Topic: October 2008 Public Report

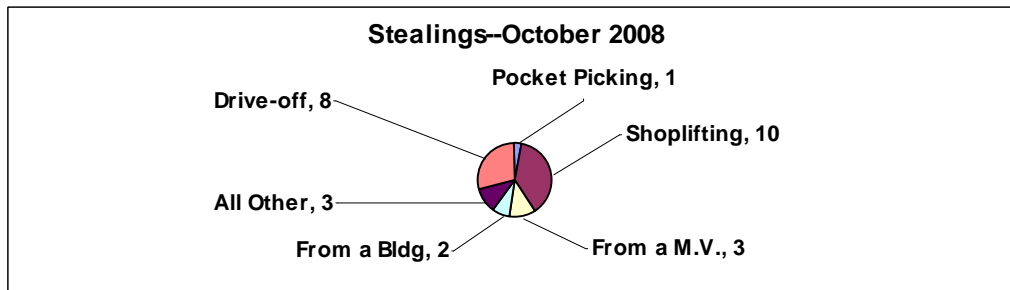
This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of October 2008. In October 2008, there were 37 Part I offenses and 376 Part II offenses for a total of 413. This compares with 75 Part I offenses and 420 Part II offenses for a total of 495 in October 2007. The main difference was in the number of stealings, motor vehicle thefts and traffic stops.

There were six assaults in October 2008 and three involved domestic violence. In five cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

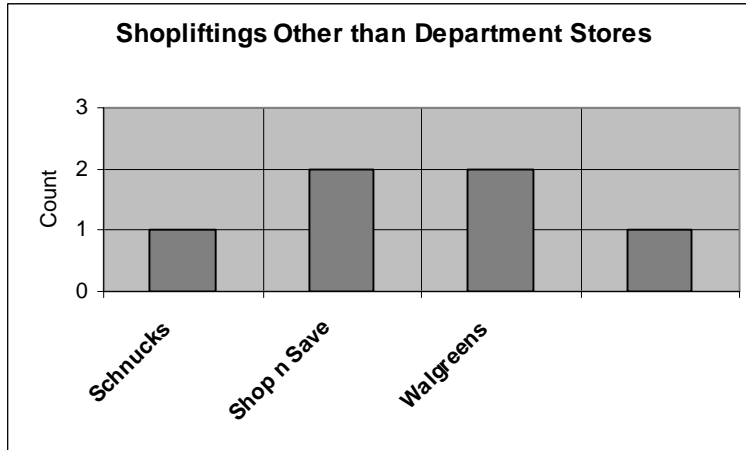
There were two burglaries reported in October. The residential burglary occurred on Tahiti Drive on 10-28-2008. Someone forced open a rear door and removed coins and currency. The Detective Bureau processed the scene. The second burglary was at a business along Watson Road on 10-25-2008. Someone had broken out a front window of the business and removed three laptop computers. The Detective Bureau also processed this scene.

Stealing offenses numbered 27 in October 2008.

Stealings were of the following classifications in October 2008:



Shopliftings accounted for 10 of the 27 stealings in October 2008 or 37%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in October 2008:

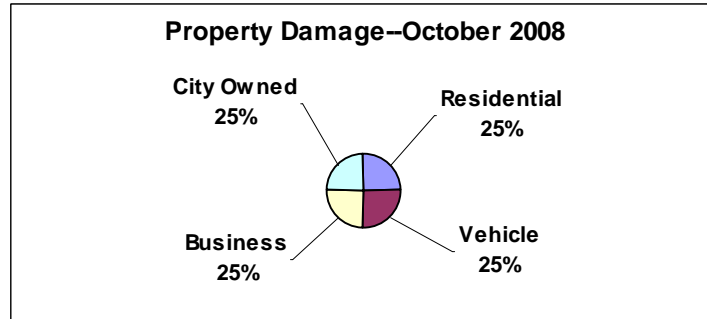


Of the shopliftings, 89% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 87% and adult and juveniles together accounted for 13% of the clearances.

There were eight property damages in October 2008 and they were of the following classifications:



The two City-Owned property damages were graffiti on a sidewalk in a park and damage to a slide in another park.

Part I offenses numbered 37 in October 2008.

**Part II:**

In October 2008, there were six frauds, two all other type frauds, and one forgery, one passing bad checks, one identity theft and one credit card fraud. There were five drug offenses, two possessions of marijuana and three possessions of drug paraphernalia. The four Offenses against Public Peace were two trespassings, one annoying telephone calls and one harassment. There was one DWI case and eighty-two people related calls including 79 medical emergencies, two suicides or attempts and one missing person. The four juvenile offenses were all minors in possession of alcohol. The two family offenses were child abuse cases. There were five animal calls, 41 suspicious activities calls and 167 miscellaneous police service calls.

Part II offenses totaled 339 in October 2008.



In October 2008 in Ward One, stealings numbered four with four at addresses on Watson Road and one in an apartment complex. Property damages numbered two, one in the neighborhoods and one in apartment complex. There was one drug offense and one juvenile related offense. There was one DWI case, four traffic accidents, sixteen people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered ten and occurred on seven different streets and there were 36 miscellaneous police service calls.

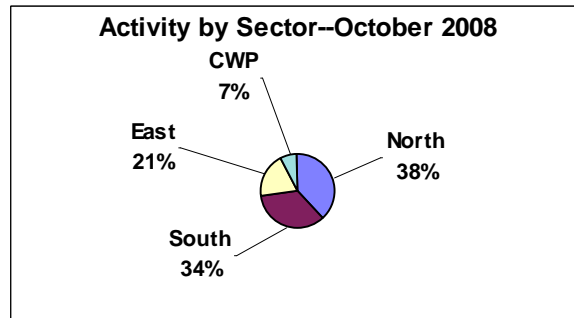
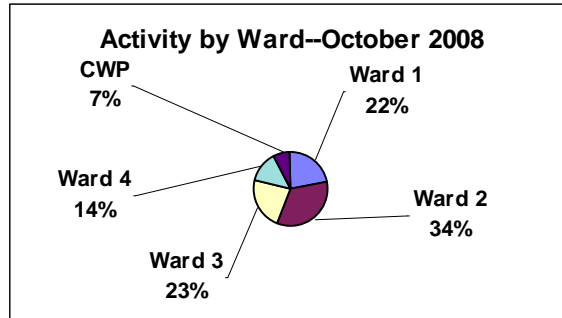
In Ward Two in October 2008, there were two burglaries, a residential on Tahiti and a non-residential on Watson Road. Stealings numbered thirteen with thirteen at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and none in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, one at addresses along Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. There were three frauds, one drug offenses, one offense against public peace, and one juvenile related offense. There were thirteen traffic accidents, 25 people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered ten and occurred on six different streets and there were 60 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In October 2008 in Ward Three, stealings numbered five with five at addresses on Watson Road and none in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, both in the neighborhoods. There was one drug offense, two offenses against public peace, one juvenile related and one family offense. There were three traffic accidents, 24 people related calls and no animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered twelve and occurred on nine different streets and there were 29 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in October 2008, stealings numbered one and property damages numbered two. There was one fraud, one drug offenses, one juvenile related and one family offense. There were fourteen people related calls and one animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered nine and occurred on seven different streets and there were 25 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered four with four shopliftings and there were no property damages. There were two frauds, one drug offenses and one offense against public peace. There were three people related calls. There were no suspicious activity calls and there were seventeen police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

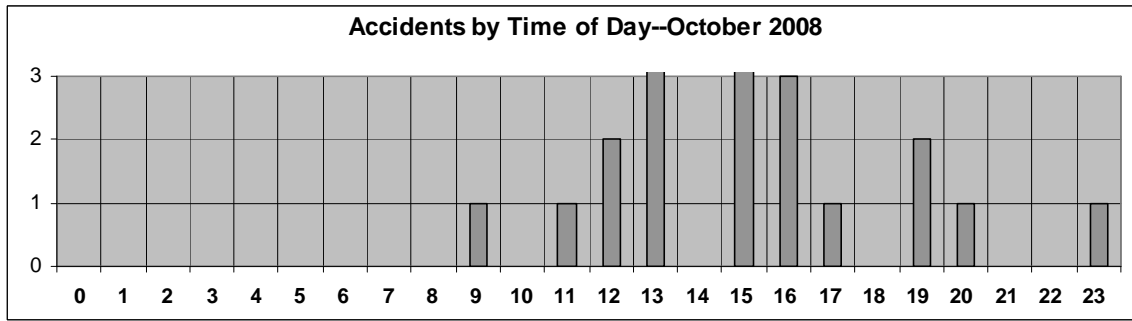

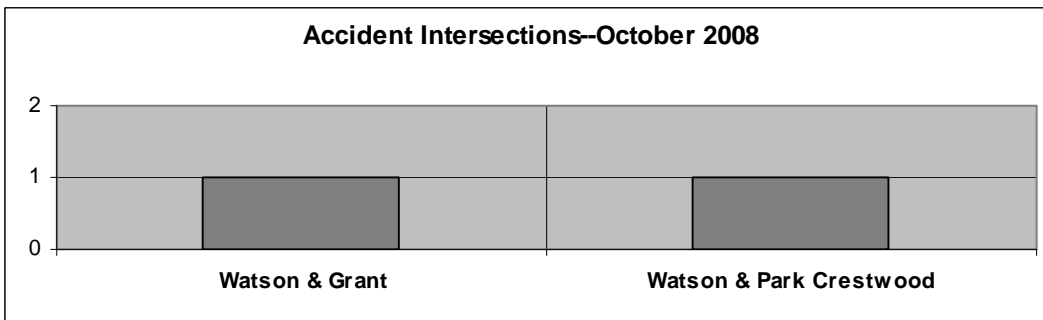
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



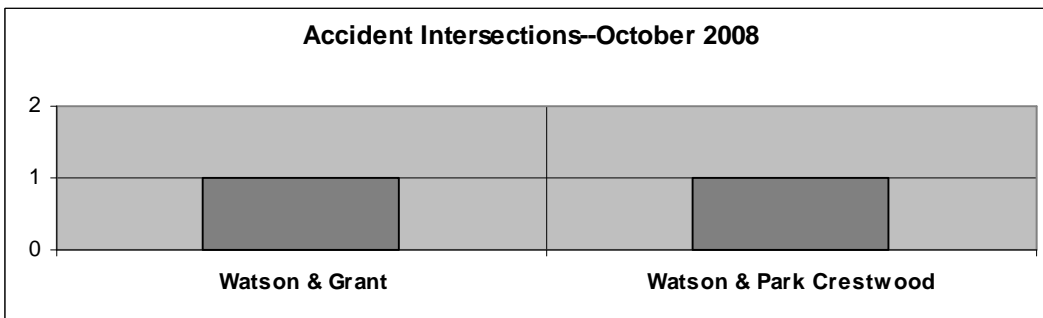

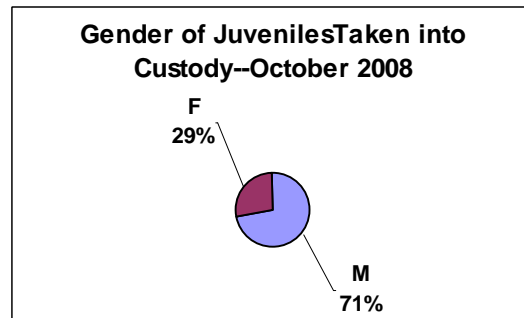
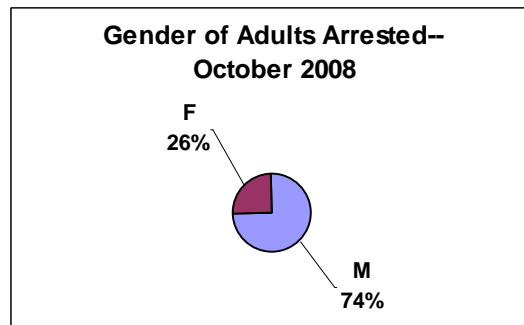
**Arrest Information:**

Seventy-eight adults and seven juveniles were taken into custody in October 2008. Eleven persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

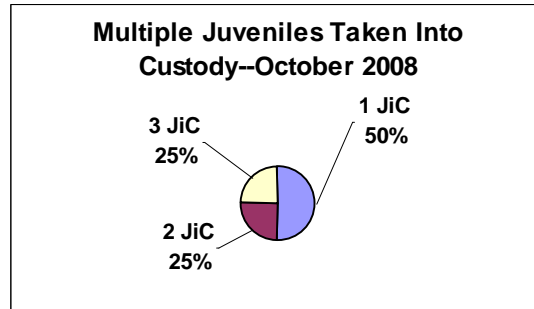
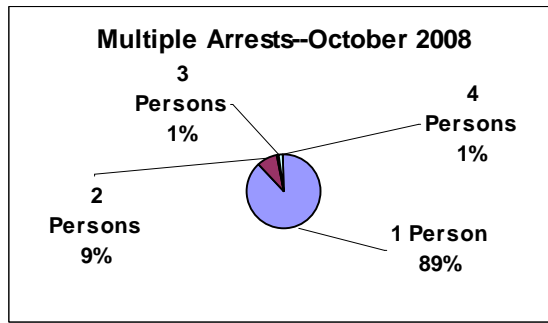
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



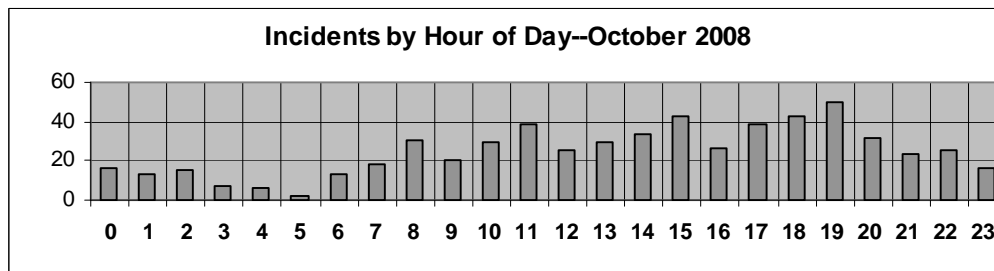
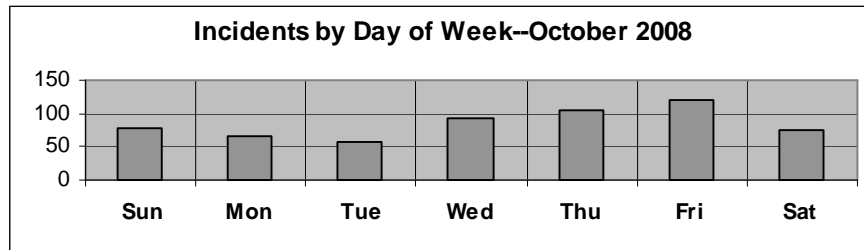
**Multiple Arrests:**



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

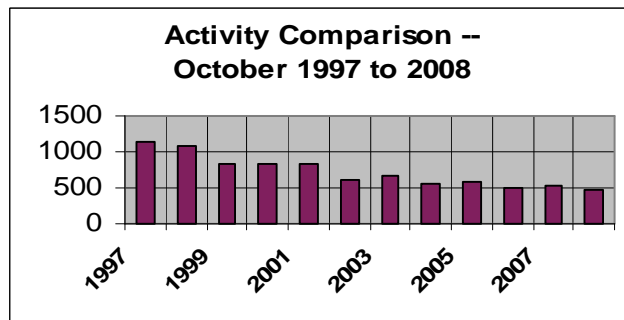
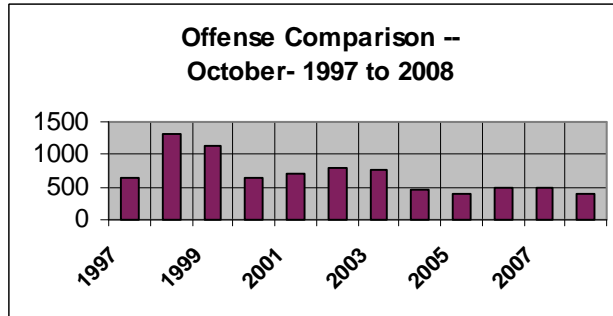

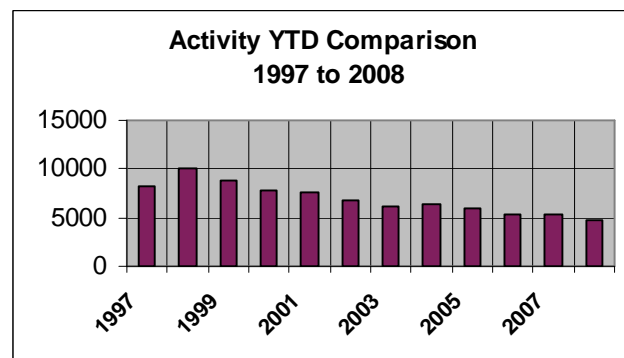
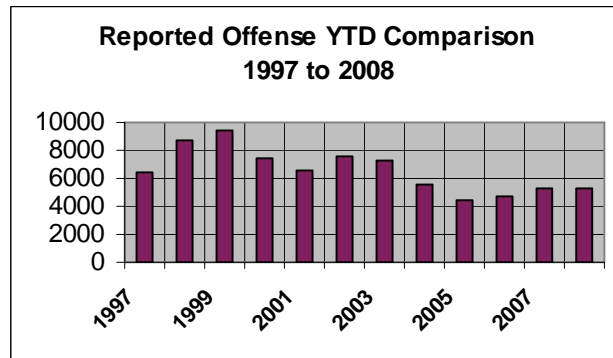


**Offense and Activity Comparison:**

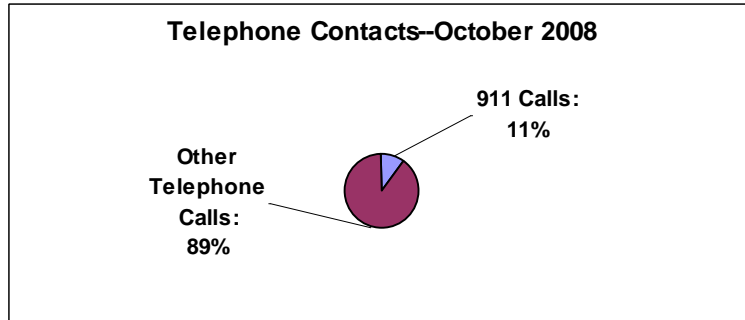


Years to Date:

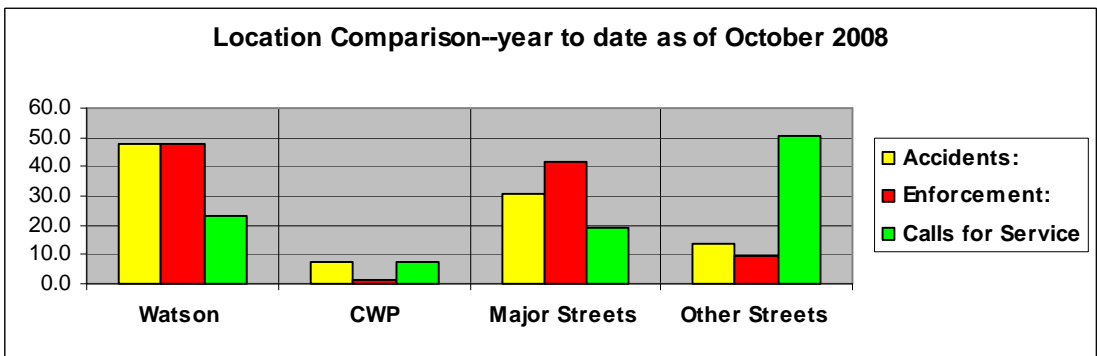


**Location Comparison:**

This chart is a comparison of the percentage of accidents, enforcement and calls for service by the four major tracking areas in the city year to date for 2008.
