Topic: September 2009 Public Report

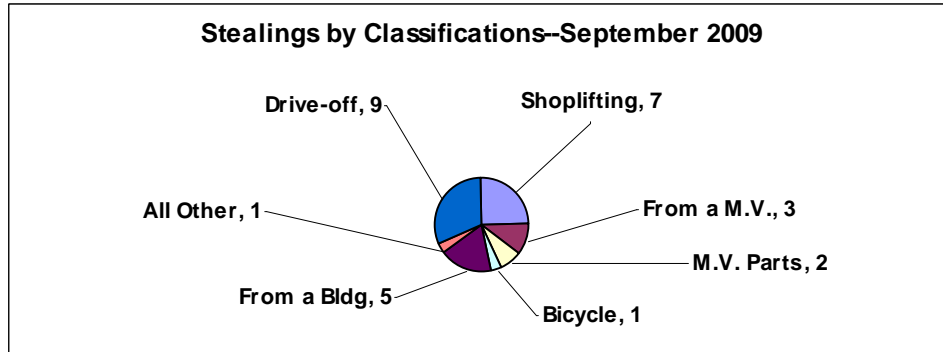
This is the report of the activity of the Crestwood Police Department for the month of September 2009. In September 2009, there were 38 Part I offenses and 339 Part II offenses for a total of 377. This compares with 56 Part I offenses and 387 Part II offenses for a total of 443 in September 2008. The main difference was in the number of Stealings and traffic stops.

There was one assault in September 2009 and it involved domestic violence. In all cases, the parties knew each other prior to the assaults.

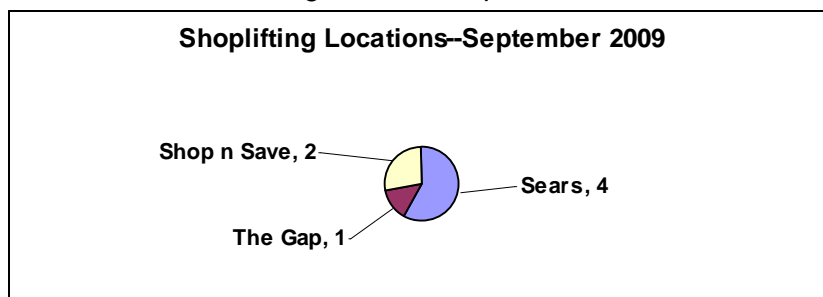
There were three burglaries in September. The first occurred on 09-02-2009 and the homeowner found a male leaving his garage on Garber Road with some power tools. The suspect dropped the tools and ran to a vehicle. The vehicle was stopped and the suspect was taken into custody. The second occurred on 09-18-2009 in a house under construction on Wildwood Circle. A neighbor observed something suspicious and called the Police. The suspect was taken into custody for taking a shop vac and a light. The third burglary occurred on 09-25-2009 on High Hill Court. Another neighbor noticed something suspicious and called the resident at work. It was found that a Playstation was taken from the residence and that there was no forced entry. The resident thinks that he knows who may be involved.

Stealing offenses numbered 28 in September 2009.

Stealings were of the following classifications in September 2009:

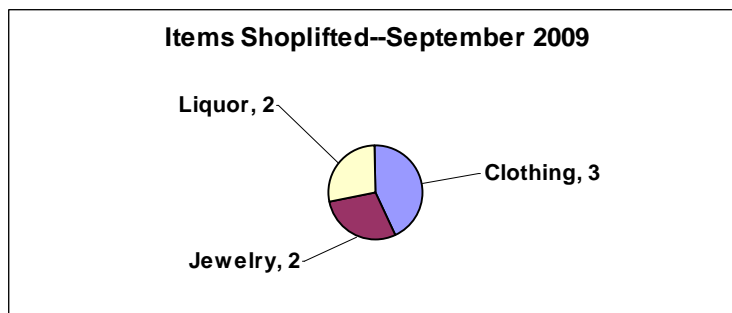


Shopliftings accounted for 7 of the 28 stealings in September 2009 or 25%. The shopliftings occurred at the following stores in September 2009:

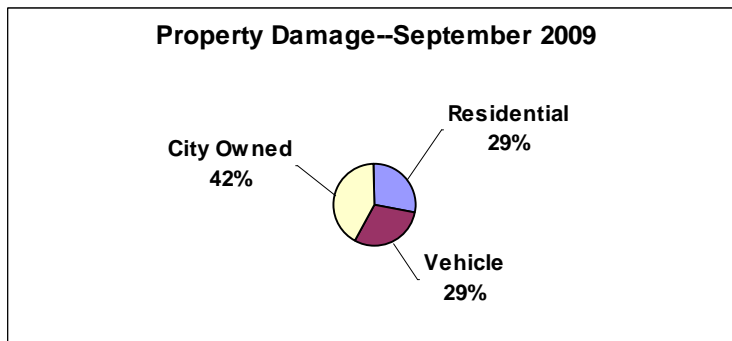


Of the shopliftings, 86% were cleared by arrest and adults accounted for 83% and juveniles accounted for 17% of the clearances.

There were seven property damages in September 2009 and they were of the following classifications:



The three City-Owned property damages were to playground equipment and the playground mat in Spellman Park.

Part I offenses numbered 38 in September 2009.

Part II:

In September 2009, there were five frauds including three credit card frauds, one identity theft and one passing bad checks. There were two drug offenses and both involved small quantities of marijuana. The two offenses against public peace were a resisting arrest and an annoying telephone call. There were sixteen animal related calls and 76 people related calls including 73 medical emergencies, two missing persons and one suicide or attempt. There was one juvenile offense, a runaway juvenile and 32 suspicious activity calls. There were 195 miscellaneous police calls.

Part II offenses totaled 353 in September 2009.

In September 2009 in Ward One, there was one burglary on High Hill Court. Stealings numbered one at an address on Watson Road. Property damages numbered one with the one in the neighborhoods. There was one fraud and one drug offense. There was one DWI case and four traffic accidents, fourteen people related calls and seven animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered nine and occurred on nine different streets and there were 48 miscellaneous police service calls.

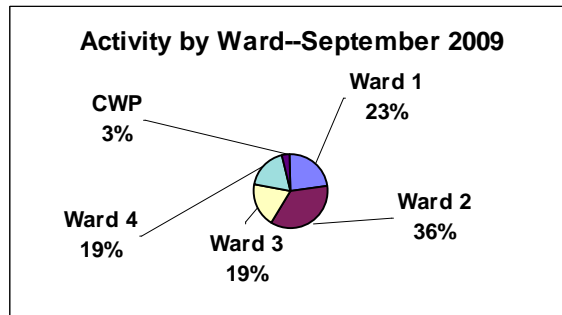
In Ward Two in September 2009, there was one burglary on Wildwood Circle. Stealings numbered thirteen with eleven at addresses on Watson Road, Watson Plaza and Big Bend and two in the neighborhoods. Property damages numbered three with all three occurring in Spellman Park. There were four frauds, two offenses against public peace and one juvenile related offense. There was one DWI case and fourteen traffic accidents, 21 people related calls and three animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered nine and occurred on seven different streets and there were 72 calls for miscellaneous police services.

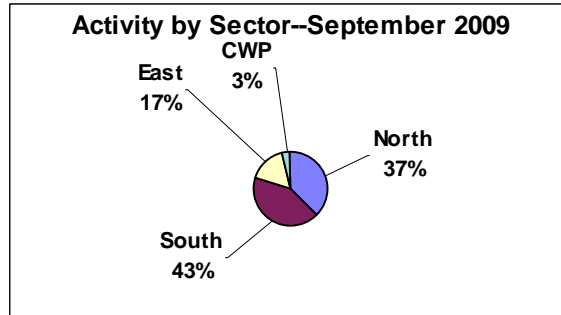
In September 2009 in Ward Three, there was one burglary on Garber Road. Stealings numbered five with four at addresses on Watson Road and one in Whitecliff Park. Property damages numbered one with the one occurring in the neighborhoods. There was one drug offense, one traffic accident, 22 people related calls and two animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered five and occurred on four different streets and there were 36 miscellaneous police service calls.

In Ward Four in September 2009, stealings numbered three and property damages numbered one. There was one DWI case, two traffic accidents, nineteen people related calls and four animal related calls. Suspicious activity calls numbered eight and occurred on seven different streets and there were 37 calls for miscellaneous police services.

In Crestwood Plaza, stealings numbered six with five shopliftings and one from a building and property damages numbered one. Suspicious activity calls numbered one and there were two police service calls of a miscellaneous nature.

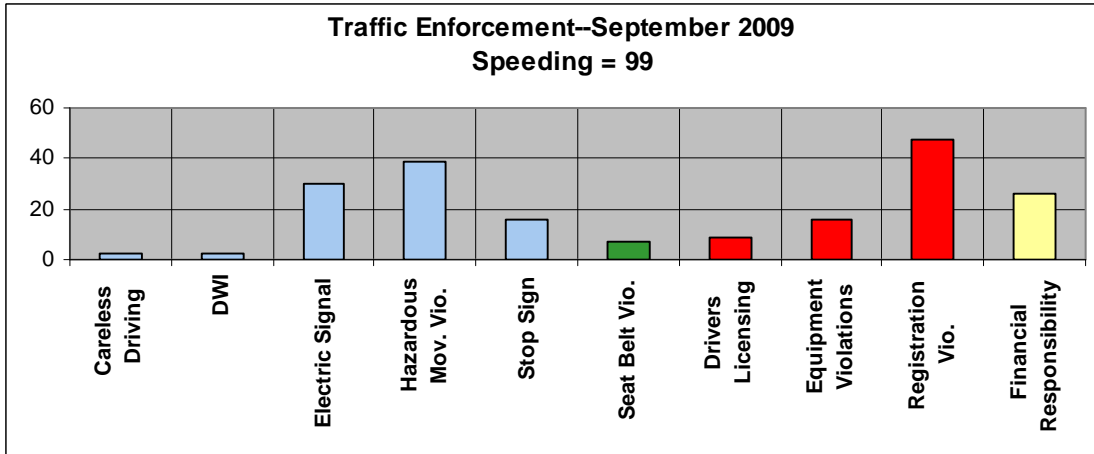

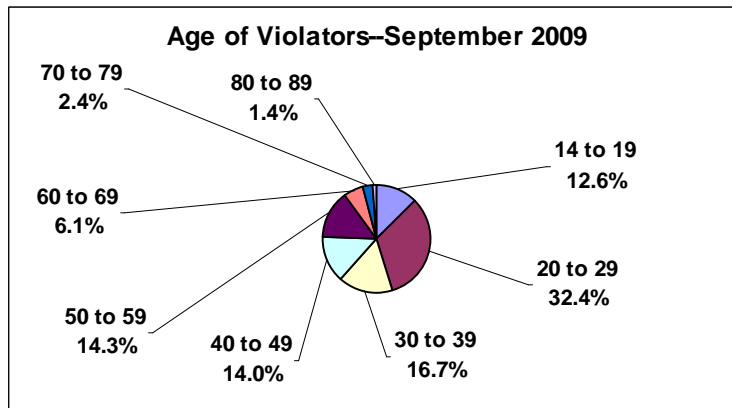

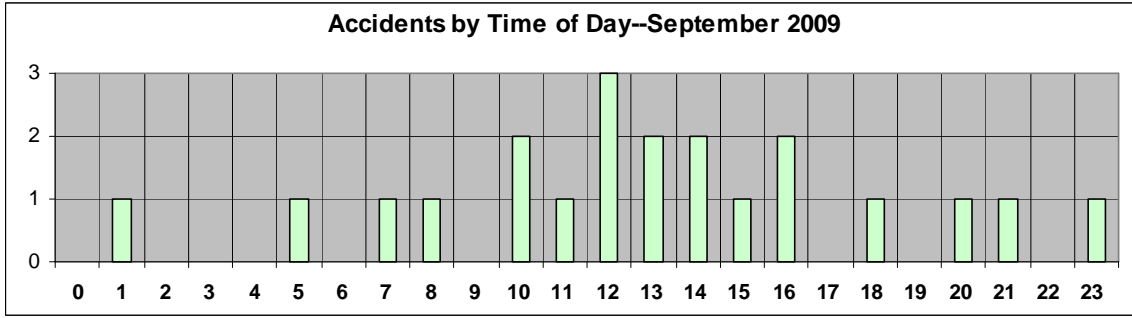

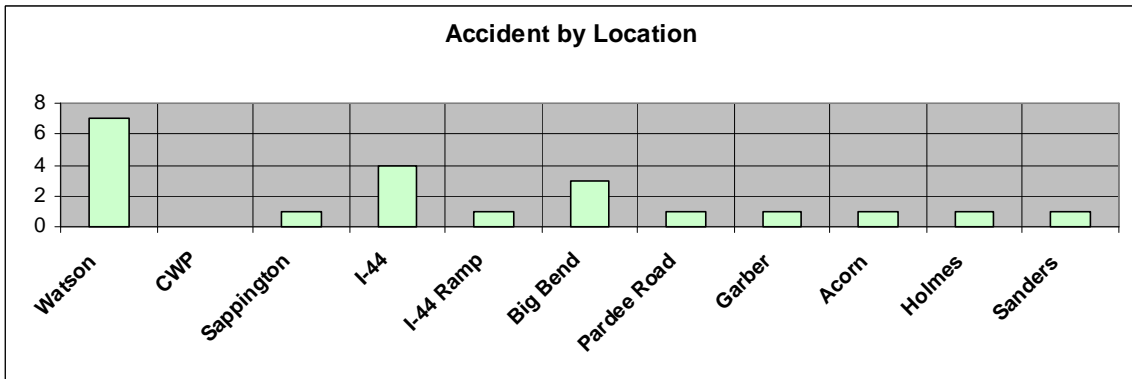
Accidents occurred on the following days of the week:



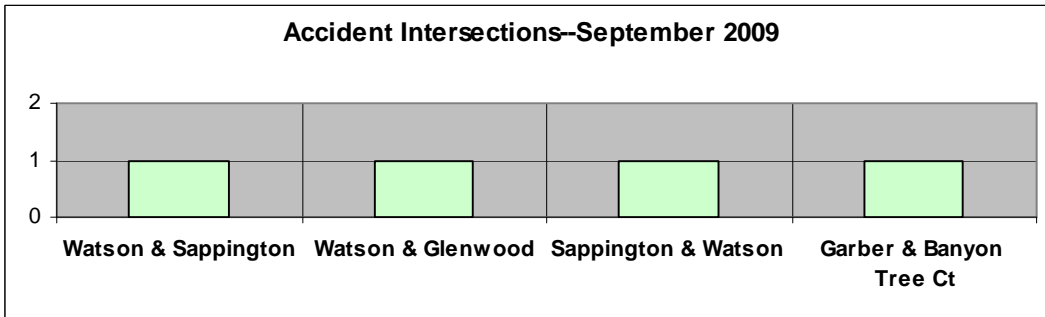
Accidents occurred during the following hours of the day:



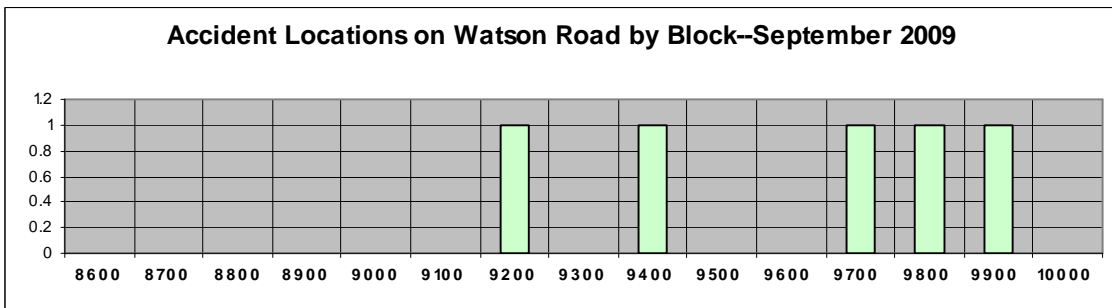

Accidents occurred at the following intersections:



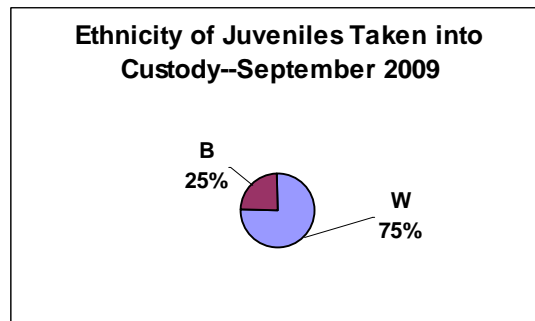
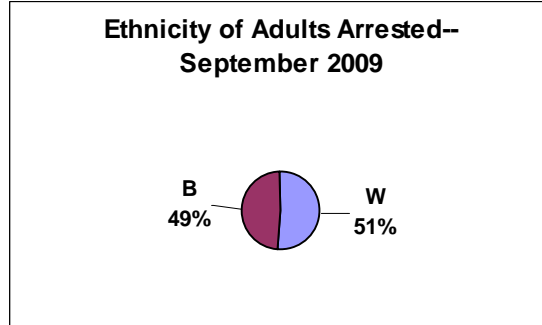
Accidents occurred in the following blocks of Watson Road:



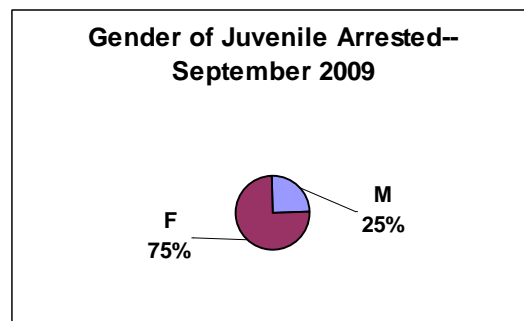
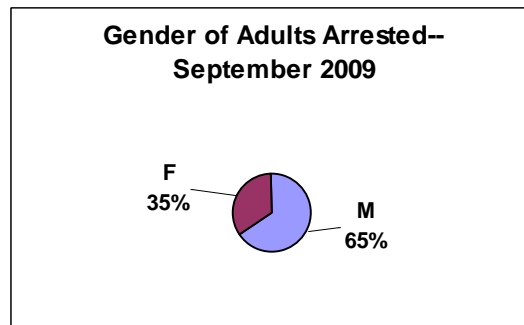
Arrest Information:

Fifty-three adults and four juveniles were taken into custody in September 2009. Ten persons were issued summons in lieu of physical arrests.

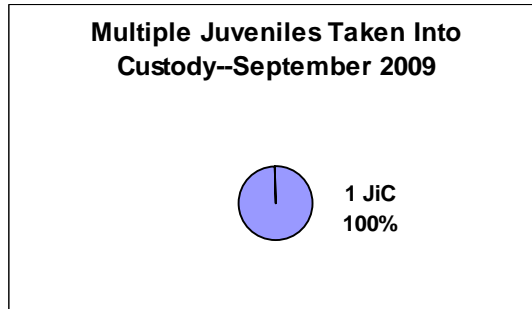
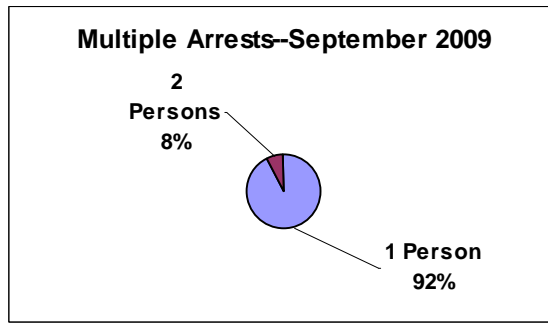
The ethnicity of the person taken into custody was:



The gender of the persons taken into custody was:



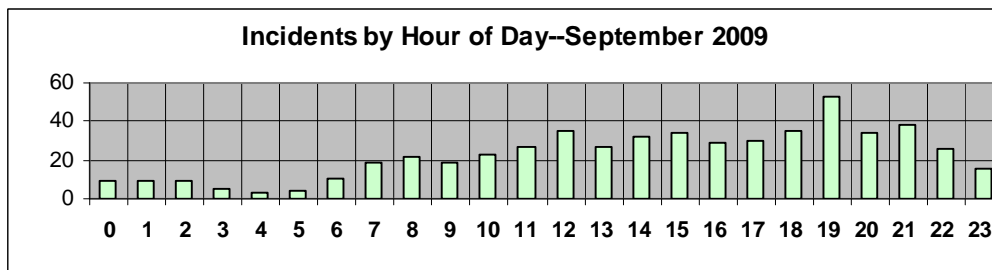
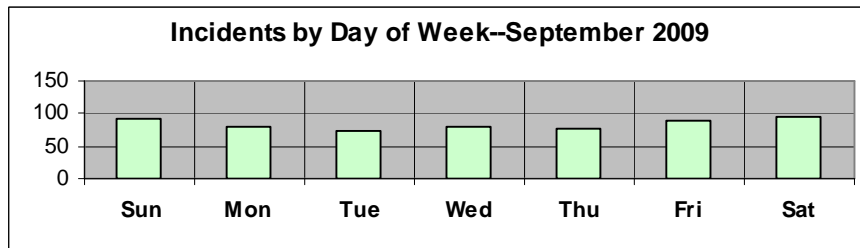
Multiple Arrests:



Multiple arrests are tracked due to the manpower and time required to safely transport and process multiple prisoners from the same incident.

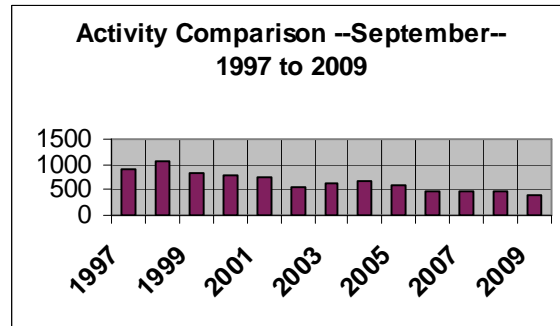
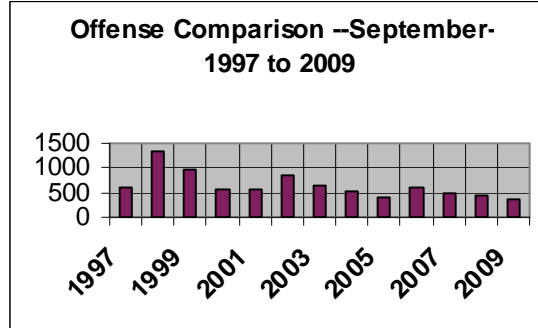

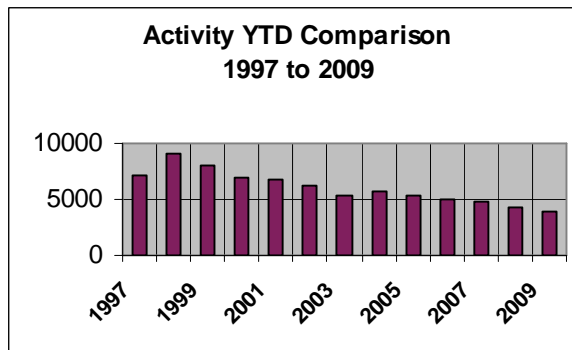
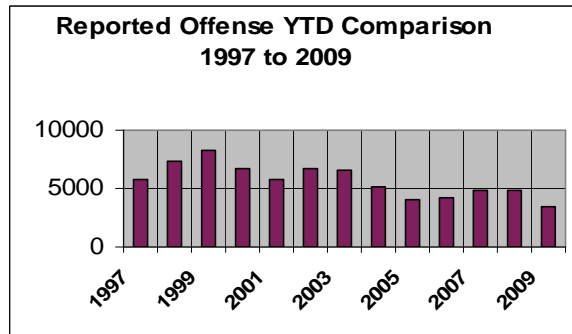


Offense and Activity Comparison:

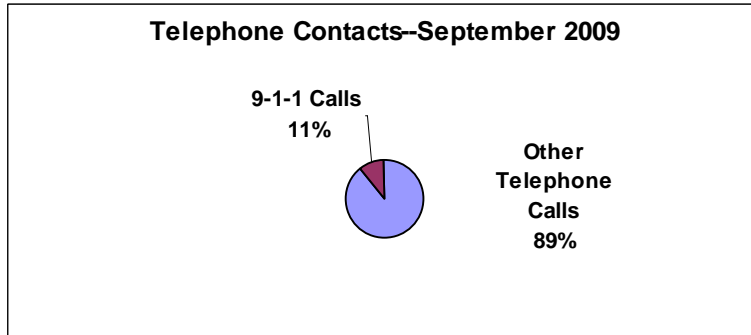


Years to Date:



Communications:

Communications handled over 4390 telephone contacts and 545 9-1-1 calls in September 2009. This is a daily average of 146 telephone contacts and eighteen 9-1-1 calls.

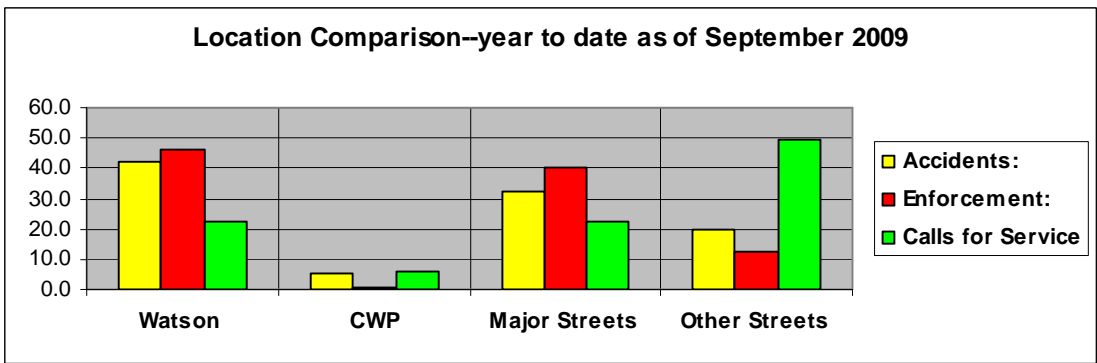


Location Comparison:
