Topic: October 2009 Public Report

This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of October 2009. In October 2009, there were 36 Part I offenses and 295 Part II offenses for a total of 331. This compares with 37 Part I offenses and 376 Part II offenses for a total of 413 in October 2008. The main difference was in the number of suspicious activities and traffic stops.

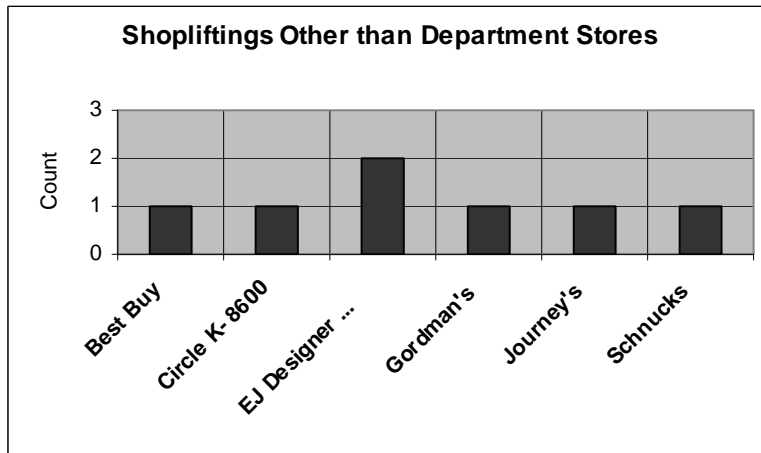
There were four assaults in October 2009 and one involved domestic violence. In three cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults. On 10-10-2009 at 0040, the Police Department received a telephone call from an individual, who stated that he had placed a bomb in his truck so that the President would listen. Officers responded and found the individual in possession of an air-soft gun and pressing keys on his cell phone. There were wires running to a box on the truck from inside the residence. The individual was taken into custody and St. Louis County Bomb and Arson responded and determined that there was no bomb. Suspect was arrested, booked and taken to a medical facility for observation.

Stealing offenses numbered 32 in October 2009.

Stealings were of the following classifications in October 2009:

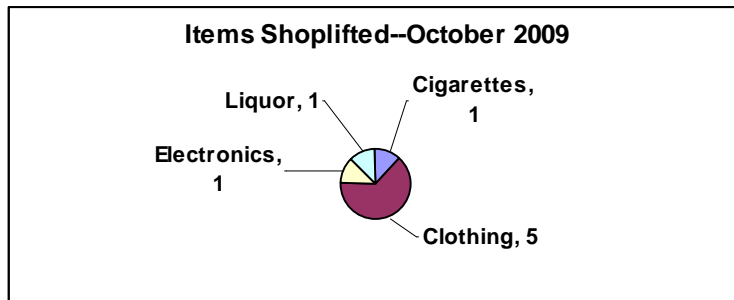


Shopliftings accounted for eight of the 32 stealings in October 2009 or 25%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in October 2009:

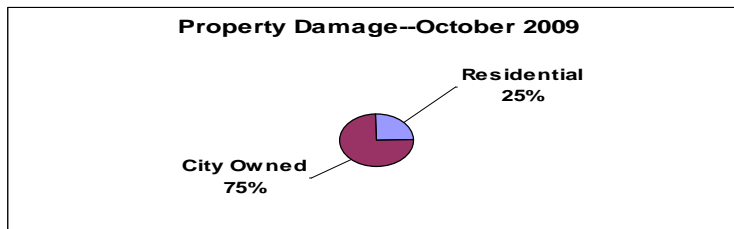


Of the shopliftings, 25% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 100% of the clearances.

There were four property damages in October 2009 and they were of the following classifications:



The City-Owned property damages were to a light fixture and two incidents of graffiti.

Part I offenses numbered 36 in October 2009.

**Part II:**

In October 2009, there were two frauds, two forgeries, one offense against public peace, a disorderly conduct and two DWI cases. There were seven animal related calls and 80 people related calls including 75 medical emergencies, two sudden deaths, two missing persons and one suicide or an attempt. The one juvenile offense was a minor in possession and the one family offense was an ex-parte order violation. There were 28 suspicious activities, 176 miscellaneous Police Service calls and seventeen motor vehicle accidents.

Part II offenses totaled 315 in October 2009.

In October 2009 in Ward One, stealings numbered five with four at addresses on Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered one in the neighborhoods. There was one offense against public peace, a disorderly conduct. There was one DWI case and four traffic accidents, eighteen people related calls and three animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered five and occurred on four different streets and there were 45 miscellaneous police service calls.

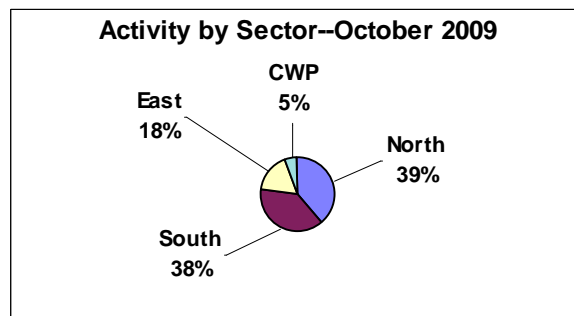
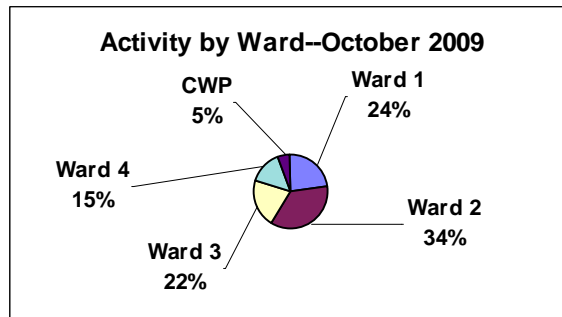
In Ward Two in October 2009, stealings numbered fourteen with twelve at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and two in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered one in Spellman Park. There were two frauds and one juvenile offense. There were five traffic accidents, 25 people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered seven and occurred on six different streets and there were 66 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In October 2009 in Ward Three, stealings numbered nine with eight at addresses on Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered one that occurred in Whitecliff Park. There was one family related offense and four traffic accidents and 26 people related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered ten and occurred on seven different streets and there were 25 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in October 2009, stealings numbered two and property damages numbered one that occurred in Crestwood Park. There was one DWI case, three traffic accidents, ten people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered six and occurred on six different streets and there were 30 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered two with both being shopliftings. There was one traffic accident and one people related call. There were ten police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

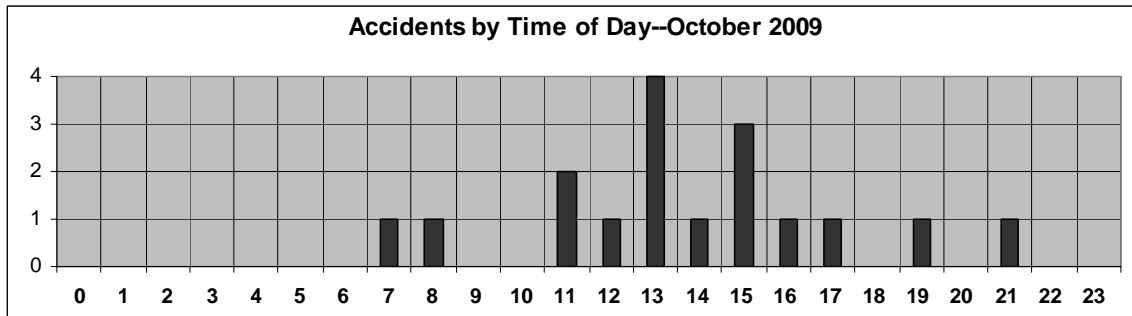

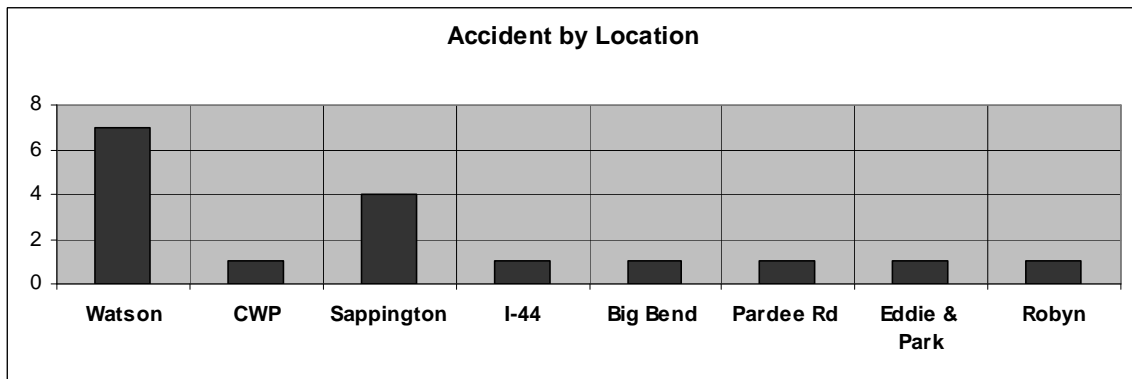
Accidents occurred on the following days of the week:



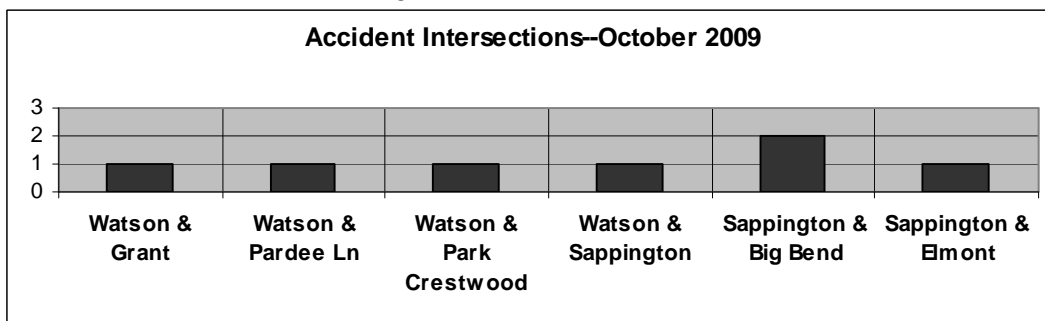
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



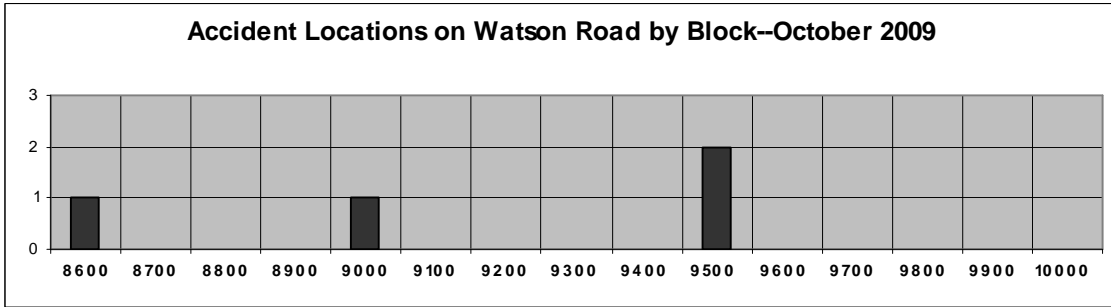
Accidents occurred on the following streets in October 2009:



Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



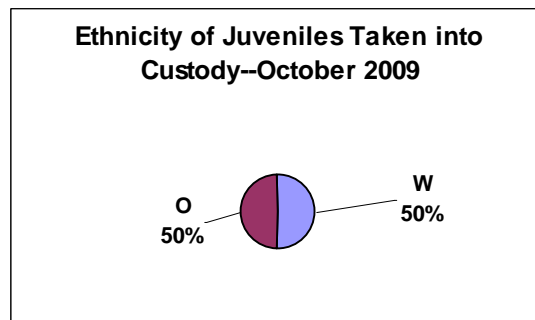
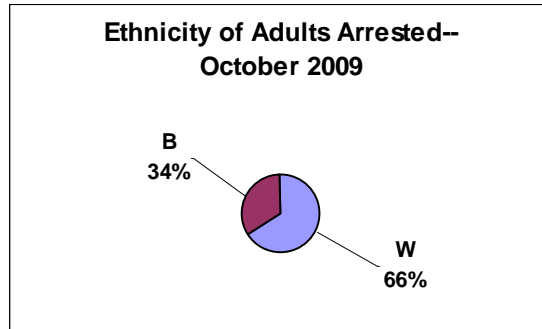

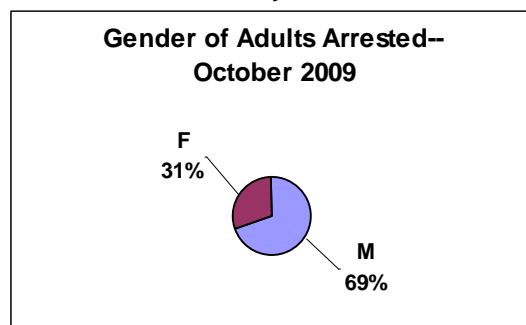
**Arrest Information:**

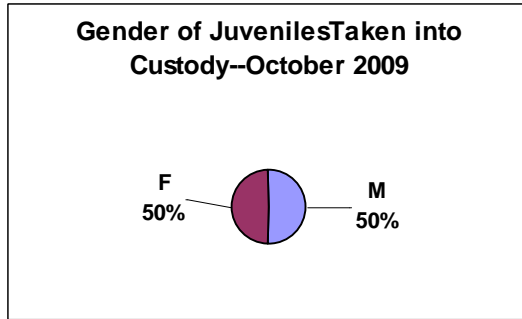
Thirty-two adults and two juveniles were taken into custody in October 2009. Two persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:

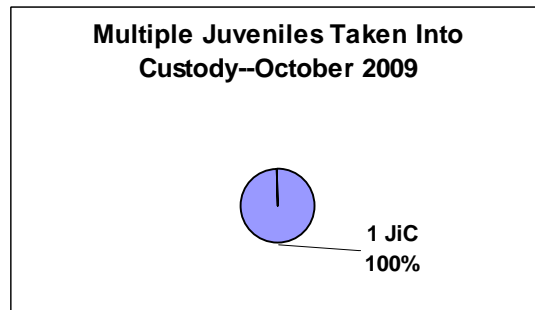
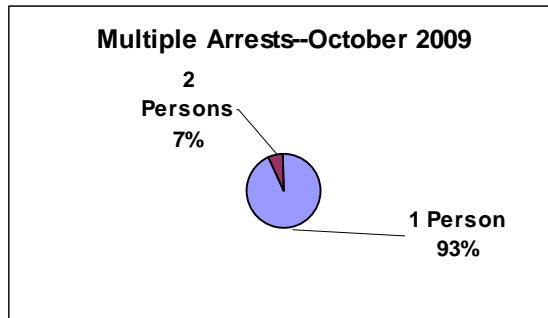


The gender of the persons taken into custody was:





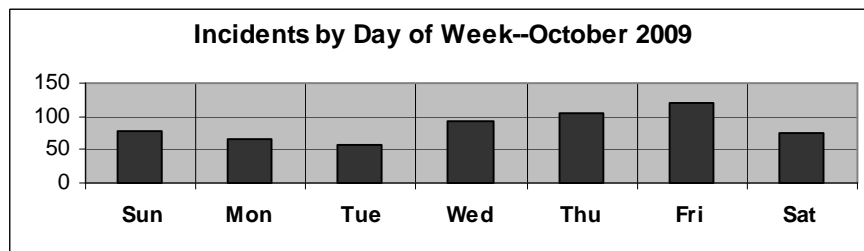
Multiple Arrests:

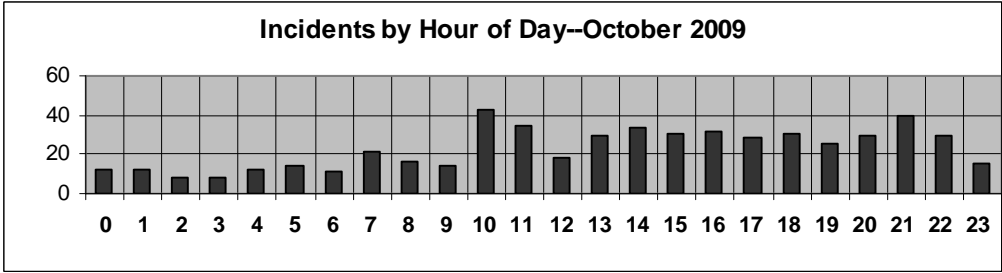


Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

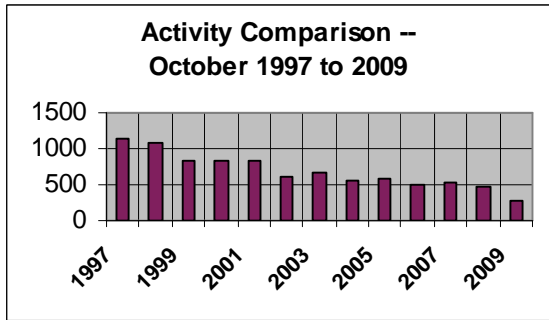
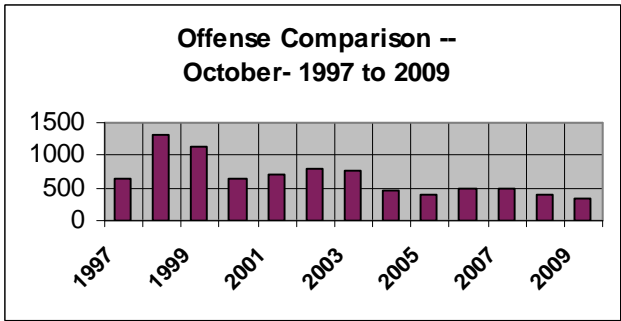
Activity occurred on the following days of the week and hours of the day:



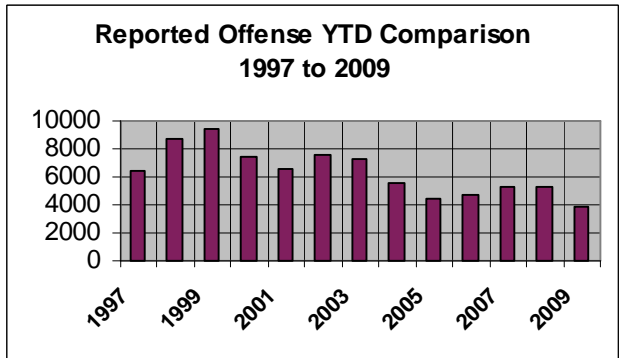


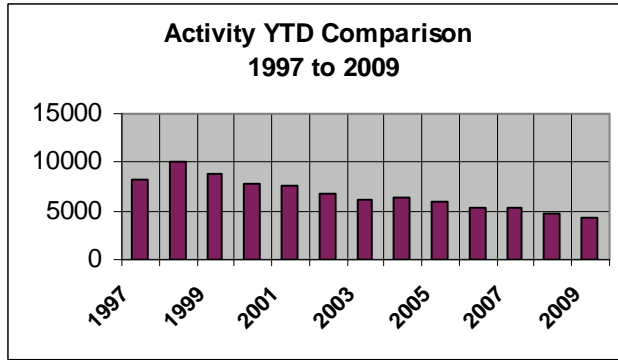
**Offense and Activity Comparison:**

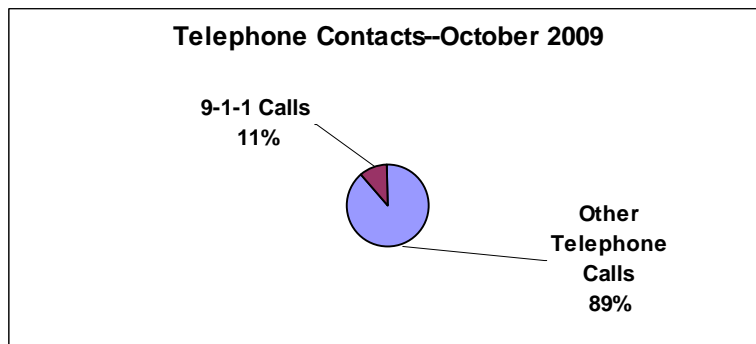
Years to Date:

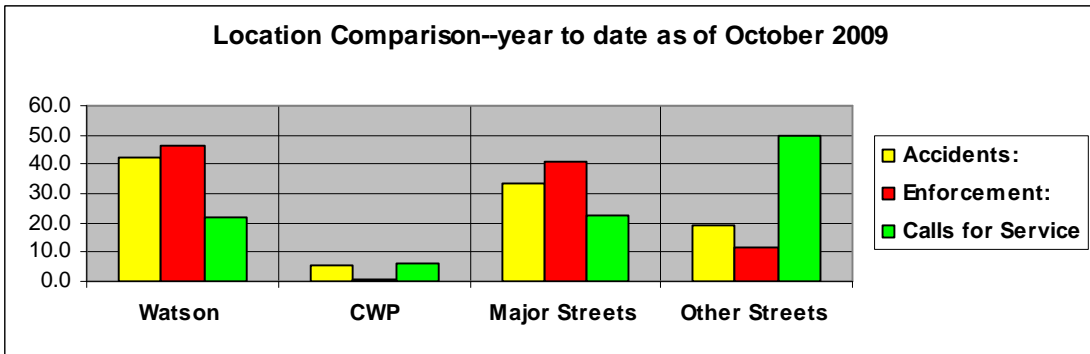


**Location Comparison:**
