Topic: October 2007 Public Report

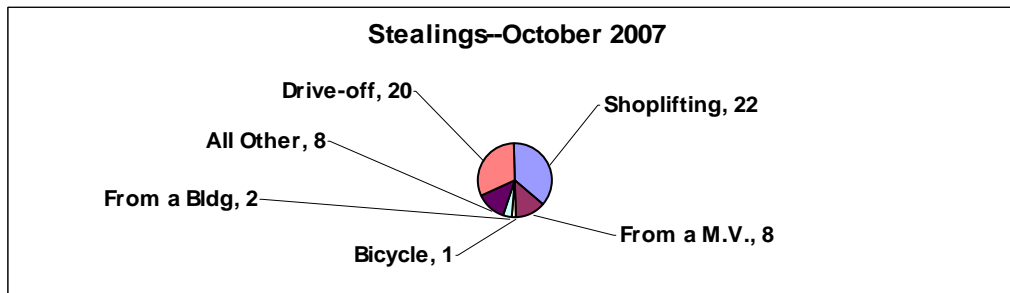
This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of October 2007. In October 2007, there were 75 Part I offenses and 420 Part II offenses for a total of 495. This compares with 77 Part I offenses and 447 Part II offenses for a total of 524 in October 2006. The main difference was in the number of traffic stops.

There was one attempt burglary reported in October. On 10-12-07, a residence on Grant Haven had a window broken but entry was not gained to the residence.

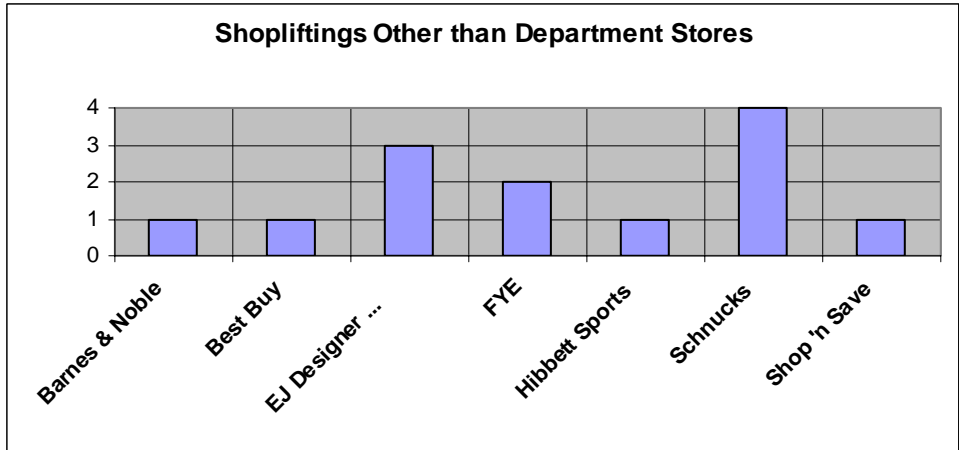
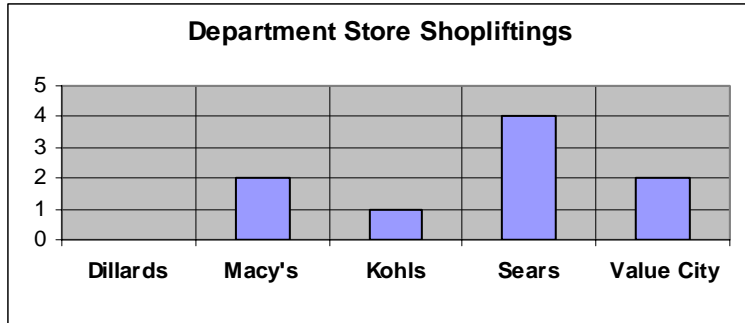
There were six assaults in October 2007 and three involved domestic violence. In five cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

Stealing offenses numbered 61 in October 2007.

Stealings were of the following classifications in October 2007:

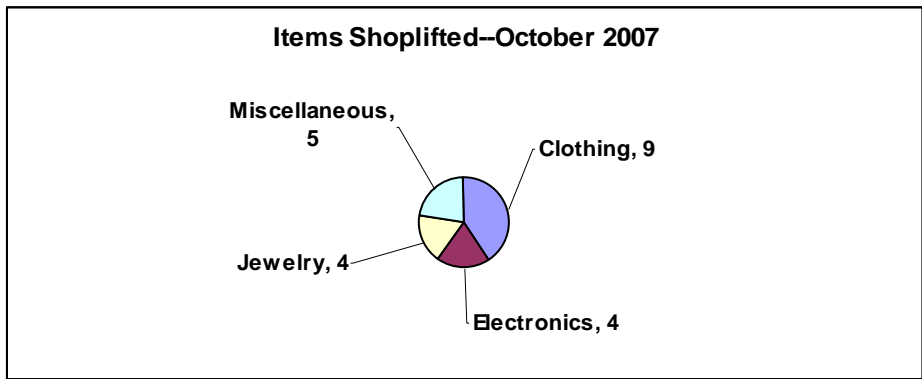


Shopliftings accounted for 22 of the 61 stealings in October 2007 or 36%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in October 2007:

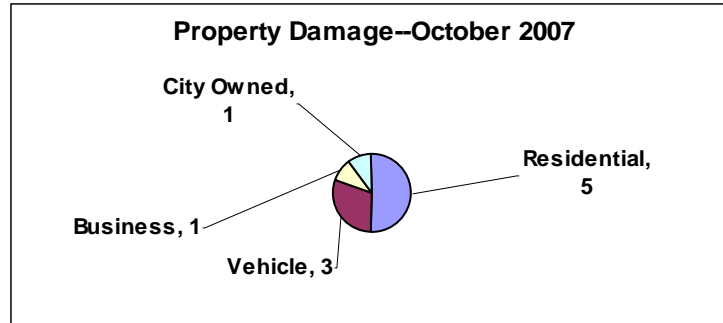


Of the shopliftings, 73% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 75% and juveniles accounted for 25% of the clearances.

There were ten property damages in October 2007 and they were of the following classifications:



The City Owned was damage to a stop sign.

There were three stolen vehicles in October 2007. The first was a green 1995 Ford Contour that was stolen on 10-08-2007 from CWP and was later recovered in St. Louis City. The second was a 2004 Honda motorcycle that was stolen from a residence on Westglen on 10-08-2007. The third was a white 2002 Intrepid that was stolen on 10-15-2007 and was recovered in Webster Groves prior to the victim knowing the car was stolen.

Part I offenses numbered 75 in October 2007.

Part II:

In October 2007, there were six frauds, three credit card frauds, two forgeries and one other type fraud. The one drug offense was an attempt to obtain prescription medicine fraudulently. There was one offense against public peace, a peace disturbance in October. There were five DWI cases, sixteen animal related calls and 67 people related calls including 66 medical emergencies and one sudden death. There were three family offenses, one criminal nonsupport and two unattended children in vehicles.

Part II offenses totaled 392 in October 2007.

In October 2007 in Ward One, stealings numbered twelve with nine at addresses on Watson Road or Watson Industrial and three in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered one with one in the neighborhoods. There was one stolen vehicle and one fraud, and one family offense. There were five traffic accidents, twenty people related calls and seven animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eighteen and occurred on nine different streets and there were 56 miscellaneous police service calls.

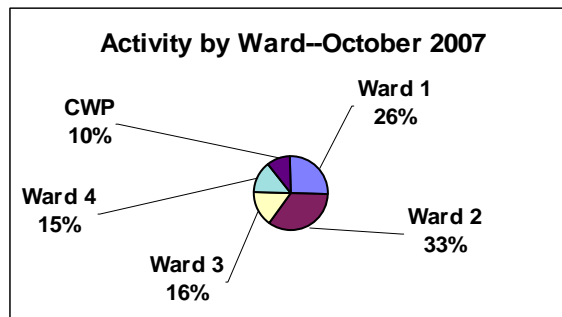
In Ward Two in October 2007, stealings numbered twenty-five with twenty-three at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and two in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered four, one at addresses along Watson Road and three in the neighborhoods. There was one stolen vehicle and four frauds, one offense against public peace and one family offense. There were two DWI cases and four traffic accidents, twenty-three people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered twenty-three and occurred on thirteen different streets and there were 69 calls for miscellaneous police services.

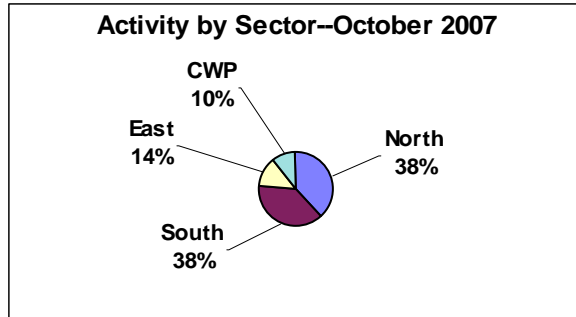
In October 2007 in Ward Three, there was one attempt burglary on Grant Haven. Stealings numbered ten with six at addresses on Watson Road and four in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, both in the neighborhoods. There was one fraud and one family offense. There were two DWI cases, four traffic accidents and nine people related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered sixteen and occurred on eleven different streets and there were 30 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in October 2007, stealings numbered two and property damages numbered one. There was one drug offense and one DWI case and two traffic accidents, ten people related calls and nine animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eleven and occurred on nine different streets and there were 29 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered twelve with nine shopliftings, one from vehicles and two all other thefts. Property damages numbered two and one stolen vehicle. There were four traffic accidents and five people related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered four and there were seventeen police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

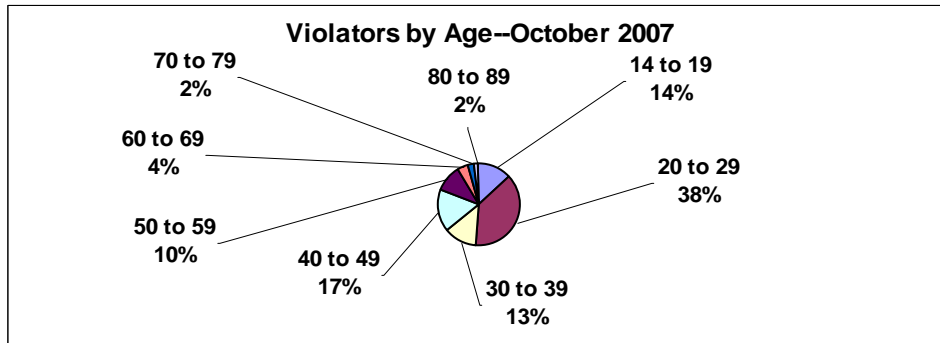

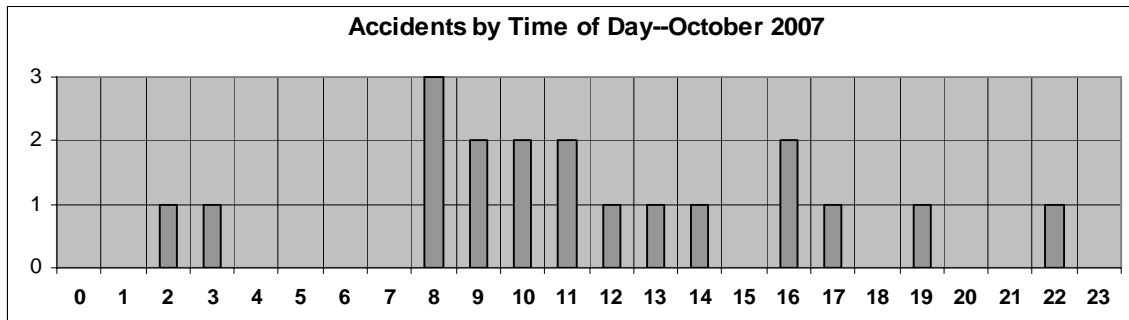

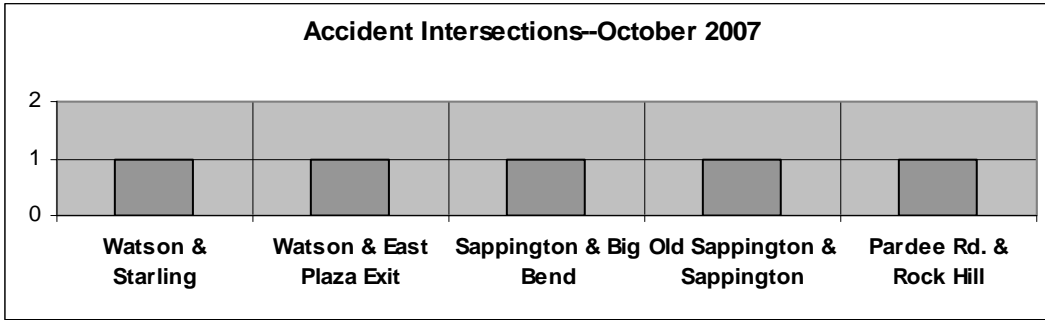
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



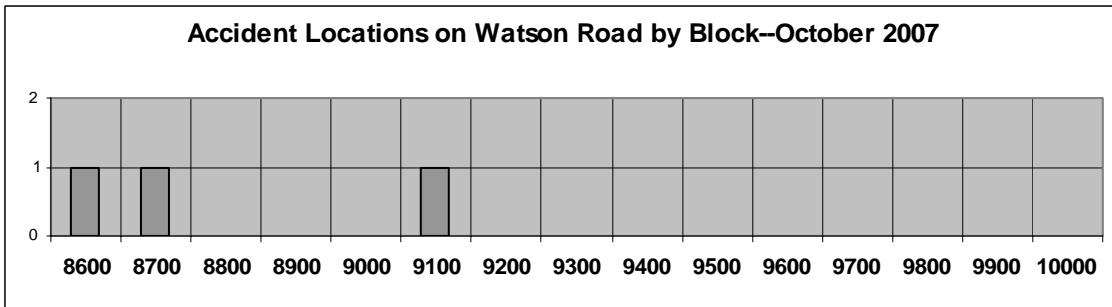

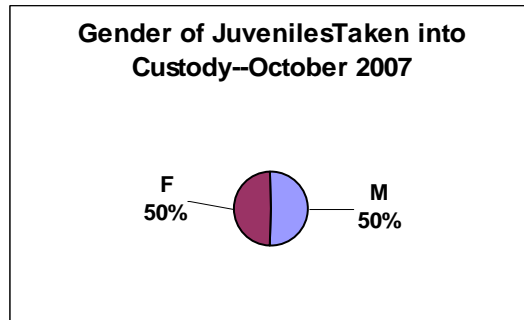
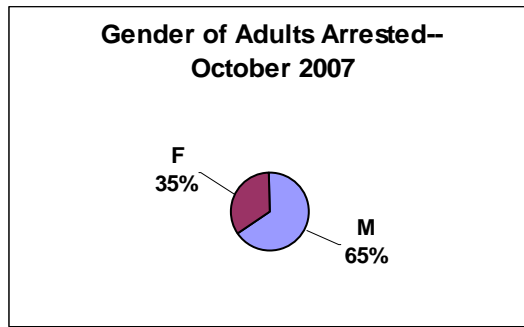
Arrest Information:

Sixty-three adults and six juveniles were taken into custody in October 2007. Three persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

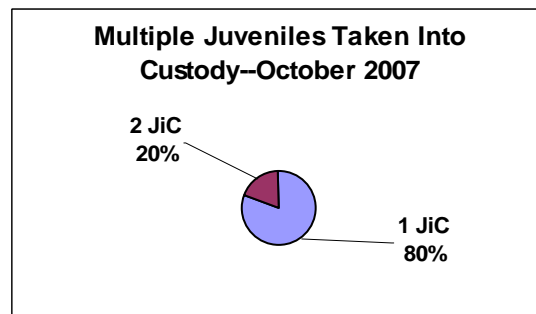
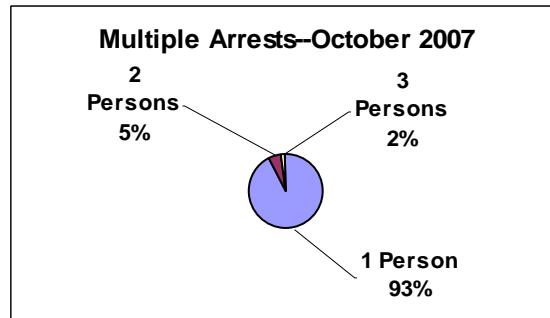
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



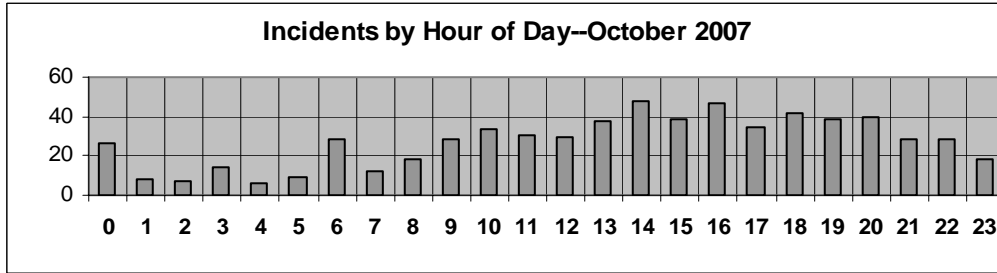
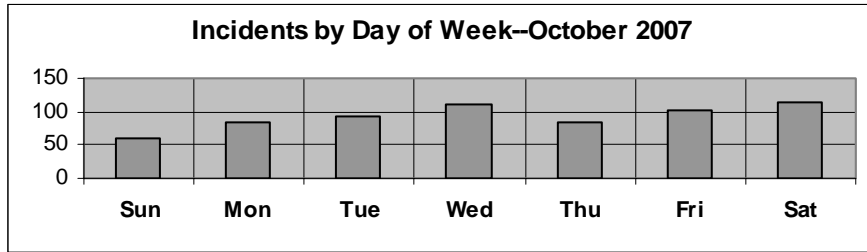
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

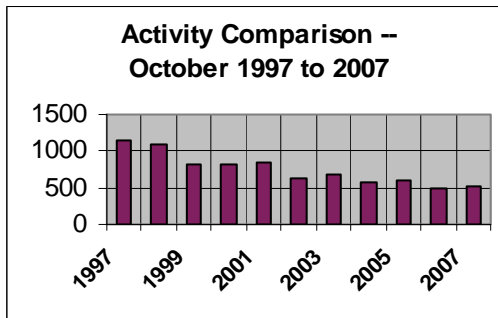
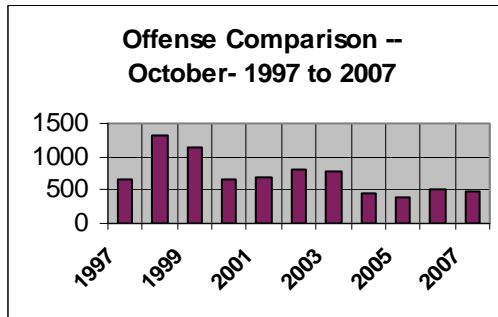

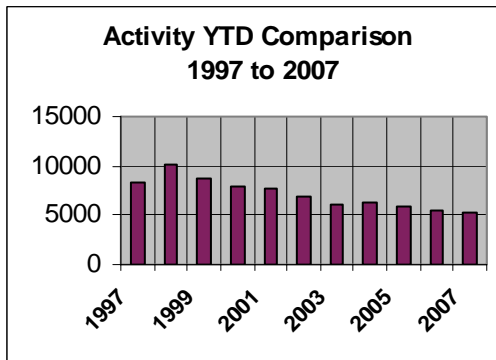
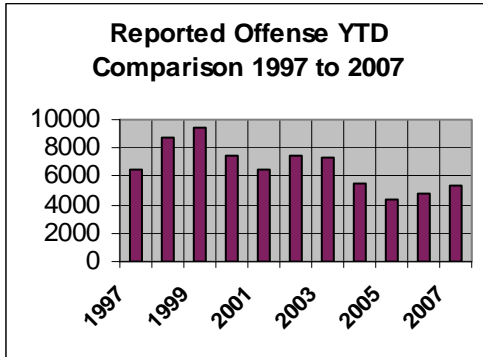


Offense and Activity Comparison:

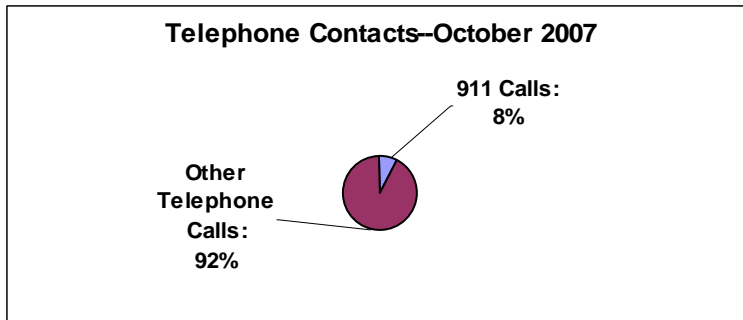


Years to Date:

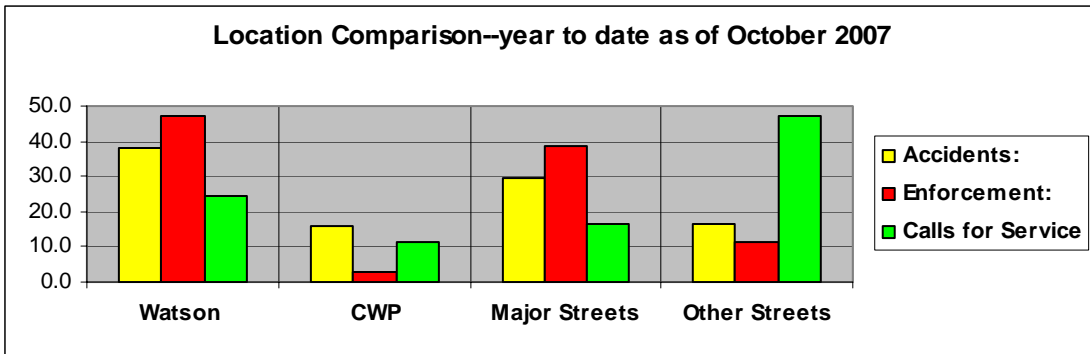


Location Comparison:
