Topic: May 2009 Public Report

This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of May 2009. In May 2009, there were 40 Part I offenses and 372 Part II offenses for a total of 412. This compares with 53 Part I offenses and 486 Part II offenses for a total of 539 in May 2008. The main difference was in the number of stealings and traffic stops.

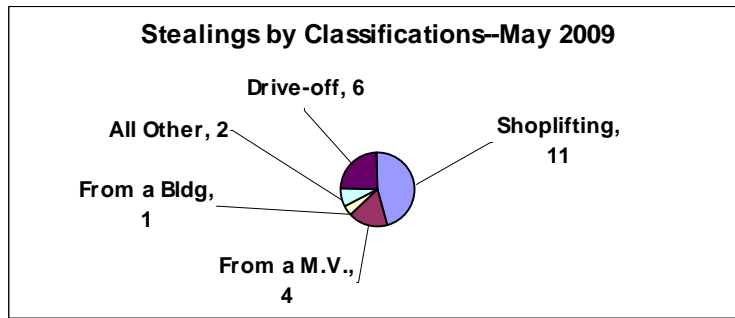
There were two sexual offenses that occurred in May. The first was a rape that was reported on 05-08-2009. The victim reported that she was raped by a neighbor. Investigation is continuing into the offense. The second offense was as male with no pants observed on the trails in Whitecliff Park. A check of the area did not find the suspect.

There were four assaults in May 2009 and one involved domestic violence. In all cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

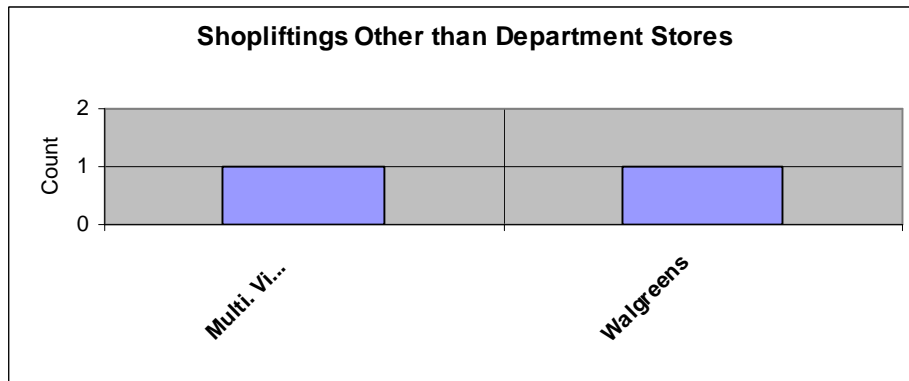
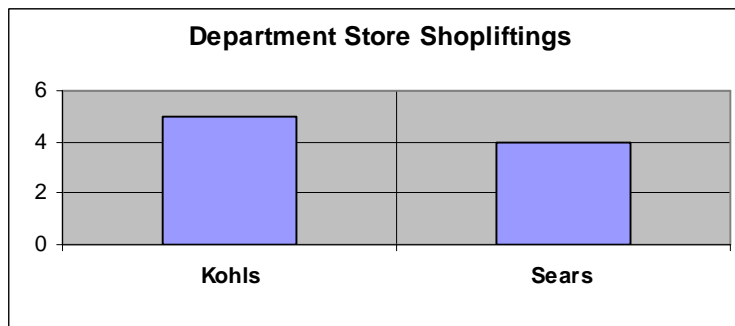
There were two residential, two apartments and one business burglary reported in May. The first residential was reported on 05-02-2009 on Arban. Someone had forced open a window and removed a television, VCR and some beer. The second residential was reported on 05-24-2009 on Joann Place. Someone had broken a window to gain entry to the residence. The victim was not sure what was taken at the time of the original report. The first apartment burglary was reported on 05-23-2009 on Park Crestwood. Someone entered the apartment by removing the second floor sliding door and removed a television, radar detector and some blinds. The second apartment burglary was reported on 05-29-2009 on Park Crestwood and there was no forced entry and only some photographs were taken. The business burglary was reported on 05-24-2009 at a restaurant on Watson Road. A window was pried open and entry gained and only some coins were taken.

Stealing offenses numbered 24 in May 2009.

Stealings were of the following classifications in May 2009:

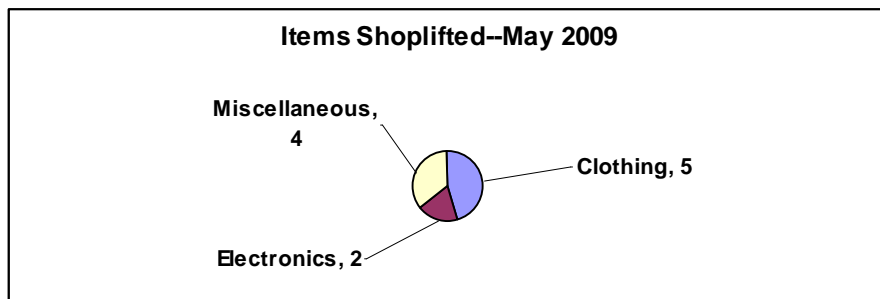


Shopliftings accounted for 11 of the 24 stealings in May 2009 or 46%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in May 2009:

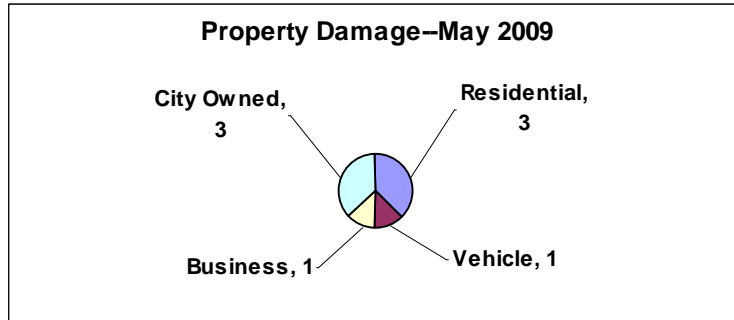


Of the shopliftings, 82% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 78% and juveniles accounted for 22% of the clearances.

There were eight property damages in May 2009 and they were of the following classifications:



The City Owned property damages were to a field, a sign and some graffiti.

Part I offenses numbered 40 in May 2009.

**Part II:**

In May 2009, there were two frauds, one passing bad check and one other type fraud. There were five drug offenses, two possessions of marijuana and three possessions of paraphernalia. The three offenses against public peace were two disorderly conducts and one trespassing. There was one DWI case, 20 animal related calls and 79 people related calls including 75 medical emergencies, two sudden deaths, one missing person and one suicide or attempt suicide. There was one family offense, a criminal nonsupport case.

Part II offenses totaled 372 in May 2009.

In May 2009 in Ward One, there were four burglaries, a residence on Arban, two apartments on Park Crestwood and a business on Watson Road. Stealings numbered three with one at addresses on Watson Road, one on Watson Industrial and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, one at addresses along Watson Road and one in an apartment complex. There was one fraud and one family offense. There were seven traffic accidents, 22 people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eleven and occurred on six different streets and there were 47 miscellaneous police service calls.

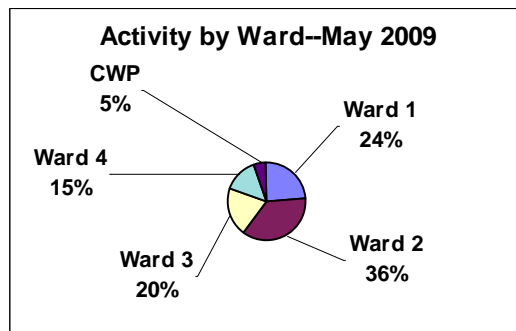
In Ward Two in May 2009, there was one burglary on Joann. Stealings numbered twelve with twelve at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and none in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, one at addresses in Watson Plaza and one in the neighborhoods. There was one fraud, two drug offenses and two offenses against public peace, There was one DWI and eight traffic accidents, nineteen people related calls and three animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered fourteen and occurred on six different streets and there were 47 calls for miscellaneous police services.

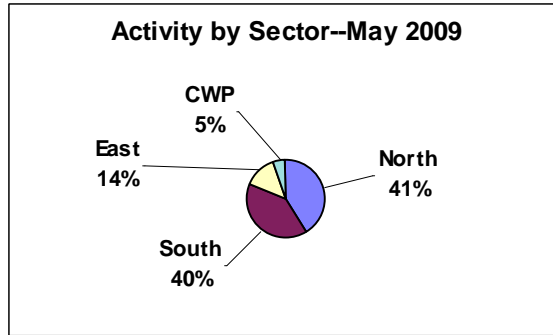
In May 2009 in Ward Three, there was one sexual offense, an exposing person in Whitecliff Park. Property damages numbered two, two in Whitecliff Park. There were two drug offenses. There were four traffic accidents, 28 people related calls and ten animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered six and occurred on five different streets and there were 35 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in May 2009, there was one sexual offense, a rape reported. Stealings numbered three and property damages numbered two. There was one drug offense and one offense against public peace. There were three traffic accidents, nine people related calls and six animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered twelve and occurred on nine different streets and there were 30 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered six with five shopliftings and one from a vehicle. There was one traffic accidents and one people related call. Suspicious activity calls numbered two and there were eight police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

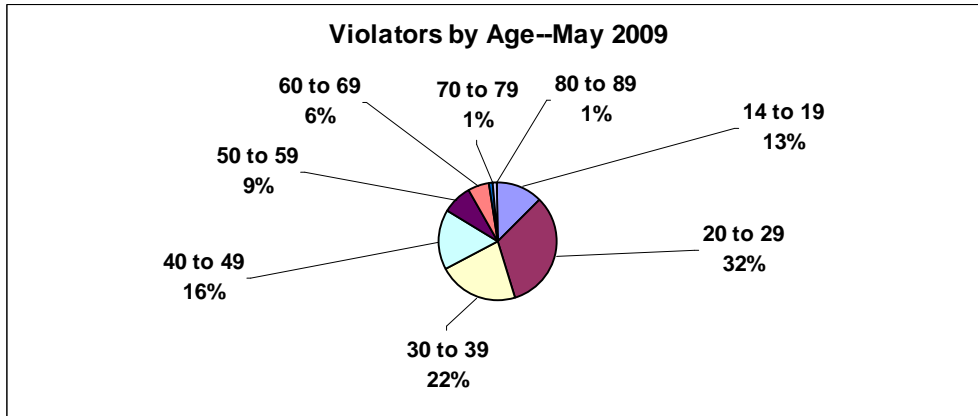

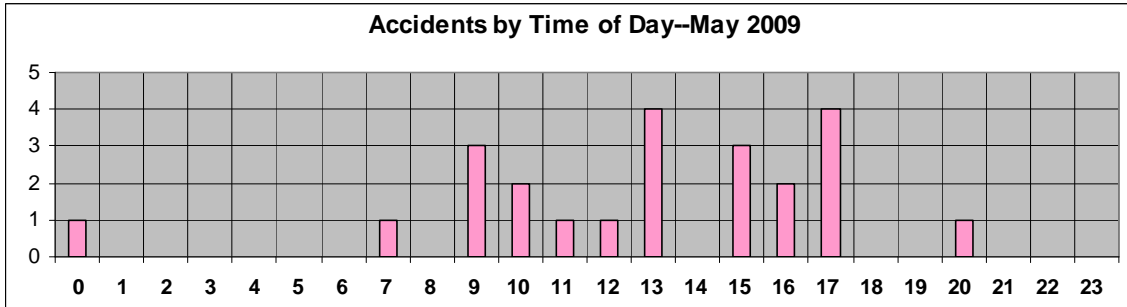

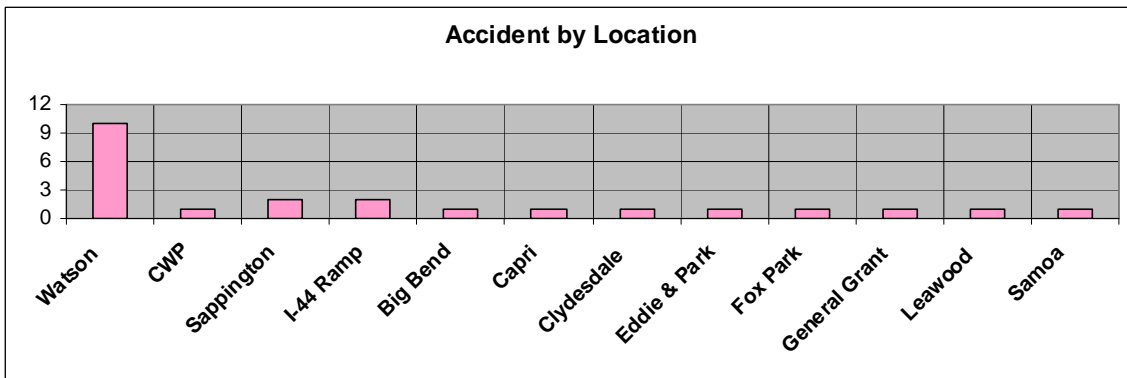
Accidents occurred on the following days of the week:



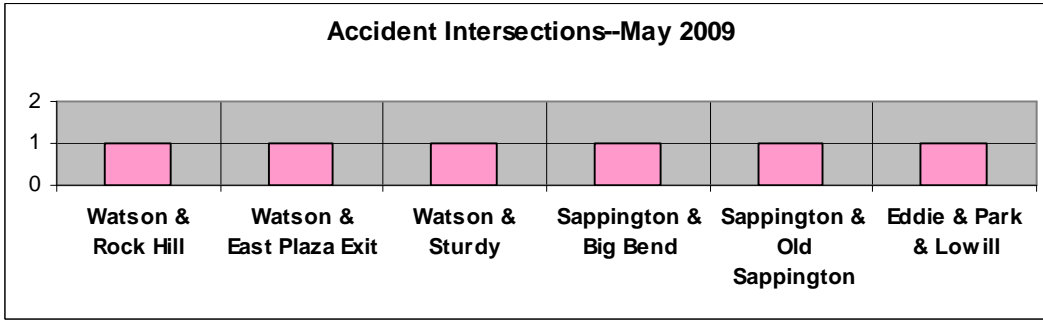
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



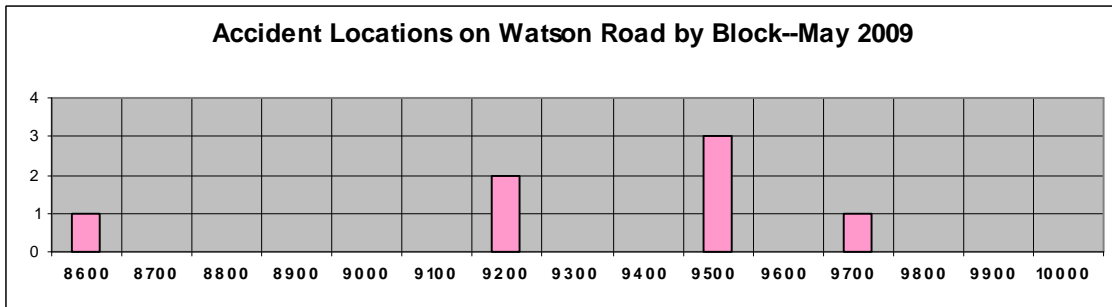
Accidents occurred on the following streets in May 2009:



Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



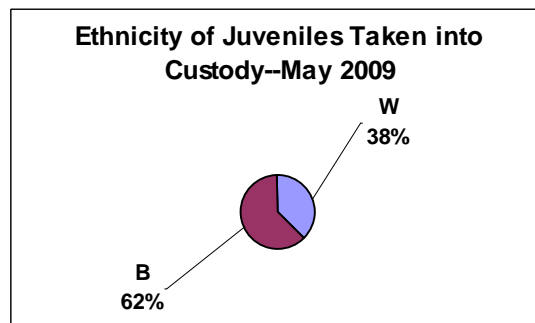
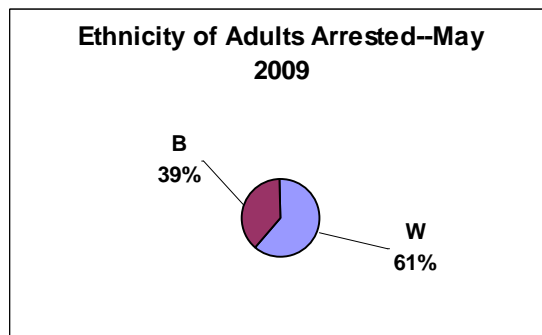

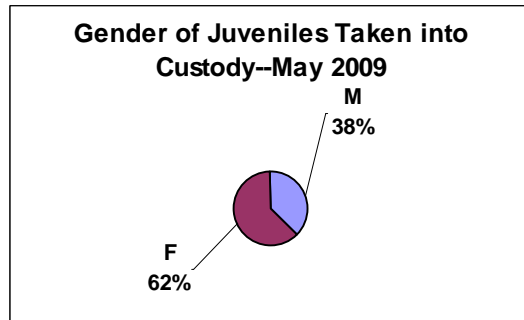
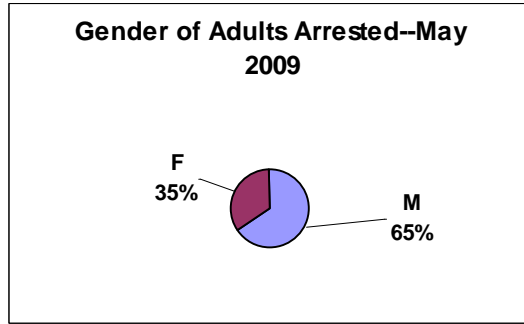
**Arrest Information:**

Fifty-one adults and seven juveniles were taken into custody in May 2009. Two persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

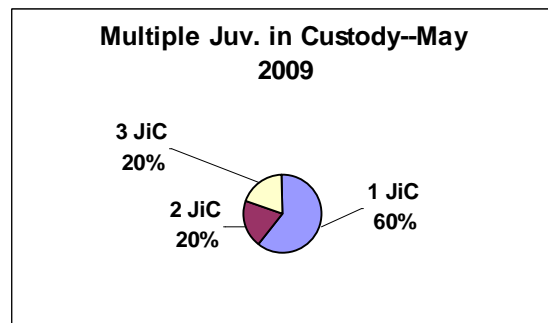
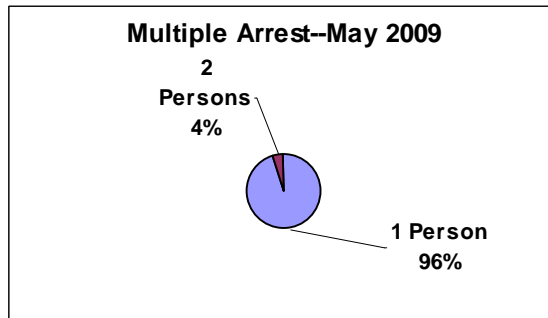
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



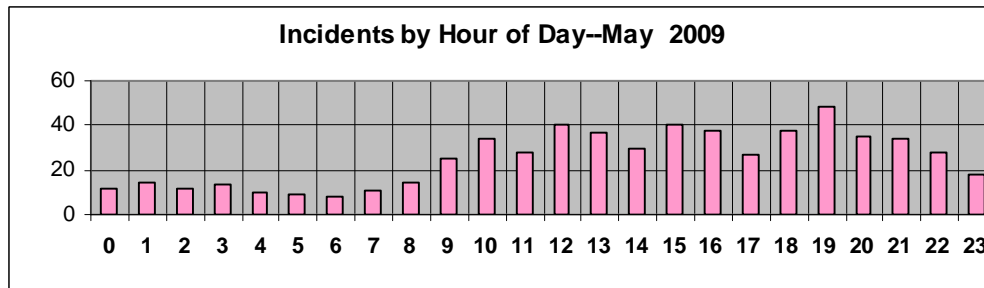
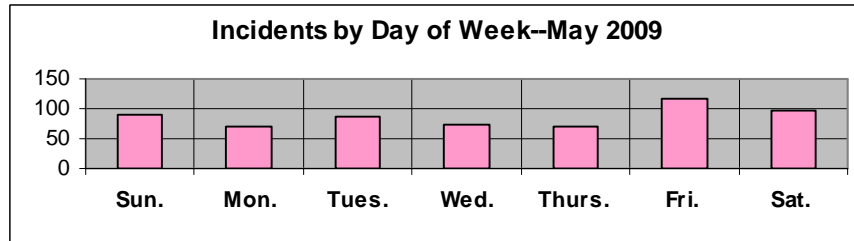
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

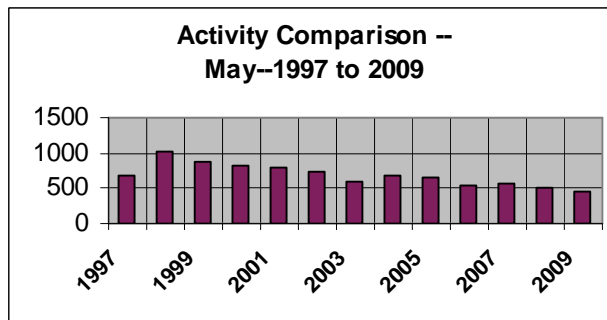
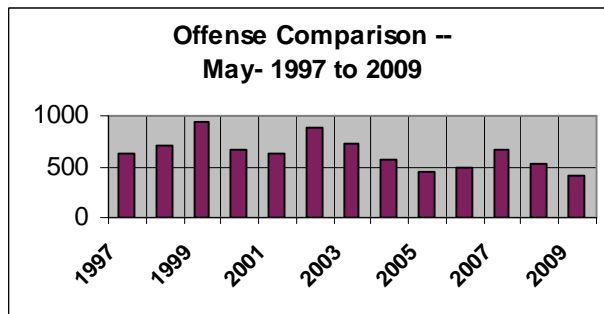

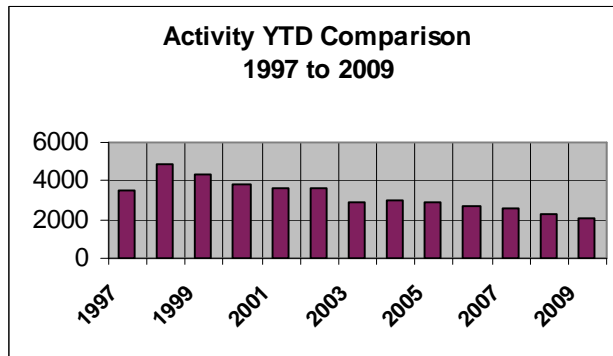
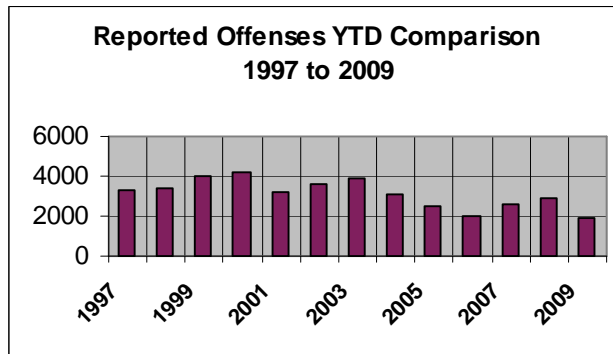


**Offense and Activity Comparison:**

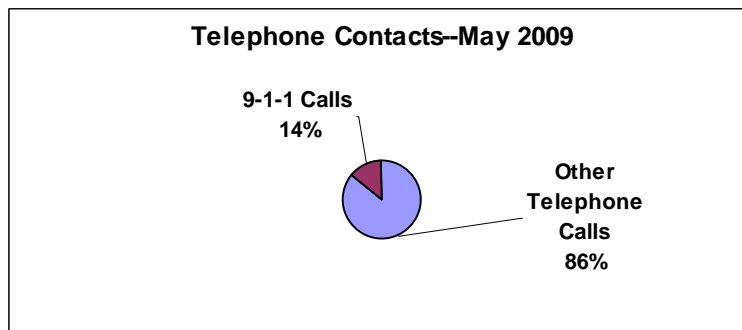


Years to Date:

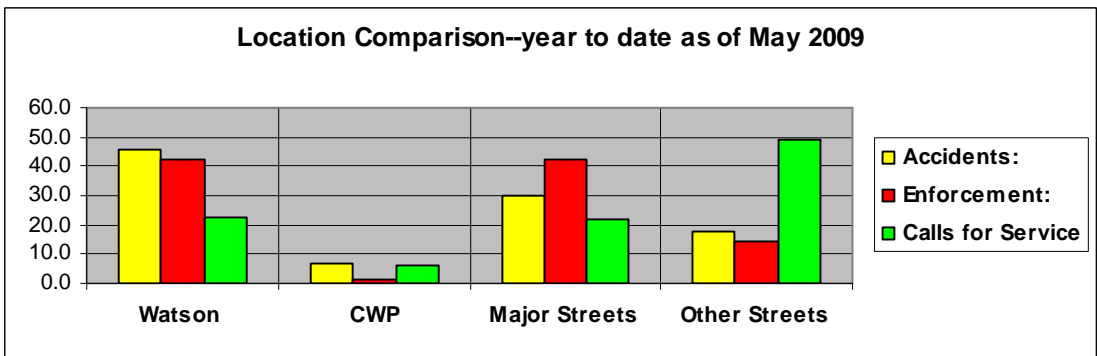


**Location Comparison:**
