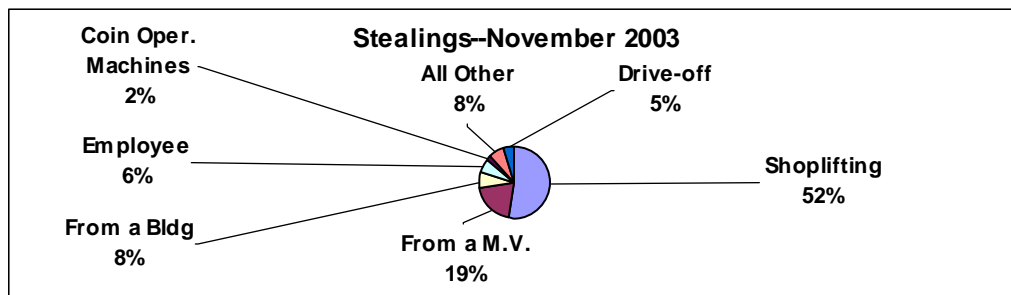
Topic: November 2003 Narrative Report

This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of November 2003. In November, there were 87 Part I offenses and 585 Part II offenses for a total of 672. This compares with 111 Part I offenses and 754 Part II offenses for a total of 865 in November 2002. The main differences were in the number of stealings, property damages, suspicious incidents and traffic stops.

There were no sexual offenses or robberies in November and there were seven assaults reported. Four involved domestic violence and six of the seven cases involved parties, who knew each other.

There was one residential forced entry burglary and one attempt residential forced entry burglary in November. On 11-20-03, a residence on Sappington was broken into during the afternoon and jewelry, guns and two figurines were taken. On the same day, during the same time period, someone attempted to gain entry to a residence on Big Bend, which is next to the house on Sappington. Entry was not gained but the victim observed a male in a vehicle in her driveway when she came home. On 11-02-03, someone pried open the rear door to a hair salon in Crestview Plaza, entered the business and removed coins from the cash register, a commercial washer and a portable stereo / message center from the business. Scene was processed by the Detective Bureau.

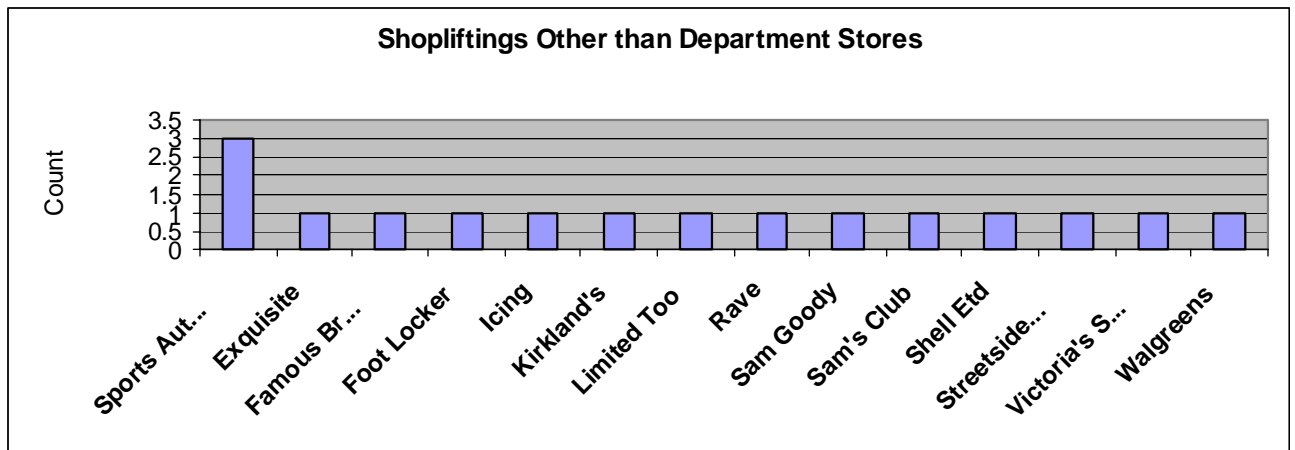
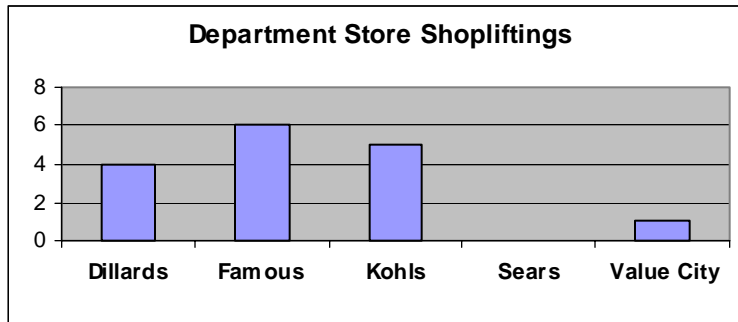
Stealings numbered 62 in November. Stealings were of the following classifications:



Thirty-two of the stealings involved shopliftings and the remainder involved the theft of license plate tabs and license plates. Some checks was stolen from a truck and the checks have started coming back from the bank, a set of golf clubs were removed from a vehicle and a relative has been using checks and credit cards without permission. A book of inspection stickers were taken, an employee was short changed \$69.00 at the kiosk in CWP and four employees were involved in thefts from their employers. A coin-operated game was broken into in CWP, a contractor took a \$900 down payment but did not start the work and construction equipment was stolen from a storage area. Two American Flags were taken from front yards, a cooler from a rear yard and three gas drive-offs were reported.

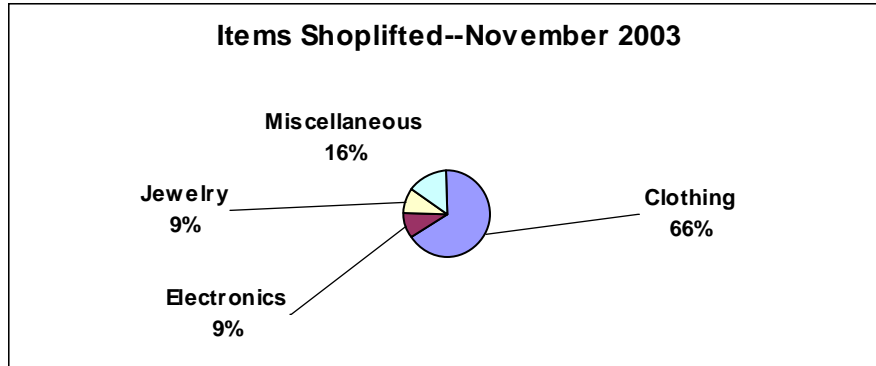
In late October, twelve vehicles were entered and change and other items were taken from the vehicle, in an area roughly along Old Sappington, Sappington and off Eddie and Park. In November, ten vehicles were entered and items stolen from four of them in an area along Big Bend and Sappington Roads. In December, there have been another five reports from an area along Sappington Road and Eddie & Park Road. On 12-01-03, Officers took a male into custody on an unrelated offense but in his possessions he had a receipt from the change machine in Schnucks for about \$60.00 and has been involved in these thefts before. Investigation is continuing and Kirkwood, Sunset Hills and Glendale Police are looking at the suspect for thefts that these Department have had reported to them with the same method of operation.

Shopliftings accounted 32 of the 62 stealings or 52%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in November:



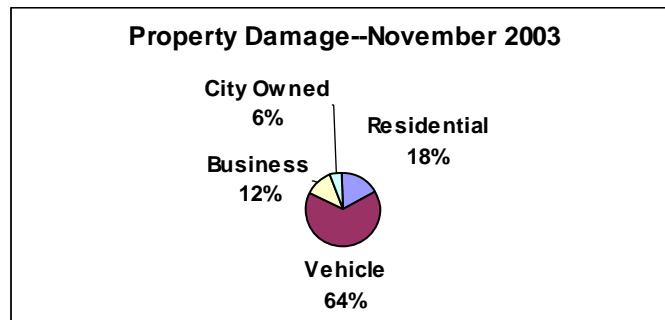
Of the shopliftings, 66% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 62%, juveniles accounted for 33% and adults and juveniles working together accounted for the remaining 5%.

The following items were taken in the shopliftings:



There were five stolen vehicles reported in November. Thefts included a 1994 Saturn, 2001 Nissan and 1998 Dodge Neon stolen from CWP. All three were recovered in St. Louis City. Two pickup trucks, 1993 Chevrolet and 1994 Ford, were stolen on different dates and in different sections of the city and only one has been recovered.

There were 17 property damages reported in November and they were of the following classifications:



Tamperings included two recovered stolen vehicles, a tampering with a utility at a residence by an estranged husband and seven tamperings with vehicles. Property damages included someone driving on the grass at Crestwood Park, graffiti in Watson Plaza and clothing marked with a marker at a clothing store in CWP. Property damages involving vehicles included two broken windows and the residential property damages were a mailbox and a coffee table broken during a dispute.

Part I offenses totaled 87 in November.

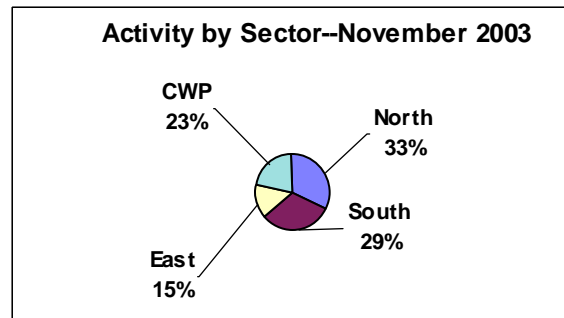
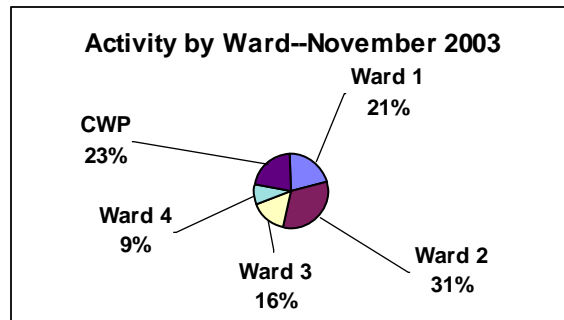
**Part II:**

In November, there were eight frauds, one bad check, four credit card frauds, two forgeries and one other fraud. There were two drug cases; both involved marijuana and one of these cases involved the obtaining of a search warrant for a residence. There were four offenses against public peace, one disorderly conduct, a peace disturbance, one harassment and an annoying telephone call.

There were six DWI arrest cases with test results in a range from .114 to .328%. There were three people related calls, two suicide attempts and an accidental injury. The four juvenile offenses were two minors in possession of beer, a curfew violation and one "all other" type juvenile offense. There were three family offenses, a child abuse investigation being handled by DFS and two ex-parte order violations. There was one weapons offense involving an accidental discharge of a rifle and an arson at a manufacturing plant involving a fire in a wall that the fire detection system caught before there was an actual fire and any damage.

Part II offenses numbered 585 in November.

In Ward One in November, there was one burglary in Crestview Plaza, four stealings, all at Watson Road addresses, one property damage and one stolen vehicle. There were three frauds, one drug offense and two offenses against public peace. There were seven traffic accidents, 4 DWI cases, one people related and three juvenile cases. There were 24 calls for suspicious activity on 12 different streets and 36 calls for miscellaneous police service.

In November in Ward Two, there were two burglary offenses, 22 stealings with seven occurring in the neighborhoods, eight property damages and one stolen vehicle. There was one fraud, one drug offense, one family offense and one weapon call. There were 21 vehicle accidents, one people related call and one animal related call. There were 23 calls for suspicious activity on 13 different streets and 70 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Three in November, there were 8 stealings with two occurring in the neighborhoods and two property damages. There was one fraud, one juvenile and two family related calls. There were 4 motor vehicle accidents, one DWI case and one people related case. There were 12 calls for suspicious activity on 7 different streets and 34 calls for miscellaneous police service.

In November in Ward Four, there were two stealings and four property damages. There were two offenses against public peace and one motor vehicle accident. There were 13 calls for suspicious activity on 10 different streets and 25 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Crestwood Plaza in November, there were 26 stealings, nineteen shopliftings, one theft from a building, one theft from a kiosk, two employee thefts, one theft from a coin-operated machine and two thefts from vehicles. There were two property damages and three vehicle thefts. There were three frauds and nine motor vehicle accidents. There were 6 calls for suspicious activity and 24 calls for miscellaneous police service.

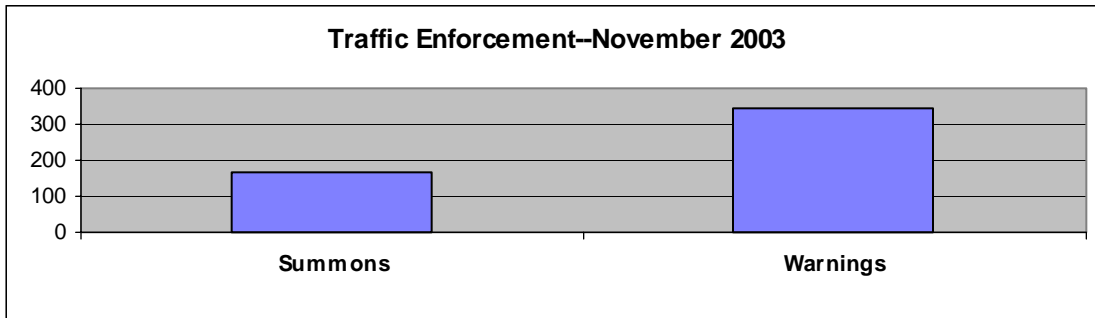

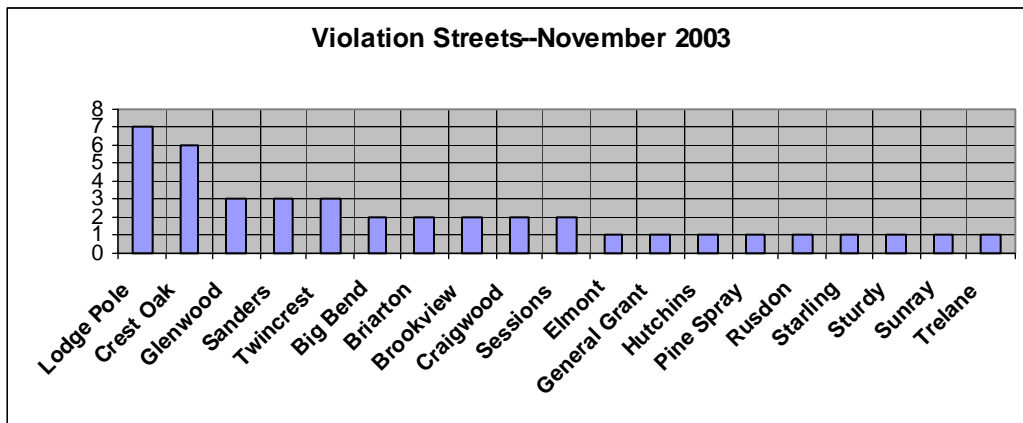
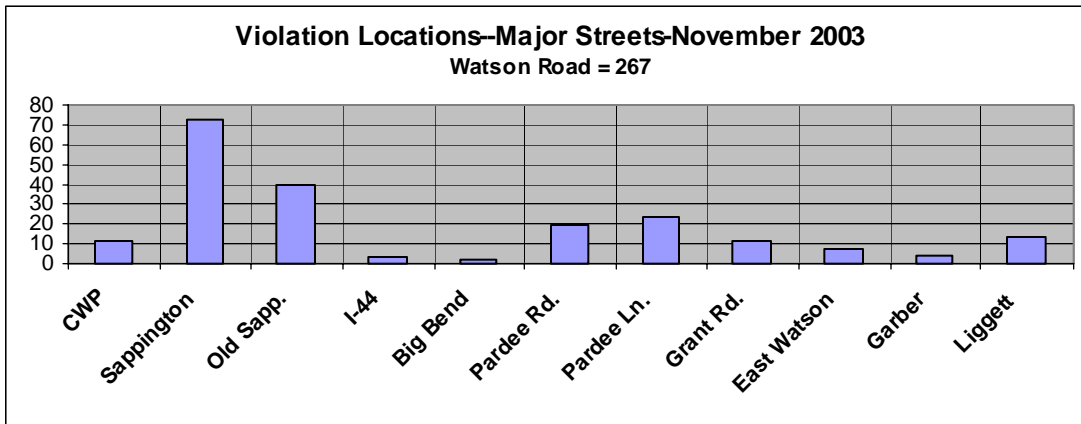
Traffic enforcement actions were taken for the following violations:



The age of the violators was determined to be:

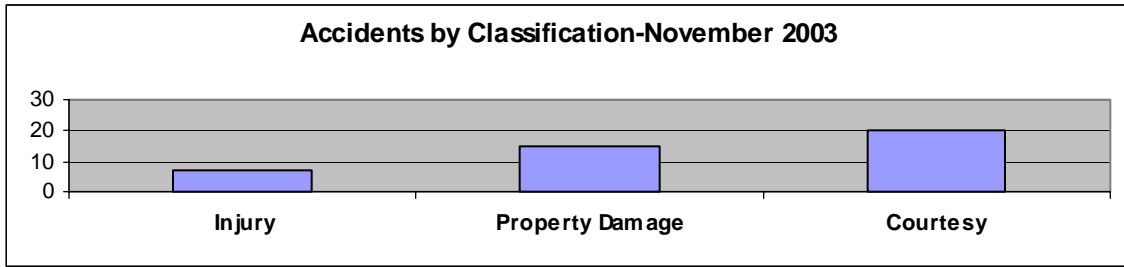

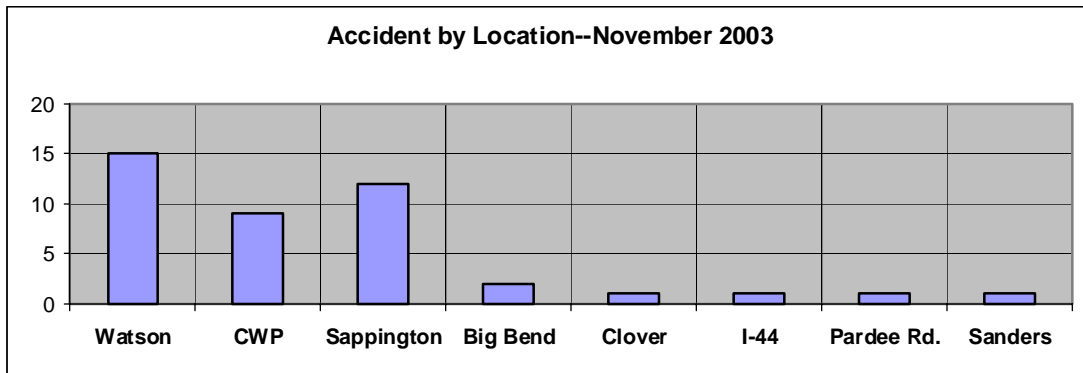
The accidents occurred on the following days of the week:



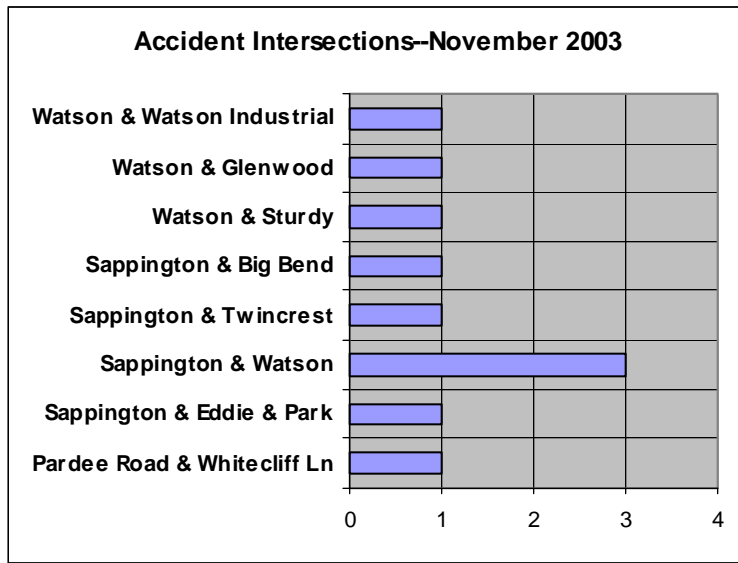
The accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



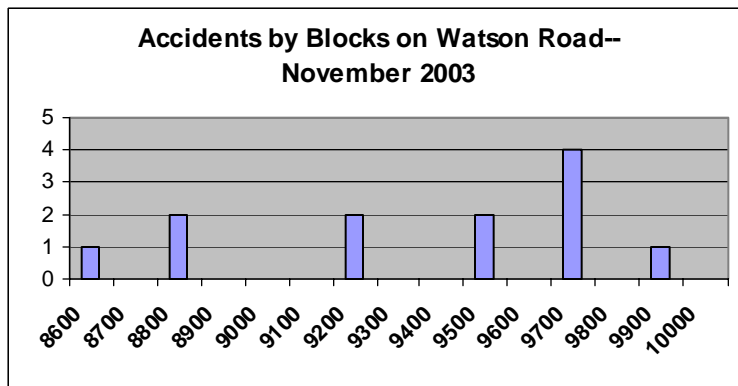
Accidents occurred on the following streets in November:



Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



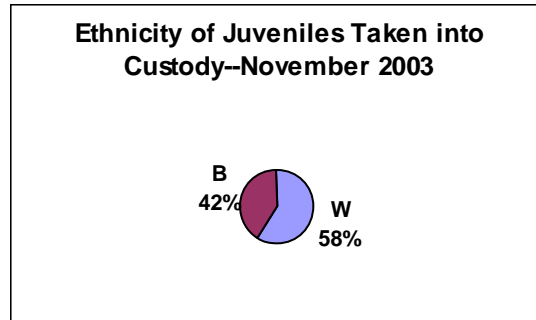
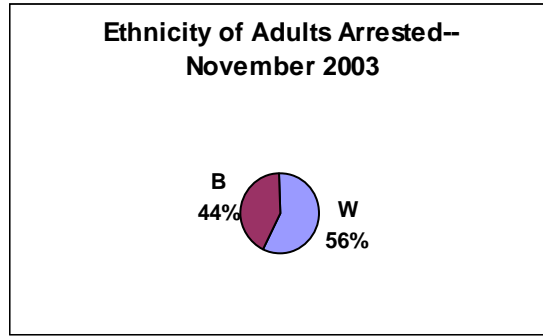

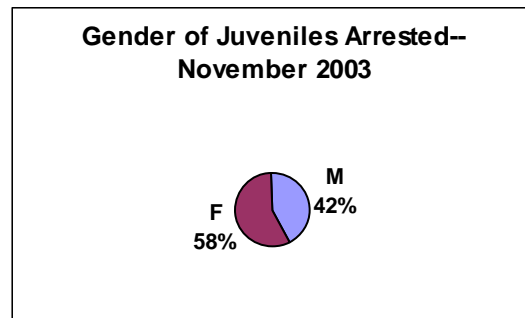
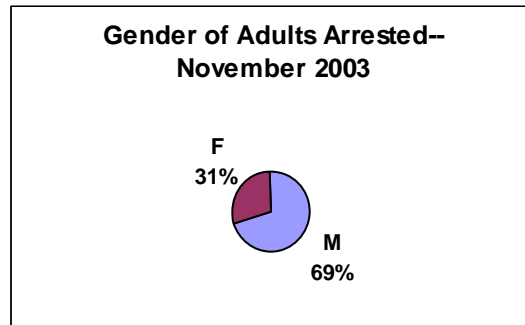
**Arrest Information:**

Eight-seven adults and 12 juveniles were taken into custody in November. Fifteen persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrest.

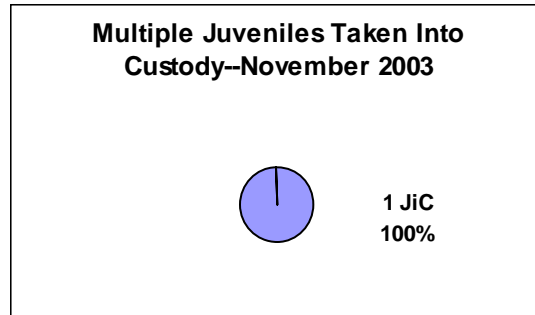
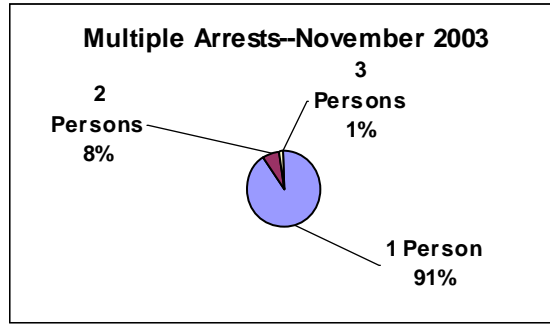
The ethnicity of the person arrested was:



Gender of the person arrested was:



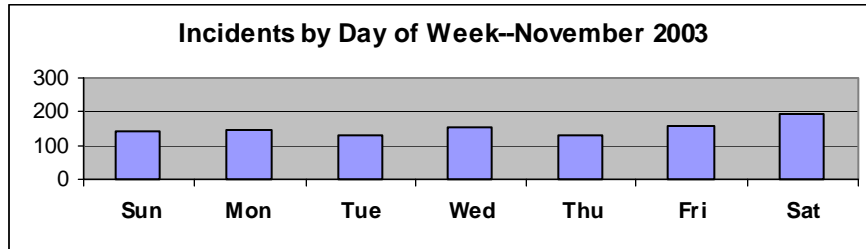
Multiple Arrests:



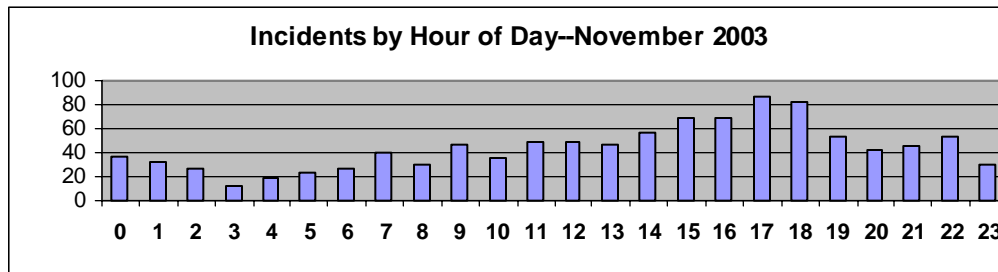

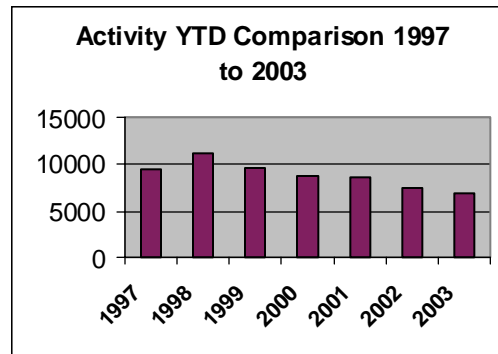
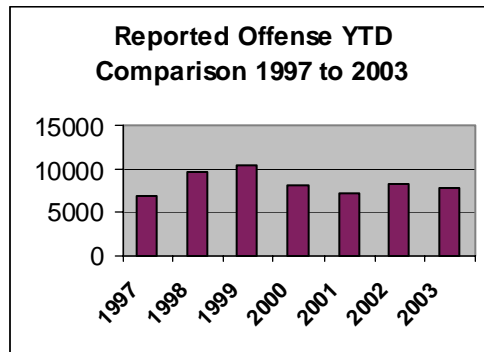


**Offense and Activity Comparison:**
