Topic: November 2009 Public Report

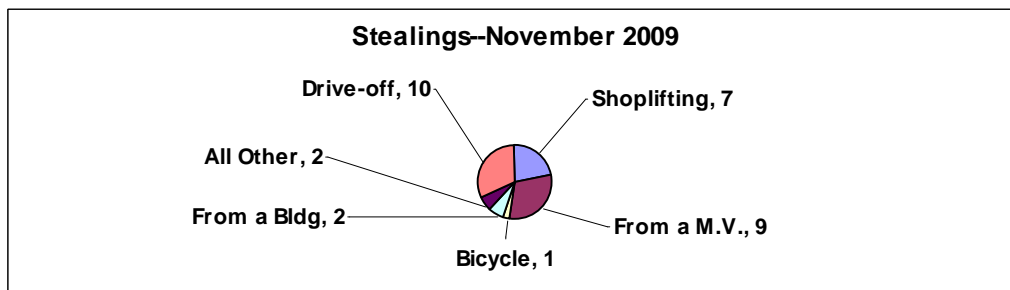
This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of November 2009. In November 2009, there were 42 Part I offenses and 341 Part II offenses for a total of 383. This compares with 61 Part I offenses and 320 Part II offenses for a total of 381 in November 2008. The main difference was in the number of stealings.

The sexual assault was reported after a Department of Family Services Hotline call was received and DFS has started an investigation into a sexual assault involving siblings.

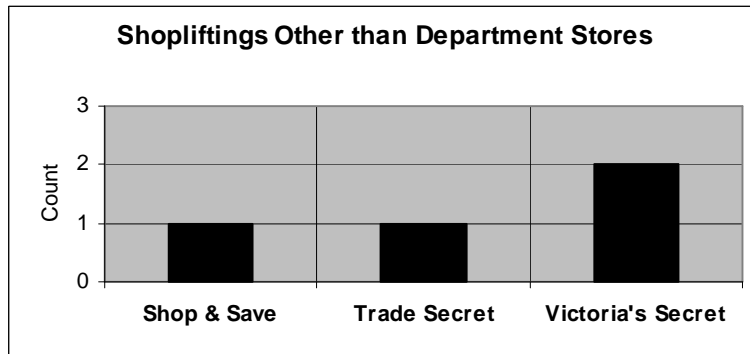
There were two assaults in November 2009 and neither involved domestic violence. In both cases, the parties did not know each other prior to the assaults. One assault involved suspects in an auto theft driving a vehicle towards the responding Officer's vehicle and almost striking the Officer's vehicle.

There were two burglaries reported in November. The first was reported on 11-26-2009 on Dallwood Drive. The suspect broke a basement window and entered the residence but nothing was taken. The Detective Bureau was notified to process the scene. The second burglary was reported on 11-30-2009 on Arban Drive. The rear door was pried open and copper pipe and a gas furnace were taken. The scene was processed by the Detective Bureau.

Stealing offenses numbered 31 in November 2009.

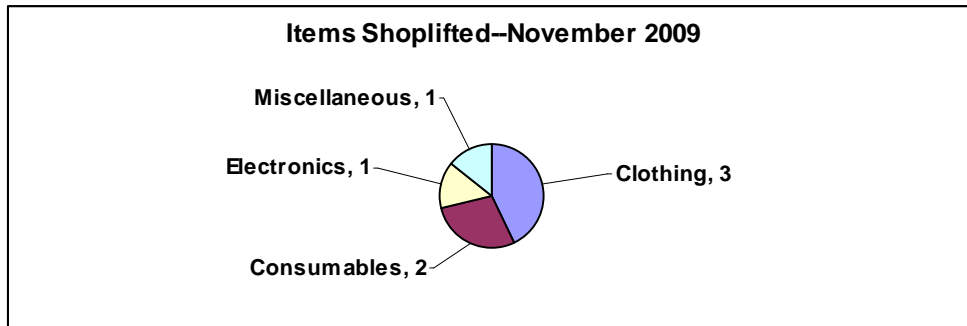


Shopliftings accounted for seven of the 31 stealings in November 2009 or 23%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in November 2009:

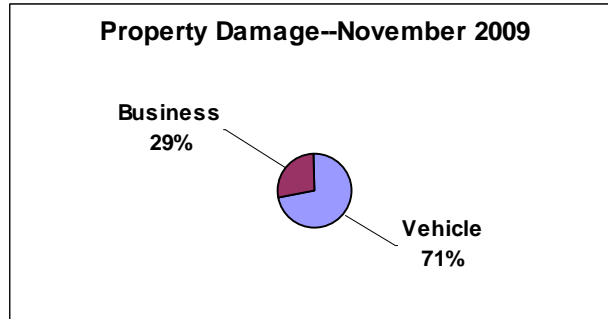


Of the shopliftings, 71% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 75% and adults with juveniles accounted for 25% of the clearances.

There were seven property damages in November 2009 and they were of the following classifications:



There was one stolen vehicles in November 2009. On 11-21-2009, a brown 2000 Dodge Neon was stolen from the former Value City lot. The vehicle was later recovered in St. Louis City.

Part I offenses numbered 42 in November 2009.

Part II:

In November 2009, there were seven frauds, three identity thefts, two fraudulent use of credit device, one forgery and one all other type fraud. There was one drug possession case that involved a small quantity of marijuana. The one offense against public peace was a disorderly conduct. There were three DWI cases, 69 people related calls including 68 medical emergencies and one sudden death and thirteen animal related calls. There were 45 suspicious activity calls, five fugitive arrests and 23 failure to appear arrests.

Part II offenses totaled 319 in November 2009.

In November 2009 in Ward One, there was one residential burglary on Arban. Stealings numbered three with one at an address on Watson Road and two in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two with both at addresses along Watson Road. There was one drug offenses involving a small amount of marijuana and one DWI and six traffic accidents, fourteen people related calls and four animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered thirteen and occurred on seven different streets and there were 43 miscellaneous police service calls.

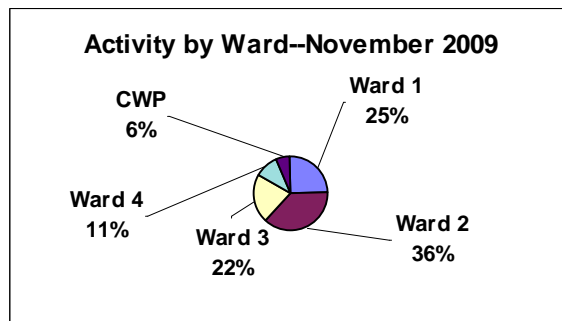
In Ward Two in November 2009, there was one residential burglary on Dallwood. Stealings numbered fourteen with twelve at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend, one in an industrial area and one in the neighborhoods. There were four frauds, one forgery, one identity theft, one credit card fraud and one other type fraud. one offense against public peace, a disorderly conduct, two DWI and eight traffic accidents, 25 people related calls and five animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered twelve and occurred on nine different streets and there were 58 calls for miscellaneous police services.

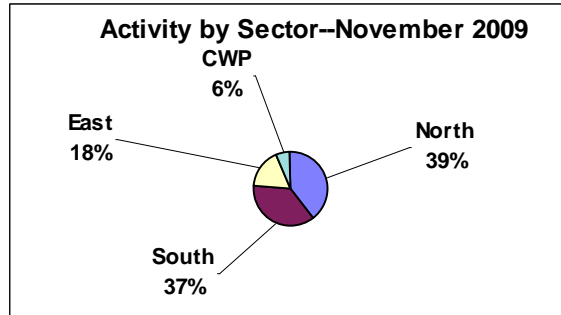
In November 2009 in Ward Three, stealings numbered eight with five at addresses on Watson Road and three in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered three, two at addresses along Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. There was one vehicle stolen from the former Value City Lot. There were two frauds, a credit card fraud and an identity theft, three traffic accidents, nineteen people related calls and three animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered twelve and occurred on eight different streets and there were 27 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in November 2009, there was one sexual assault and stealings numbered one. There was one fraud, an identity theft, ten people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered six and occurred on six different streets and there were 22 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered five with four shopliftings and one from a vehicle and property damages numbered two. There was one people related call. Suspicious activity calls numbered two and there were thirteen police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

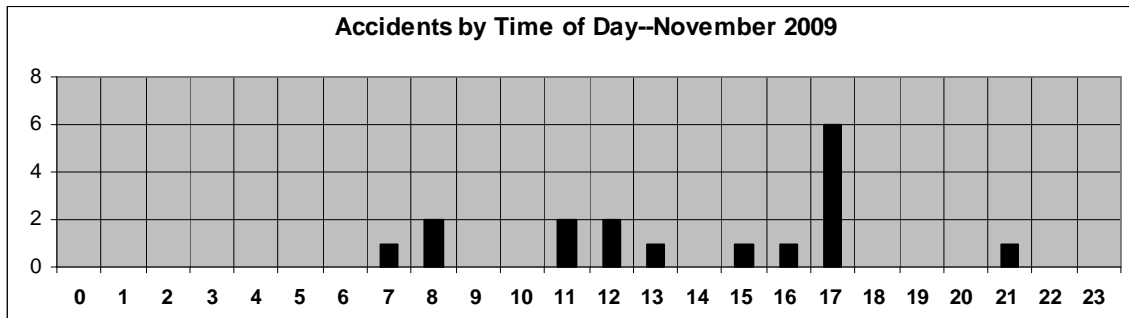

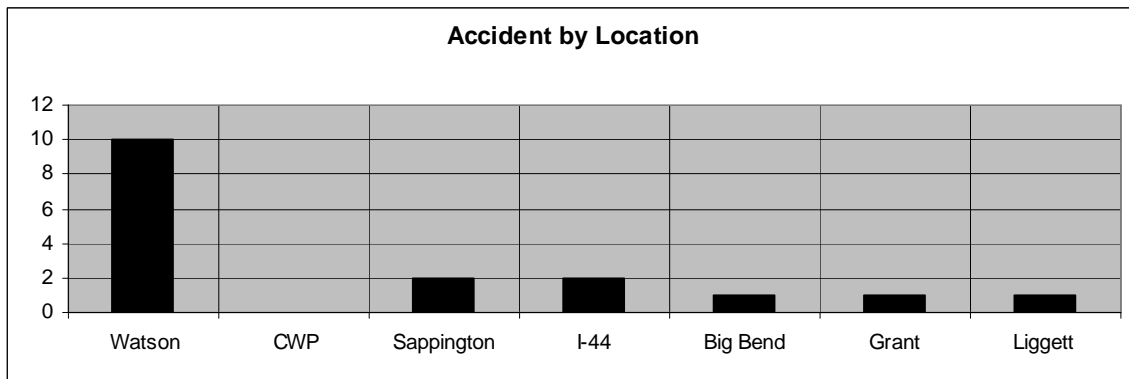
Accidents occurred on the following days of the week:



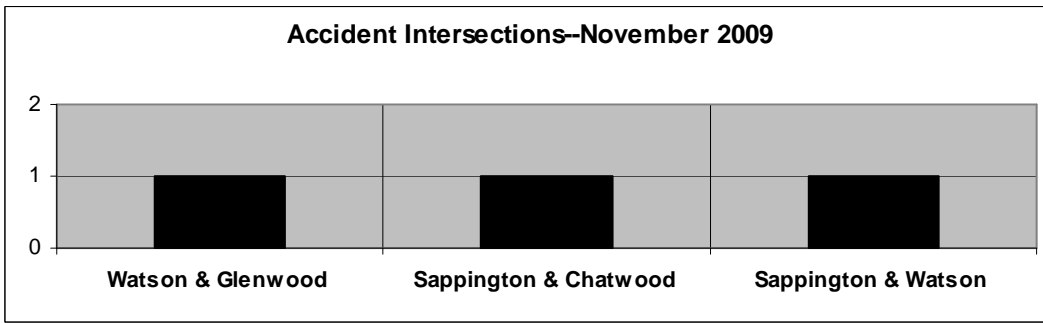
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



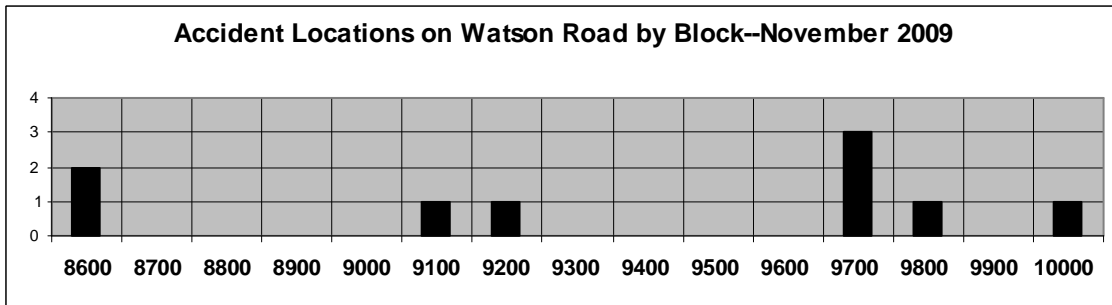
Accidents occurred on the following streets in November 2009:



Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



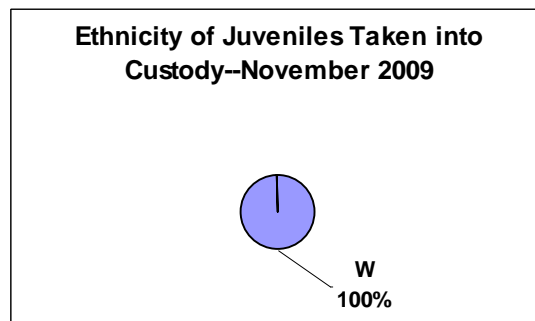
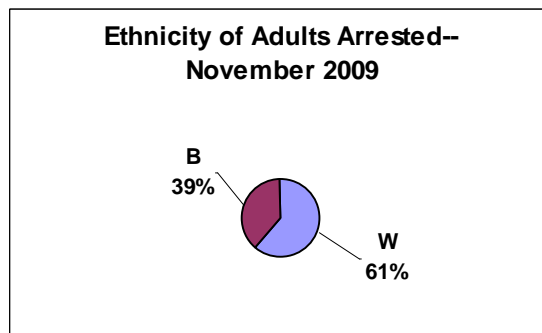
Accidents occurred in the following blocks of Watson Road:



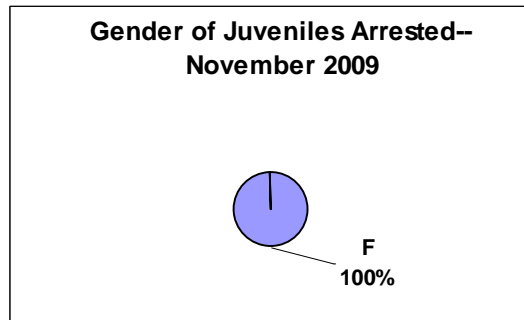
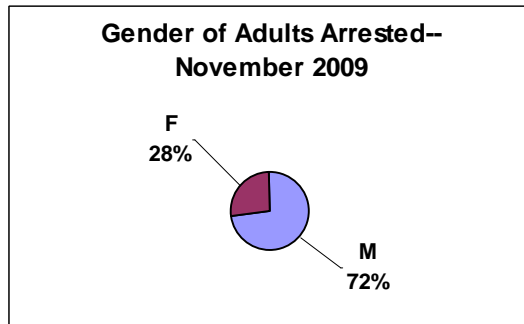
Arrest Information:

Thirty-six adults and one juvenile were taken into custody in November 2009. Four persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

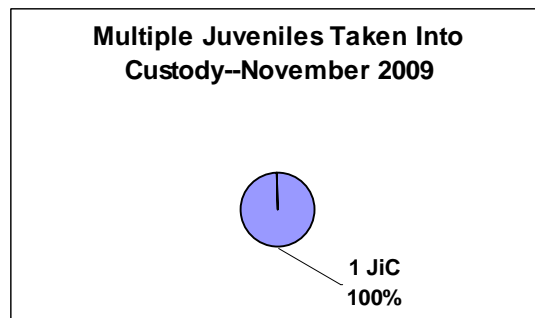
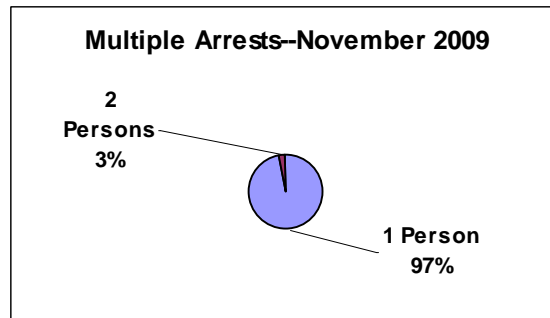
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



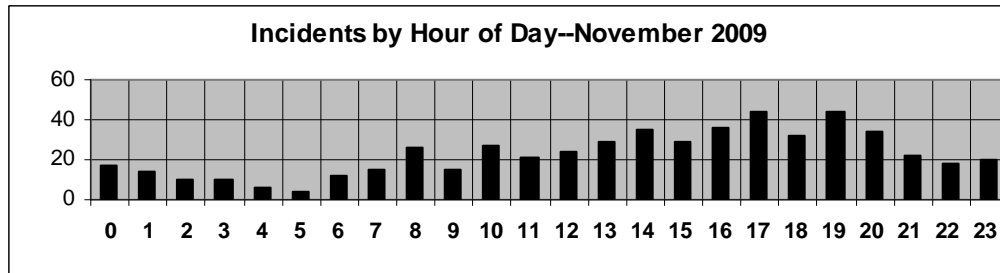
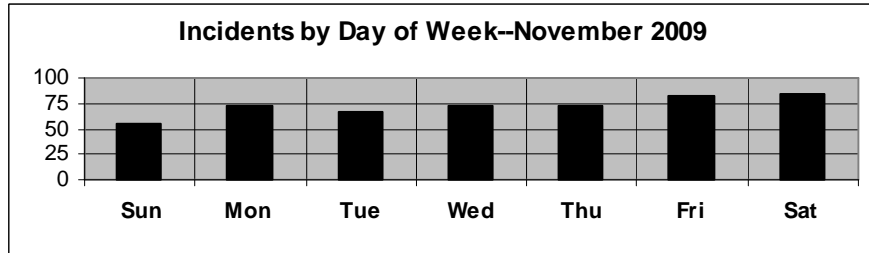
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

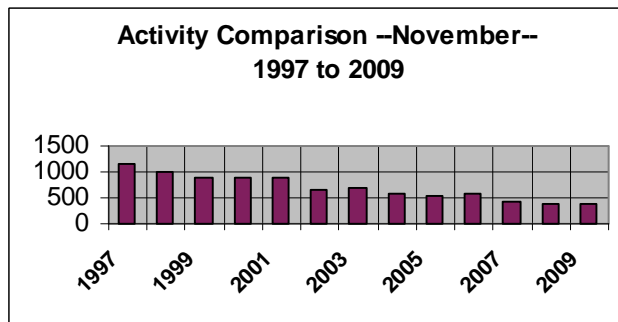
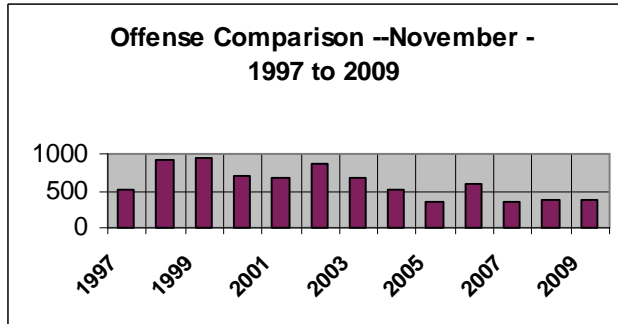

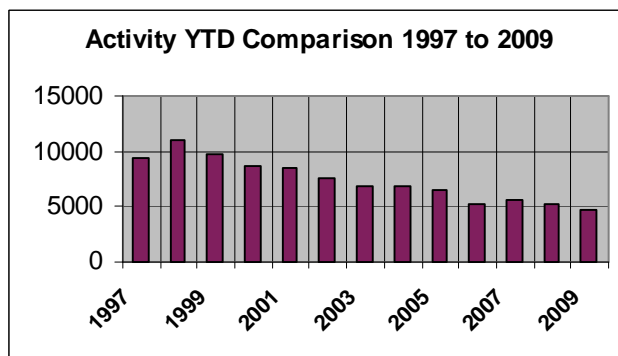
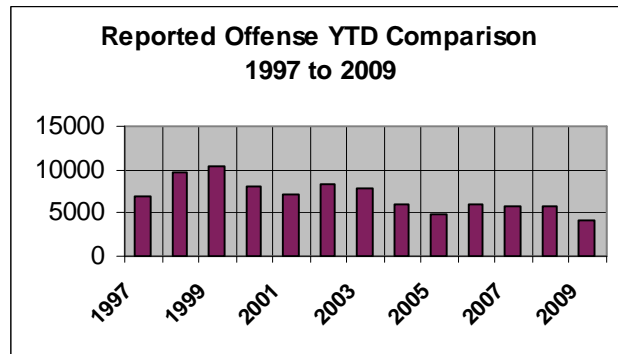


Offense and Activity Comparison:

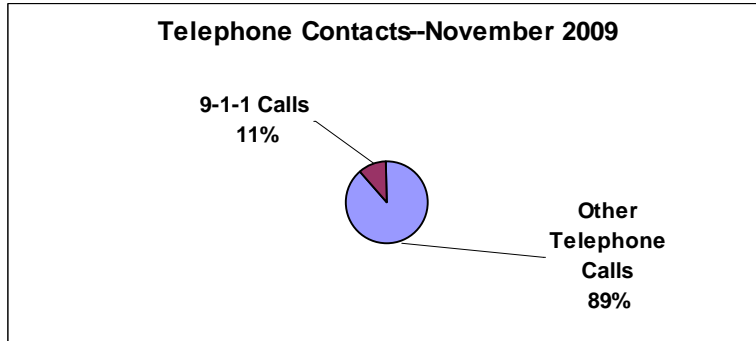


Years to Date:

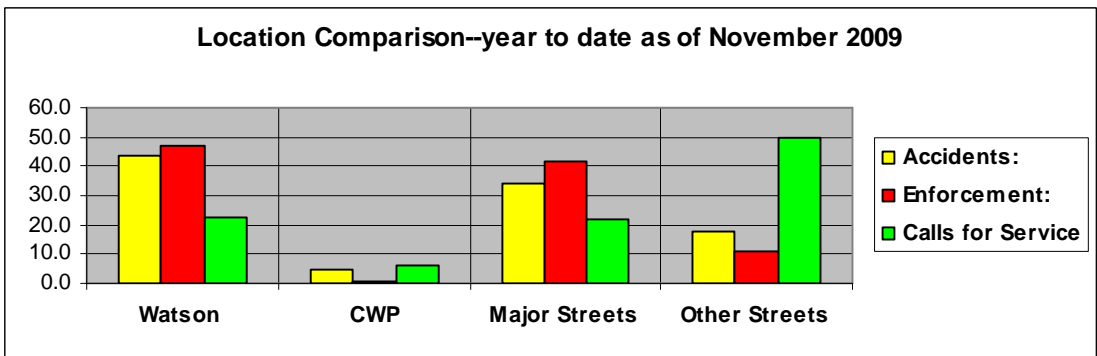


Location Comparison:
