Topic: May 2007 Public Report

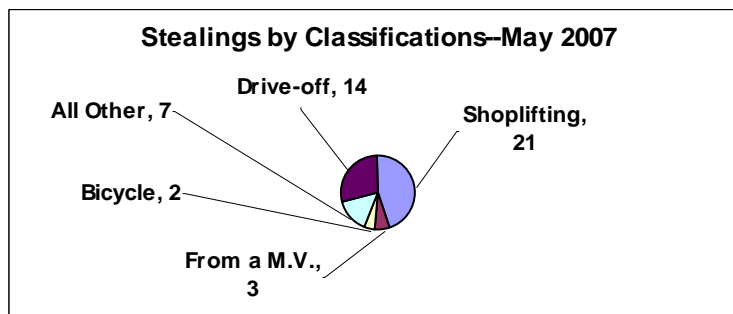
This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of May 2007. In May 2007, there were 62 Part I offenses and 597 Part II offenses for a total of 659. This compares with 72 Part I offenses and 426 Part II offenses for a total of 498 in May 2007. The main difference was in the number of stealings, traffic stops, motor vehicle accidents and suspicious activity calls.

There was one sexual assault in May. A twenty-one year old male had inappropriately touched two juvenile males while visiting the residence. The perpetrator could not be located.

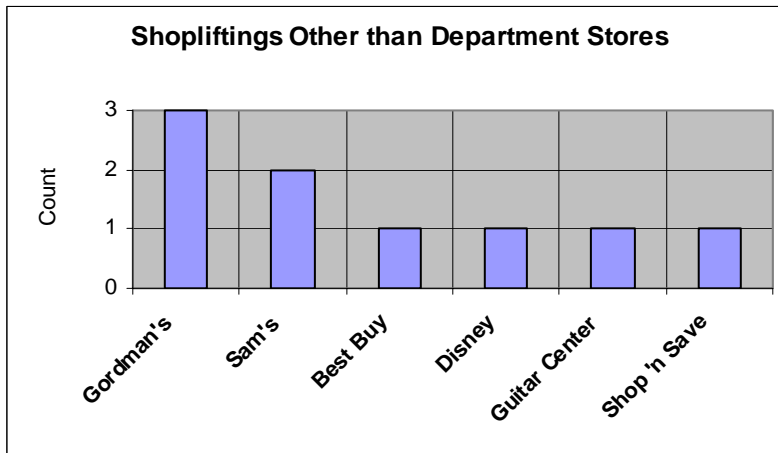
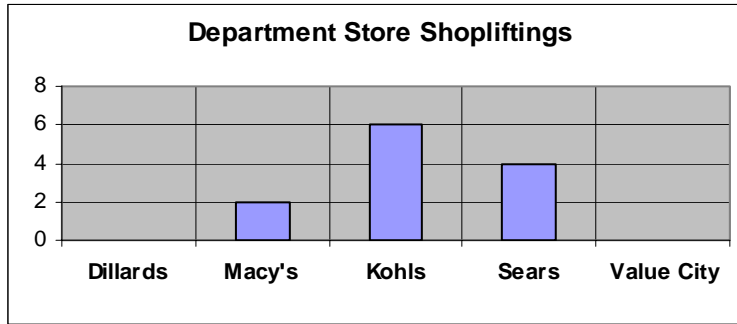
There were four assaults in May 2007 and three involved domestic violence. In three cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

The two burglaries were reported in May. The first occurred on Pinellas Drive, on 05-01-2007 and involved the theft of two game consoles. The burglary occurred during the day and there was no forced entry. The second burglary occurred on 05-07-2007 on Grant Farm Trail and a theft from a garage that was possibly left open overnight. A bicycle was stolen from the garage.

Stealing offenses numbered 47 in May 2007:
Stealings were of the following classifications:

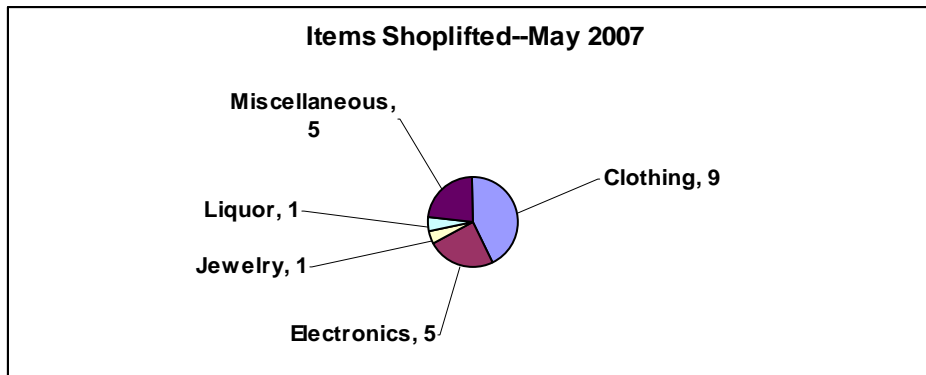


Shopliftings accounted for 21 of the 47 stealings in May 2007 or 45%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in May 2007:

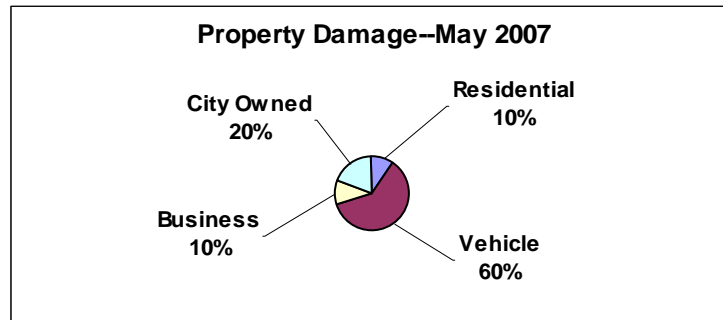


Of the shopliftings, 81% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 82% and juveniles accounted for 18% of the clearances.

There were ten property damages in May 2007 and they were of the following classifications:



The City Owned property damages were a stone removed from a stone wall in Ferndale Park and shattered in the street and the second was damage to the windshield of a front end loader at City Garage.

There was one receiving stolen properties that involved the recovery of stolen clothing. There were two stolen vehicles in May. The first was a maroon 1998 GMC Safari Van that was stolen from the lot of a Department Store. The victim had left the keys in the vehicle and it was stolen and later recovered in St. Louis City. The second was a green 1995 Ford Aerostar van that had been taken by the victim's roommate from on Honeywood. The vehicle was later recovered in St. Louis City.

Part I offenses numbered 62 in May 2007.

Part II:

In May 2007, there were eight frauds reported, four credit card frauds, one passing bad checks, one identity thefts and two all other type frauds. There were four drug offenses, two possessions of marijuana and two possessions of drug paraphernalia. The two offenses against public peace included a disorderly conduct and a trespassing. There were nine DWI cases and 70 people related calls including four missing persons, sixty-one sick cases and accidental injuries, three sudden deaths and two suicides or attempts. There were twelve animal calls, five juvenile offenses including three minors in possession, one runaway and one contributing to the delinquency of a minor and one family offense that involved child abuse, the assault of a ten year old boy.

Part II offenses totaled 435 in May 2007.

In May 2007 in Ward One, there was one sexual assault and no robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered eight with six at addresses on Watson Road and two in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered five, two at addresses along Watson Road and Watson Industrial and three in the neighborhoods. There were no stolen vehicles. There was one fraud, one drug offenses, two juvenile related and no offense against public peace, family or weapons offenses. There was one DWI case and three traffic accidents, twenty-one people related calls and one animal related call. Suspicious activity calls numbered twenty-three and occurred on nine different streets and there were 56 miscellaneous police service calls.

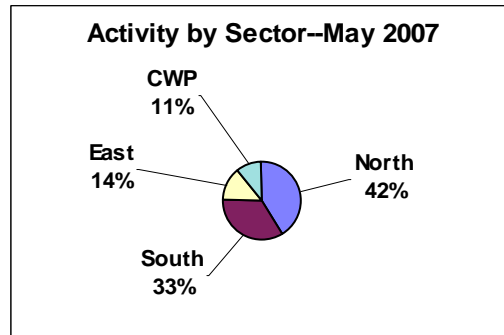
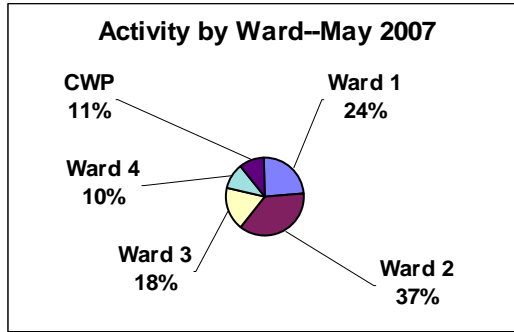
In Ward Two in May 2007, there were no sexual assaults or robberies but there was one burglary on Pinellas. Stealings numbered twenty-four with twenty-three at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered three with all three in the neighborhoods. There was one stolen vehicle. There were four frauds, one drug offenses, one juvenile offense and one family offense and no offenses against public peace or weapons offenses. There were three DWI cases and ten traffic accidents, nineteen people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered twenty-six and occurred on eleven different streets and there were 83 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In May 2007 in Ward Three, there were no sexual assaults or robberies but there was one burglary on Grant Farm Trail. Stealings numbered seven with three at addresses on Watson Road and four in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, one at addresses along Watson Road and one at a City Owned facility. There was one stolen vehicle. There was one fraud, two drug offenses, one offense against public peace and no juvenile, family or weapons offenses. There were four DWI cases and two traffic accidents, fifteen people related calls and seven animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered fourteen and occurred on eight different streets and there were 40 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in May 2007, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries. There were no stealings, property damages or stolen vehicles. There were two frauds, two juvenile offenses, and no drug offenses, offenses against public peace, family or weapons offenses. There was one DWI case and three traffic accidents, nine people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered five and occurred on four different streets and there were twenty-five calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, there were no sexual assaults, robberies or burglaries. Stealings numbered eight with seven shopliftings and one from a vehicle. There were no property damages reported and there were no stolen vehicles. There was one offense against public peace, and no frauds, drug offenses, juvenile, family or weapons offenses. There were no DWI case and two traffic accidents, six people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eight and there were twenty-four police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

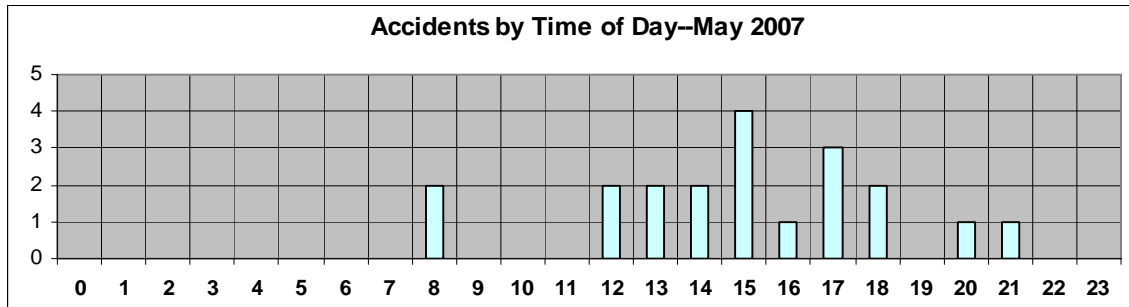

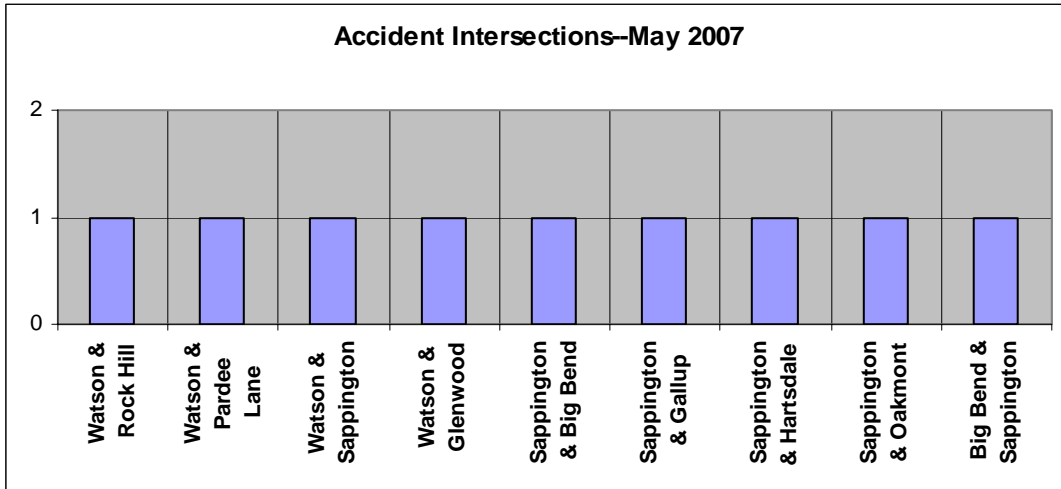
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:

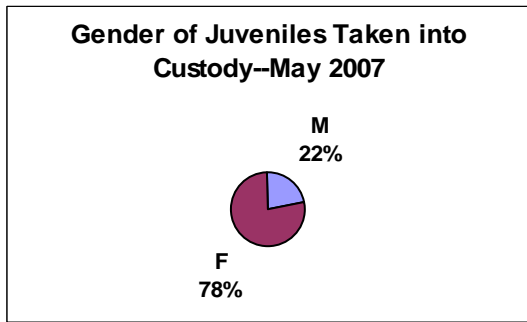
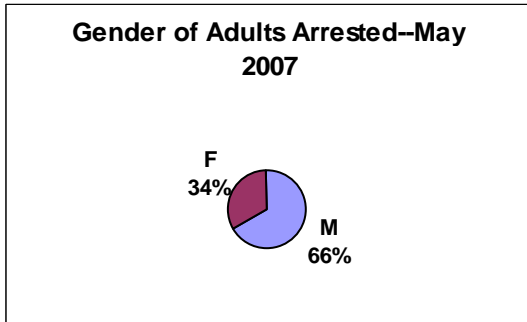
Ninety-four adults and nine juveniles were taken into custody in May 2007. Twenty-two persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:

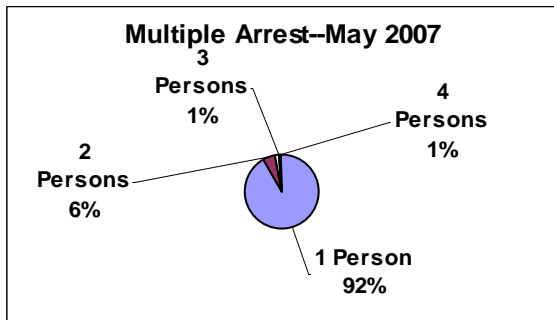


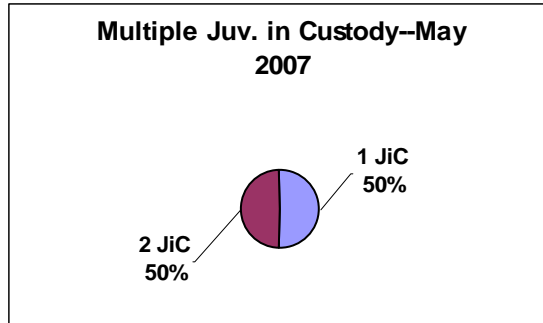


The gender of the persons taken into custody was:

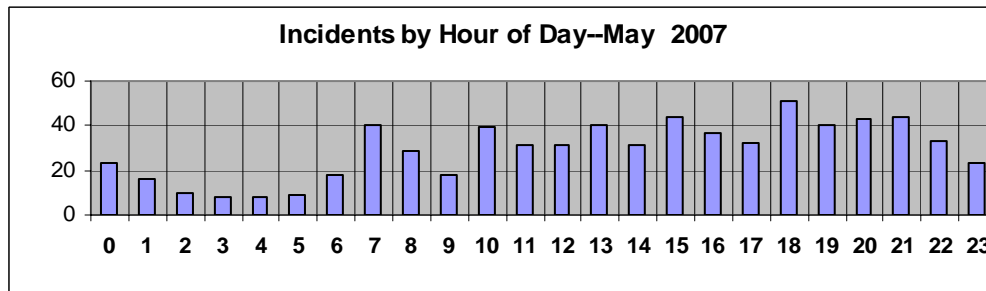
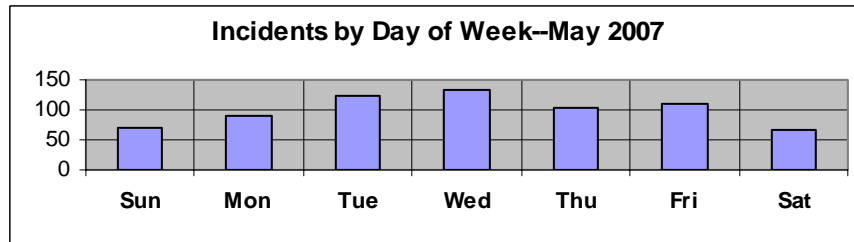




Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

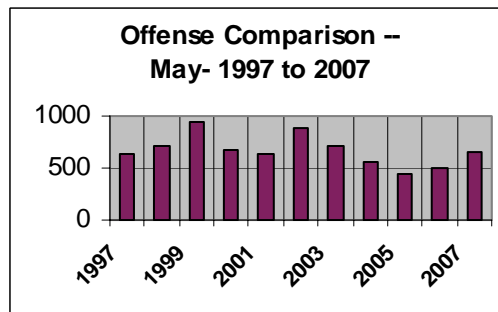

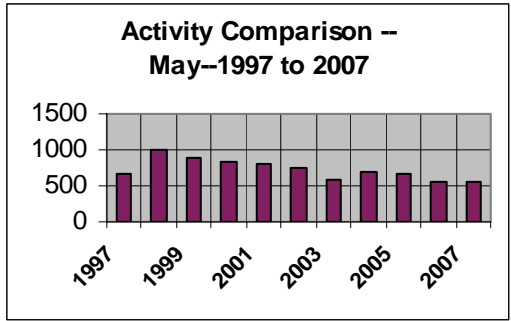
Activity occurred on the following days of the week and hours of the day:



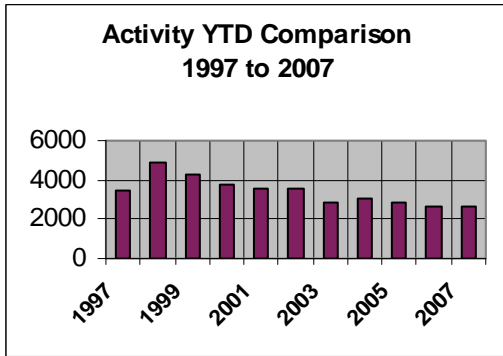
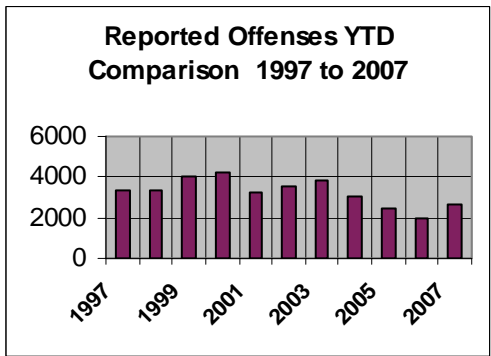
Offense and Activity Comparison:

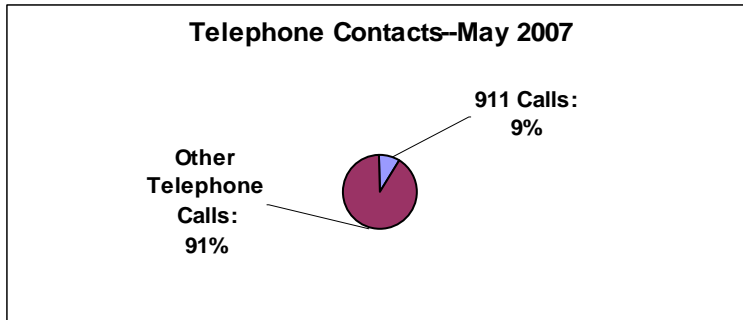


Years to Date:



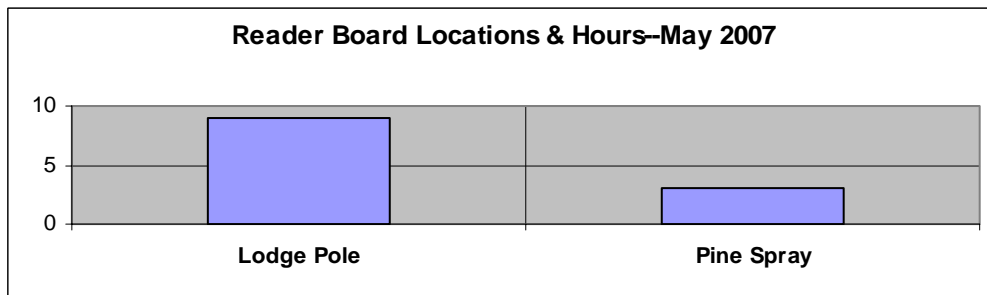
Communications:

The speed measuring reader board was placed at the following locations and for the following amount of time in May 2007:

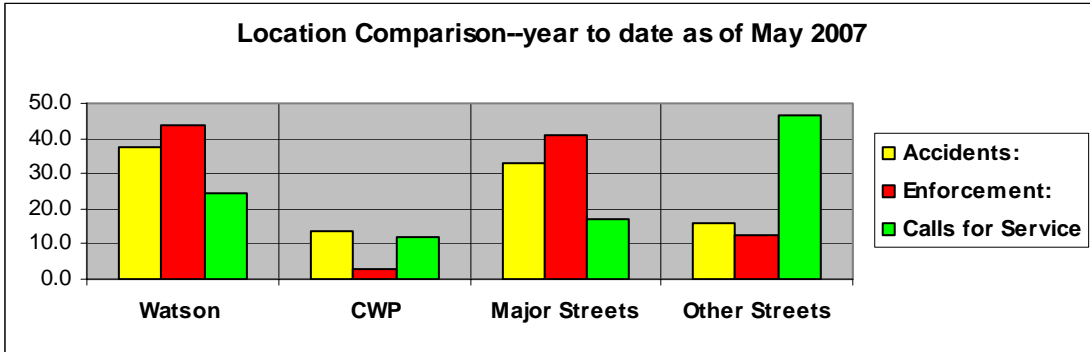


Location Comparison:
