Topic: November 2008 Public Report

This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of November 2008. In November 2008, there were 61 Part I offenses and 320 Part II offenses for a total of 381. This compares with 73 Part I offenses and 390 Part II offenses for a total of 463 in November 2007. The main difference was in the number of stealings, suspicious activities and traffic stops.

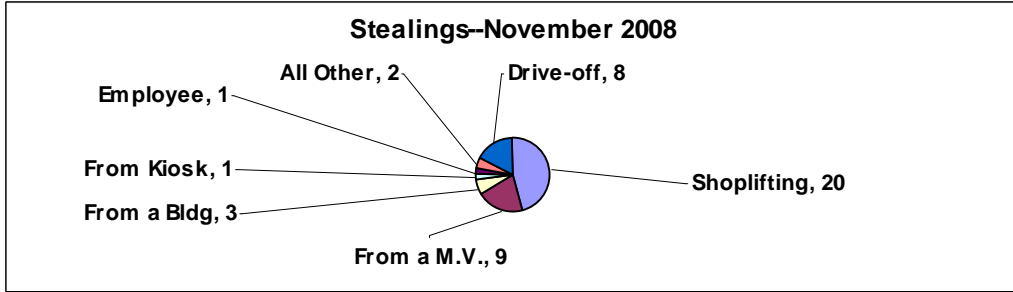
There was a rape reported on 11-23-2008 that occurred at a residence in Ward Two. The victim and suspect had met while drinking in St. Louis City and later arrived at the residence where the rape occurred. Investigation is continuing in this case.

There was one assault in November 2008 and one involved domestic violence. In all cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

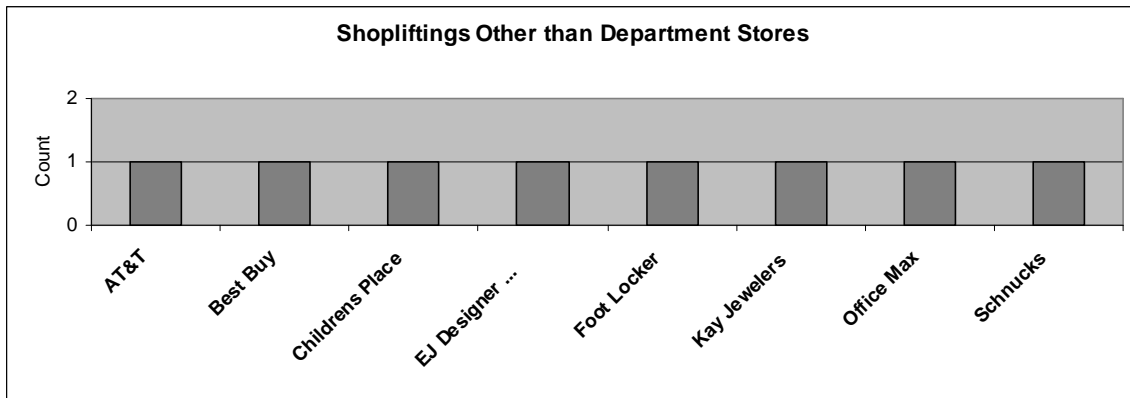
There were four burglaries reported in November. The first was reported on 11-14-2008 on Fieldcrest drive. The window was forced open and electronics were taken. The second was reported on 11-24-2008 on Liggett Ave. A window was broken out to gain entry and guns were taken. On 11-07-2008, someone attempted to enter a residence on Del Vista Dr. Entry was not gained. On 11-24-2008, a male attempted to gain entry to a residence and when he was surprised by the resident, the male ran from the area.

Stealing offenses numbered 44 in November 2008.

Stealings were of the following classifications in November 2008:

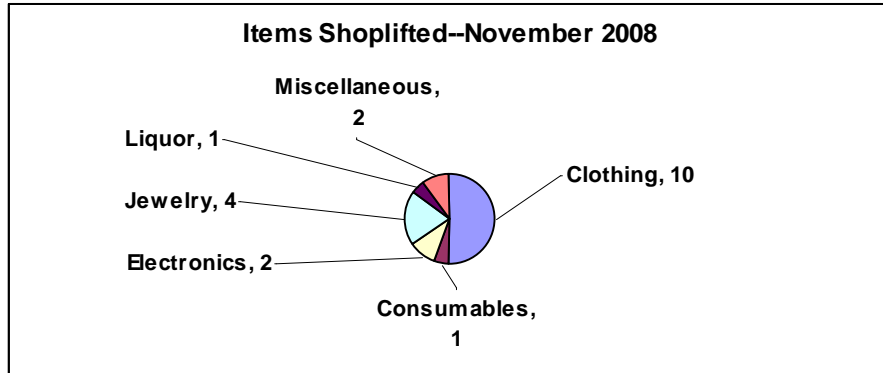


Shopliftings accounted for 20 of the 45 stealings in November 2008 or 45%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in November 2008:

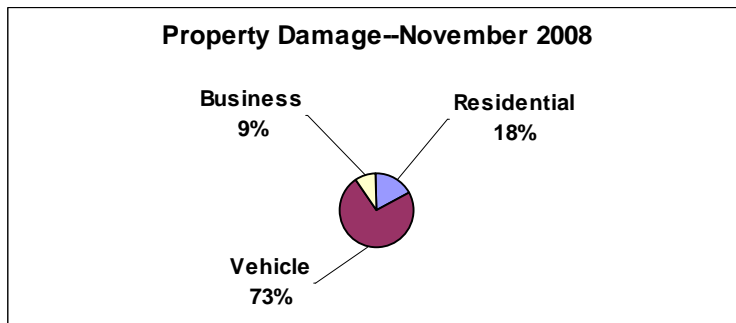


Of the shopliftings, 74% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 66%, juveniles accounted for 27% and adults and juveniles together accounted for 7%.

There were eleven property damages in November 2008 and they were of the following classifications:



There was one receiving stolen property, involving a painting that was stolen from St. Louis City venue. The one stolen vehicle was a white 1996 Dodge Intrepid that was stolen from a residence on Del Vista and was later recovered in St. Louis City.

Part I offenses numbered 61 in November 2008.

Part II:

In November 2008, there were three frauds, two credit card frauds and one counterfeiting. The one drug case involved the possession of a small amount of marijuana. The two offenses against public peace were a peace disturbance and a trespassing. There were eleven animal calls and 60 people related calls including 58 medical emergencies, one sudden death and one suicide or attempt. The two juvenile offenses were a curfew violation and a minor in possession. The family offense was a violation of an order of protection.

Part II offenses totaled 320 in November 2008.

In November 2008 in Ward One, there were three burglaries or attempts and stealings numbered seven with three at addresses on Watson Road and four in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered three, one at an address on Watson Industrial, one in an apartment complex and one in the neighborhoods. There was one fraud and one offense against public peace. There were six traffic accidents, twelve people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered six and occurred on four different streets and there were 38 miscellaneous police service calls.

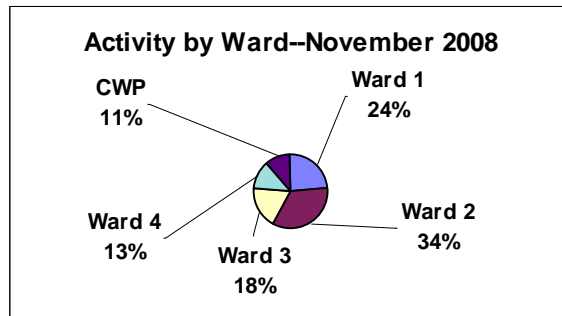
In Ward Two in November 2008, there was one sexual assault and stealings numbered fifteen with twelve at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and three in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered five, three at addresses along Watson Road and two in the neighborhoods. There were two frauds, two juvenile related and one family offense. There were seven traffic accidents, nineteen people related calls and three animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered nine and occurred on eight different streets and there were 44 calls for miscellaneous police services.

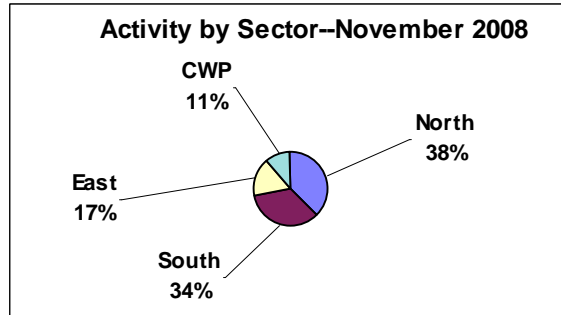
In November 2008 in Ward Three, stealings numbered three with two at addresses on Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. The single property damage was in a neighborhood. There was one traffic accidents, seventeen people related calls and four animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered six and occurred on three different streets and there were 15 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in November 2008, there was one attempt burglary and stealings numbered two and property damages numbered one. There was one stolen vehicle from on Del Vista. There was one drug offense and one offense against public peace. There were three traffic accidents, twelve people related calls and three animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered five and occurred on four different streets and there were 16 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered seventeen with fifteen shopliftings, one kiosk and one employee thefts. Property damages numbered one. There were three traffic accidents and suspicious activity calls numbered two and there were 17 police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

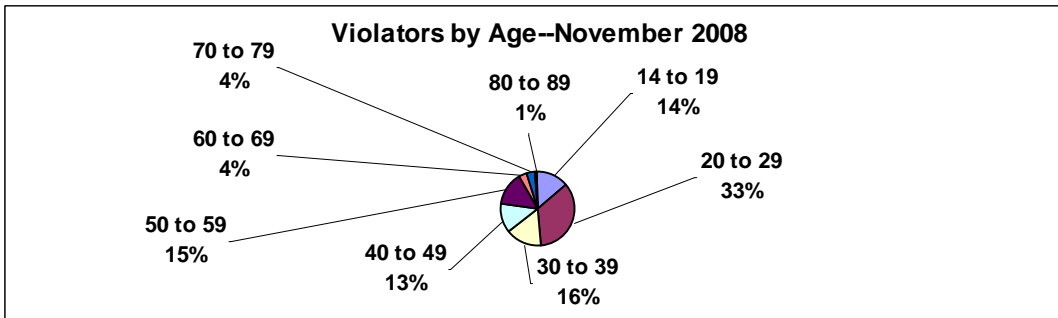

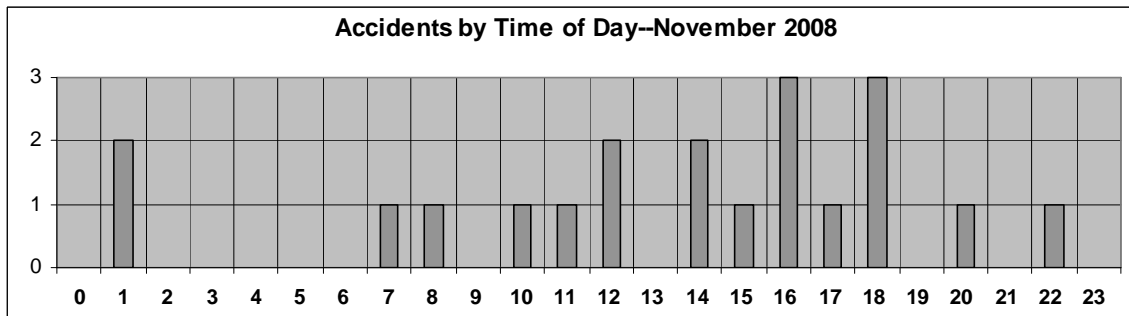

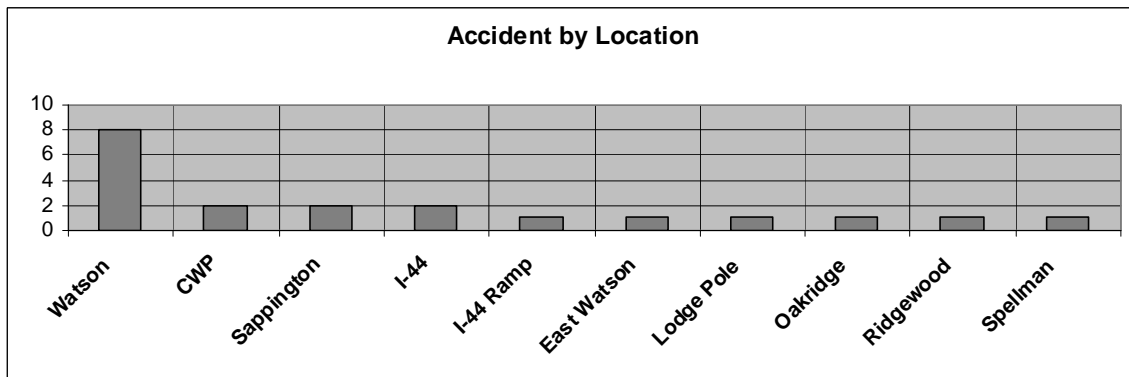
Accidents occurred on the following days of the week:



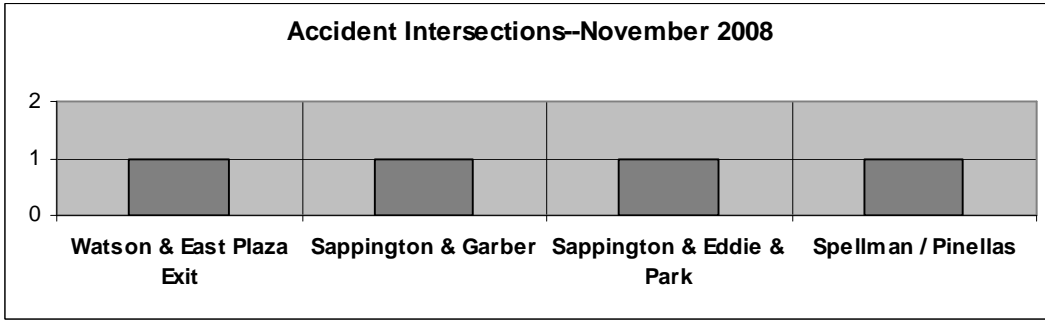
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



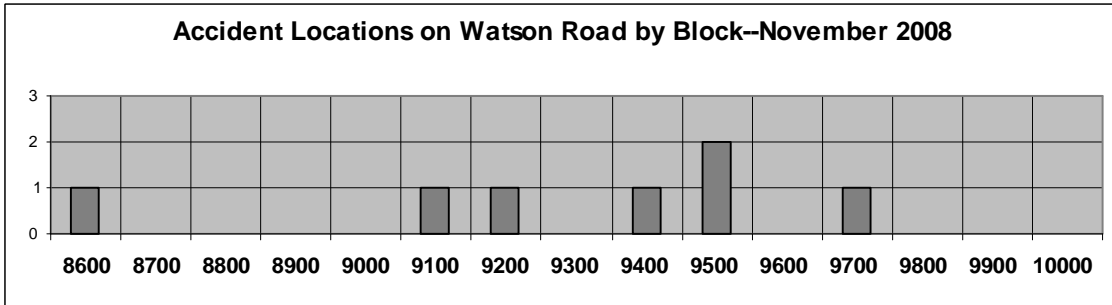
Accidents occurred on the following streets in November 2008:



Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



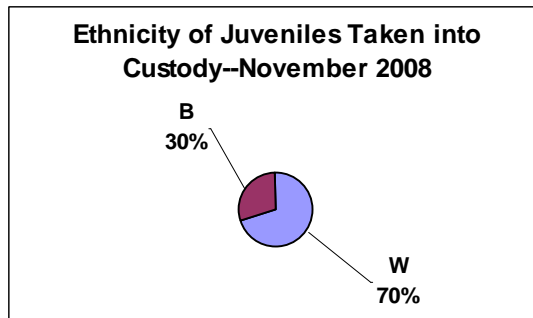
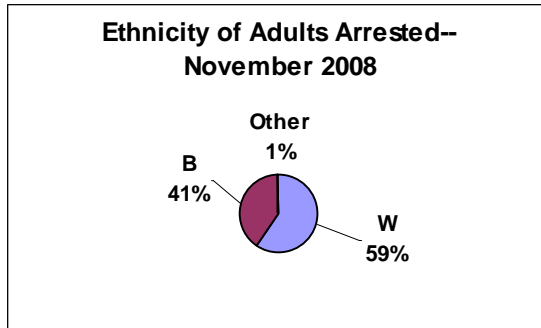
Accidents occurred in the following blocks of Watson Road:



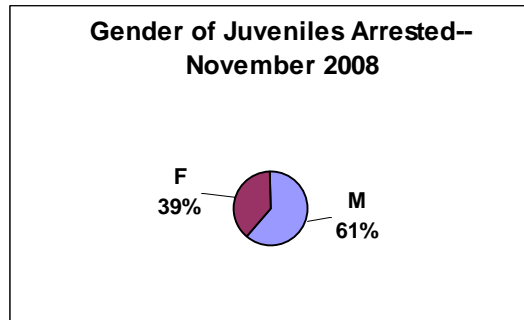
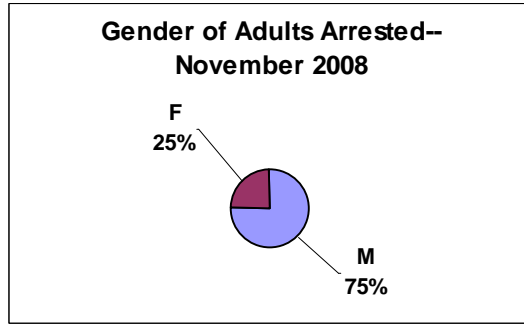
Arrest Information:

Sixty-three adults and 23 juveniles were taken into custody in November 2008. Eight persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

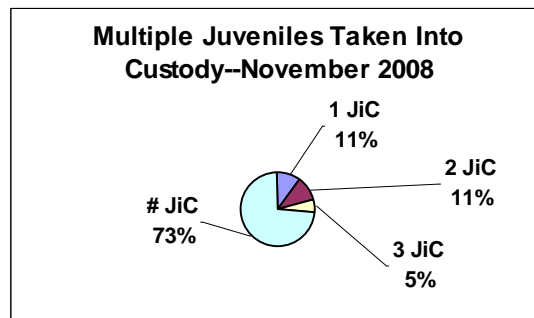
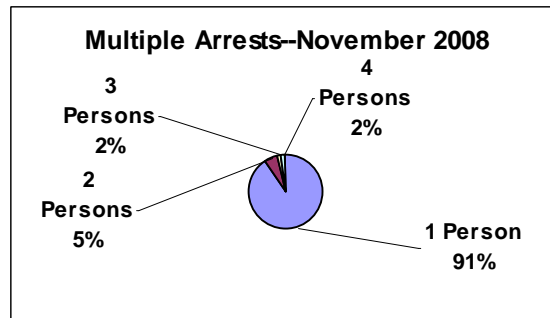
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



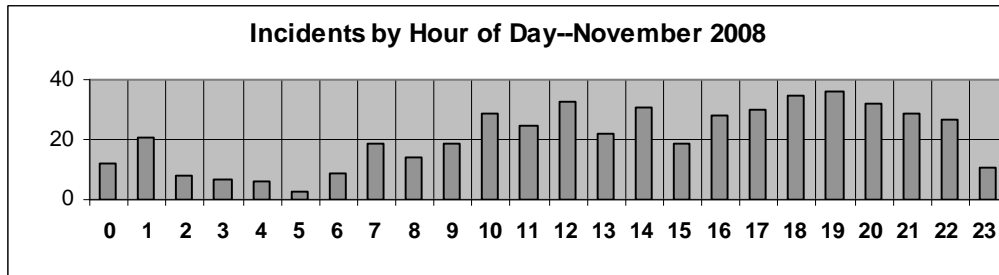
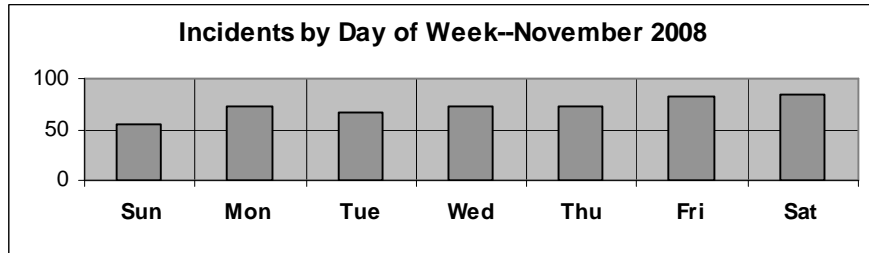
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

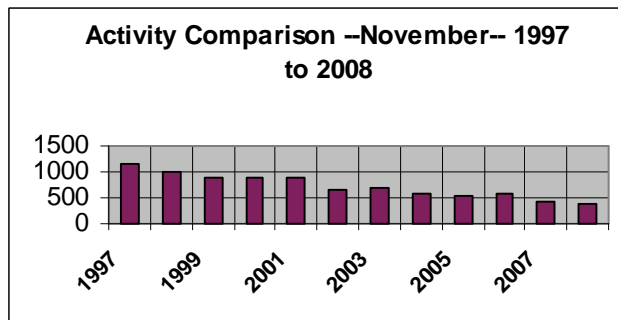
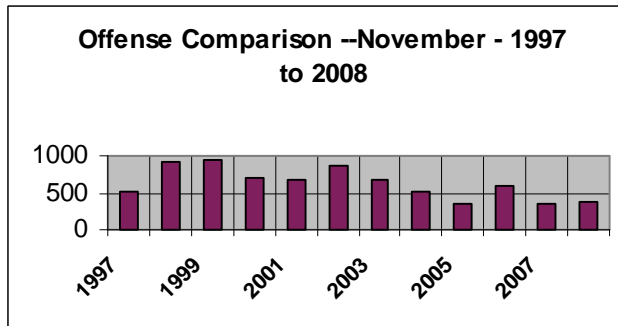

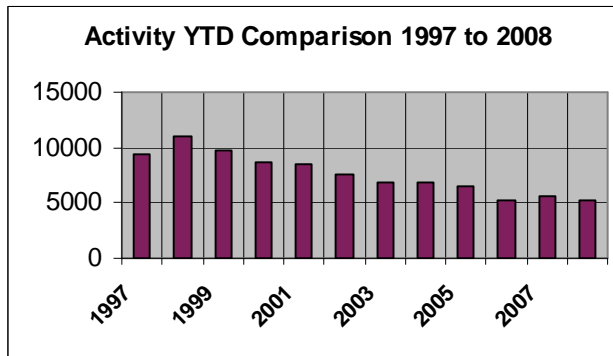
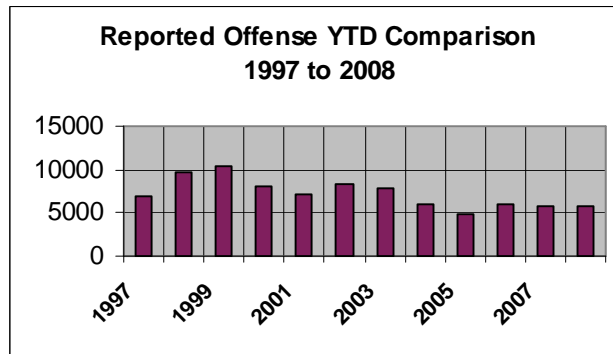


Offense and Activity Comparison:

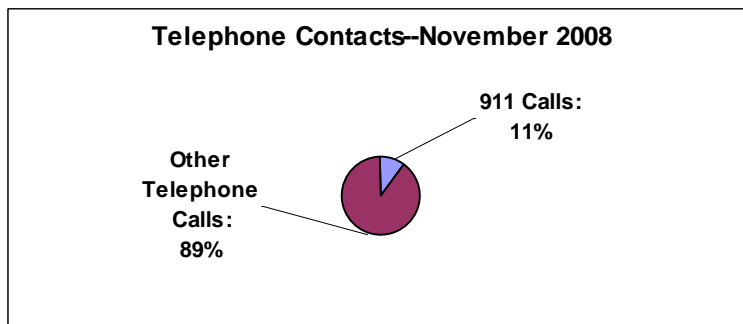


Years to Date:

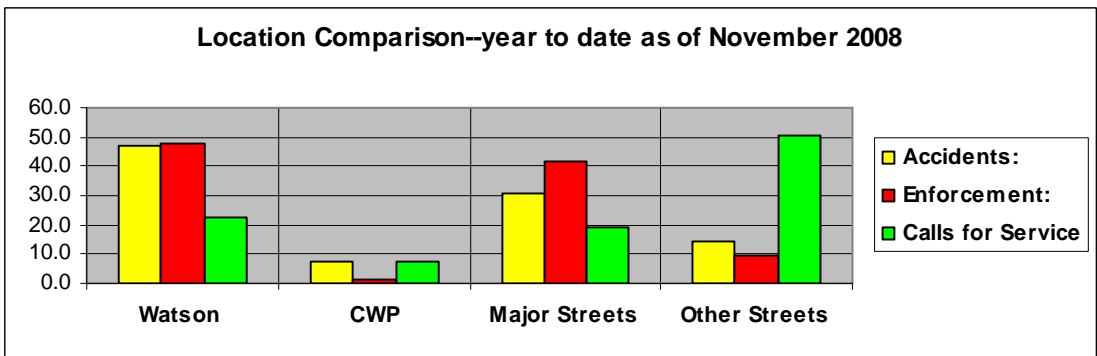


Location Comparison:
