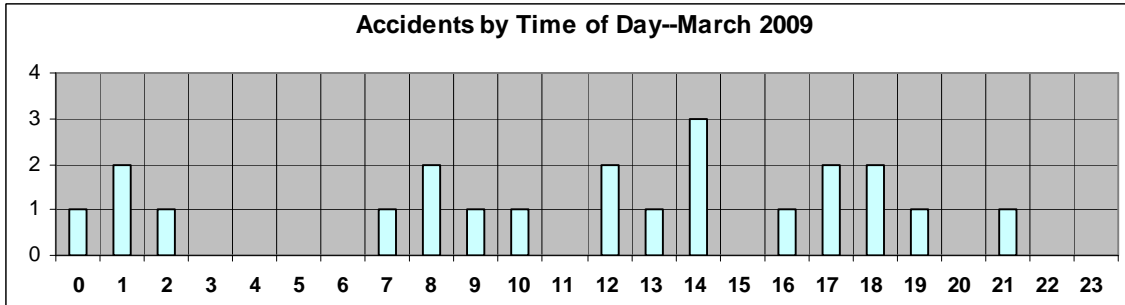

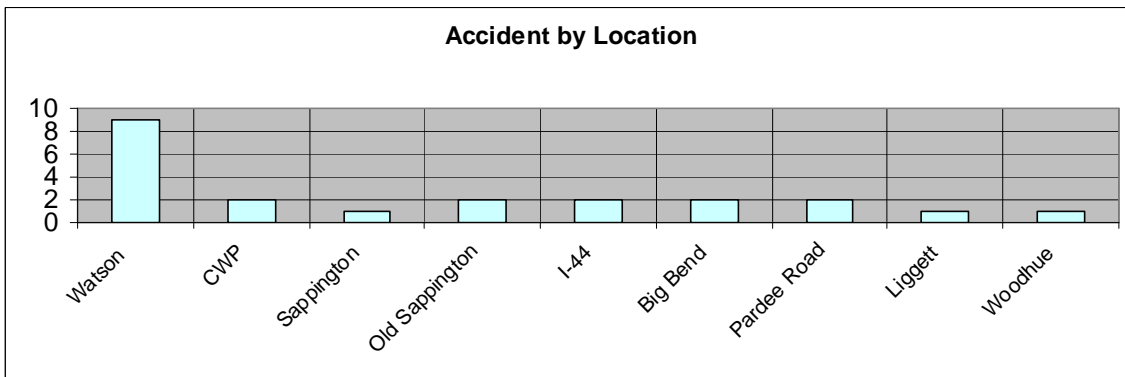
Accidents occurred on the following days of the week:



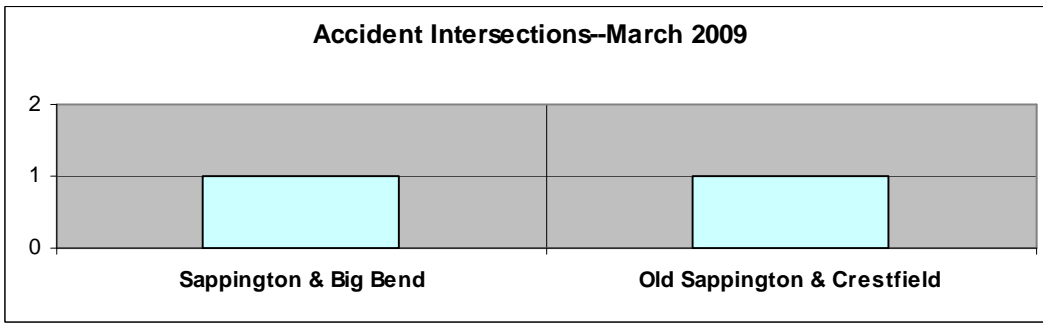
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



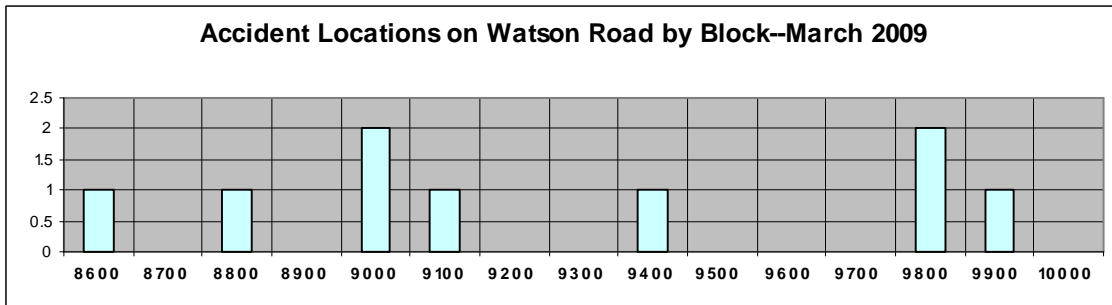
Accidents occurred on the following streets in March 2009:



Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



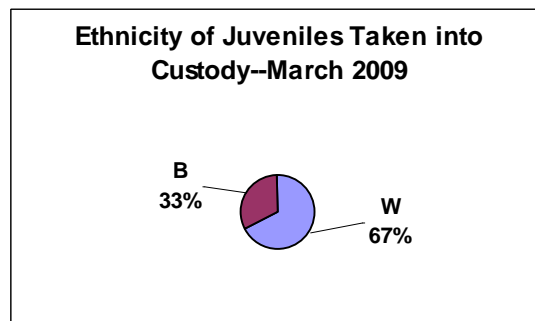
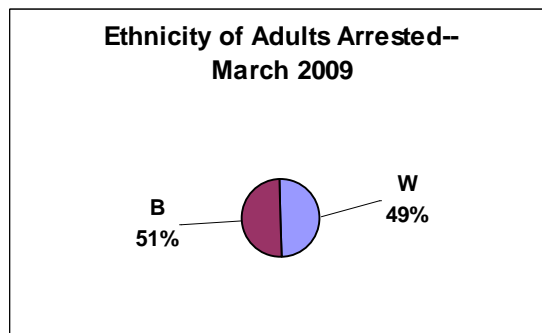
Accidents occurred in the following blocks of Watson Road:



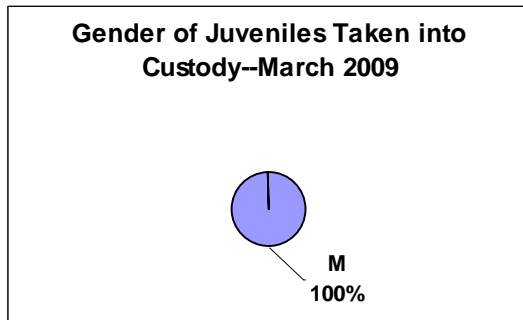
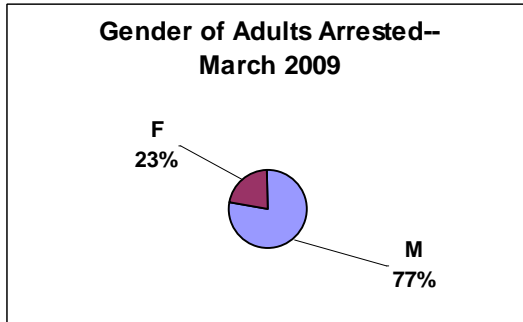
Arrest Information:

Fifty-seven adults and three juveniles were taken into custody in March 2009. Fourteen persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

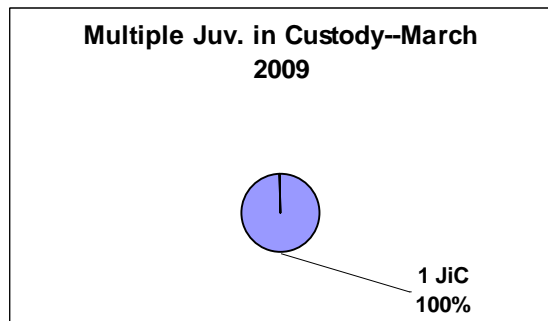
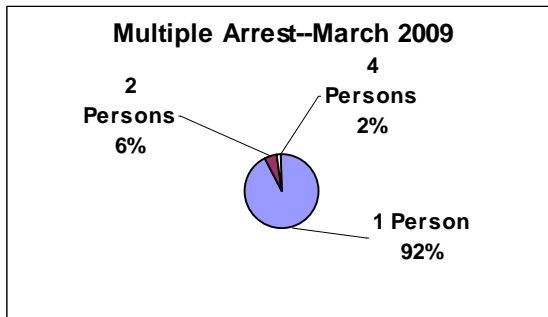
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



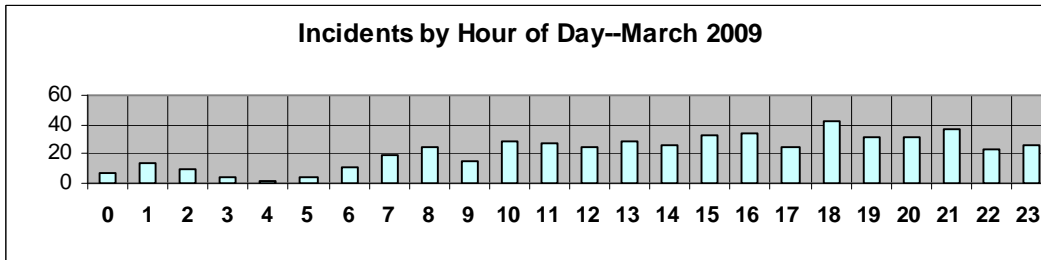
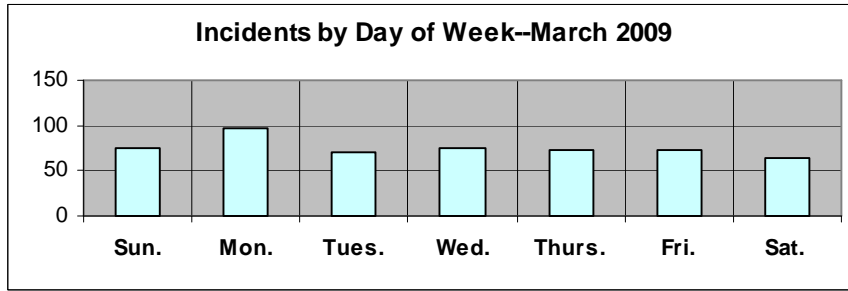
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

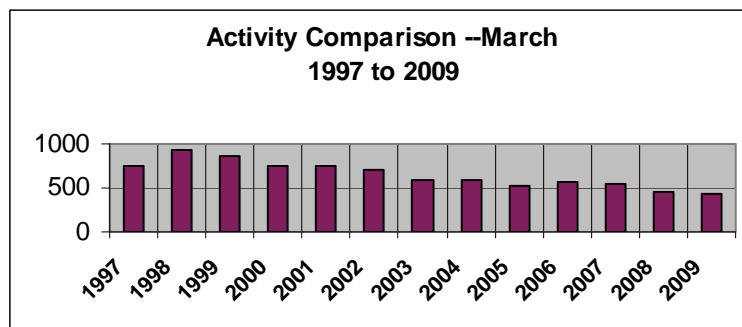
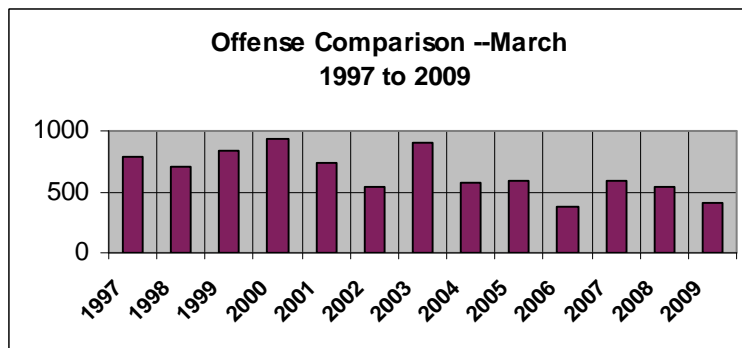

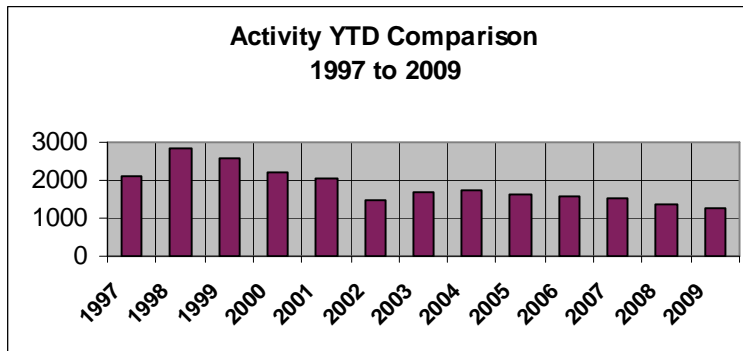
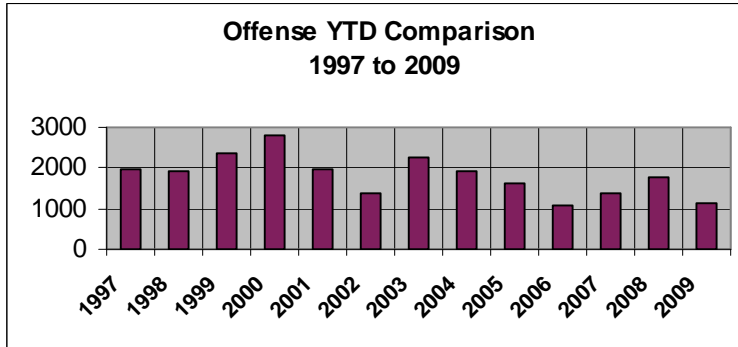


Offense and Activity Comparison:

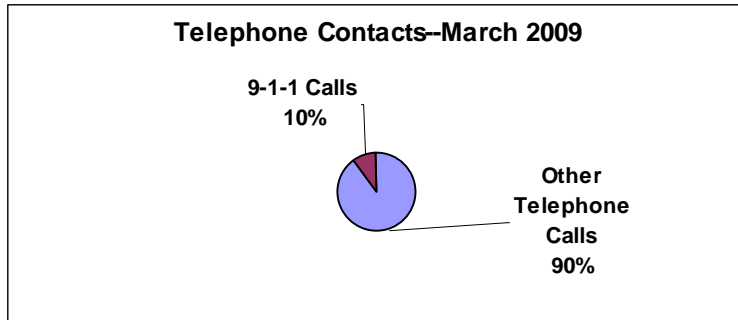


Years to Date:



Communications:

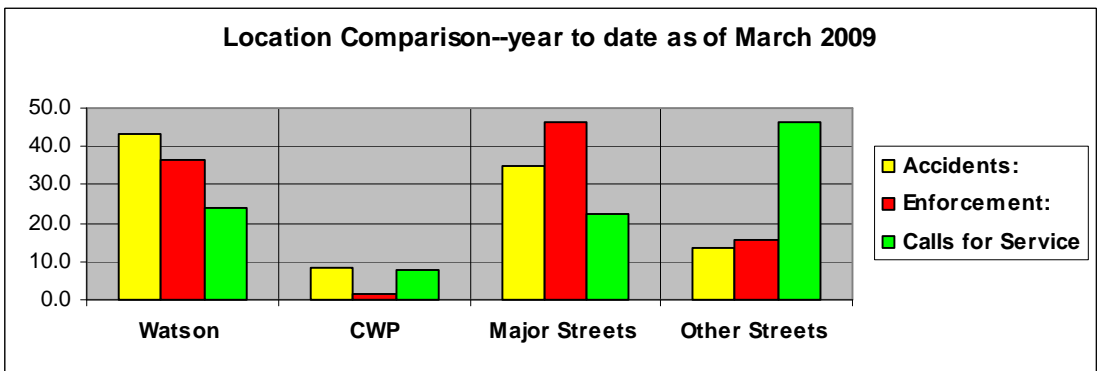


Location Comparison:
