Topic: November 2007 Public Report

This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of November 2007. In November 2007, there were 73 Part I offenses and 390 Part II offenses for a total of 463. This compares with 65 Part I offenses and 537 Part II offenses for a total of 602 in November 2006. The main difference was in the number of traffic stops.

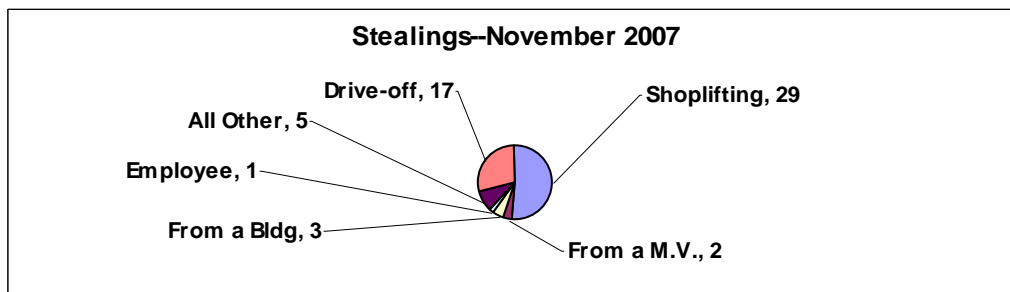
The one sexual offense involved inappropriate touching of a female by a male neighbor while riding in a vehicle.

There was one burglary reported on 11-17-2007 on Samoa. Someone broke out a window and entered the residence.

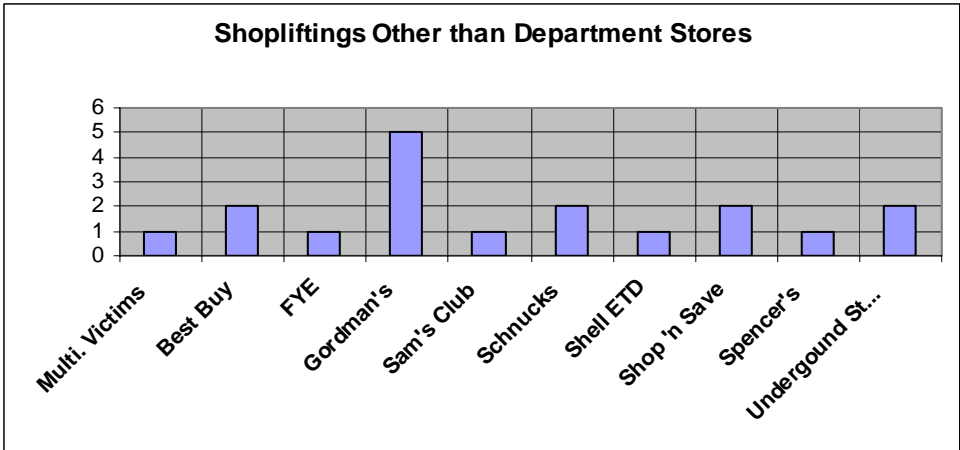
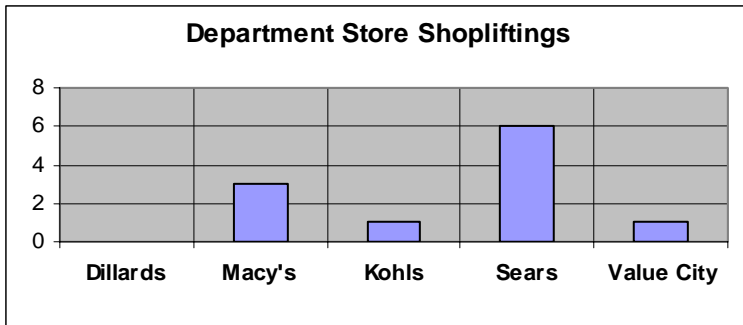
There were three assaults in November 2007 and one involved domestic violence. In two cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

Stealing offenses numbered 57 in November 2007.

Stealings were of the following classifications in November 2007:

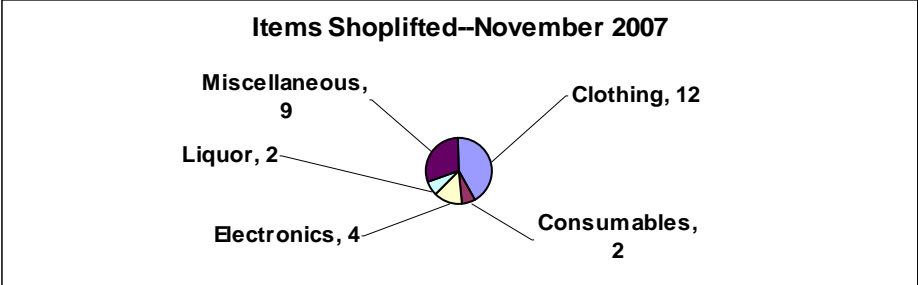


Shopliftings accounted for 29 of the 57 stealings in November 2007 or 50%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in November 2007:

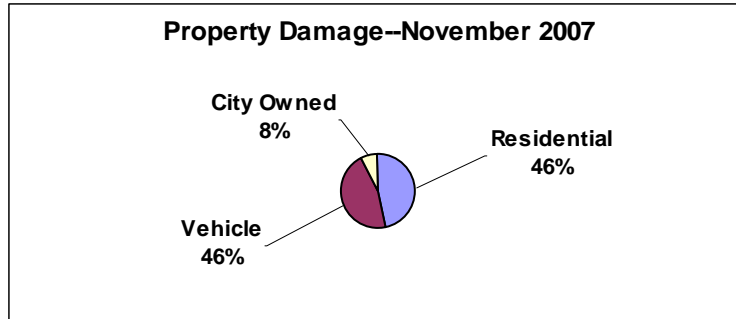


Of the shopliftings, 76% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 59%, adults and juveniles together accounted for 9% and juveniles accounted for 32% of the clearances.

There were thirteen property damages in November 2007 and they were of the following classifications:



The City Owned was damage to playground equipment.

There were no receiving stolen properties or stolen vehicles in November 2007.

Part I offenses numbered 73 in November 2007.

Part II:

In November 2007, there were eight frauds including three credit card frauds, two passing bad checks, two forgeries and one identification fraud. The three offenses against public peace were a resisting arrest, a disorderly conduct and a trespassing. There was one DWI, seven animal related calls and 58 people related calls including 52 medical emergencies, two missing persons, two sudden deaths and two suicides or attempt suicides. There were two juvenile offenses including one runaway and one minor in possession. There was one family offense, a child abuse, involving a father and son.

Part II offenses totaled 323 in November 2007.

In November 2007 in Ward One, stealings numbered ten with ten at addresses on Watson Road. Property damages numbered three, one in Watson Industrial and two in Forestview Apartments. There were two frauds, two offenses against public peace and one juvenile related offense. There were eight traffic accidents, fourteen people related calls and four animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered twelve and occurred on six different streets and there were 56 miscellaneous police service calls.

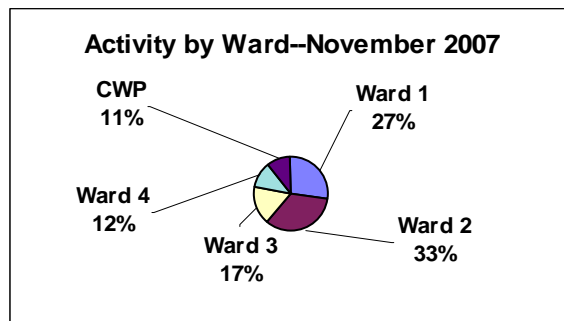
In Ward Two in November 2007, there was one sexual offenses that involved inappropriate touching and one burglary on Samoa. Stealings numbered twenty-one with twenty at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered six, one at addresses along Watson Road and five in the neighborhoods. There were two frauds and one offense against public peace. There were ten traffic accidents, fifteen people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eleven and occurred on six different streets and there were 56 calls for miscellaneous police services.

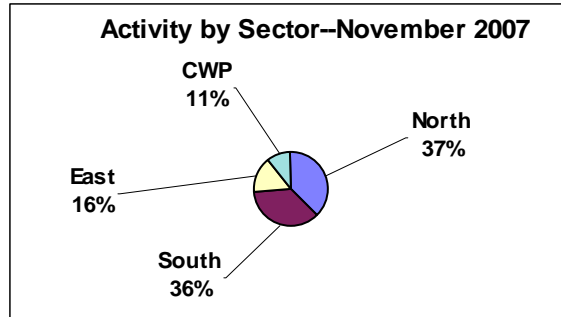
In November 2007 in Ward Three, stealings numbered seven with five at addresses on Watson Road and two in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, one in the neighborhood and one in White Cliff Park. There were three frauds, one drug offense and two juvenile offenses. There was one DWI case and five traffic accidents, twelve people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered thirteen and occurred on nine different streets and there were thirty miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in November 2007, stealings numbered one and property damages numbered two. There was one traffic accident and fifteen people related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eight and occurred on seven different streets and there were fifteen calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered eighteen with 15 shopliftings, one from buildings, one employee thefts and one all other thefts. Property damages numbered one. There was one fraud and one family offense. There were three traffic accidents and two people related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered six and there were twelve police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

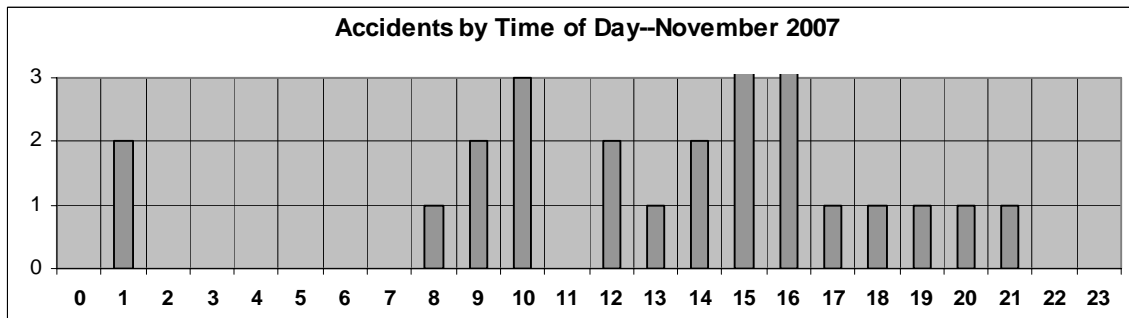

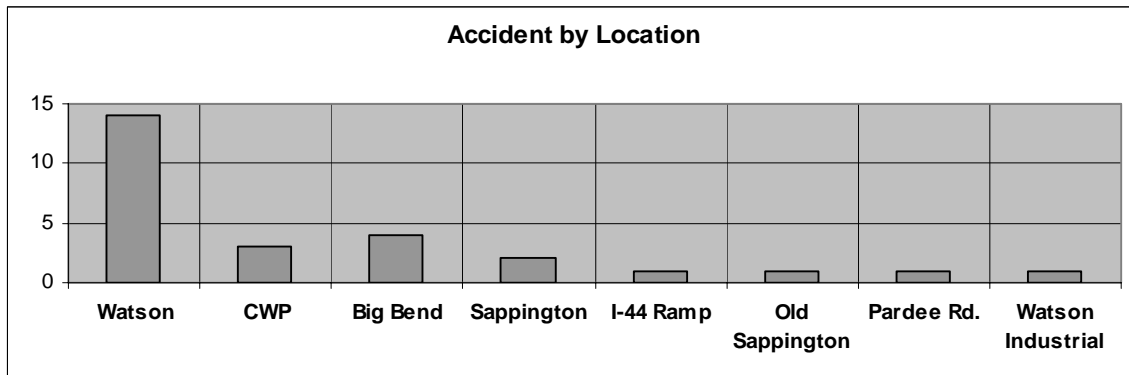
Accidents occurred on the following days of the week:



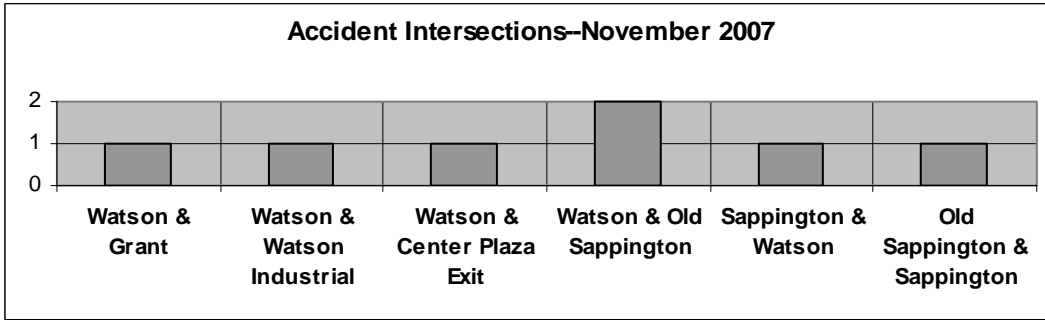
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



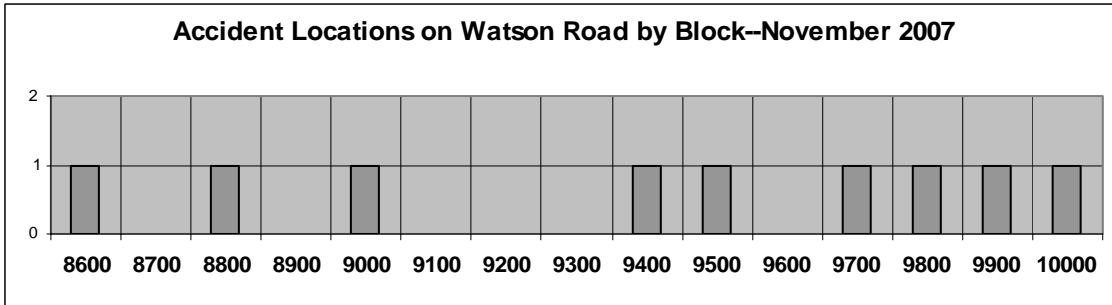

Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



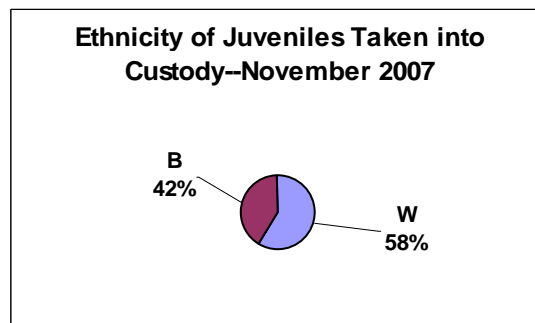
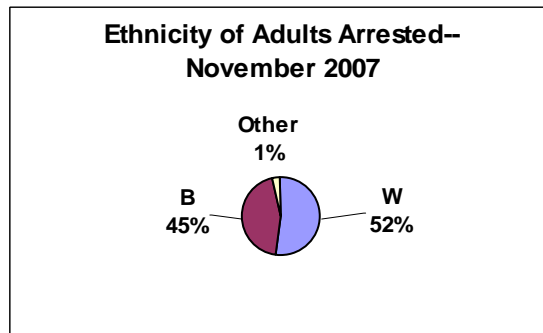
Accidents occurred in the following blocks of Watson Road:



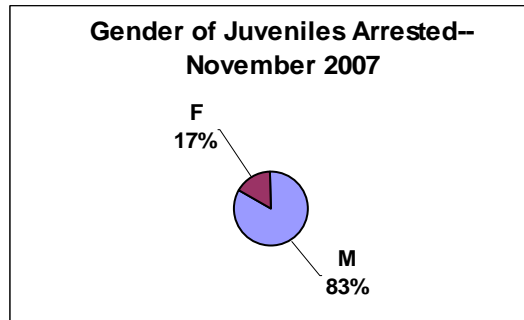
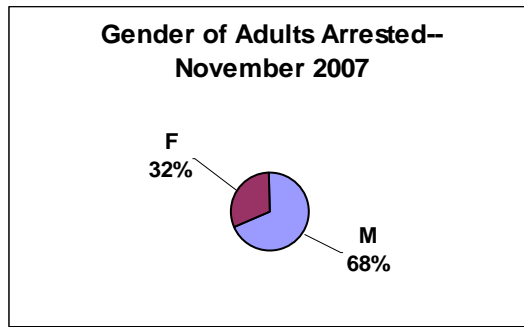
Arrest Information:

Sixty-two adults and twelve juveniles were taken into custody in November 2007. Six persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

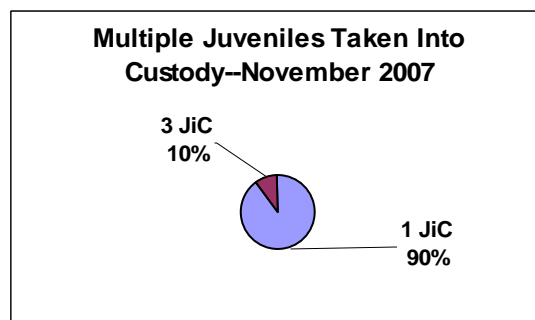
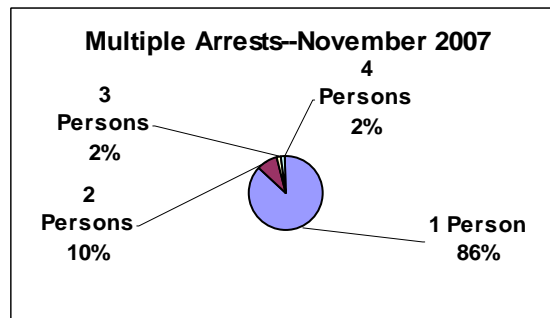
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



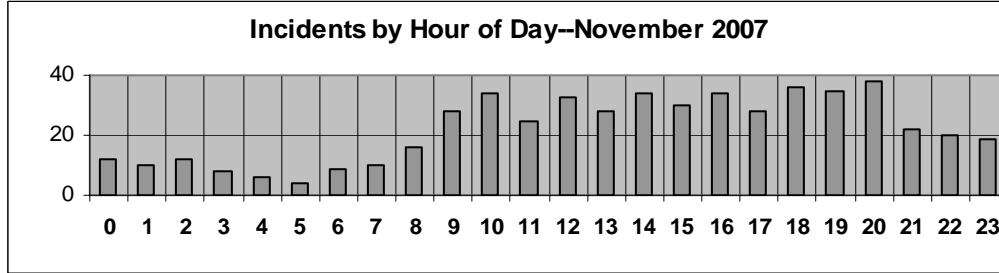
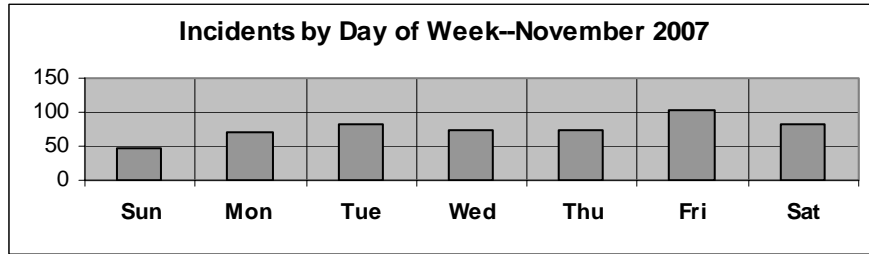
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

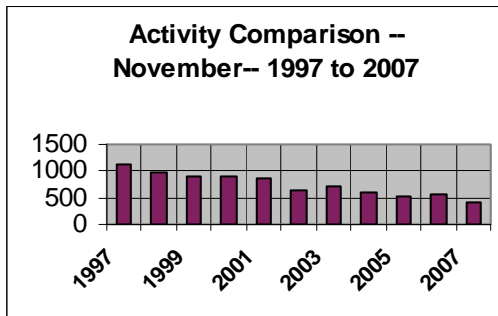
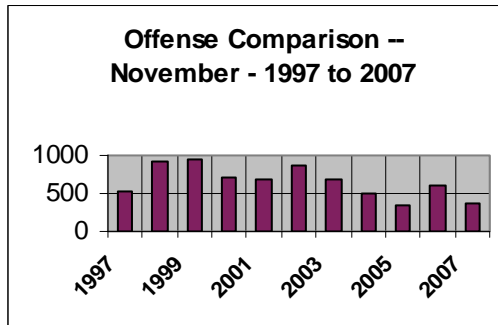

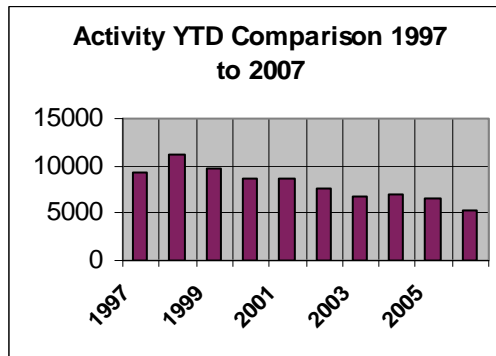
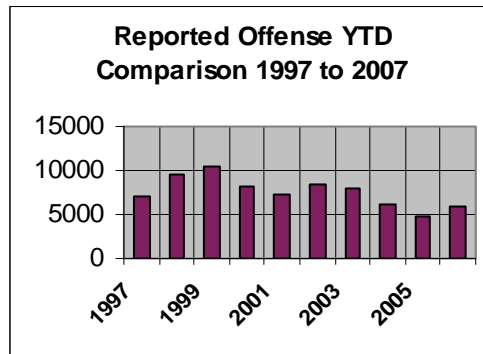


Offense and Activity Comparison:

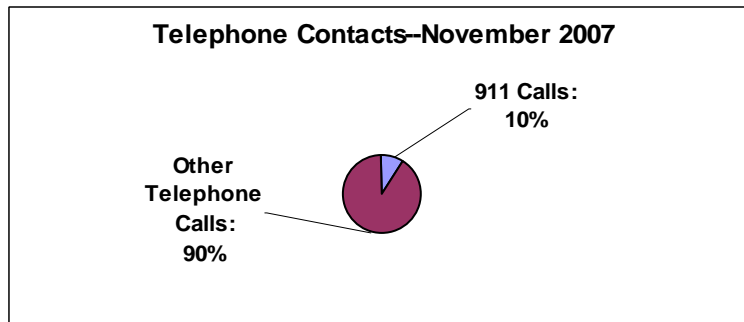


Years to Date:

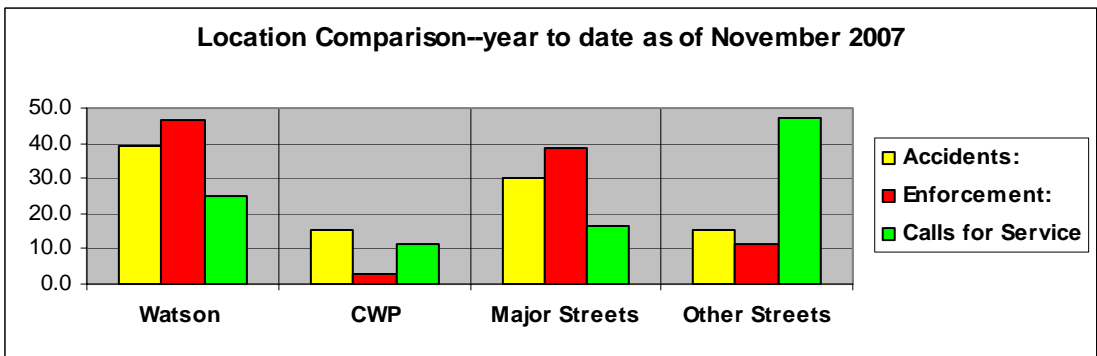


Location Comparison:
