Topic: September 2008 Public Report

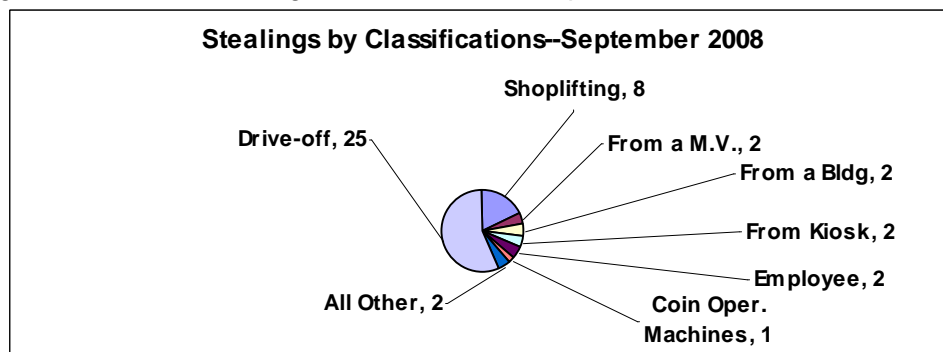
This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of September 2008. In September 2008, there were 56 Part I offenses and 387 Part II offenses for a total of 443. This compares with 55 Part I offenses and 444 Part II offenses for a total of 499 in September 2007. The main difference was in the number of traffic stops.

There were two assaults in September 2008 and one involved domestic violence. In both cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

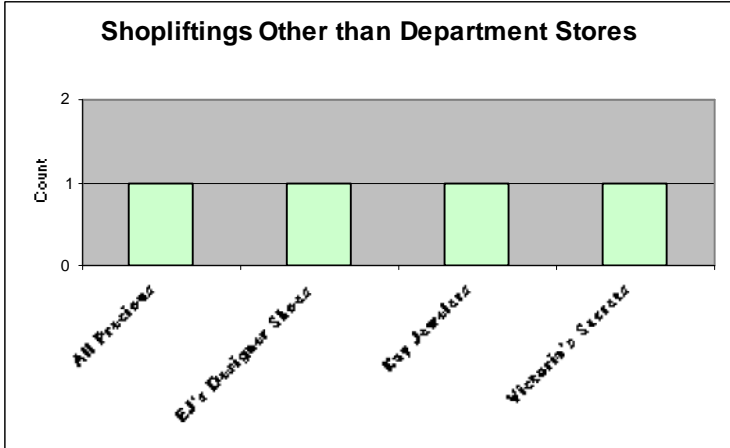
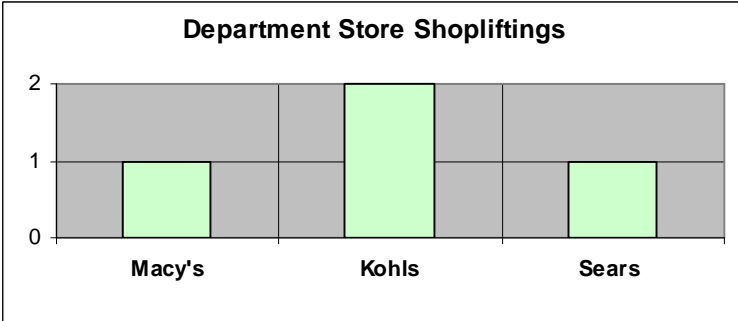
There was one attempted burglary on Watson Industrial on 09-06-2008. Someone had attempted to pry open garage door but entry was not gained.

Stealing offenses numbered 44 in September 2008.

Stealings were of the following classifications in September 2008:

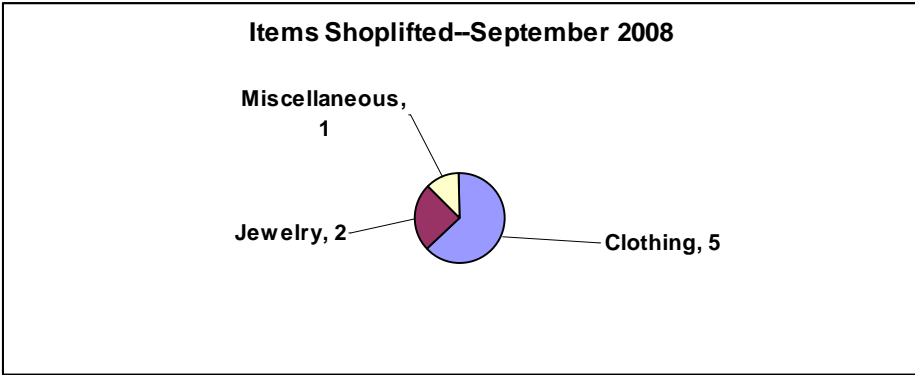


Shopliftings accounted for eight of the 44 stealings in September 2008 or 18%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in September 2008:

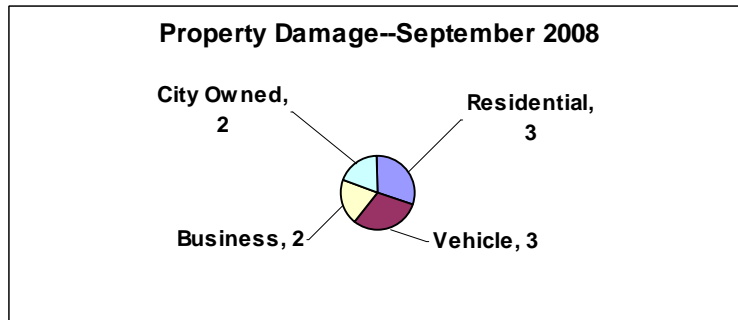


Of the shopliftings, 75% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 33% and juveniles accounted for 67% of the clearances.

There were ten property damages in September 2008 and they were of the following classifications:



The two City Owned property damages were to an asphalt roller where city crews were doing slab replacements and a bench in Sanders Park.

There was one receiving stolen properties that involved a stolen license plate and one stolen motorcycle. On 09-26-2008, a 1996 Harley Davidson Soft Tail Classic was stolen from the parking garage of Crestwood Plaza.

Part I offenses numbered 56 in September 2008.

Part II:

In September 2008, there were five frauds, one Fraudulent Stop Payment, one passing bad check, one identity theft and two other type frauds. There were two possessions of marijuana cases in September. There were 73 people related calls including 68 medical emergencies, three missing persons, one sudden death and one suicide or attempt suicide. The three juvenile offenses included two minor in possession cases and one runaway juvenile. The two offenses against the family were both Ex-Parte Order violations.

Part II offenses totaled 387 in September 2008.

In September 2008 in Ward One, there was one attempted burglary reported at a business in Watson Industrial. Stealings numbered two with one in an apartment complex and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered four, two in an apartment complex and two in the neighborhoods. There were three juvenile related and one family offense. There were three traffic accidents, thirteen people related calls and five animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered seven and occurred on five different streets and there were 37 miscellaneous police service calls.

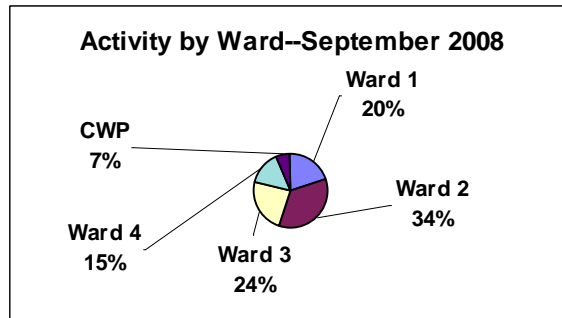
In Ward Two in September 2008, stealings numbered nineteen with eighteen at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, one at addresses along Big Bend and one in the neighborhoods. There were four frauds, one drug offenses and one family offense. There were ten traffic accidents, 29 people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered twelve and occurred on seven different streets and there were 56 calls for miscellaneous police services.

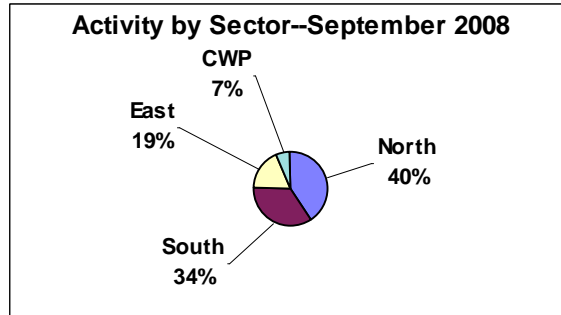
In September 2008 in Ward Three, stealings numbered thirteen with twelve at addresses on Watson Road and one in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered two, both in the neighborhoods. There were eight traffic accidents, fifteen people related calls and five animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered seven and occurred on five different streets and there were 46 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in September 2008, stealings numbered one and property damages numbered two. There was one fraud and one drug offense. There was one traffic accidents, thirteen people related calls and seven animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered four and occurred on two different streets and there were 27 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered nine with five shopliftings, two kiosk, one employee thefts and one from coin operated machine. There was one stolen motorcycle reported in September 2008. There were three people related calls and animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered one and there were eleven police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

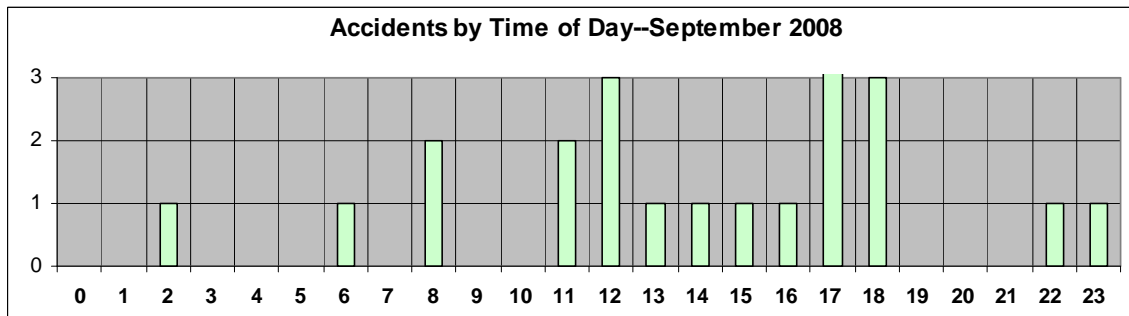

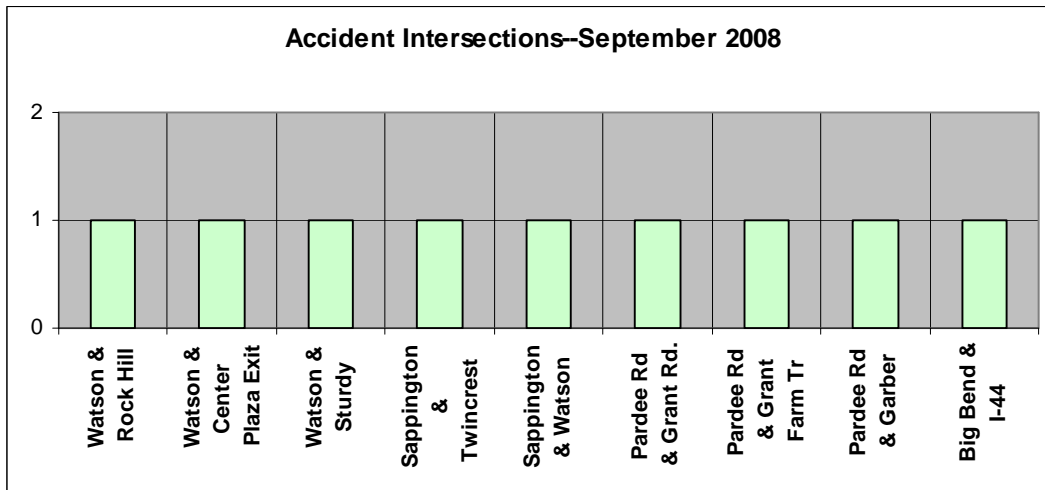
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



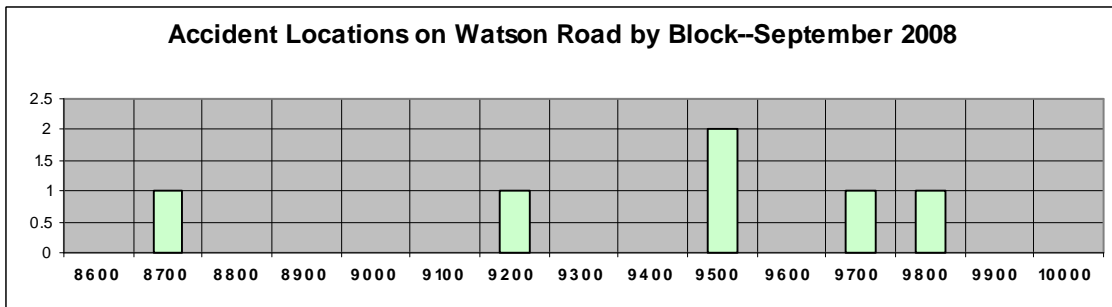

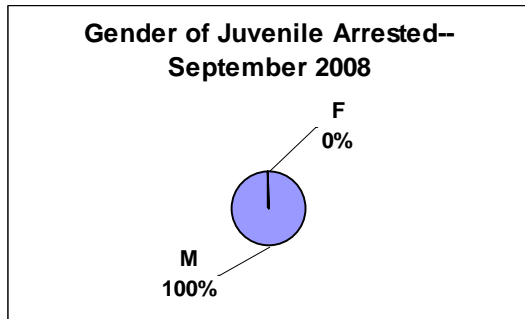
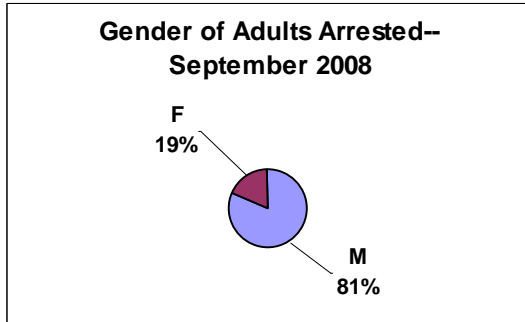
Fifty-four adults and four juveniles were taken into custody in September 2008. Eight persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:

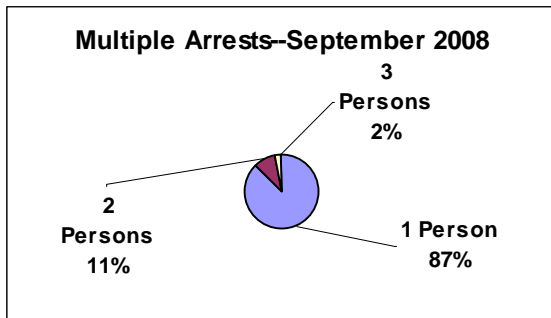


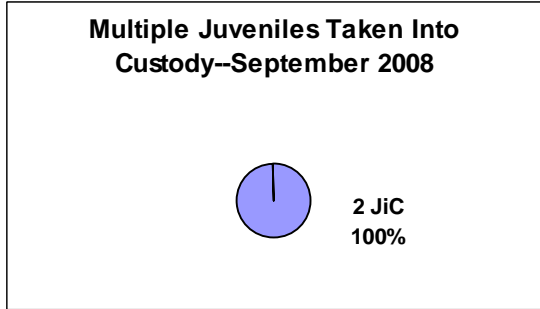


The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



Multiple Arrests:

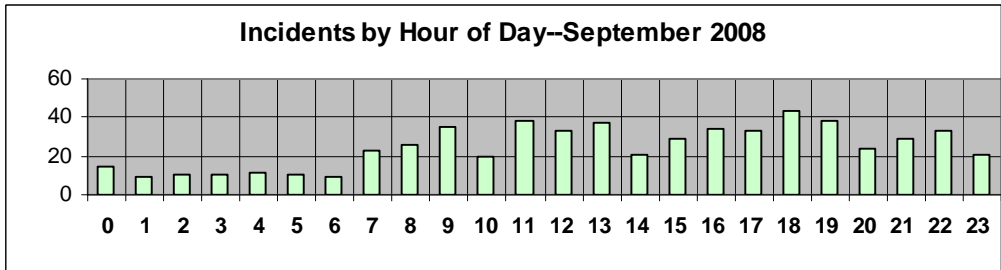
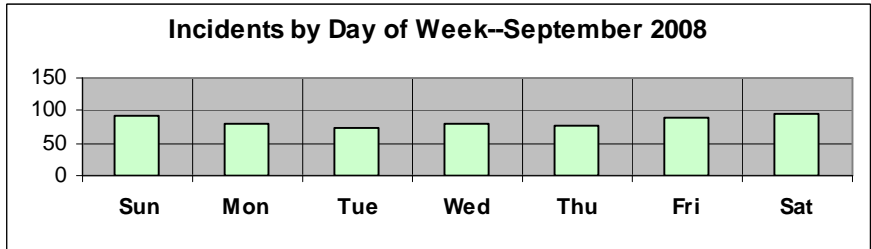




Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

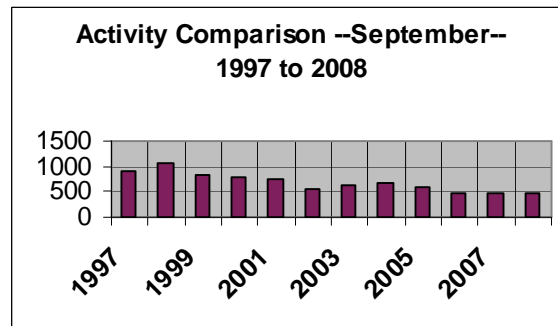
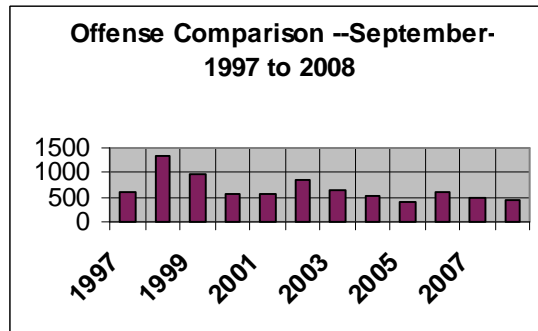

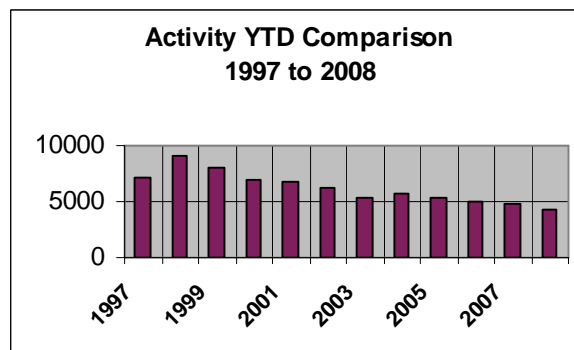
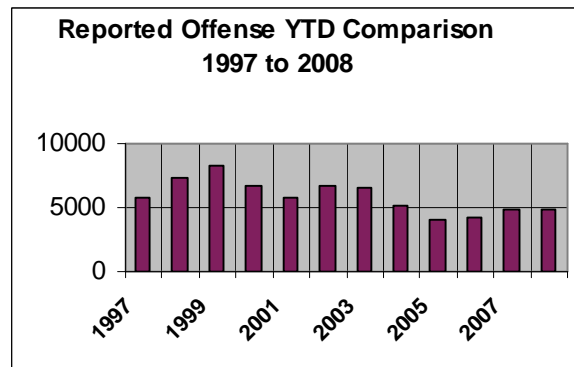


Offense and Activity Comparison:

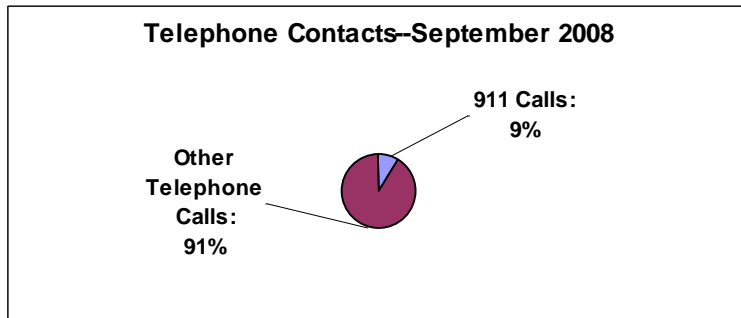


Years to Date:



Communications:

Communications handled over 4142 telephone contacts and 431 9-1-1 calls in September 2008. This is a daily average of 138 telephone contacts and fourteen 9-1-1 calls.

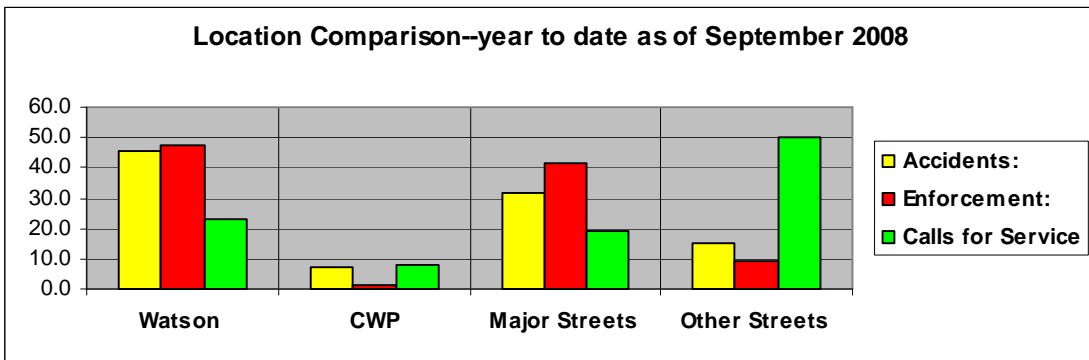


Location Comparison:
